The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In his will, dated 17 Dec 1729, proved 18 Feb 1744, Abraham Alberson, of Gloucester, Gloucester Co., NJ, mentioned Sons--Abraham, Ephraim and Joseph Alberson, to have equally "all of my plantation whereon I live." Daughter--Rebecca Beverly. Executors to have the rest of estate, real and personal for bringing up of three sons, Aaron, Levi and Jonathan Alberson, until they will be 14, and then to put them out to some trade. After they attain 21 years, executors to pay them 10 pounds apiece. To son-in-law (step-son) Richard Chew £10, when he will be 21. Executors--sons Abraham and Joseph Alberson. Witnesses--Joseph Low, William Hampton, John Kaighin. Proved 18 Feb., 1744. 1745, Dec. 10. Letters Testamentary were granted. Lib. 5, p. 136. 1739, Dec. 6, (filed 1744). Inventory of the personal estate of Abraham Alberson senior (£193.4.6), includes negro Tom, £5, 30 lbs. of wool and 12 lbs. of worsted, beef, pork and lard. Appraisers--John Mickle, Joseph Low.

Sarah Alberson, admx. (her mark). Thomas Clement of the same place, "cordwainer," bondsman. Witnesses--John Hampton, John Ladd. Lib. 5, p. 463. 1745-6, Jany. 18. Inventory of personal estate (£51.18.0), includes "salt pork, beaf, hogs, lard £4.10.0." Appraisers--John Hampton, John Thorne.

Mother Dinah Albertson to be maintained. Son Albert, when of age to have all money from the sale of my lands; if he dies, his share will go to my bro. Derick & my widow. If my wife & child die, the estate to go to my sisters Penelope, Wilmont, Temperance, Mary, & my sister Dinah's children. Exrs: Samuel Doty, Benjamin Carpenter, & my bro. Derick. Wits: Tho. Carpenter, Daniel Hopkins, and Tho. Pearsall, Jr. pro 21 April 1739.

Dirck Albertsen, Dutch, was in New Amstel by 1658 and in 1671 was a justice on the New Castle court. He owned several lots in New Castle. His residence was on the Strand at Hart Street, opposite Widow Crabbe.

Derrick Albertson was an early settler at or near Newcastle, Delaware, c. 1662-65 having probably gone there from New Amsterdam. He witnessed an Indian deed in 1665 to Fop Jansen Outhout for a tract in Salem Co., opposite Newcastle. When a formal patent for this land was given in 1669 it mentions Derrick Albertson's land as a northern boundary. He died 1675-6 leaving children, but there is no indication that they lived in NJ and the family may have taken the name Derickson. In 1690 Cornelius Derickson, formerly of New York, and then resident in Newcastle, sold the land in Salem County previously belonging to Derick Albertson. (See "Derrick Albertson" in the *Genealogical Magazine of New Jersey*, July 1938, p. 50.)

In 1672 Derick Albertson had built a mill near the South (Delaware) River.¹

[11 January 1675] "Declaration. William Tom, plaintiff, and Derick Albertson, defendant, relative to half of a lot of land where the mill stood ; claims by the defendant under a transport from William Beeckman... 48" [Calendar of Historical Manuscripts in the Office of the Secretary of State ..., p. 350]

[2 January 1676] "Captain Edmund Cantwell and Johannes de Haes executors of the last will & testament of Dirk Albertsen of this Towne, deceased ..." [Record of the Court of New Castle, Vol. 1, p. 43]

On 1 July 1679 and earlier, at a court held in the Town of New Castle, the Justices considered the estate of Dirk Albertsen, deceased. Executors, and guardians of his children, were Capt. Edmond Cantwell and Johannes de Haes. This case concerned a certain lot & piece of ground sold by said Dirk Albertsen to Hendrick Williams. The case was suspended (or continued) until a letter of administration arrived from New York. Court minutes mention heirs of deceased Derrick/Dirk Albertsen.

A Derrick Albertson was in Musketa Cove (now Glen Cove), L.I., NY in 1670 when his name appeared in the Moses Mudge account book.

According to Torrey's NewEngland marriages, Wilmeth may be the widow of John Coates instead of his daughter.¹

Willmet m. (2) by 1684, **Jerwin Root** (Jurrien). Jerwin (Jurrian) Root(e)s (Ruts) was of Madnan's Neck (now Great Neck), L.I., NY. He was mentioned occasionally in the Hempstead Town Records as he held several town offices. In 1695 he was mentioned ("Jurrian Roots of Cow Neck") when he bought land at Musketo Cove. (Cow Neck is now Port Washington.) He and his wife Willmet sold land at Madnan's Neck in 1696.

In his will dated 6 July 1696, probated 23 May 1697, Jerwin Rootes left a life estate to wife Willmet, including the house & lands I bought of Nicholas Simkins of Muscoto Cove, with remainder to my son Peter Rootes. Son Peter when of age also to have my clothes, three dozen plaite buttons, a sealed ring, a silver hat band, and one pair of plaite breeches buttons. To my daus. Dorothy Snethen & Phebe Rootes furniture, gold rings with stones, spoons, etc. To my wife's dau. Elizabeth Coles pewter plates, gold ring, etc. To my wife's three sons Derrick, William,, & Garret, & two sons-in-law Samuel Coles & Nicholas Snethen each a Holland neck cloth. The negroes to my wife. Wife sole Exx. Overseers: Thos Hicks & Thos. Barker. Wits: John Cornwell, Sr., Thos. Hicks, Jr. & Tho. Barker. (Queens Co. Wills),

Derrick Albertson was a millwright at Musketa Cove, Long Island, NY and a justice of the peace for Queens County, NY. He was mentioned in Oyster Bay and Hempstead Town Records as early as 1687. On 10 Nov 1892 he was called son-in-law in the will of Daniel Coles. Both Derrick Albertson and Dinah (Coles) Albertson signed the agreement among the heirs of Daniel Coles dated 12 Sep 1693.

William Burnet, Esq., Captain-General and Governor. Whereas, Samuel Cole, of Oyster Bay, in Queens County, died intestate, Letters of administration are granted to Derrick Albertson and Benjamin Cole, yeomen, January 5, 1725/6. ²

In his will, he wrote: ...September 3, 1733. I, Dirck Albertson, of Musketoe Cove, in Oyster Bay, in Queens County, mill wright, being very sick. I leave to my wife Dinah, my dwelling house and garden spot, during her life, and all movables within doors, and 10 bushels of wheat, and 8 bushels of Indian corn, yearly; And a cow every summer with pasture, "and firewood at the door," and two pair of shoes yearly, and 10 pounds of flax and 10 pounds of wool, and £3 in money, yearly. I leave to my son Dirck, all my homestead, "from a picket rock that stands anent the mulberry tree, and running the same breadth as far as the Hollow, and as far as my land goeth, running north from said rock, with all housing thereon, after his mother's death." I leave to my son Daniel all the rest of my homestead lot, and all the land east of said line, round about Killbuck swamp. And my son Daniel's land is to begin on the west side of my lot that joineth to the lane that leadeth to Benjamin Woolsey's farm; and to take up so much land as will make 25 acres, I gave him a deed for, And 10 acres more adjoining said lane. I leave the rest of my lands and creek rights to my two sons. I leave to my daughters, Penelope Doughty, Willmet Craft, Dinah Carpenter, and Temperance Coles, 20 shillings each, and to my youngest daughter, Mary Dines, £2. I appoint John Carpenter, of Red Spring, and Daniel Valentine, of Musketoe Cove, and my sons Dirck and Daniel, executors. Dated October 3, 1733. Witnesses, William Craft, Joseph Coles, John Groen. Codicil, October 6, 1733. Leaves to wife Dinah, 200 pounds of beef and pork, yearly. Leaves to his two sons, "all movables out of doors which did escape my memory." Proved, February 23, 1735/6.

According to Oyster Bay Town Records, Garret Albertsen in 1698 with his brother William⁵, bought land at Jericho and elsewhere in Oyster Bay from John Townsend, and two years later William assigned his interest in the property to Garret. Garret Albertsen conveyed part of the property to Thomas Powell, Jr. of Bethpage in 1702.

In 1711 Garret Albertson provided food for the militia in Oyster Bay, and in 1715 he was in the militia there. He was mentioned occasionally elsewhere in Oyster Bay Town Records, and was cited in the 1721 inventory of his mother's estate.

In his will dated 29 Dec 1729, probated 13 April 1730 (unrecorded, NYC), "Gerritt Albertsen, of Jericho, in Oyster Bay, in Queens County" mentioned wife Abigail (£60, some household goods and a riding horse); sons Nicholas and John (all rest of estate, real and personal); daughter Elizabeth (some livestock and some household goods). He made wife and son Nicholas executors. Witnesses were Nathaniel Townsend, Jacob Seaman, Daniel Denton (Nathaniel Townsend and Jacob Seaman were Quakers).⁶

On May 2d, 1682, William Albertson located a tract of land in Newton township, [Gloucester County] New Jersey, between the south and the middle branch of the creek that bears that name, and settled thereon. It does not appear whence he came, but the probability is that he was of Dutch extraction, and that his parents were among the Hollanders of New York. The house which he built--no doubt, a small one--stood by the middle branch, and nearly fronting the little settlement called Newton; but in a few years it entirely disappeared. He was a married man with a family when he came there; shortly after he removed to Byberry, Pennsylvania, and gave the possession of the estate to his son William. This occurred before 1692, for, in that year, he purchased a tract of land in the town bounds of Gloucester, the deed for which names him as then a resident of the place above mentioned.¹

In 1684 land was surveyed for Thomas Sharp between the fork of Newton Creek and a run opposite the house of William Alberson, along the Forke Creek....He was one of the earliest members of the Newton Friends' Meeting in 1684. (GMNJ 3:20). He was one of the members of the General Assembly which met at Burlington May 12, 1685, representing the "3rd Tenth", also called the "Irish Tenth". (LS:498). He moved from Newton 1695-98 to Bybury, on Poquesin Creek, in Bucks Co. PA.²

By will dated March 18, 1691/92, his son-in-law Walter Forest of Bybury (Byberry) had given half of his mills and lands to his wife Ann and the other half to "William Albertson ye younger, Abraham Albertson and Rebecka Albertson in equall proportion". As executor and residuary legatee the will names "William Albertson Senir of West Jersey by New Towne Creek".....Probate....May 1692...call William a weaver.²

The elder William owned a grist-mill on Poquesin Creek, apparently in partnership with his son-in-law Joseph Satterthwaite...²

His will, dated Dec 7, 1709....names wife Hannah and seven children. (the four youngest being minors), son-in-law Jervis Stogdale and dau.-in-law Ruth Stogdale (Philadelphia Co. Wills, C:189). Part of the family were members of the Friends' Meeting at Abington, PA, the members helped "widow Alvinson" and her son-in-law "Shaterthite" when their mill burned in 1711-12. Widow Hannah Albinson and family transferred their membership from Abington to Philadelphia in 1720.²

Upon the setting apart of a lot of land at Newton whereon to build a meeting house, he was one of the persons who accepted the trust therefor, and no doubt took an active part in the erection of that place of worship. This trust was continued until 1708, when other and younger men were called to occupy the same position.¹

He made several locations and purchases of land, while a resident here; but his removal so soon from this neighborhood leaves but little of his history among us, yet, so far as his record goes, he was a person much respected in his day and generation. In 1685, he was returned as a member of the Colonial Legislature; he also held other minor county and township offices during his settlement here.¹

At the time of his decease, he resided at Poquesin, in Bucks county, Pennsylvania, where he owned grain and saw mills, and considerable other property. He died soon after the execution of his will (1709), survived by his widow Hannah, and by all his children except Ann.

To his son William, in the year 1698, he deeded the homestead property, whereon he remained until his decease in 1720.

In his will, dated 22 Dec 1744-5 and 22 Feb 1744-45, proved 16 April 1745, William Alberson, yeoman, of Newton, Gloucester Co., NJ, mentioned -- To son William and his heirs forever, "all the land and meadow I bought of John Kasley and the meadow I bought of Thomas Dennises, excepting the Lower Branch, also my two tracts of outland." To son Simeon Alberson and his heirs forever, "the lower part of my plantation where I live, bounded by Newton and the Fork Creek, near the house of John Mickle; also my cedar swamp, my son Simeon to pay each of my daughters Sarah and Ann £30 and my son Nathan £10, for the same when they will be 21." Son John Alberson to have the residue of land within the township of Newton, "he to pay my son Nathan, when 21, £20, to whom I give my 60 odd acre lot on a branch of Timber Creek, called 'Stephens Run.'" "I commit the tuition, care and estate of my children unto my uncle Josiah Alberson and my friend Ebenezer Hopkins." Executrix--wife Jane Alberson. Witnesses--Joseph Low, Andrew Tate, Elizabeth Smith, Jos. Cooper. Proved 16 April 1745. Letters granted July 25, 1746. Lib. 5, p. 220. 1745, 1st mo. (March), 25 da. Inventory (£858.4.4), includes watch and apparel, £54.13.3, bonds £174.1.2 1/2, saddle-bags, remnant of cloth, 1/2 doz. teaspoons, £2.4.6, negro-woman and child, £40, 11 horses, 34 cattle, oxen £214. William Albertson lived on the south side of Peconic river, at Riverhead, in an old house which is yet standing. The lands mentioned are all in that region except the land and stream at Noyack, which is a well-known locality north of Bridge Hampton. The 2,400 acres of land left to his son Daniel, are probably in Topping's Purchase, Southampton, south of Peconic river. The ancient line between Quogue Purchase and Topping's Purchase, in the town of Southampton, ran very near the old house.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, William Albertson, of the town of Southampton, clothier, being sick. I leave to my son, John Albertson, all my meadow at a place called the Muddy Cove; Also 100 acres of land lying in the manor of St. George, being at the east end of said land; Also all my right in the Cedar Swamp lying between the two rivers. I leave to my son William, all that part of my land lying at the place called the Ponds, formerly in possession of William Coleman; beginning at the bound tree eastward, which stands between me and Daniel Horton, and running west by the Kings road, "to the bound tree that stands between me and Glover." I leave to my son Richard all that part of my lands at the Ponds which was formerly in possession of William Coleman, south of the Country road, and beginning at the bound tree between me and David Horton, so running to the manor line. I leave to my two sons, William and Richard, all my meadow that belongs to my Ponds farm on the land formerly in possession of William Coleman. My son William shall grant to my son Richard, a passing road to his meadow. I leave to my son Daniel, a lot of land running from the manor to the Saw mill, on Peconic river, with the mill and stream; Also 2,400 acres of land lying to the said river; Also 1 right of land undivided lying in the manor of St. George in the township of Southold; I also leave him my land and stream at Naiock (Noyack) in the town of Southampton. My land at Goshen in Orange County is to be sold by my executors. I leave to my three daughters, Mary, Elizabeth, and Abigail, £100 each, when of age. All the rest of my movable property is to be sold at vendue to highest bidder, and the proceeds paid to my 3 daughters, after my wife has had her thirds. I make my wife and my sons John and William executors. "Dated in Riverhead in the town of Southampton," March 25, 1749. The 100 acres of land in the manor of St. George which I have given to my son John is to begin at the Bald Hill westward, and so to come east, to include 100 acres. Witnesses, Hugh Raynor, William Raynor, John Mackie. Proved, March 30, 1749.

In his will, he wrote: ...January 24, 1764. I, William Albertson, of the town of Southampton, in Suffolk County, farmer, being sick in body. "I leave to my wife Charity £30, together with £30 which her father Woodhull gave her; also all other movable goods and household stuff, to be made good to her when the heir comes of age." "If she shall marry, then he is to pay her £50, and she is to quit her Thirds of my estate." I leave to my daughter Clement £80. To my son Josiah £180, and he is to be brought up to a trade. I leave to my 3 daughters, Mary, Elizabeth, and Abigail, £60 each, to be paid as they come of age. My land and meadow at the Wading River are to be sold by my executors, and the money put at use till the children are of age. The rest of my lands and meadows I leave to my wife to have the use of, to bring up the children, and then to return to the heir when he is of age. I leave to my son William all my lands, meadows, and buildings lying at South, in the Neck commonly called Ketchaponack. I make my wife and John Woodhull and Daniel Foster, executors. Witnesses, John Woodhull, Daniel Foster, Abigail Albertson. Proved, June 21, 1764.
