The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Jean Boudin, descended from the celebrated French economist, Jean Bodin, was b. at Medis, France, and m. there Esther Bridon. He d. on Staten Island in 1695. Sons were Jean, Eleazor and Francis. The Somerset Co., NJ line of Bodines comes through son Francis.

The following seems to combine two Jean Bodines: Jean Bodine was a French Huguenot on Staten Island, (vide, Baird's Hug. Em., Vol. II, p. 38-9). The First Settler there and in New Jersey was Jean Bodine, called "Jean Boudin, fugitiv de Medit." He was b. in France, at the Village of Medis, near the southern shore of Saintonge, along the Gironde, and was naturalized in London, Oct. 14, 1681, along with his second wife, Esther Bridon, (dau. of Francis Bridon, vide, ante, Part Four, p. 590). He d. on S. I. as early as 1695, leaving a dau., Marianne, and a son, Jean. (N. Y. Hist. Coll. 1892, Vol. 1, Wills, pp. 249 and 260.)

Jean Bodine, of the Cambray family in France, is said to have removed to Medis, in the province of St. Onge, France, where his son Jean was born in 1645. He was doubtless a Huguenot and left his native land to seek a refuge in other countries. It is thought that he went to Holland, and, after a short stay, went to England before coming to America. He came to New York as early as 1677, for on November 3rd of that year, he witnessed with Maria Creison at the Reformed Dutch Church, the baptism of Jan, son of Andries Canon by his wife Janetje Pluck. Bodine settled on Staten Island, New York, where he had a survey of land, April 1, 1686, and where he died in the latter part of 1694. Paulus Richards was appointed to administer his estate, March 4, 1695, and before the final settlement, the son, Jean Bodine, appeared as defendant in a suit against his father's estate.<sup>1</sup>

On June 19, 1701, John Bodine bought 80 acres of land on the west side of Staten Island at Charles Neck in Richmond County (Richmond Co. Deeds, B, p. 402). This is the earliest record that we have of this John Bodine. At the time, he was a resident of Middlesex County, Province of East New Jersey.<sup>2</sup>

Jan Bodin, Maria Creison, witnessed the baptism 3 Nov 1677 NYC Ref Ch, of Jan, son of Andries Canon & Jannetje Plück.

John Bodein, late of Richmond County, lately died intestate, Letters of administration are granted to Paul Richards as principal creditor, March 4, 1694/5.

He was b. in France, at the Village of Medis, near the southern shore of Saintonge, along the Gironde, and was naturalized in London, Oct. 14, 1681, along with his second wife, Esther Bridon, (dau. of Francis Bridon, vide, ante, Part Four, p. 590). He d. on S. I. as early as 1695, leaving a dau., Marianne, and a son, Jean. (N. Y. Hist. Coll. 1892, Vol. 1, Wills, pp. 249 and 260.)

Jean (or John), son of Jean Bodine, was born at Medis, France, near the south shore of St. Onge, on the Gironde, May 8, 1645, and he was naturalized at London, England, March 21, 1682, with his second wife Esther, her parents, Francis and Jane Susan Bridon, and their son Francis Bridon. Many French Huguenots were naturalized about this time in England. For a short time he resided in Rye, county Sussex, where at least two of his children were born. He joined his father on Staten Island and was living there when his father died in 1695. He bought land in Middlesex county, New Jersey, and he went thither, possibly with the intention of settling there. He bought eighty acres of land, May 12, 1701, in Middlesex county, East Jersey, on the west side of Staten Island, at Charles Neck. He bought eighty acres more of Francis Bridon, May 8, 1722, and the heirs of Francis Bridon deeded other lands to him, February 2, 1736. He was living March 7, 1736, when he and wife Esther deeded lands. He married (first) (???) Crocheron, daughter of John Crocheron, one of the immigrants at Staten Island, who by will, dated December 13, 1695, described himself as "of great age," and bequeathed his estate to wife Mary, sons Nicholas and Anthony and other children. Nicholas Crocheron's will dated February 10, 1702, gave bequests to his nephews and nieces, children of John Bodine by his first wife. Jean Bodine married (second) probably in England, Esther Bridon, daughter of Francis Bridon, who was naturalized in London and came to New York, where he died in May, 1704.

In their marriage record, they were: Jean Bodin, young man from near Bethune in Artois, with Maria Crosseron, young lady from near Ryssel in Flanders; both residing on Staten Island, with testimony of the bride's two brothers and Piere Verite, all present.

They lived on Staten Island south of Fresh Kill near the Poillons.<sup>1</sup>

Vincent Bodine was a sailor. In 1720, he was captain of the sloop, "Mary," which left the port of New York for St. Christopher's, July 25, 1720. The trip back to New York took twenty-two days. On his arrival, he stated that a day or two before leaving St. Christopher's "a pyrate ship of twenty guns and one hundred and seventy men commanded by a Welshman, and a Sloop of --- Guns came into Buckstarr Road in that Island and Burnt one Ship, set fire to a second and Carried out a third with them. That they sent word to the Governor of Sandy Point that they would Come and Burn the town about his ears for hanging the Pyrates there" (The American Weekly Mercury, Thursday, October 27, 1720). In 1721, he was captain of the sloop *Three Brothers* which was bound for Suriname.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Vincent Boden, of New York, mariner, being in good health. My executors are to pay all debts and funeral expenses, And I leave all my estate, real and personal, to my wife Elisye, and make her executor. June 30, 1735. Witnesses, Charles Beekman, Charles Beekman, Jr., Simon Johnson. Proved, May 10, 1744.

In her will, she wrote: I, Hyla Bodine, widow of Vincent Bodine, of New York, mariner, being sick. I leave to my grand daughter, Mary Bodine, 5 shillings before any division, she being my eldest son's daughter. I leave to my grand daughter [I think this is suppose to be daughter] Hester, wife of Cornelius Brower, of New York, baker, all my personal estate (except one feather bed, which I bequeath to my son Vincent) on condition that my son-in-law, Cornelius Brower shall recover his lawful right to the land now in the possession of the Trinity Church of England in New York, within 12 months. All the rest of my estate is to be sold by my executors, and after paying debts, I leave 1/3 to my grand daughter, Mary Bodine, daughter of my son John, deceased, and 1/3 to Hester, wife of Cornelius Brower, and 1/3 to Hester Brower and my son Vincent Bodine. I appoint my friends, John Stephens and James Wright, executors. Dated March 8, 1750. Witnesses, Evert Byvanck, Luke Kierstede, John Bogert, Jr. Proved, June 6, 1750
