The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Cornelis Jansen Berrian, from Alckmaer, N. Holland, was probably a Huguenot whose parents had fled from Berrian in the Department of Finisterre, in France. He was settled in Flatbush as early as 1669. In 1685 he moved to Newtown, Queens Co., NY, where during the previous year, he and his brother-in-law, Abm. Brinckerhoff, had bought over 400 acres of land at the head of Flushing Bay, which they afterward divided.

The will of Cornelius Johnson Berrien of Newtown was dated 12 Dec 1687, probated 21 May 1691. In it he mentions wife Johannah; children (not named except for son John); youngest child to be maintained until of age.

In 1727 Cornelius Berrian bought from Timothy Wood the island since called Berrian's Island.

In his will he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Cornelius Berrian, of Newtown, in Queens County, being indisposed in body. I leave to my wife Sarah the use of all household furniture, and 2 cows, and part of the house and garden, and £70, and a bed. I leave to my son John 10 shillings "on behalf of his birthright." I leave to my son Cornelius all my real estate, with the deeds and writings thereto belonging, and he is to pay to my wife Sarah £7 yearly, and furnish firewood, pasture, and fodder for two cows; And he is also to pay £700, after my wife's death, in four instalments, to be divided among my children. I leave to my daughters, Phebe and Ruth, each £60 13s. 4d. All the rest I leave to my sons, John, Samuel, Richard, Nicholas, Cornelius, Peter, and Jacob. I make my sons, John, Richard, Samuel, and Cornelius, executors. Dated March 23, 1767. Witnesses, Daniel Rapalje, Jr., Henry Ricker, Jesse Warner. Proved, June 1, 1767.¹

Cornelius remained in Newtown and in 1740 bought the paternal farm. He served as a civil magistrate.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Cornelius Berrian, of Newtown, in Queens County, being very weak. I leave to my son Cornelius £100, and my executors may sell property for the same. My executors are to keep £300 in their hands for the use of my wife Amy as long as she remains my widow, but if she marries, then she is to have £50. All the rest of my estate is left to my 7 children, Cornelius, John, Peter, Elizabeth, Amy, Yanatie, and Catryntie. I make my wife, and my son Cornelius, and my well esteemed brother in law, Nathaniel Fish, executors. Dated December 25, 1757. Witnesses, Benjamin Cornish, Timothy Cornish, William Van Wyck. Proved, February 4, 1758. [In the Probate the testator is called Cornelius Berrien, Jr.]

The birth and baptism of Daniel Berrien, son of John Berrien and Elinor his wife, was also recorded by the NYC Society of Friends.²

In the marriage record they were: Zyn van ons in den Huwelyken Staat bevestigd, Daniel Berrien, Scheeps Timmerman [ship carpenter?], en Meriam Wilson, beyde van (from) Nieuw York.

Daniel Berrien, Shipwright, died 10 Sep 1795 of yellow fever; his place of residence at the time of his death was No. 319 Water Street, NYC.¹

“Daniel Berrien, New York City, ship carpenter” died intestate and on 13 November 1795, his widow, Mariam, of New York City, was granted Letters of Administration on his estate.

In October 1809 Jesse Sneeden and Sarah, his wife, presented a petition to Common Pleas Court of New York City to make partition of premises, setting forth that Daniel Berrien of New York City, shipwright, deceased, at the time of his death was lawfully seized of estate in fee simple of lot of land in 2nd Ward (late Montgomery Ward) bounded as follows to wit: southward by land front upon Cliff St., northwardly by land formerly of Col. Henry Beekman dec'd and lately John Palmer; westwardly by land formerly of Eleanor Berrian and eastwardly by land formerly of Col. Henry Beekman and lately Henry Denmark, containing in front in Cliff St. and in rear 40 feet and in depth on each side 24 feet. And upon death of said Daniel Berrien said lot descended to said Sarah Sneeden and to Daniel Berrien the younger, John Berrien, Margaret Berrian, now wife of James Corkney, Deborah Berrian, now wife of William Brass and William Berrian, the children and heirs of Daniel the elder as tenants in common in equal parts. (The lot was sold 14 March 1810 to Henry Newport of New York City³).

John Macpherson Berrien moved with his parents to Savanna, GA in 1782. He graduated from Princeton College in 1796 and studied law in Savannah. He was admitted to the bar and began practice in Louisville, then the capital of Georgia, in 1799; returned to Savannah; elected solicitor of the eastern judicial circuit of Georgia in 1809; judge of the same circuit from 1810 until January 30, 1821, when he resigned; captain of the Georgia Hussars, a Savannah volunteer company, in the War of 1812. He was a member of the State senate 1822-1823; elected as a Jacksonian to the United States Senate and served from March 4, 1825, until March 9, 1829; resigned to accept the position of Attorney General in the Cabinet of President Andrew Jackson and served from March 9, 1829, until June 22, 1831, when he resigned. He resumed the practice of law; again elected, as a Whig, to the United States Senate and served from March 4, 1841, until May 1845, when he again resigned to accept an appointment to the supreme court of Georgia; again elected in 1845 to the United States Senate to fill the vacancy caused by his second resignation; reelected in 1846 and served from November 13, 1845, until May 28, 1852, when he resigned for the third time; chairman, Committee on Judiciary (Twentieth, Twenty-sixth, and Twenty-seventh Congresses); president of the American Party convention at Milledgeville in 1855. (Congressional Biography)

I appoint my brother, Nicholas Berrien, and my brother-in-law, Samuel Fish, executors. Dated October 31, 1727. Witnesses, James Hazzard, Thomas Hazzard, Thomas Fish. Proved, April 18, 1737.²
