The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In what is probably his will, he wrote: ...I, Christopher Bancker, of New York, merchant, being in good health. "I leave my Body to the Earth from which it was taken, there to be decently buried." All debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my son, Evert Bancker, £10, in full satisfaction of all claim which he may have as eldest son and heir at law. All the rest of my estate I leave to my dear and well beloved children, in the following manner, 1/5 to each of my children, Evert, Adrian, Richard, Christopher, and William. All money which I have paid or shall pay to any of my sons, and charged to them in my book, or Ledger, is to be part of their share. My executors may sell all real estate, "except my Vault in the New Dutch Church, which I will shall always be kept for the use of my children and their heirs for ever." The shares of my children who are under age to be put at interest. I make my sons, Evert, Adrian, Richard, and Christopher, executors. Dated February 22, 1752. Witnesses, Anthony Rutgers, Adrian Renaudet, Isaac Roosevelt. Codicil, March 12, 1756.--Confirms the will. I leave to all my children the lands which I have bought since making my will. Witnesses, Leonard Lispernard, Joris Jansen, Jonathan Fish. Proved, May 26, 1763. The surviving executors were then Evert, Adrian, and Richard Bancker. [NOTE.--Christopher Bancker died April 13, 1763, in his 68th year. He was a prominent merchant and magistrate of the city. His residence was the northwest corner of Wall and William streets. He owned much real estate, including a great many lots on the Rutgers farm east of Park Row. Anne Bancker, widow of Christopher Bancker, Jr., married Robert Leake, Esq., Commissary General, September 17, 1764.--W. S. P.]

His house in Albany was on State St, next east of his father's, fourth east of Pearl St. Of Rensselaerswyck Manor. He was a merchant, in Albany, and Indian trader, Justice of the Peace - 1692. In 1692, he furnished the supplies for the Fusileers, in King William's War.

He was the third Mayor of Albany, 1695-6. A Commissioner of Indian Affairs, 1696. Lived in Albany almost his entire life. He retired to his farm in Guilderland during the latter part of his life

In his will, he wrote: I, Evert Bancker, of the manor of Rensselaerwyck, this 30 of March, 1734. I leave to my son Christofell, £5, in right of primogeniture. I leave to my son Johannes, £50, besides what is hereinafter bequeathed, on condition that he continues to live with me according to agreement, until my decease, or until such time as I shall dispose of my farm where I now live. I leave all the rest of my estate to my children, Elizabeth, wife of Gerritt Lansing, Christofell, William, Jannettie, wife of Harmanus Schuyler, Adrian, Gerardus, and Johanes. My executors may sell real estate, and give good title. I make my sons Christofell, William, Adrian, and Gerardus, executors. Witnesses, Anthony Bogardus, John De Peyster, Rutger Bleecker. Proved in Albany, before Myndert Schuyler, Esq., July 31, 1734.

She may have been previously married (to a Van Ness ?). He was a merchant and Indian Trader. He came to New Netherlands in 1651, from Wessum (or Wessen, Wessum), in Limburg Province, near Tongeren and Maastricht, in NE Belgium or SE Netherlands. (or Amsterdam, his brother (some say son) William was a merchant there, as late as 1700) He l. Beverwyck 1657. He came as a merchant's clerk for Gerrit Jansz (Cuyper), at 20 guilders per year.

1681 Agreement of Gerrit Banker, husband of Elisabeth van Eps, Marte Cregier husband of Jannetie Hendriks, both sons-in-law of Maria Dame deceased, and also for Jan van Eps her son at Schenectady, with Hendrick and Gerrit van Ness, attorneys for their father Cornelis van Nes, releasing for 5700 guilders the interest of the surviving husband in his wife's estate, partly annulling the joint 1677 will of Corn: van Ness and Maria Daeme.²

Gerrit Bancker came from Amsterdam, where his brother Willem was a merchant as late as 1700. He was in New Amsterdam before 1655, and two years later in Beverwyck, where he continued to reside till his death, about 1691. His home lot, in Albany was on the south side of Yonker [now State] Street, the third east from Pearl Street, as it then was. When Arent Van Curler began the settlement of Schenectady in 1662, he became one of the original fifteen proprietors. Farms number six on the Bouwland, were allotted to him, and his village lot comprised the northerly quarter of the block, bounded by Washington, Union, Church and State Streets. His son Evert held this property till 1702, when he disposed of it to Isaac Swits.

Gerrit Bancker married Elisabeth, daughter of Dirk Van Eps, and sister of Jan Van Eps, one of the first settlers of Schenectady. After the death of her husband, Mrs. Bancker removed to New York and engaged in trade. She died July 3, 1693, aged 70 years, leaving a large property for thosetimes, to her only son Evert. Besides Evert, who was born in Albany, Jan. 24, 1665, Mr. Bancker had a daughter Anna, who married Johannes De Peyster of New York, Sept. 21, 1688, and perhaps a dau. Maria licenced to marry Cornelis De Peyster, also of New York, Sept. 19, 1694.³

In his will, he wrote: (Dutch). "In den naame Godes, Amen." On the 25 November, 1690, at New Albany, the Honorable Mr. Geritt Bancker, merchant, being of sound mind. I appoint as my universal heir my wife Elizabeth of all my estate both here and in Schenectady and in New York during her life or widowhood. My eldest son shall have £6 before any division, and each of my children shall have an equal proportion of my estate. Each of my married children shall have a dower of 300 Beavers or the value in current silver money, which is a piece of 8 reckoned at 12 guilders sewant (wampum), and those who hereafter marry are to have a similar dowry, and each child is to have his share when of age. I make my son Evert Bancker and Mr. Johannes De Peyster, the husband of my daughter living in New York, the guardians of my minor children. Witnesses, G. Swortt, Jan Onderkerck, J. Becker, Notary. Proved May 7, 1691. Recorded Liber. 3-4, Page 243. Letters of administration upon the estate of Gerritt Bancker and Elizabeth Bancker, are granted to Johannes De Peyster, who married Anne, their daughter, July 24, 1693. Whereas, Geritt Bancker, of New York, lately died intestate, Letters of administration are granted to his

brother, Evert Bancker, of Albany, merchant, November 2, 1702.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...June 9, 1772. I, Nathaniel Banker, of Rumbouts Precinct, in Dutchess County, farmer, being very sick. "I leave to my wife, Anattie, one cow and calf and four Pounds in money." To my son Stephen æ5 for his birthright. "My wife shall remain in full possession with my children till Fall next," and then all the estate to be sold by the executors, and the proceeds paid to my wife and my children, Stephen, Adolph, Mary, Sarah, Elizabeth, and Magdalene. But £30 are to be taken from the portion of Stephen and Mary for what they have had. I leave to my brother's son, Jeremiah, £10, when he is of age. I give to my sons, Stephen and Adolph, my wearing clothes. "My two youngest daughters are to be put out to Christian People by my executors," "and my two gray horses are to be sold for a team." I make my friends, Johanes De Witt, Jr., and Samuel Somer [Soms?], and John Jewell, executors. Witnesses, John Wilde, Henry Clapp, Stephen Thorn. Codicil, June 9, 1772. Confirms the will. I leave to my wife and to my children, Adolph, Elizabeth, and Magdalene, the summer crop now growing. Proved, July 16, 1772, before Henry Vanderburgh, Judge, and Bartholomew Noxan, and Henry Ellis, Justices of Common Pleas.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Richard Bancker, of New York, merchant, being in good health. I leave to my wife Elizabeth the use of all my estate until my daughter Elizabeth is of age or marries. For her support, maintainance, and education. I leave to my daughter Elizabeth when of age or is married £1,000. And I leave to my wife the use of the rest during her life or widowhood. If she marries, she is to have £500. If my daughter dies under age, then all to my wife. If my daughter survives my wife and dies unmarried, then I leave to my sister-in-law, Mary Duyckinck, £500, and the rest to the children of my three brothers, Evert, Adrian, and William (names of children not given). Dated (???) --, 1767. No witnesses. Proved, May 12, 1775, upon oath of Thomas William Moore, of New York, merchant, and of Abraham B. Bancker, "of New York, aged about 20 years." That they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the testator, "and that the said will and the Seal of his Family Arms, affixed, is all of this the said Richard Bancker's own proper handwriting." The widow, Sarah Bancker, was confirmed as executor. [NOTE.--"Mr. Richard Bancker, merchant, of Hanover Square, died of a putrid fever, April 18, 1775, in his 48th year."]

In his will, he wrote: ...I, William Bancker, of Staten Island, being at present of sound mind. I leave to my wife Anna, and to my three children, Catharine, Elizabeth, and Hendrick, and to such children as I shall hereafter have, all my estate real and personal. If all my children should die, then I leave 1/3 to my wife and 2/3 to the children of my brothers, Ernest, Adrian, and Richard Bancker. My children are to be educated till of age. I make my brothers, Evert Bancker, Hendrick Rutgers, Jr., and Richard Bancker, and my wife, executors. Dated November 12, 1770. Witnesses, John Marling, James Duffe, Laurence Roome. Proved, in New York, April 9, 1772. In the probate, all the witnesses are said to be of Dutchess County.
