The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

A Board family may have lived, about 1717 at "the Raritans," where about that year, Catharina Bord, who m. about 1737 Thades Van Winkle, was born.

A Board Family Burying Ground was located at Boardville, Passaic County. This burying ground was one of four removed by the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission from the site of the new Wanaque Reservoir. The remains and headstones were removed, in May 1922, to the Pompton Reformed Church Yard. Gravestone records from this cemetery were published Jan 1927 in the *Genealogical Magazine of New Jersey*, p. 107.

Charles Board was a Judge of Court of Common Pleas, 1822 and 1832; General in the New Jersey State Militia; Member of the New Jersey Legislature 13 years in succession.

Charles Board, 77, farmer, was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Pompton Township, Passaic County, NJ. Listed living with him were: Mary Board, 40; Phebe Board, 37; Elizabeth Board, 28; Chas. J. Johnson, 26, farmer; Joanna Johnson, 32; Henry P. Johnson, 2/12; Abram Haycock, 24, laborer; William Hosey?, 20, laborer; and Bridget Gasen, 18.

His will admitted to probate Jan. 22, 1859, at Paterson, Passaic Co., NJ. He lived at Boardville, NJ.

He came from Sussex, England (or Wales), with his wife Elizabeth and two sons, James and David, in 1730, to discover copper mines for Lord Sterling, and settled first at Bloomfield, Essex Co., N. J., and later at Boardville, Pompton Township, Passaic County, N. J. He was a civil engineer and surveyor.

Cornelius Board, a Welsh miner, was brought from England by Alexander Lord Sterling to see if he could find any copper deposits in the Ramapo Mountains. Instead Board, in 1730, discovered iron deposits at Ringwood and erected a small furnace on Sterling Pond. The place of this find of iron ore he named Stirling after his patron, and he built there a forge in the year 1730 to 1736. The first iron made in that part of the country was made by Cornelius Board, and it is absolutely certain that this first Stirling Forge was the beginning of the works that later made iron for cannon and balls used during the Revolution; also for the great chain stretched across the Hudson at West Point.

On 17th of August, 1732, he bought 150 acres of land 'at the little falls of Pisaack'. James Alexander, Surveyor General. He later lived at Pompton. He also bought in 1737 several tracts along the Wanaque and Ringwood rivers, evidently for the iron in them and for water power. He sold in 1740, to Ringwood Company--the Ogdens of Newark--16 acres at Ringwood for £63. (Cornelius Board and Elizabeth, his wife, gave a deed April 15, 1740, to Josiah Ogden and others of 16 acres at Ringwood. Witness, James Board.)

On 10 January 1755 James Bourd of Ringwood, conveyed to Elizabeth Bourd of same place, for £0.25, 37 acres...willed to said James Bourd (eldest son) by Cornelius Bourd. Wit: David Bourd, Joseph Woolcox.¹

On 9 Dec 1772 James Bourd of Ringwood, conveyed to Joseph Bourd of same place, for £6, willed to said James Bourd by Cornelius Bourd, who purchased of James Alexander. Wit: David Bourd, Mary Bourd (her mark).¹

In his will, dated 29 Jan 1744/5, Bergen Co., NJ, Cornelius Board, yeoman; instructed Trustees to sell lands in Essex and Morris, purchased of Wm. Davenport, and all land "above the small tract that I formerly sold to the Oggdins, called the 'Falls in the County of Bergen.' " Wife, Elizabeth. Eldest son, James, and his heirs, the home-plantation at Ringwood, on the west side of Long Pond River; likewise small tract lying between said place and Philip Pico, on east side of said River. Son, David, and his heirs, that part of my plantation in the Fork of the Long Pond River and the eastermost part of the Iron Works, or Furnace River. Son, Joseph, and his heirs. Daughters--Elizabeth, Shusanah, Sarah and Martha. 1747, Oct. 1. Administration granted to James Board, eldest son, as Joseph Board, Executor named, was 10 years old and Elizabeth, the widow, had renounced her right. Fellow bondsmen--Joseph Bartram, of Ringwood, Jonathan Davis, of Newark, Essex Co. Executor--son, Joseph. Trustees--Jonathan Davis and Joseph Bartram. Witnesses--Robert Sturgeon, Joseph Bartram, Gerrit Fitzgarril. Proved 15 Sept., 1747. Witnesses--David Ogden, Uzal Ogden. 1747, Sept. 27, (filed 11 Dec. 1760). Cornelius (signed Col's) Board and Cornelius Board Jr, both of the Township of Franklin in the County of Bergen... [bound to]... William Livingston... Governor... 500 pounds... 27 Aug 1785.... He was a soldier in Bergen County, N. J. Regt. in Rev. War. He, with his brother James, removed soon after the Revolutionary War to Chester (then Goshen), Orange County, N. Y., and purchased some 300 acres of land in Sugar Loaf Valley, upon which Cornelius resided the remainder of his life. He was one of the incorporators of the Goshen and Munroe Turnpike Company, 1823-4.¹

Cornelius D. Board was a Private in the NJ Militia and Continental Line He filed for a Revolutionary War Pension No. R974. In Genesee Co., NY Common Pleas Court, 10 Jun 1834, Cornelius D. Board, age 70, resident of Warsaw, Genesee Co., NY; b. 28 Jan 1764 Saddle River Twp., Bergen Co., NJ, "my brother, who lives in NJ, has a record of my birth. In 1790 I moved to Fairlawn, Rutland Co., VT, then to Castletown, same Co. In May 1811 moved to Olean, Cattaraugus Co., NY; in Apr 1816 moved to Rushford, Allegheny Co., NY; in spring of 1823 moved to Centerville, same Co; in Sep 1831 moved to present place. Served under Lt. John Nafee, in the Bergen Co., NJ Militia, was involved mostly with some South Carolina troops, in the recapture, at Smith's Clove, NY, of some arms and household goods that were stolen by the Cowboys (British soldiers) from Bergen Co., NJ; involved in the recapture of some Negroes and horses, in the Ramapo Mts, that were taken from Ringwood by the Cowboys. While on sentry duty, arrested John Robison, who escaped from the Morristown jail. I also served in a Continental Line regiment we called "the Hairy Corps." I was at a camp in Hackensack called "the sign of the three Pigeons" where John Berry, called "Jack the Regular," one of the Cowboys, who had boasted that he had killed 48 people, was killed himself.... In 1778 I was one of only 28 soldiers in Captn. Joseph Board's company, among whom were some Negroes.....the reason being that most of the inhabitants of Saddle River Twp. were in the British (Tories) interest.... I know Gen. Knox, Col's Barber, Ogden and DeHart, Maj. Cummings and Captn.DeHart all of the Jersey Line... who can testify as to my war service."

David Board was a Major and Paymaster in a New Jersey Militia Regiment in the Revolutionary War.

Deed given in 1788 to David Board by Thomas Machen and Elizabeth, his wife, of Ulster County, N. Y. He owned lands in Miami, Ohio.

He left, by will, a large estate. Will dated April 30, 1798; proved Feb. 15, 1799, in Bergen County, mentions wife Mary and children Nathaniel, Cornelius, David, Joseph, James and Eleanor (wife of Peter Dey). He was chosen member of Committee of Correspondence and Observation, Sept. 21, 1775. Member of Assembly, 1776 and 1786 (or 1778-91).

James Board came to America in 1730, with his father Cornelius and brothers David and Joseph, and settled in Ringwood, Passaic Co., N. J. They were managers of the iron-works at that place. James Board's house was the welcome and hospitable stopping-place for officers and soldiers of the Continental army during the Revolutionary War.

James Board had Letters of Administration from Jonathan Belcher, Esq., Captain-General and Governor-in-chief in and over His Majesty's Province of New Jersey, on his father's will during the minority of his brother, Joseph Board, at that time, 1747, a minor of the age of ten years.

"James Board, of Bergen Co., gives deed May 28, 1750, to Philip Tyce." (Records in office of Secretary of State at Trenton, N. J.).

He signed an article including an "Abjuration of the Papacy" May 23, 1755.

On 9 Dec 1772 James Bourd of Ringwood, conveyed to Joseph Bourd of same place, for £6, willed to said James Bourd by Cornelius Bourd, who purchased of James Alexander. Wit: David Bourd, Mary Bourd (her mark).¹

All that certain Messuage, Tenement House, and tract in Bergen County, beginning at the Hackensack River and N from land of said Abraham Bartolf. Boudaries: orchard of Hendrick Banta; Tien Neck Road; David Lozier's land; W by Hackensack River; S by Hendrick Banta; E Tien Neck Road; N Derick Banta. Land confiscated in term of 6 January 1779 in Court of Common Pleas held at Pompton in and for the said County of Bergen; judgment against Jost and Edward Earle, late of Hackensack as they did on or about 15 January 1777 join the army of the King of Great Britain. Signed Hendericus Kuyper, James Board, Gerret Lydecker. Witnessed by John Dey, Phillip Board. [Land prob. in what is today Englewood Township.]

His will dated Sept. 18, 1803; proved Dec. 13, 1803. mentioned children, Philip, Cornelius (heirs of son James). Executors, son Cornelius, friends, William Colfax and Adrian Post.
