The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

One of the original purchasers of the Elizabethtown grant, in 1665, Captain John Baker was an Englishman, first in New Amsterdam. An interpreter and familiar with the Dutch language. It is suggested that he was first employed by Daniel Denton, and his associates to conduct negotiations in their behalf, 1664, but, very early, he drew to himself the attention of Gov. Richard Nichols who appointed him, Sept. 25, 1665, chief military officer, at Albany, N. Y., which fact, he being away at his post of duty, accounts for his not joining in the oath of 1665. His house-lot at Elizabeth Town, adjoined that of Luke Watson. He was a leading citizen there, though other localities in N. J. records reveal his name. He frequently intermingled with the activities of both Piscataway and Woodbridge.

His brother, William Baker, mentioned him in his will: ...2nd day of December, 1690. I, William Baker, born in the Parish of Stepney, in the County of Middlesex, England; and now of New York, mariner, being in good health," and being willing to settle all my affairs. I leave to my beloved brother, Joseph Baker of New York, mariner, £224, now in the hands of Daniel Butts, merchant, and £54 in the hands of Jacob Mayle, merchant. And £10 in the hands of Thomas Roberts, cooper. And £15 in the hands of Thomas Coher, merchant. And 315 guilders of the Province of Holland, now due me from Frederick Phillipse, merchant. "But if my brother die without issue, then I give the same to be laid out in the building of an Alms House for the relief of the Poor of the Parish of Stepney." I leave to the poor of Stepney 158 sterling, now due me from Humphrey Owen, deal merchant, living in Wopping Parish, in the County of Middlesex, England. Leaves legacies to Jane Ransom of Stepney, and her children Robert, Jane, Mary and Rebecca. "I leave the rest of my estate which I now have, or may be due me by this intended voyage, unto the Poor belonging unto the Brownists Church, in Amsterdam, in Holland." Makes his brother Joseph, and Humphrey Owen and Richard Jones, executors. Witnesses, Daniel Butts, Jacob Mayle, (???) Fromanteel. "The 2 lots of ground, and everything else not in the will, I leave to my brother Joseph Baker, and he is to pay 140 to the Poor English of the Towne of New Yorke." Proved before Governor Benjamin Fletcher, October 11, 1695, and Joseph Baker takes the oath of executor.

In his will, he wrote: ...June 25, 1711. Know all men that I, Joseph Baker, of New York, mariner. My executors are to pay all debts, and to take especial care of my negro girl, named Elizabeth, free born, in my house May 20, 1706, and christened and registered in January, 1710. And my executors are to take security for her support from any persons she may freely live with. And at or before she is eleven years of age she is to be taught to read English, good housewifery, and to sew, knit and spin linen and woolen well, living as a white Christian in that my little house, where she was born. And she is to have and hold the said house, and the lot it stands on, being about three feet rear, and about seven feet front on King street, next to the house of Thomas Roberts, cooper. And she is to have three shillings a week during her life. I leave to Joseph B(???), sometime pipemaker, my biggest house, being 40 feet next to the wharf, and 20 feet next the said street [King street], with the ground and land to low water mark. I leave to William T(???), of this city, pipemaker, my house and lot lying next between the aforesaid dwelling houses, with the ground and land it stands on. To the said Joseph B(???), and William T(???), abusively called Baker, sons of Eunice, the supposed wife of Thomas Warden, of this city, pipemaker, and after the death of her and her husband, and not before, to the said Joseph B(???), and William T(???), and to their issue, never to be sold or let for more than one year, to any same person whatsoever. If they leave no male issue, then the said houses and lands are to be for poor, strange, distressed orphans, who are to be maintained till they are eleven years of age, and for work houses for good able poor, and to no other use, never to be sold or let. I leave to William Howard, my one-half of the island and mill at Hellgate. I make William Huddleston, Gent., William Howard, carpenter, Joseph De Witt, joyner, and Mr. John French, merchant, executors, and I give to them to fulfil my will, all houses and messuages. "It is my mind and will that all my houses and orchards and fresh meadow, lying joining to the road that goes up to Thomas Shutes, shall be sold, and my salt meadow lying at the Pines, and my Smith shop, which stands below the Hill before my house, and the small slip of land lying to the south of the same." Also all my personal property, "in six months' time." I leave to my daughter, Catharine Drake, 30 shillings, she having had the rest of her portion. All the rest I leave to my wife Hannah, and she is to have the use of my now dwelling house during widowhood, and then to my sons Joseph and William. Legacy to his daughter, Eunice Baker. I make my wife Hannah, and my brother, John Ward, executors. Witnesses, John Flood, Joseph Fowler, John Cuer. Proved, August 21, 1741.
