

-- ANDROVET --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Jean Androvet was a Huguenot who settled on Staten Island by 1699.

In his will, he wrote: August 29, 1760. I, John Androuet, of Staten Island, boatman, being sick. I leave to my wife Leah the use of all my estate during her life or widowhood. I leave to my youngest daughter, Mary, a negro girl and a bed and furniture. Also that part of my Plantation next the water side, with the house, orchard, barns, and other buildings. And the meadow near the water side, beginning at the water side and running along Peter Androwvet's land to the road, thence along the road to Joseph Soper's land, thence along his land to the river. I leave to my daughters, Elinor and Leah, all the rest of my Plantation, beginning at the road and running along Peter Androwvet and Israel Dissosway's land to Sandy Brook, and from Sandy Brook along the rear of the water side to the road, and along the road to Peter Androwvet's land. I give to Elinor Woglom and Leah Topping two pieces of meadow, one piece lying in Fresh Kill, commonly called the Long Neck, being 7 acres, and the other at Woodbridge, called the Sunken Marsh, also 7 acres. All the rest of my movable estate I leave to my three daughters. I make my wife and my daughter Mary executors. Witnesses, Rebecca Androwvet, Catharine Androwvet, Laughlen Fallen. Proved, December 8, 1760.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Andrivet, of Richmond County, being sick. I leave to my son John a negro boy, my wagon, two horses, one plow, and my Sloop called the Susannah, with all the appurtenances, and he is to pay to his brother Lewis £50. But if he lose the Sloop by accident within five years he is not to pay. I leave to my son Lewis a negro boy. To my daughter Susannah £30 and a bed and a negro girl, and I have given to my four other daughters each a negro girl. The rest of my personal estate is to be sold and the money paid to my five daughters, Elizabeth, Ann, Rebecca, Tabitha, and Susanah. I leave to my son John the possession of my estate after my death to enable him to bring up and maintain his brother Lewis and his sister Susanah till they are of age. When my son Lewis is of age, the estate is to be divided between them. I make my son John and my two sons-in-law, Gilbert Jackson and Jacob Cole, executors." Dated January 14, 1780. Witnesses, Paul Micheau, Elizabeth Andrevet, Henry Butler. Proved, April 18, 1780.

In his will, he wrote: October 6, 1761. I, Peter Andrevet of Richmond County, "having at this time my usual sence." All debts to be paid. I leave to my wife the use of my farm or Plantation that I now live on, lying and adjoining to the river on the west side of Staten Island, Containing two lots, and all the meadow adjoining; Also a negro wench and child, and a horse and chair, and two cows, a bed, and household goods sufficient to furnish a room. After her death, I leave all the said farm to my son Peter, also the movable estate. I leave to my son Andrew all my land or farm at the South side where he now lives, with all the salt meadow adjoining to Joseph Stragge, "And 10 acres of salt meadow lying on Cannuns Point, adjoining the meadow of Anthony Stottenborgh [Stoutenburgh]; Also two negroes. I leave to my son Peter a lot of meadow and small island lying in the Fresh Kill adjoining to Barent De Pue. I leave to my daughters, Rebecca, wife of John Storrey, Elizabeth, wife of Aaron Cortilew, Anne, wife of Zacheus Van Dike, Susanah, wife of Daniel Winants, and Rachel, wife of Daniel Winants, Jr., each a negro slave. I leave to my two grandsons, Peter Noe and John Noe, each a negro boy, and all the rest of my movables to my daughters and grandsons. I make my sons, John and Peter, and my son-in-law, Aaron Cortilew, executors. Witnesses, Leuis Grondain, mariner, Cornelius Van Dike, Sarah Monett. Proved, October 9, 1769, before Benjamin Seaman.
