The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

George S. Allison was an officer in the War of 1812, in the regiment of Col. Washburn, and was stationed at Sandy Hook. After the War, he came to Haverstraw, NY. He was twice elected Member of Assembly in 1828-29, He was a Col. and later a Brigadier General of Militia in Rockland County, NY. He was Judge of the Court of Common Pleas.

Mary Brewster, widow of Jonas Brewster, of Haverstraw, in her will dated 1 Aug 1824, mentioned grand dau. Mary Allison, the dau. of George and Hannah Allison.

In his will, he wrote: I, John Ellison, of New York, merchant, being sick and weak. I leave to my eldest son, John Ellison, £100, in full bar to all claims and pretence as heir at law. I leave to my wife Mary all her wearing apparell, both linnen and woolen. Of all the rest of my estate, I leave 1/3 to my wife and her heirs and assigns "for ever more," 1/3 to my son John, and 1/3 to my daughter Mary. If both my children should die, then their part is to go to my brothers, William, Thomas, and Joseph Ellison. I make my wife Mary, and my brother, Thomas Ellison, and my brother-in-law, Wessell Wessells, of New York, executors. Dated July 6, 1725. Witnesses, Abraham Messier, Guysbert Van Inbrough, Peter Mersier, John Chambers. Proved, October 29, 1725.

The house of John Allison and his son Joseph Allison stood on what became Allison Street in Haverstraw.

John Allison, of Hempstead, L.I. was one of the purchasers in 1729 (1719?) of part of the north part of the Kakiat Patent in Rockland County, NY, and one of the founders of New Hempstead, now Ramapo. He also later became the owner of the larger part of the DeHarte Patent, which included what is now Haverstraw and Grassy Point.

In his will dated 6 June 1751, probated 21 Oct 1754, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, John Allison, of the Precinct of Haverstraw, in Orange County, being much out of health. "As my farm, now in the hands of John Johnson, is on shares, that is, he has 1/4 of all the grain that he shall raise in the space of two years, and I am to have 3/4 thereof. It is my will that Phebe Hubs shall stay with my slaves and family in my house and receive all the 3/4 of the grain for the support of the family, and she is to have two cattle killed for beef, and eight hogs, for the support of the family. The rest of the produce and stock is to be sold, and £20 paid to Phebe Hubs. I leave to my son Benjamin 1/3 of the meadow that belongs to the place he lives on, and was reserved by me, Also 100 acres of land lying on Kakiat road, joining to the widow Conkling on the north side, Also 100 acres where Lewis Van Ditmarsh lives, bounded east and south by a fence called the new field fence, and north by Menesacongo brook, and so running the same width west till it makes 100 acres. I leave to my son John 6 shillings as his share, he having had his portion before. I leave to my son Joseph the farm I now live on, being a tract of land purchased of Albertus Minnie and others, bounded north and east by Hudsons river, south by the mountains, and so running west along Menesacongo brook and the mountains so far as to reach a tier of 100 acre lots, a little to the east of a brook called the muddy brook. To him and his heirs and assigns, except 100 acres which I give to my son Benjamin. And my son Joseph shall pay £100 to my son William and £50 to his son Edward Ellison. I leave to Phebe Hubs £60 for her and her three children, and to her daughter Hannah £30, and to her daughter Priscilla £70, "and to the child now in her body, yet unborn,

£60 if it lives." I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Cooper, 8 shillings for her part, with what I have given her. I leave to my daughter, Deborah Johnson, £60. To my daughter, Mary Degraugh, £60. To my daughter, Hannah Taylor, £50, being her share, with what I have given her. All my goods and movable estate to be sold by my executors. They shall also sell 4 lots of land lying in Kakiat, one lot bounded north by John Osborn, south by Hans Urz, east by land that did belong to Silvanus Mott, and running west till it makes 200 acres. Another lot bounded north by Gurnee, south by Joshua Conkling, east by Van Huter's land, and so running west till it makes 200 acres. Another lot bounded north by Isaac Secor, south by Charles Mott, east by Mr. Garrison, and west by Nathaniel Jones, being 170 acres. The other lot lies in the northermost corner of the West Division. Also one lot more, of 50 acres, in Company, bounded east by More and Ward, south by Banks and Lyon. My executors are to take the money, and collect the debts due to me, and pay all debts and legacies, and they shall sell all other lands, except my rights on Long Island, which I leave to my son William, and the rest of the money they shall pay to my legatees, except my son John. I make my friends, John Palmer, John Johnson, and John Peterson Smith, executors. Dated June 6, 1751. Witnesses, Joshua Seaman, Cornelius Seaman, Isaac Davis. Proved in New York, October 21, 1754.¹

He was raised as a foster child by William B. Dana and his wife (whose pen name was Olive A. Wadsworth). In 1880 Allison and William B. Dana became joint owners of the Palisade Mountain House. After that famous hotel burned, Allison became the sole owner of the property, and built his own mansion on the former Palisade Mountain House property (in 1903 this mansion also burned down).

Caroline Longstreet Comstock was of Syracuse, and her father was at one time Attorney General of the United States.

He was the first Mayor of the Borough of Englewood Cliffs (serving 1895-1902 and again 1910-1911) and one of the founders of the Bergen County Historical Society.
