

-- ANDRIES, ANDERSON --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Andries Jochemsen was also known as Albada.

Translation from "Amsterdam marriage register" -- "Andries Jochemsz, born at Leeuwarden, seaman (varentsgezel), 24 years old, living in the Lindestraat, assisted by Grietie Pouwels; and Celitgie Frerix, born in Amsterdam, 22 years old, parents dead, assisted by Celytgie Willems, her relative, living in the Boomstraat. He signs with cross. She signs: Seletien Fredericks."

Celitje Frederickse had two siblings living in New Amsterdam - Thomas Fredericksen (m. about 1646 Marritie Adriaens) who was the ancestor of the Cadmus Family, and Neeltje Fredericksen (m. with banns 30 Oct 1649, Claes Hendrickszen), who was the ancestor of the Kingston Van Schoonhovens and a whole mess of Blanchans.

Andries Jochemszen & Celitje Fredericks probably immigrated about 1650, probably with her brother and sister and their families.

Seletje appears over 40 times in the Court Minutes of New Amsterdam. Many of these cases seem to be disputes over payments arising from the tavern she apparently ran. Some were between her and her suppliers and some between her and her customers. She is shown most often as Seletje Arens, sometimes as Seletje Ares, twice as Seletje Frerick, and once as Seletje Jochemsen. There was one case on 30 Jan 1663 (RNA 4:194) in which it is explicitly stated: "Andries Joghemszen, Seletje Aren's husband."

Both Andries and Celitje appear in various records in 1674. In a tax list of July 1677 (Minutes of the Common Council of the City of New York; vol I, p. 50), we see at a location "The Water Side" "The heirs of Andriess Jockems".

Enoch (Andrus, Andrews, Anderson) appears very often upon the oldest records of West Jersey, of Burlington court, Maidenhead township, and later of Hunterdon Court and County. In 1698 he was made Trustee, with Johannes and Lawrence Opdyck, Joshua and Cornelius Anderson, for the Maidenhead 100 acre lot for church, school and burial purposes. In 1699 he served on the grand jury at Burlington; in 1706 he was chosen constable for Hopewell; in 1709 he was Justice of the Court of Common Pleas at Burlington, and in the same year he and his brother Cornelius were trustees of the church lot at Ewing. In 1710 he was made Trustee, with Lawrence and Albertus Opdyck, Joshua and Cornelius Anderson, for the Lawrenceville church plot. In 1712 he subscribed at Maidenhead town meeting, with Johannes and Lawrence Opdyck and Joshua Anderson, for setting off Hunterdon county, and the town appointed him to meet the men of Hopewell and to aid the justices in levying a tax. In 1729 he was elected Overseer of Highways in Trenton township, and in 1729 Overseer of Poor and of South road. We find records of his owning land in 1708 along a road laid out through Hopewell to the Delaware river, and of his selling 330 acres in Hopewell for 61 pounds in 1713. In 1722 he bought of Johannes Opdyck 150 acres on Eight Mile Run in Maidenhead, and in 1725 he bought 200 acres adjoining; his son John purchasing from his father the former tract and from his executors the latter, sold the whole to Wilson Hunt in 1765 for 3510 pounds. But Enoch's chief land interest was in Trenton. In 1707, years before Trenton had a settlement or a name, Enoch owned land on the Assenpink adjoining some purchased by his father in law Johannes and Joshua Anderson from the first settler, Mahlon Stacey. In 1709 Enoch bought Johannes's 12 acres for 20 pounds, and sold a part of it in 1718 for 30 pounds. In 1722 he bought Joshua's 12 acres for 90 pounds. Of this he sold a small lot, 74 ft. by 60 ft., the same year for 20 pounds, the deed described him as "Gentleman of Trent Town", his wife Catarine (Tryntie) joined in the conveyance. The place had just been named for Wm. Trent, the first chief justice of the Jerseys and speaker of the legislature. Out of the land that he bought from Joshua, Enoch gave 150 feet square to trustees for the Presbyterian church on April 10, 1727, and the last surviving trustee conveyed this plot to the church in 1763; the first Presbyterian church of Trenton was long called "the Anderson meeting House". Enoch sold 22 acres at Trenton in 1730 to Wm. Morris of Barbadoes, for 310 pounds; 1/4 acre in 1732 for 25 pounds; a small lot in 1733 for 25 pounds and various lots at other times. he may have certainly been called one of the chief founders of the city. Tryntie's name has not been found on any deed after 1722; she was undoubtedly dead in 1741 when Enoch made his will. He bequeathed to his sons, John a small sum, Enoch the homestead, Eliakim 200 acres "over Sanpink" Jeremiah 200 acres, Joshua 200 acres bought of Dr. Cadwallader; to his daughters, Caturm, Sarah, Elizabeth and Mary, sundry sums; and mentions his sons in law, Benjamin Stevens and Ralph Smith. Benj. Stevens' grave stone can still be seen in the Lawrenceville Cemetery, "Died 1763, aged 64".
