The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

On 1 December 1784, Cornelius Haring, Commissioner, of Bergen Co., conveyed to Daniel Baldwin of New York City, for £800, 69 acres, corner to James Bogart; seized of William Bayard, late of Bergen Township, for joining the army of the King. Signed by Cornelius Haring. Witnessed by Peter Lozier (his mark), Sayer Crane.¹

On 28 March 1788, Daniel and Phebe Baldwin, of Bergen Precinct, conveyed to Daniel Smith, of the same place, for £630, former land of William Bayard. Signed by Daniel Baldwin, Phebe Baldwin. Witnessed by John Outwater, John Smith.¹

He is likely the "David Bawldwin" listed in the Franklin Township Rateables for 1778 and Jan-Feb 1779 with (1778) 93 acres, 3 horses, 4 cattle, 9 hogs, 1 slave. In 1779 he is also listed a having 1 gm [prob. grist mill].

He owned land in the southeastern section of Saddle River. About 1774 he built a house and sawmill near the Van Buskirk Cemetery (the cemetery is located on private property off the East Saddle River Road). Before 1790 David Baldwin acquired about 115-120 acres of land at Pemrepogh (later called Bayonne), which on 13 Sep 1792, he sold to Cornelius Van Buskirk of Saddle River, taking in exchange land Van Buskirk owned at Saddle River. In 1800 Baldwin bought 200 acres from his father-in-law, part of the original Werimus Tract.

He was the master carpenter of the Ramapo Reformed Church in Mahwah, begun on 4 June, 1798.

He probably also worked on the 1801 Dumont (No. Schraalenburgh) Church and the 1806 Wyckoff Church.

On 1 May 1786, Cornelius Haring, John Haring and John Neafie, all of Franklin Township, conveyed to David Baldwin of Harrington Township, for £39, 39 acres in Harrington Township; mentioned division between Thomas Van Boskerk, Jacob Van Horne and Albert Zabriskie; bounded by Abraham Ackerman. Signed by Cornelius Haring, John Haring, John Neafie. Witnessed by John Hopper, John Benson.²

On 6 November 1803 (recorded 24 July 1804, Bergen Co. S:418) Cornelius Bogert of the Township of Harrington, Gentleman, and Elizabeth, his wife, conveyed to David Baldwin of the same place, for \$180, 6 acres being a small parcel in the Township of Harrington, beginning E side of the Public Road with leads near along the E side of Saddle River; N side of the New Road leading to Weremus. Bounded N, E, & S by land of said Cornelius Bogert. Signed Cornelius Bogert, Elisabeth Bogert. Witnessed by James Demarest, Abrm. Westervelt.³

On 26 March 1804 (recorded 24 July 1804, Bergen Co. S:422) Andrew G. Hopper of New Barbadoes Township, Taylor, conveyed to David Baldwin of the Township of Harrington, Carpenter, for \$1,875, 75 acres more or less in the Township of Harrington, beginning N corner of lands of Thomas L. Van Buskirk. Bounded NW by Saddle River; NE by lands of Thomas Van Buskirk; SE by lands of Cornelius Demarest and Caspares Westervelt; SW by said Thomas L. Van Buskirk. Signed by Andrew G. Hopper. Witnessed by Garret Hopper, Abrm. Westervelt.³

On 10 March 17 (recorded 4 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:321) John Van Horn and Abraham Hopper, both of the Township of Harrington, held and bound unto David Baldwin of the same place, carpenter, for £5,000 (in payments) 115 acres upland

and 15 acres meadow, tenement house and tract of land and meadow in the Township of Bergen and now in possession of Cornelius Van Buskirk. Signed by John Van Horn, Abraham Hopper. Witnessed by Peter Van Buskirk, Michael Bayard.³

David Baldwin ran a sawmill on the Saddle River, in what became the Borough of Saddle River, Bergen Co., NJ.¹

On 20 December 1811 (recorded 24 March 1812, Bergen Co. G2:161) Thomas Blanch Junr. of the County of Bergen, and Elizabeth, his wife, conveyed to Thomas Baldwin and David Baldwin Junior, of the same place, for \$3,925., a certain message, house, and land in the Township of Franklin: (1) oldf homestead lot, bounded N by Jacob A. Hopper; W by John A. Hopper; S by public road and lands of Aaron Ackerman; W by the Saddle River. (2) woodland in New Prospect, bounded N by Jacob A. Hopper; E by John A. Hopper; S by John A. Hopper; W by Franklin Turnpike and Henry A. Hopper. Signed by Thomas Blanch Junr. Witnessed by Ephemina Blanch, Gerrit Durie.²

David Baldwin, 65, farmer, and Allice Baldwin, 55, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township, Bergen County, NJ. In the next listed dwelling was the family of David D. Baldwin.

Alice Baldwin, 65, "widow lady" is listed in the 1860 census as living in New Barbadoes Township, with John Steward, 23, black; Jane Steward, 25, black; and Henry Steward, 5, black. They were listed immediately after the family of David D. Baldwin and his wife, Catherine.

In 1857 James Van Riper sold the gristmill (on what is now Paramus Road, in Paramus) and 20.5 acres to David D. Baldwin. Baldwin's father, David, ran a sawmill on the Saddle River in what became the Borough of Saddle River. David D. Baldwin had lived since 1833 in a house across from the mill. By 1870, according to an industrial census, Baldwin was listed as the operator of a sawmill worth \$6,000 and a gristmill worth \$2,000. By the 1870s the mill was operated by Baldwin's son-in-law, Jacob Henry Blauvelt. In 1881, Baldwin transferred the ownership of the mill to his daughter Alice, wife of Jacob Henry Blauvelt.¹

David D. Baldwin, 38, farmer, and Catherine Baldwin, 33, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township, Bergen County, NJ. Living with them were: Levina, 10; Charity, 7; Alice, 4; and John, 2. Also living with them were Ellen E. McCall, 16; and John McCall, 13 (both b. Ireland).

David D. Baldwin, 48, farmer, and his wife, Catherine, 43, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township (Hackensack P.O.), Bergen County, NJ. Listed with them were: Lavina, 19, house help; Charity, 17, house help; Alice, 14, house help; John D., 9; Catherine A., 5; Jane M., 1; and Joseph Broadway, 18, laborer. All were b. Bergen County, NJ.

David Baldwin, 57, farmer, and Catharine, 53, keeping house, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them was John Baldwin, 19, at home. Also living with them (in smae dwelling, but separate family) were Henry Blauvelt, 23, farmer; and Alice Blauvelt, 23, keeping house; Lenor Jackson, Female, 20, black, domestic; and David Johnson, 15, black, farm laborer.

David Baldwin, 44, farmer, b. NJ was listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township (Godwinville P.O.), Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with him were: Mary Baldwin, 24, b. Limerick, Ireland [poss. a wife?]; Rebecca Baldwin, 69, b. NJ [David's mother]; and Harriet Mulligan, 10, b. NJ. In the next listed dwelling lived Joseph Baldwin, 75, gentleman, b. NJ; and Mary [Dering?], 25, b. NJ.

Steven Baldwin was a farmer at Paramus. In 1745 he built the grist and saw mill that later became known as the Red Mill (and the neighborhood took the name of Red Mills) at what is today Fair Lawn (in what was later known as the Arcola section). He sold this mill about 1753 to John Doremus.

Steven Baldwin was a justice or freeholder of Bergen Co. in 1760, 1762, and 1775/6.

"Stephen Baldwin, Esquire, of Paramus, N.J." died intestate and letters of administration were granted 16 Mar 1784 to Abraham W. dePeyster, Esquire, New York, and Christina, his wife, daughter of Stephen Baldwin. His estate was admin. 1 Jan 1783.

Ann Bawldwin (spelled "Bauldwin" in 1779) was listed in the 1778 and 1779 Franklin Township Rateables with 140 acres. ---*children of Steven Baldwin & Antje Zabriskie*:
