The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with citations.

There were two apparently distinct families of Beekmans who came to America. One, that of William, settled in New Amsterdam and spelled the name Beekman, and the other, that of Martin Hendricksen, settled in Rensselaerwyck, and spelled the name Beekman. Descendants of both families removed to villages on the lower Hudson, and their respective genealogies became very difficult to trace.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Charles Beekman, of New York, cordwainer, being at present in good health. I leave to my son, Samuel Beekman, £5, in bar to all claim as heir at law. I leave to my wife Eyda the use of all my real and personal estate, during the time she remains my widow, for her better maintainance and support. I leave to my sons, Samuel, Charles, and Adam, all that my tan yard, situate on the north side of Freshwater, in the Out Ward, with all the houses and tan vats; But all the skins and leather are to be part of my estate. I leave to my daughter Eyda £40, if she is unmarried at the time of my wife's decease. I leave to my granddaughter Eyda, daughter of my son Samuel, £20 when married. After the death of my wife, I leave all the rest of my estate to my sons, Samuel, Charles, John, Hendricus, Adam, and Barent, and my daughter Eyda, and I make my sons executors. Dated January 24, 1743. Witnesses, Conrad Ten Eyck, Robert G. Livingston, Simon Johnson. Proved, December 5, 1768.

He died in New York City while on a visit to purchase machinery for a grist mill he was erecting on the Mill Stone River. They lived at Six Mile Run, Somerset Co., NJ. Most of their children were bp. NY.

In his will, dated New York City 6 May 1724, probated 19 June 1724 (A:326 etc.), Christopher Beekman, a resident of the province of East Jersey, bequeaths £500 to son Gerardus; orders executors to sell all real estate, put the money out at interest, the interest to be paid to his wife Maria during her widowhood and until her death, for her and his children's maintenance, after her death the principal to be equally divided among his children and paid to them as they come of age or marry. Children named in will: Gerardus, Adrain, Christopher and Abraham (four sons) and Cornelia, Magdalen, Maria and Catherina (four daughters). Executors: wife, and his two brothers, William and Gerardus. Wit: David Denis, Johannes Van Gelder and Abraham Gouverneur.

6 May 1724, NJ, Christopher Beekman, gentleman; will of. Wife Maria. Children--Gerardus, Adrianus, Christopher, Abraham, Cornelia, Magdalena, Maria and Catharine. Real and personal estate. Executors--the wife, and brothers William and Gerardus Beekman, of N. Y., merchants. Witnesses--David Davis, Johannes van Gelder, Abrah: Gouverneur. Proved 19 Jun 1724.¹

In his will, he directed: Cornelis Beackman, New Utrecht. "Being sicke in his bed, disposes his estate as follows." First, he, the said Cornelis Beackman, and his wife ~~Marihe~~ **Marihe** Cornelis (corrected to Marike Cornelis) "do break and annull their first Contract of Marriage," and do declare that of all they have in this world the said wife shall have one half, and his daughter ~~Mettie~~ (corrected to Mettie) the other half. But if his wife should die before the daughter is twelve years of age, "which God forbid," the testator appoints Lucas Dirckse and John ye Cooper, Jr., to be tutors of said child, they being both inhabitants of New York. Dated March 4, 166 8/9. Witnesses, Jan Tommasen Vandyes, Jacob Lieters. This is the mark [X] of Cornelis Beackman, with his own hand. This is the mark [O] of Marihe Cornelis. Proved April 3, 1669. Translated from the Dutch language into English by me, Thomas Lovell. Inventory taken by John Thommasen and Jacob Lieters. Mentions house and 50 acres of land and meadow at Canarsie. Also a list of debts due to the following persons: Lucas Dickson, Coenraet Ten Eyck, Hendrick Kip, Jr., John Guisberts, Gouvert Lockermans, Mr. Hans, Jan Jansen, Reynier Williamse, Cornelis Clopper, Isaac Bedloe, Laurence Vander Spiegel, Hermanns Wessels, John Tommasen, Rut Joosten.

In his will, he wrote: I, Cornelius Beekman, of New York, merchant, being sick and weak. I leave to my son, Gerard Beekman, 10 shillings in bar of all claim as heir at law. My executors are to sell all real estate and all personal estate, except my best bed and furniture thereto belonging, and so much of my household furniture as to furnish one room, which I give to my wife. The money arising from such sales is to be put at interest by my executors for the support of my wife while she remains my widow and for bringing up my children and the child wherewith my wife is now pregnant. If she should marry, she is to have 1/5, and the rest to my son Gerard and my daughters Catharine and Mary. I make my wife Catharine and my loving mother in law, Catharine Van Horne, and my brothers, Gerard and David Beekman, executors. Dated December 2, 1754. Witnesses, Catharine Beekman, John Jones, Simon Johnson. Proved, May 15, 1755.

In the marriage record, they were: Gerardus Beekman, surgeon, young man from N. York, residing in Midwoudt, and Magdalena Abeel, young lady born in N. Albany, and residing there; with certificate from this place, married there.

He lived at Flatbush at the time of his marriage, she was from Albany. Supporter of Jacob Leisler, Member of his Council, convicted of treason in Leisler affair, sentenced to be hung, but pardoned by William & Mary in 1694. Capt of Militia, Flatbush, 1681. Col of Militia, Justice of the Peace, 1685. Lt. Col Kings County, 1698-1700. Col 1700. Justice of the Quorum, Court of Sessions and Common Pleas, 1688. Colonial Assembly, 1685, Kings Co, 1698-99. President of Provincial Council, 1709-1710 - temporary (acting) Gov of NY (1709-10), member of councils under Cornbury, Hunter and Burnet. Justice, Kings Co, 1685. Judge of Co, 1700. L. at Brooklyn (Flushing) for a while. He was also a merchant in NYC. Owned land at the Raritan, conveyed to son, Hendrick. [Ancestors of FDR]

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. This 10 day of November, 1722. I, Gerard Beekman, of the city of New York, Gentleman, being of sound and perfect memory, Thanks be to Almighty God; and calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this life, do make and declare this to be my last will and Testament. I leave to my eldest son, Christopher Beekman, the sum of £5, in right of primogeniture. I leave all my wearing apparel to be equally shared amongst my five sons. And as for my wife's wearing apparel and other things belonging to her body, she may dispose of them at her own discretion, "so that neither of our apparel, nor my wife's Parapharnelia, shall be taken for any part of my residuary estate." It is my will and intent that all my sons, viz., Christopher, William, Jacobus, Gerardus, and Hendricus, and my three daughters, by name Catharine, Cornelia, and Marytie, be equally sharers of my residuary estate, real and personal. If any of my sons should die before they come of age, or any of my daughters should die before they come of age or are married, their share shall go to the survivors. And because some of my children are of age and have had their education and outset out of my estate, and others of them are not of age, nor have had their education or outset, I leave all the rest of my estate, real and personal, to my well-beloved wife, Magdalena, during her life (if so long she remains my widow). Provided always, that out of the income and profits thereof she shall be obliged to give unto my children, not equally provided for, such suitable education, maintenance and outset, as to make them all equal. If my wife should marry she is to have half of the income, and the other half to my children. I appoint my wife Magdalena, executrix, and my sons, William, Gerardus, and Hendricus, and my son-in-law, Charles Le Roux, overseers. Witnesses, Cornelius Rapalye, Abraham Lefferts, Isaac Ten Eyck, Adrian Bancker. Proved, November 15, 1723.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Gerard Beekman, of New York, being in good health. My executors shall pay to my wife, Catharine Beekman, £400, pursuant to an agreement and bond entered into by me before our marriage; Also the further sum of £70 in full of all claims which she might have on my estate, and she is to release my estate from all her right of dower. I leave to my eldest son Gerard, 10 shillings, and if he decease before me then the said 10 shillings is to be paid to my next eldest son in full for his right of primogeniture. I leave to my sons all my wearing apparell, both linen and woolen, also all silver and gold belonging to my body. All the rest of my estate, both real and personal, I leave to all my children equally. I make my eldest son Gerard, and my brother, William Beekman, and my brother-in-law, David Provoost, executors. The children which are under age to be educated and maintained out of my estate (names not given). My executors may sell all houses and lands. My wife's wearing apparell is to be valued and taken as a part of the £400 to be paid to her. Witnesses, Jeronimus Remsen, Johannes De Graef, Richard Kip. Proved, August 26, 1746.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Catharine Beekman, of New York, widow, being in good health. I direct all debts and funeral charges and legacies to be paid. I leave to my eldest son, William Beekman, £10 in full bar to any claim as heir-at-law. I leave to my son-in-law, Mr. Gerard G. Beekman, merchant, £15 to purchase him a suit of mourning. I leave to Mrs. Catharine Beekman, widow of my son-in-law, Mr. Cornelius Beekman, merchant, £15, to purchase a suit of mourning. I leave to my two daughters, Magdalen, wife of Abraham Lynsen, Jr., merchant, and Effie Beekman, all of my wearing apparell and sheets and table linnen. My negro wench "Phebe" may choose her own master. Whereas I have advanced an outset to my daughter Magdalen, of which I have an account, each of my other children shall have an equal sum before any division.

All the rest of my estate I leave to my four children, William, David, Magdalen, and Effie. I make Abraham Lodge and my four children executors. Dated March 7, 1758. Witnesses, William Provoost, Gerard G. Beekman, Anne Provoost. Proved, August 4, 1763. At that time Anne Provoost was Anne Lefferts.

Johannes M. Beeckman obtained an interest in the Kayaderoseros, or Queensborough, Patent, from the government. He was granted this patent with his partners, Naning Harments (Visscher), Rip Van Dam, Ann Bridges, May Beckley, Peter Fauconnier, Adrian Hooghlandt, John Stevens, John Tatham, and Stephen Broughton, on 2 Nov 1708.

In his will, he wrote: December 16, 1728. I, Johanes Beekman, of Albany, yeoman, "being in perfect health, and of Good, Sound, and Perfect mind." After my decease I leave all my wearing apparell, both linnen and woolen of whatever nature or kind, unto my 5 sons, Johanes, Jacob, Marten, Johanes Hanse, and Henry. I leave to my wife Eva, all my estate, real and personal, for the maintainance of my unmarried children, during her life. The children that shall be unmarried after my decease, and the decease of my wife, shall have their reasonable outfit before any division. After the decease of my wife I leave to my son Johanes £3, for his birth right. To my daughter Susanah, £40. I leave to my five sons each an equal part of all my 1/13 part of a tract of land in company, situate in the County of Albany, and called Kayodorasses, alias Queens Borrough, as by the Patent thereof, dated November 2, 1708. This is to be appraised among my 12 children, and my sons are to pay to each of the other children 1/12 part of the value, after payment of debts. All the rest of my estate I leave to my 12 children, Johanes, Jacob, Martin, Johanes Hanse, Henry, Janettie, Susanna, Helena, Maritie, Johana, Alida, and Neeltie. I appoint my wife Eva, executor. Witnesses, Thomas Williams, Hendrick Minderse Roseboom, Daniel Hogan. Proved, in Albany, before Myndert Schuyler, Esq., December 2, 1732. On 1 Oct 1755, Johannes Jr., and Henry, being the only surviving executors, applied for letters of administration.

In the marriage record, they were: "Wilhelmus Beeckman, j.m. Van Zutphen, en Catalina de Boots, j.d. Van Amsterd."

Willem immigrated to America, May 27, 1647, on the *Princess* with Gov. Peter Stuyvesant. He was a magistrate and officer of the Dutch reformed Church in Holland. He was a Dutch West India Company clerk, a Schepen, 1654, Orphan Master, 1658. One of the Nine Men, 1652. He purchased land at Corlear's Hook from Jacob Corlear and lived there. On Sep 24, 1670 he purchased a farm and brewery (house, brew house, brew kettle and other brewing instruments, with a mill house, horse mill and other buildings, and orchard) from Anna Hall, widow of Thomas Hall, near what is now Beekman St (traverses his property), became known as Beekman's Farm, at the easternmost end of Smiths Valley. Beekman's Swamp was on his land, west of Corlear's Hook. Beekman's Swamp became center for leather tanning. It was near the new City Hall. Beekman's Pond was about Madison Ave and 61 St. In 1674 he owned land between Wall and Franklin Sts, (Smith's Valley), valued at £10,000, one of highest valuations. He was Burgomaster, 1674. He was a member of Leisler's Assembly, 1690. Nine times Mayor of NYC. Sheriff of Esopus under Lovelace, then returned to NYC. Commissary, Burgomaster of New Orange, Schepen - 1674, NYC, Alderman 1678-1682, 1685, 1691-1696. William St in NYC is named after him. He was appointed by Gov Stuyvesant, Secretary and Vice Director of New Amstel (founded by the City of Amsterdam, in 1656, land bought from the Dutch West India Co), on the Delaware, River. Gov of the west side of the Delaware, 1658. Note - later Jacobus and Johannes Roosevelt, would buy the Beekman swamp area (ca. 1728), the beginning of the Roosevelt real estate holdings.¹

In his will, he wrote: 13 December, 1701. I, William Beekman, Sr., of New York, brewer, being of sound and perfect memory. I leave to my son, Henry Beekman, £30 in lands at the orchards or lots. Also what ever land is over and above 60 feet in width that is between the lot of my grandchild, Magdalena Van Vleck, now the present wife of Alexander Baird, and the land of Captain William Morris. Also a house and land in the County of Ulster, which hath been in his possession since the time of his marriage, in consideration of his privilege, as being my first born son and heir at law, which privilege is hereby made void and null. But he is to have the first offer either to buy or hire from the rest of the heirs, if they see cause to sell, my dwelling-house, brew-house, mill, and mill-house, gardens, orchards and other premises. I leave to my grandchild, Magdalena Van Vleck, now wife of Alexander Baird, and to each of my children, one lot of land on the south side of the street where I at present dwell. The first lot to the south side to Gerard Beekman, the second to John Beekman, the third to Magdalena Baird, the fourth to Henry Beekman, and the fifth to William Beekman. Each lot to be 60 feet wide except my son Henry's which is more or less. And in length to the water as deep and long as my right is, and as the old foundation of Isaac Allerton doth demonstrate. And they shall not sell without giving the others the preference. Whereas I have sold to my son John, one small warehouse, which doth stand upon his portion, and where he hath built a dwelling-house, I do acknowledge myself fully satisfied for the same. And whereas I have erected, for the better support of my family, a slaughter-house, and finding no better place for the same than the land I leave to my son John, and he having been at one half the charge of building the same, he is to have the same provided he pay one half the cost of building the slaughter-house, pen or crall, to Magdalena Baird, his sister's daughter, deducting 1/5, together with the allowance of ten feet more of land on the east side of the lot. And it is my will that on the southwest side of the lot of my son John, there shall remain 12 feet for a cartway to the slaughter-house, and for the conveniency of a slip if they make one, and the rest of the land to our bounds shall remain to my son, Gerard Beekman. I leave to our maid Rachel, one lot of ground adjoining to Christopher Ellsworth, 25 feet wide, and 75 feet long, and she shall be free at the age of thirty-one. I leave all the rest of my estate to my four sons, Henry, Gerard, John, and William, and to Magdalena Baird. But my son William shall not have power to sell without consent of the executors. I make my sons executors; and provided my son William shall continue to live and settle here in New York, I give to him, in place of the lot above mentioned, a lot in the orchard, opposite to the lot of Magdalena Baird, being in front to the street 40 feet, and in length 100, provided he gives up the lot next to his brother Henry's. And to the end that no discord may arise in the division of the estate, which the Lord in his mercy hath lent me, my desire is that you receive it from God, with a thankful and contented mind. And I call upon God to bless it to you all, with the same advice that Joseph gave to his brethren, that you fall not out by the way, while you live in the world. I would have you to have faith and a good conscience, for a good name is better than riches. Witnesses, Abraham De Lanoy, Johannes De Peyster, Thomas Adams. Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God to remove my son William Beekman by death, his land is to be divided among the rest, and Magdalena Baird is to have the refusal of the house and lot, if she see cause to buy. October 26, 1702. Witnesses, Bartholomew Vonck, Peter Rycken, Thomas Adams. Proved, November 8, 1708. [NOTE.--The Beekman "Orchard and Pasture," which is divided by the foregoing will, is one of the most important tracts which make up the old city of New York, its boundaries being so well known to all students of New York history, that it is needless to describe them here. The lots, each 60 feet wide, given to the children are on the south side of Pearl street, the lot No. 5 being now Fulton street, formerly called "Beekman's Slip," the other lots being north or east of this in succession. In very early times the land here was owned by Captain William Dyer, and Isaac Allerton built a dock, which at the time of the above will was almost obliterated. The north or east line of the farm was a few feet west of Ferry street.--W. S. P.]²
