The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Albert Alyea, miller, 7 July 1785 sold lands totaling about 120 acres in the Township of Pequannock (now Lower Montville area in Montville Twp., Morris County, NJ to Daniel Durie. Situated on the land were a snadstone dwelling house, farm buildings, and a grist mill on the Rockaway River. On the same date as the Morris County purchase, Daniel Durie sold to Albert Alyea in exchange and for the same price, the easterly 124 acres of his Kinderkamack farm, plus 26 acres to the west, a total of 150 acres.

On 13 April 1786, Albert and Maria Alyea, yeoman, of Harrington Township, conveyed to Richard Kuyper, yeoman, of New Barbadoes Township, for £1050, 124 acres, 9 acres, and 16 acres, corner to Cornelius Kuyper and Jacob Van Wagener; mentioned line of Jacob Van Boskerk, corner Stephen Bourdett. Signed Albert Alyea (his mark), Maria Alyea (her mark). Witnessed by John Westervelt, John Van Wagener.<sup>1</sup>

Albert A. Alyea, prob. 40-50, was listed in the 1840 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, New Jersey. Listed living with him were one male 20-30, one male 70-80 [prob. his father], one female 15-20, one female 20-30, and one female 30-40.

He is listed as a miller in the 1850 census.

In the 1860 census, he is listed as a miller, living with the family group of John Alyea and Margaret.

Jane Alyea, 72, was listed with her daughter-in-law and grandson in the 1870 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ: Albert J. Alyea, 23, farmer; Margaret Alyea, 50; and Jane Alyea, 72. Also living with them was Maria Snyder, 78. Listed in the same dwelling, but separate family, were: Jno. (Dunning?) [ or Deering? Deeny?], 64, farm laborer; Josephine, 52, and Mary, 10 (all b. Holland).

Jean Aliee is reported to have come from Artois, France. He owned land on the west side of the Hackensack River (perhaps in Oradell) and in Old Hook (now Emerson and Harrington Park) in Bergen County, NJ.

Jan may have purchased property in 1687 in Kent Co., Delaware. The tract he bought was swamp land which today is Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge. Jan bought up more land and had a plantation of orchards, woodlands, pastures, meadows, etc. Each child was willed land, with the lion's share going to the 2 eldest sons, Peter and Abraham. If Peter did not move to DE to lay claim to his land within 3 years after Jan's death the land was to go to Jacob and his heirs.<sup>5</sup>

Jean Aliee settled in Dutch Neck on the coast line between Dover and Smyrna. Smyrna began about 1700 as an English Quaker settlement called Duck Creek Village, one mile north of the current town. The Smyrna Landing wharves were centers of commerce in the 1800s. Many examples of Federal and Victorian architecture can be found in the town. Located: eight miles west of the Delaware Bay and Bombay Hook Wildlife Refuge. Local site: Allee House. In 1753, John's son Abraham built a handsome brick farmhouse. The house was restored by 1966 and in 1971 it was placed on the National Register of Historic Places.<sup>6</sup> (According to Joan M. Alyea <aerohawk@rmi.net>, online Sep 1999, an acre of land is supposed to be the area that could be plowed by an ox in a day. A hide of land, about 120 acres, is the amount of land that an ox could plow in a year. A hundred hides was the origin of the sub-division of a county in England called a Hundred, a term still used in certain areas.)

The family, with the exception of eldest son Peter, removed to Duck Creek Hundred, Kent Co., Delaware, probably in the early 1700s, where "John Alley" died in 1718 leaving a will dated 19 Feb 1718, pr. 16 Mar 1718.

According to family tradition, Susanna's uncle, Pierre LeRoux's cousin, Abraham Le Roux of Mannheim arrived on Staten Island, NY in 1678 on the Dutch ship *De Trouw* (Faith) with Jeanne Guerin LeRou and her children, all b. Mannheim. They were followed in 1680 by more of the family, arriving on the ship *Caledonia*. Pierre LeRou/Le Roux had died on the voyage, which originated in Holland.<sup>4</sup>
