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The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In 1634, he was the Captain of the carvel St Martyn, (or the Hope) which accompanied the new Director, van Twiller to New Amsterdam. He also brought Govert Loockermans and Jacob van Kouwenhoven to America, and also probably Dom. Everardus Bogardus. He was a skipper, engaged in trade with the Swedes on the Schuykill and South Rivers as early as 1643. In 1645, he voyaged to Rhode Island. In 1646, he was ordered to leave by a Swedish officer, under threat of confiscation of his ship and cargo. Ground brief, Manhattan, Apr 15, 1647. His was house # 3, Block G (South of the Fort), of the Castello Plan, bought May 26, 1649, one of 2 houses (east half of lot) on the lot formerly owned by Jacob Jacobsen Roy, purchased from Marritie Jans, widow of Dirck Cornelissen, next to that of Annetje Jans Bogardus. His widow, married dau, and a son still lived there, in 1686. He had a defective grant for No. 11, (or lot 6) Block J (now No. 18 Pearl St), and he lost the suit brought by Gillis Pietersen, who claimed that he had previously bought the lot. He was granted a Small Burgher Right for New Amsterdam Apr 17, 1657. He took the oath of allegiance to the British in 1664. He was a goldsmith and silversmith in NYC. He did work for the Van Cortlandts, Livingstons, Beekmans, etc. which can be seen at Winterthur, Yale University, Museum of the City of NY, Tarrytown DRC. Tryntje Claeszen had m. (1) Barent Simonsen, and had a son Simon Barentsen. Members, NYDRC, 1686, 1. Pearl St, between State and Whitehall.¹

In her will, she wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Catharine Blank, widow of Jurian Blank, being under bodily indisposition. "I leave to my son, Symon Barentsen, 30 shillings, in full for all pretence he may have to my estate, real and personal; he having been sufficiently provided for, during the life of my husband, Jurian Blanck; having received one half of a sloop, a wedding dinner, 2 wedding suits, a cloak, a fine red broad cloth waist coat, with silver thread buttons, one half dozen fine Holland shirts, one half dozen striped Calico neck cloths, an oyen brigg feather bed, two new blankets, and had his diett, for two years after he was married." "And whereas my eldest son, Jurian Blanck, in consideration of £3, 12s. and a Bible by me to him given, hath released all claim to my estate, except such part as I have bequeathed to him," I leave all my estate to be divided into seven equal parts and leave thus to my children, viz.: Jurian and Nicholas Blanck, Elsie, widow of Albert Busch, Antie, widow of George Brewerton, Catalyna, wife of Frans Boon, Cleasie, wife of Victor Bickers, and the children of my deceased daughter Margaret, wife of Philip Smith, deceased, viz.: Philip, Margaret, Caetje and Mary. And whereas my son, Nicholas Blanck, being moved with compassion for the children of his sister Margaret, hath paid for their maintenance and necessaries the sum of £106, 9s. 11d. besides other charges he has suffered as administrator of Philip Smith, deceased. If the children do not repay him then their share is to be sold to repay him. Makes her sons, Jurian and Nicholas Blanck, and Frans Boon, Victor Birker [Bicker?], Elsie Blanck, Edward Busch, Caetje Blanck, and Abraham Brewerton, executors. Dated September 1, 1698. (Not witnessed.)²

In 1676, lived with Mary Badye, her mother, in Brooklyn (formerly the farm of Abraham Schermerhoorn at Gowanus). They had, in 1676 Census, 2 horses, 1 cow, 6 morgans of land at Middlewout, Kings Co. 1683, 1 poll, 1 horse, 2 cows, Breukelen. Goldsmith, New York City, ca. 1666-1699 (or 1668-1714). A two-handled cup, made by him for a Van Cortlandt marriage is in the collection at Winterthur. House on Broadway, First NYC Directory. Members, NYDRC, 1686. May 16, 1698, Freeman, NYC.

Nicholas Blanck was elected constable of the West Ward in 1687 and 1689. He was a member of Jacob Leisler's council in 1690 and was indicted in March 1691. However, he was cleared in Oct 1691 and was again elected constable of the West Ward in 1694. As Nicholas Blanck, shoemaker, he was made a freeman of New York City on 30 Aug 1698, and in 1700 he was ensign of a militia company there.¹

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Nicholas Blank, cordwainer, of the city of New York, being weak in body. I leave to my son Jacob Blank, a piece of land lying and being at the Fresh Water, with all my right and interest in the same, which is made use of for a Tan vat. I also leave him £25. I leave to my daughters, Cornelia and Katherine, each £25. I leave to "the child my wife now goes withal," if it shall live, £25. I make my wife Gertruy sole executor, and leave to her all the rest of my estate, houses and lands, always provided, that the children's portions be secured, when the house is sold. I make my trusty and well beloved friends Mr. Robert Blackwell, of Mannings island, and Justus Bosch, of New York, overseers of this my will, their expenses to be allowed "and a piece of 8 to buy them gloves." Dated August 17, 1700. Witnesses, Isaac Schever, Evert Van Hoel, Robert Blackwell. Proved before Lord Cornbury, March 19, 1703.

On 4 Feb 1716/7 Gerrit Windel, tailor, and Cornelia his wife, and John Stephens, wagoner, and Catherine his wife, the two wives being the "only Children and Coheirs of said Nicholas Blanck, deceased," conveyed land in New York City that had belonged to Nicholas Blanck.¹
