The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In their marriage record, they were: "Allard Anthony, Van Amsterdam, en Henrica Wessels, Van Uytrecht. Getrouwt den 12 April."

Allard Anthony was one of the most prominent citizens of early New York, and held the office of Sheriff. He was

appointed Burgomaster on 9 Dec 1654, 1655, 1663. His house was on the west side of Broadway, a little south of Oyster Pasty lane.

Allard Anthony, Francois Rembout, and Anna Elizabeth Wessels wit. bp. 10 Sep 1671 NYC Ref Ch, of Jacobus, son of Pieter Aldrichs & Maria Wessels.

In his will, he wrote: [I,] Allard Anthony, of the city of New York, December 12, 1685. My body to be buried in such place as my wife Henrica shall think fit. I leave to my wife Henrica, all houses, lands, tenements, and goods, and all legacies due unto me by the decease of our father, Franciscus Anthony, of Holland. I leave to my son, Nicholas Anthony, for that he hath proved disobedient to me, in his marriage with Angie, his now wife, and for other reasons to me best known, 1 shilling, in full for all his portion. If my wife and the children of my son should die, then one half of my estate is left to the Elders of the Dutch Church, and the other half to my wife's relations, and I make my wife executor. Witnesses, Edward King, Charles Lodowick, Robert Sheldon, George Blackwell. Recorded Liber 19 B. Page 182.

In her will, she wrote: I, Henrica Anthony, of New York, widow, being ancient and weak of body, but of sound mind. I leave all my estate of every description, houses, lands, and goods, to my three well beloved grand sons, Henry, Allard, and Nicholas Anthony, to them and their heirs. My grand son, Henry Anthony, is to have £10 more than the rest. Mentions "my brother Warner Wessells and his children." "Henry Coerten, son of my sister, Christina Coerten, widow;" "My sister, Maria Aldrichs, of New Castle, Pennsylvania;" "My brother, Harmanus Wessells, late of New York, Chirurgeon," "My brother, Dirck Wessells, of New York." I leave to Elizabeth Sharpas, daughter of William Sharpas, Town Clerk, of New York, £5. I appoint Isaac De Reimer, merchant, William Jackson, cordwainer, and Colonel Jacob Rutsen, of Ulster County, executors. I leave to my brother, Dirck Wessells, £4 per annum. Dated January 16, 1701. Witnesses, Thomas Hwarden, Isaac De Peyster, John Sheppard. Codicil. Makes Henricus Coerten, mariner, Andreas Teller, merchant, William Jackson, Jacobus Kip, husband of the late widow Ver Planck, executors. Dated August 24, 1702. Witnesses, William Sharpas, Isaac De Peyster, John Sheppard. Proved, May 16, 1707. Henry Coerten and Wm. Jackson being the surviving executors.

Signed John Berry. Witnessed by Richard Edsall, Thomas Lawrence, Thomas Van Boskerk.¹

He was a ship builder and in 1874 was building steamboats on the Hudson. In 1858 he and a friend formed the shipbuilding and joiner firm of Murray and Anthony; abt. 1860 he bought out Murray's interest. At one time he was a boss of over 300 men in a Brooklyn shipyard, at the height of the busy Civil War shipbuilding activity.

He lived at 59 Mangin St., NYC; later moved to Cannon St., NYC; and in 1867 bought a 26-acre farm and house in Allendale, Bergen Co., NJ from John A. Storms. He farmed this land, but continued through the 1870s to commute to NYC, where he worked at ship carpentry and joining.

July 4, 1656: "There was submitted and presented a certain memorial of the honorable consistory of the village of Beverwyck, stating and setting forth that one Michiel Antonisz from Uytrecht, owing to a certain mistaken and untruthful report of a certain neighbor, who had lived in one and the same street next to one Grietge Jacobs, the aforesaid Michiel's first wife, that she, meaning instead of the wife, the mother, was dead and buried, had thereupon, mistaking the one for the other, married for the second time one Femmetge Aelberts, residing in Katskil; that since that time the first wife, the aforesaid Grietge Jacobs from Amsterdam, had also arrived here and revealed herself, wherupon the aforesaid Femmetge had declared that she wished no longer to live with the aforesaid Michiel Anthonisz, being of opinion that the said Grietge Jacobs, having the oldest papers, should have the priority and continue her marriage with the aforesaid Michiel Anthonisz, her own and lawful husband; that the same for the reasons aforesaid was also requested by the aforesaid Grietge Jacobs; furthermore, that the aforesaid case, being not only of ecclesiastical but also of a political nature, is referred to the christian authorities to request their approval, the aforesaid consistory requesting finally that the instance of the said Femmetge Aelbrechts she be granted letters of divorce. "The commissary and magistrates, having examined the aforesaid memorial and the request made therein and having summoned the said Michiel Anthonisz and Grietgen Jacobs to appear before them and confronted them with each other and heard their respective prayers and requests, have after mature deliberation considered, first, that the aforesaid case was contrary neither to the laws of God nor of man, the more so as the aforesaid Michiel Anthonisz had for nine years been out of the country and for a period of more than five successive years had heard or received no word or sign from the aforesaid Grietge Jacobs; also, that all marriages by mistake are ipso jure null and void, and finally, that the aforesaid Femmitge Aelberts has renounced her aforesaid matrimonial rights and relinquish them in favor of the aforesaid parties who were first joined in marriage. They therefore approve the aforesaid memorial and ordain, order and consent that the said Michiel Anthonisz and Grietge Jacobs shall be and remain husband and wife and the bonds of marriage between them are not dissolved by the second marriage with the aforesaid Femmitge, declaring the said Femmitge freed therefrom, restoring her to her former liberty and granting her the right at all times to marry again, where and whomsoever she pleases, without interference or objection by any one." Vol. 1, pages 282-283. [Only two items in the Beverwyck court records refer to a Femmetge Aelberts or Femmetien Albertsen, who was linked with Katskil. The other appears on Vol. 2, page 27. Both items are indexed along with the others concerning Femmetjen Alberts, widow of Hendrick Jansen Westercamp. No other woman the with first name Femmetien – of any spelling – appears in the records.]¹
