In his will, he wrote: ...December the 16, 1731. I, Elias Balies, Jr., of Jamaica, in Queens County, being sick and weak. I leave to my wife Ruth 1/2 of my movable estate, and to my daughter Mary the other half. I leave to my son, Elias Balies, all houses and lands for the support of her and the children during her widowhood. My apprentice, John Muirhead, is to be set at liberty, and he is to have my working tools. I appoint my father, Elias Balies, and my brothers, John and Ephraim, executors. Witnesses, Robert Cross, Dirck Brinkerhoff, Altie Rodes. Proved at Hempstead, April 3, 1732.

John Bayly of Westchester "having obtained from my father all his right in the above piece obtained from Huestis, assign to my father Necolas Bayly my right in the meadow on Frog's Neck butting n. to the town bridge, and e. to the white bank." Wit: Edward Collier and John Ferres, Jr.¹

In his will, he wrote: May 26, 1719. I, John Bayley, of the Borrough and town of Westchester, Esq., being sick and weak. I leave to my wife Elizabeth all movable estate and one certain lot of land lying in the town of Westchester with the house, out-houses, and orchards adjoining to the lot of land now in tenure and occupation of Jonathan Laurence, and lying opposite to the church with all the appurtenances with full power to sell. Also the rest of my estate, real and personal, being on Throckmorton's Neck, during her life and then to my daughter Sarah. I leave to my son John £5, and I make my wife executor. Witnesses, John Parant, Sarah Parant, (???) Gerard. Proved before Governor William Burnet, December 3, 1720.

On 19 November 1805 (recorded 29 December 1805, Bergen Co. X:11) Jonathan Mulford and Phebe, his wife, of the Township of Morris, County of Morris, conveyed to John Baily of the Township of New Barbadoes, for \$92.50, 1 acre strict measure in the Township of New Barbadoes, beginning at main road leading from Newark to New York, at corner of lot no. 41, belonging now or late to William Howard. Signed by Jonathan Mulford, Phebe Mulford (her mark). Witnessed by Thomas Ward, John Thomson.¹

On 24 March 1806 (recorded 25 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:260) William Halsey and Julia, his wife, of Newark in the County of Essex, conveyed to John Bailey of the Township of New Barbadoes, for \$340, two lots in the Township of New Barbadoes: (1) 1 acres beginning corner of Daniel Kemper of New York; mentioned land of Robert Kennedy. (2) 2 acres strict measure, mentioned land of William Howard of New York. Signed by Wm. Halsey, Julia Halsey. No witnesses recorded.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Jonathan Bailey, of Florida, in Orange County, being weak. I leave to my wife Elizabeth 1/3 of all my personal estate, after debts are paid, and 1/3 of the income of all my real estate so long as she remains my widow; "Also one gray mare, over and above her thirds." I leave to my eldest son, Richard, £10, when he is 21. I leave to my son Jonathan all the farm I now live on, with all the houses and appurtenances, but my wife is to live in the house so long as she remains my widow. And my son Richard is to pay to my sons, Benjamin and Asa, œ40 when they are of age. I leave the rest of my present estate to all my children. I make my wife and my brother, Richard Bailey, and Nathaniel Elmore, executors. Dated April 29, 1772. Witnesses, Isaac Nicolls, Ananias Whitman, Daniel Corwin. Proved, May 10, 1772.

The Manor of West Farms was part of the Borough Town of Westchester. The original deed from the Indians, with their names attached with "their mark" each being the rude drawing of an animal, in the ownership or at least in the possession of Mr. Francis W. Liggett of New York. The territory must have covered some thousands of acres. It was dated March 12, 1663 and was signed "marks" in the presence of Edward Walters, Richard Ponton, and Nathan Bailey.

They lived on Van Cortlandt Manor.

Upon the consolidation of the "Manor of Cortlandt" Church with the "Old Dutch Church of Sleepy Hollow", they transferred their membership to the latter, appearing on the register as the 85th and 86th members. Jeremiah Cennieff and his wife Antje, together with William Teller and Marritje (Mary Kniffen) his wife, transferred their membership at the same time. No date is given as to the agreement of the people of the "Manor of Cortlandt" uniting with those of "Philipsburgh" at Tarrytown, N. Y., but it was about 1698, or very soon after the organizing of the "Old Sleepy Hollow Church"¹

(Liber B. On P. 88), Nicholas Bayly now living in Westchester deeded to son Nathan Bayly of the same place, land in the Long Reach Patent, March 4, 1688/9. Signed "Balie"

20 March 1703 (Westchester Town Records, Book 3, p. 276) -- Nathan Bayly, late of Westchester, now living on Rick Abrams land in Westchester County, confirms a sale he made to Peregrine Turner in 1698, land formerly in possession of Edward Collier, guardian of Rachel, daughter of Peregrine Turner, now wife of John Jennings, Jr. Wit: Nathaniel Bayly and Harrick Lend [Lent?]. 20 March 1703.¹

A record from the Tarrytown Ref Ch says, "Ester Cennieff, widow of Natan Beeley, (Nathan Bailey) born in Mareneck, lives on the Manor of Cortlandt, m. Mar. 1, 1718, Isack Larens widower of Eve Lechgester, born in Wessester (Westchester) lives in Esester" (Eastchester).

Nathaniel Bailey is named as the husband of Leah Devoe in an article of agreement between Frederick Devoose Sr. and Frederick Devoose Jr. concerning lands he received upon his marriage to Leah's mother, Esther, daughter of Daniel Turner (lands in Fordham). (Liber F, p126)

They lived in Rye. In 1728 Bayley purchased land at Budd's Neck, part of which he sold in 1738. Some five years later a part or all of his estate was sold, which leads to the supposition that he had previously died, leaving two sons, named Levi Bailey (m. Mary Gilchrist), and Nicholas Bailey, who became a prominent physician before the Revolution, living near New Rochelle.

In a document recorded Liber F, p. 287 Land Records of Westchester Co., NY: 8 Nov 1722, Leah Bayly, sole administratrix of ye estate of her late husband, Peter Gendron of New Rochelle, dec'd, with her now husband, Nathaniel Bayly of Rye, sold a parcel of land in New Rochelle, formerly belonging to her late husband.

June 13, 1721 Nathaniel names the following children in his will: Jane Abigail, Ruth, Elizabeth, Nathaniel (by tradition and inferential evidence, children by first wife, Ruth Galpin), Levi, Nathan Nehemiah, Keziah and Leah (children by Leah). Levi named after Leah's brother-in-law, Nehemiah called in will youngest son, Leah and Keziah the 2 unmarried daughters named last. He writes his will on June 2, 1740 and it is proved June 27, 1740 in NYC.¹

The First Patent of Westchester: Richard Nicolls, Esq., Governor General under his Royal Highness James, Duke of York and Albany, &c., of all his territories in America, to all to whom these presents shall come, sendeth greeting: Whereas there is a certain town within this government, situate, lying and being upon the main to the east of Harlem river, commonly called and known by the name of Westchester, which said town belongs to the north riding of Workshire, upon Long Island, and is now in the tenure and occupation of several freeholders and inhabitants who having heretofore been seated there by authority, have been at considerable charge in manuring and planting parts of the lands belonging thereunto, and have likewise settled a competent number of families thereupon for a township, now for a confirmation unto the said freeholders and inhabitants in their possession and enjoyment of the premises, as also for an encouragement to them in their further improvements of their said lands and premises. Know ye, that by virtue of ye commission and authority unto me given by his Royal Highness, I have given, ratified, confirmed and granted, and by these presents do give, ratify, confirm, and grant unto John Quimby, John Ferris, Nicholas Bayley, William Betts and Edward Waters, as patentees for and on the behalf of themselves and their associates, ye freeholders and inhabitants of ye said town, their heirs, successors and assignees, all that tract of land....Given under my hand and seal, at Fort James in New York, on the isle of Manhattans, 13th of February, in the 19th year of His Majesty's reign. Anno Domino, 1667.

Nicholas Bayly of Westchester and Margaret his wife conveyed to son John Bayly, land on frog's Neck, Jan. 20, 1684. Liber A p. 29.

Nicholas Bayly and Margaret his wife of Westchester to son-in-law James Ryle (Riley) and Abiah our daughter, living at Foster's Meadows in Queens County L. I. all our house and lot and other lands in Westchester, March 5, 1688/9. (Liber B p. 38 Westchester Co. Land Records) This transfer was apparently made with the understanding that Nicholas Bailey and his wife were to be cared for while they lived as the following bond records. (Liber B on p. 41) the Bond of James Ryle (Riley) and wife Abiah to care for Nicholas Bayly and wife during life, Aug. 22, 1689. For some reason it did not prove satisfactory and was returned and was given to his son John. (Liber B p. 233): Return deed of James Royly (signed "Rily") and wife Abiah, living at Foster's Meadows, Queens Co., L. The name is of French origin from Huguenot source, and the true pronounciation is thus retained. In French the name Baillee or Belly was pronounced Bailey" The bible was in the possession of Rev. J. Webster Bailey, Pastor of the First Congregational Church, Ottawa, Illinois, 1908. Rev. Bailey was a grandson of Nicholas and Winnifred (Purdy) Bailey, and son of Rev. John Bailey of Galesburg, Illinois.¹

My beloved wife Mehitabel shall keep in her own hands the portions of the said daughters for educating and bringing them up till of age. I appoint Capt. Barnabas Horton, of Southold, and my wife Mehitabel, executors. Dated in Guilford, May 19, 1777. Witnesses, Samuel Brown, Benjamin Vail, nailmaker; Elisha Vail. Proved, Suffolk County, June 9, 1784. Confirmed, New York, November 10, 1784.
