The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

On March 7th, 1751, Christopher Scharse and Peter Van Pelt, conveyed to "Johannes Bergen," for £225, a farm at Gowanus, Brooklyn, "bounded S. W'ly and N. E'ly by land of Cornelius Van Duyn; N. W'ly as the river runs; and S. E'ly by land of Garret Cowenhoven, containing 35 acres (Lib.6, p.4, of con., in Kings county register's office)." July 21st, 1756, "Hans Bergen" conveyed the above farm for £227, to his brother Derick Bergen. These premises are in the vicinity of 15th and 16th streets, and designated on Butt's map as land of John Dimon and heirs of Rachel Berry, and as near as can be ascertained were originally in the occupation of Claes Cornelissen Smit, afterwards of Jacob Jacobsen Bergen (who m. Margaret Croesen), who conveyed the same, August 11th, 1746, to Christopher Schass (Scharse) and Peter Van Pelt. This Claes Cornelissen was a wheelwright, and sued his neighbor, Cornelis Lambertsen Cool, in 1638, for the delivery of a horse." From a footnote on the same page [233]: "Christopher Scharse or Schaers, was a son of Johannes Christoffel Schaers and Maria Willemse Bennet, who was a resident of Brooklyn in 1675, in which year his name appears on the assessment roll. Maria Scharse, a sister of Christopher, m. March 22d, 1686, Wouter Tunis Lanen Van Pelt. This farm was bought by Scharse and Van Pelt, Oct. 11th, 1746, of Jacob Bergen and Margaret, his wife."¹

On "August 11th, 1746, Jacob Barreagan, shoemaker, and Margaret, his wife, of Richmond County, quit claim, release, &c., to Jacob Bennet and Cattrenah, his wife, of Gowanus, against all manner of actions, &c. October 11th, 1746, Jacob Bergen and Margaret his wife, convey to Peter Van Pelt and Christopher Schass, a farm at Gowanus, and woodlot No. 43, in the first division, containing 5 acres, the farm being bounded north-westerly by Cornelius Van Duyn; easterly by the Flatbush wood lots; south-westerly by woodlot of Jan Bennet, know as No. 44 . These premises are the same which Johannes Bergen bought March 7th, 1751, of Peter Van Pelt and Christophel Scharse, and which he conveyed to his brother Derick Bergen. They are located in the vicinity of Fifteenth and Sixteenthstreets, and mainly designated on Butt's map as land of John Dimon and heirs of Rachel Berry."¹

In his will, he wrote: ...October 27, 1759. I, Dirck Bergen, of the town of Brookland, in Kings County, yeoman, being very sick. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my wife Deborah the use of all personal estate during her widowhood, or until my eldest daughter Rachel is of age, for the support of my children, "And my wife Deborah shall take so much money as will build a Convenient House and Barn and other Nassearie buildings on my farm for her and my children to live in, with the ap- prabation of my executors, until the expiration of the said term." I then bequeath all my real estate "unto the child my wife now goes with if it be born a son," And he is to pay to my executors the money that the above buildings cost; But if it be a daughter, then I leave all my estate to my wife and my daughters, Rachel, Jacamyntie, Triesse, and my said child. I make my wife and my 2 brothers, Johanes and Tunis Bergen, and my brother in law, Peter Cortelyou, executors. Witnesses, Henry Van Beuren, Michael Bergen, Simon Boerum. Proved in New York, May 17, 1760.

In his will, he wrote: I, Gerritt Van Bergen, of Catskill, in Albany County. My funeral charges and all just debts to be paid by executors, and all debts due to me are to be gathered in. I leave to my eldest son, Martin Gerritszen Van Bergen, the fall lying on the Catskill creek, a little below the land of Casparus Bronck, deceased, That is, all my right in the same, And this I bequeath to him in right of his primogeniture as being my eldest son, Also all that certain farm where I now dwell, situate and being at Catskill, with all the buildings thereon erected, Also 1/2 of all my right and title to all the lands commonly known by the name of the Shingle Kill, Also 1/2 of my share of the mills and improvements thereon erected, Also all my right and title to 1/2 of all the undivided lands in the bounds of the Catskill Patent, excepting some privileges, which I leave to my other children, Also a certain lot of ground situate on the north side of Catskill creek, commonly called Lot No. 7, Also my negro man "Anthony," and my negro man called "Jack," also my negro wench called "Gin," and my negro boy "John Taps." I leave to my son, William Van Bergen, all that my farm and Plantation lying in the Manor of Rensselaerwyck, on the west side of

Hudsons river, and now in the tenure of the children of my mother, Neeltie Dow, with all the appurtenances, also including an Island, commonly called the *Plaat*, lying opposite to said farm, Also my 1/3 part of the grist mill situate at Katerskill, and all the wood lands and all the low lands thereto belonging, with all my right to anything thereto belonging, Also 1/2 of all my right and title to a certain tract or parcel of land called the *Shingle Kill*, and 1/2 my share of the mills thereon erected, Also 1/2 of my right in the undivided lands in the *Catskill Patent*, reserving some privileges herein mentioned, Also my negro men "Peter" and "Joseph." I leave to my daughter Deborah, wife of John Peers, my 1/2 of a certain tract of land commonly called the *Ryters Wey*, lying in the County of Albany, on the back of the Church Pasture, Also a negro boy "Will." I leave to my daughter Ann, wife of Wilhelmus Van Bergen, all my right to a certain "tract of land called *Keskatomachy*," Also a negro wench called "Sarah." I leave to my daughter Neeltie, wife of David Abeel, Jr., all the lands now in the tenure of Nicholas Brandow, Wilhelmus Oosterhout, and Peter Sax, situate at Katerskill, Also a negro girl "Sarah," Also a lot of ground situate on the north side of *Catskill creek*, nearly opposite to the homestead of Benjamin Dubois, with all the appurtenances. I leave to my two sons, Martin Gerritse Van Bergen and William Van Bergen, all my right to a certain tract of land called by the name of *Batavia*, lying behind the *Catskill Hills*. I leave to my grand daughter, Annake Bronck, daughter of Casparus Bronck, deceased, all my right and title in *Corlers Kill Patent*, except what I have given by deed to my daughter Deborah, but if she dies without issue, then to my children, I also give her my negro girl called "Aungall," Also another lot of land situate in the *Catskill Patent*, lying by the land of Casparus Bronck, and so northerly along the *Coxackie road* to the north end of the *Gladde Klip*, and from thence westerly to the *High Hills*, and so along the said *Hills* southerly to the land of Casparus Bronck. But if she dies without issue, then to all my children. I leave to my two sons all the rest of my personal estate. My executors are to pay or cause to be paid to the Rev. Johannes Schuneman and Martin Van Bergen, Esq., the sum of £18 for the use of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church at *Cattskill*, according to the Articles made by the Synod held at *Dordrecht* in the year 1718 and 1719. I leave to my two sons all that my certain *Brew house*, with kettles and other utensils. I leave to my 5 children the liberty of taking stone out of any of my undivided lands in the *Catskill Patent*, with free egress and regress to the same. I hereby devise and grant to my 5 children all my right to all mines or minerals in the *Catskill Patent*, and to my grand daughter, Anake Bronck, an equal share. I make my two sons executors. Dated July 25, 1758. Witnesses, Wessell Van Dyck, Joseph Nisbit, Henry Oothoudt. Proved, February 5, 1759, in Albany.¹

[NOTE.--Gerritt Van Bergen was one of the three sons of Martin Gerritse Van Bergen, who was the owner of half of the *Catskill Patent*. The other half belonged to the *Salisburys*, as will be seen by the will of Francis Salisbury in this volume. The house of Gerritt Van Bergen stood on the left-hand side of the road from *Leeds* to *Katerskill*, three-quarters of a mile from the stone bridge at the former place. It was built in 1729, and was destroyed in 1862. His eldest son, Marten Gerritsen Van Bergen, was an unthrifty man, soon fell in debt, and in 1771 sold his estate to John Leenderts Bronck, of *Coxackie*. The *Corlaers Kill Patent* is a tract of land next south of the village of *Athens*. *Keskatomache*, now called *Kiskatom*, is a tract of 370 acres "lying under the *Blue Hills*," and patented in 1718 to Colonel Henry Beekman. It was next to the *Catskill Patent*, and was disputed land. *Glade Klip* (or smooth rock) is near *Green Lake*, in the town of *Athens*. Marten Gerrits Van Bergen left three daughters, Catharine, wife of William Van Bergen (her cousin), Neeltje, wife of Henry Oothoudt, and Anna Maria, wife of Rev. Johannes Schuneman. For a more extended account of this family and its location the reader is referred to the *History of Greene County*, and the very carefully prepared sketch of the town of *Catskill* by the late lamented Henry Brace.--W. S. P.]¹

"April 13th, 1732, Jacob Hansen Bergen, and Elsjie, his wife, for £1,350, conveyed to Hans Bergen, their son, "200 A. in Brookland, bounded easterly by land of Jores Bergen and the Mill Creek to the River; southwesterly by said River; northwesterly by land and meadow of "Aeltje Sebering; northeasterly by land of Rem Remsen and Jores Bergen, excepting a certain piece of meadows formerly sold to Michiel Hanalle; and further a certain piece of meadow of Aeltje Sebering aforesaid, south by a certain creek, southerly by the Graver's Kill so called, and northwesterly by the river. Also two lots of woodland in the second division of Brookland woodlands, containing 10 A. each, (No. 60 and 61.)" The conveyance sets forth that he and his wife, "by and with consent of all their children, by name, Frederick Bergen, Jacob Bergen, Junr., Johannes Sleght,

and Catrina, his wife, Gisbert Bogaert Junr., and Marretje, his wife, Jan Croesen, and Breckje, his wife, Hendrick Croessen, and Elsje, his wife, Derick Croesen, and Cornelia, his wife, testified by their being parties to the ensembling and delivery hereof, &c.," which children joined in the conveyance. In 1738, Jacob Hansen Bergen's name appears on the census of Brooklyn, his family consisting of one white male above ten years, one white female above ten, one black male under ten, and this is the last record of his being alive."¹

To my daughter Cornelia, 3 cows and £12, and my best feather bed and furniture for one room complete, and 1/2 of my late wife's apparell. As to my houses and lands in Richmond County, I positively order my executors to sell the same, and the money to be paid to my son Jacob, and my daughters, Elsie, wife of Johanes Van Wagenen, and Cornelia. I leave all my wearing apparell to my son Jacob. I make my son Jacob and my daughter Elsie and her husband, and my brother-in-law, Cornelius Krosse, and Daniel Corson, executors. Witnesses, John Vandeventer, Stephen Martino, Cornelius Vandeventer. Proved, December 13, 1750.

In his will, he wrote: ...September 10, 1766. I, Jacob Bergen, of Brookland, in Kings County, farmer. I leave all my estate, real and personal, in Brookland or Brookhaven, in Suffolk County, to my well-beloved wife Antie during her widowhood. After her marriage or death, I leave to my grandson, Rutger Van Brunt, all the said lands, provided he pays £1,600. Out of this he is to pay to the executors of John Hallock £1,125, for the farm which I bought of them in Brookhaven, and £12 yearly to his mother, my daughter Sarah, now the wife of Thomas Roberson [Robinson]. I leave all that my messuage and tract of land in Brookhaven, which I bought of the executors of John Hallock, to my grandson, Jacob Van Brunt, provided he pays£725; And he is to pay æ12 yearly to his mother, my daughter Sarah, now the wife of Thomas Robinson. I leave to my

grandson, Thomas Robinson, £400 when of age. I leave to my granddaughter, Ann Robinson, £400 when 21. I leave to my granddaughter, Sarah Robinson, £400 when 21. I leave to my two grandsons, Rutgert and Jacob Van Brunt, the piece of woodland in Brookhaven which I bought of Thomas Robinson, lying between the lands of Joseph Davis and Noah Hallock. After the death or marriage of my wife, I leave all my personal estate to them. If any of my negro slaves of either sex shall not behave themselves well, or are disobedient to their mistress, the executors are to sell them. All the legacies mentioned are to be paid by my two sons. I make my wife, and my brother-in-law, Michael Bergen, and my cousin, John Van Horne, and my friend, Johanes Bergen, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Brower, William Brower, Jr., Simon Boerum. Proved, April 25, 1767.

Sarah Jorisse Rapalje stated in her petition of 4 April 1656 to the governor and council that she was a widow, burdened with seven children. She had eight children with Hans Hanszen Bergen, so seven would not be correct unless one had died prior to April 1656.

On March 7th, 1751, Christopher Scharse and Peter Van Pelt, conveyed to "Johannes Bergen," for £225, a farm at Gowanus, Brooklyn, "bounded S. W'ly and N. E'ly by land of Cornelius Van Duyn; N. W'ly as the river runs; and S. E'ly by land of Garret Cowenhoven, containing 35 acres (Lib.6, p.4, of con., in Kings county register's office)." July 21st, 1756, "Hans Bergen" conveyed the above farm for £227, to his brother Derick Bergen. These premises are in the vicinity of 15th and 16th streets, and designated on Butt's map as land of John Dimon and heirs of Rachel Berry, and as near as can be ascertained were originally in the occupation of Claes Cornelissen Smit, afterwards of Jacob Jacobsen Bergen (who m. Margaret Croesen), who conveyed the same, August 11th, 1746, to Christopher Schass (Scharse) and Peter Van Pelt. This Claes Cornelissen was a wheelwright, and sued his neighbor, Cornelis Lambertsen Cool, in 1638, for the delivery of a horse." From a footnote on the same page [233]: "Christopher Scharse or Schaers, was a son of Johannes Christoffel Schaers and

Maria Willemse Bennet, who was a resident of Brooklyn in 1675, in which year his name appears on the assessment roll. Maria Scharse, a sister of Christopher, m. March 22d, 1686, Wouter Tunis Lanen Van Pelt. This farm was bought by Scharse and Van Pelt, Oct. 11th, 1746, of Jacob Bergen and Margaret, his wife."¹

On "August 11th, 1746, Jacob Barregan, shoemaker, and Margaret, his wife, of Richmond County, quit claim, release, &c., to Jacob Bennet and Cattrenah, his wife, of Gowanus, against all manner of actions, &c. October 11th, 1746, Jacob Bergen and Margaret his wife, convey to Peter Van Pelt and Christopher Schass, a farm at Gowanus, and woodlot No. 43, in the first division, containing 5 acres, the farm being bounded north-westerly by Cornelius Van Duyn; easterly by the Flatbush wood lots; south-westerly by woodlot of Jan Bennet, know as No. 44. These premises are the same which Johannes Bergen bought March 7th, 1751, of Peter Van Pelt and Christophel Scharse, and which he conveyed to his brother Derick Bergen. They are located in the vicinity of Fifteenth and Sixteenthstreets, and mainly designated on Butt's map as land of John Dimon and heirs of Rachel Berry."¹
