

## -- BLOM, BLOOM --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: October 18, 1760. I, Abraham Bloom, of the New Lots, in the township of Flatbush on Nassau Island, yeoman, being sick. In the first place it is my will and I do order that all my estate, both real and personal which I have in Kings County, and Orange County, or elsewhere, be sold by my executors, "except so much of my linnen and household, and kitchen furniture as my wife Gertruyd shall choose to keep house with." All money from the sale I give to my wife until the time of the marriage of my granddaughter, Catrintie Snedeker, for the support of my wife and granddaughter. When my granddaughter marries, she is to have half, and my wife the other half. If my granddaughter should die under age, then her share is to go to my 3 brothers, Garritt, George, and Isaac. I make my wife and my brother Isaac, and my brother-in-law, John Boerum, executors. Witnesses, Nicholas Wyncoop, Stephanus Ryder, Gerritt Boerum. Proved, December 13, 1760.

I leave to my eldest son, Frederick Bloom, £3, in full of his pretence of being heir-at-law. All the rest of my estate to my wife during her life, and then to my children (not named). I make my wife Hester, executor, and Jacob Cornelison, Joost Symonson, and Lawrence Wessells, assistants. Witnesses, James Harding, Daniel Winard, William Huddleston. Proved, October 27, 1709.

In the marriage record they were: Barent Janszen, j.m. Van Stockholm, en Syntie Pieters, j.d. als voren.

He was from Ockholm, Sleswick, Denmark. He was, about 1636-37, overseer of Wouter Van Twiller's farm on what came to be called "Great Barent's Island" (later Ward's Island). He settled in Brooklyn, and in 1652 bought a farm near the Wallabout.

Barent "died from a stab wound in the side given by Albert Cornelius Wantenaer on 5 Jun 1685. As Albert set up the plea of self-defense, the court of Assize, at his trial on 2 Oct 1665, convicted him of only manslaughter. He "was then and there burnt in the hand, according to law;" the further penalties, which were the loss of his property and a year's imprisonment, being remitted by the governor." (Riker, pg. 128).

On May 16, 1732 (probably recorded 1753, Orange Co., NY) Grantor: Barrat Bloom, Flushing to Johannes Wisner, yeoman, Goshen, 60 pounds; 150 acres situated township of Goshen. Borders north Nathaniel Roe, South Barent Bloom West John Van Horne and undivided and E undivided. Witness: Abraham Bloom, John McEvery. (then Johannes Wisner sell it to King (his son in law), Wit Joseph Southerland and Joseah Reeder 1738.<sup>1</sup>

In his will he wrote: I Barent Blom, of Flushing, in Queens County, yeoman, being in health. I leave to my wife, Famettie Blom, the use of houses and lands, and estate in Flushing, and the use of all personal estate, so long as she remains my widow." He names his grand sons, Gerritt, John, Abraham, George and Isaac, and leaves them "my house and lands in Orange County. Also all houses and lands in Flushing after the death of my wife. Also the movable estate." He names his sons: John, Abraham, George, Jacob and Gerrit. The will was written on August 29, 1726 with witnesses, Gabriel Luff, Edward Jones, Adam Lawrence, Joseph Luff. Later, a codicil was added: "Codicil. Whereas I have purchased lands in Jamaica, in Queens County, and at Flatbush, and the New Lotts, so called, in Kings County; and whereas my son John is dead without issue, I give all the said lands to my four surviving sons." The codicil was written on April 3, 1733 with witnesses, Cornelius Hoogland, Ellert Hoogland, Joseph Smith and proved on March 29, 1735.

In the record of their marriage intentions, they were: Fredrick Arentsz, Van Swartensluys, en Grietje Pieters, Van Breda. Frederick Arents Bloem, ancestor of the Bloom family in New York City, was from Swarte Sluis, in Overijssel. He came via Amsterdam in 1654, to work for Laurens Andries Van Buskirk. Frederick was a turner, often was called "De Drayer."

Margaritje Pieters, h. v. Frederick Arentsz, was listed in the 1686 Dominie Selyns list of members of the NYC Ref Ch. She was living on Beurs Straet, ["Exchange Place"] (later Whitehall Street). Listed after her were: Jacob Teller, en syn huysvr. Christina Wessels; Jacob de Key, en syn huysvr. Hillegond Theunis; Sara Bedlo, h. v. Claes Borger; Pieter de Riemer, en syn huysvr. Susanna de Foreest; etc.<sup>1</sup>

I leave to my wife Cornelia my brown chest and brown table, and bedstead. I leave to my daughter Phebe my cupboard. John Blom of New Lots in Flatbush (husband of Sarah Voorhees) wrote his will on 20 Jan 1732 when he was "weak in body". In his will he mentioned his two daughters -- "Femmittie and Antie." In his will, he wrote: ...January 20, 1731/2. I, John Blom, of the New Lots, in the town of Flatbush, in Kings County, beingg weak in body. I leave to my wife Sarah, and to my children, Femmittie and Antie, my whole estate, "but if it shall please God to give my wife another child, then it is to have an equal share." My executors are to give to my beloved father, Arent Blom, a sufficient deed of conveyance for my real estate which I have in Kings County, provided he gives bonds to pay to my wife and children ?550 in five installments. I make my father-in-law, Cornelius Voorhis, and my brother-in-law, Koert Voorhis, and my brother, Adam Blom, and my uncle, Willem Van Boersum, executors. In his will, he wrote: The seventh day of August, 1780. In the name of God, Amen. I, Nicholas Bloom, of Bedford, Kings County, yeoman, being very sick. I give all the remainder of my estate, real and personal, unto my wife Mattie, and all my children, so long as my wife and children shall be able to maintain, keep good, and make satisfaction to all my present creditors. If my wife and children should neglect or not be able to make full satisfaction to all my creditors, or if my wife shall remarry, or after her death, then my executors are to sell and dispose of all my estate, for my wife and children, and the monies thence arising to be divided amongst my wife and children in manner following: Unto my eldest son Barrent, £10, for his birth-right; also, unto my wife an outset of household furniture, or, in lieu thereof, £50, also, the remainder of my estate or monies, which was not given herebefore, unto my wife and all my children, Barrent, Peter, Jacob, and Phebe, to be equally divided.
