The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Bocholt is a town in Westphalia near the Dutch frontier.

Jan Buckhout came from Leyden, Holland with his wife and five children aged 12, 9, 8, 4, and 1 year, on the same ship on (leaving Amsterdam Oct. 12, 1662), "De Purmerlander Kerck" (The Purmerland Church) with Claes Jansen Van Heyningen, Isaac Vermilye, and many others, and settled in Harlem, N. Y. He was soon engaged as the "koeherder van gemente desen stede," (The herder of the cattle) of New Amsterdam. We find that on April 15, 1667, the herd numbered 80 head. Jan Buckhout later owned a farm at Mespat.<sup>1</sup>

As Jan de Nosper, he was arrested on March 20, 1664 upon complaint of the Fiscal for resisting an officer who had attempted to arrest him for shooting pigeons on the Sabbath. On the same day is noted the commitment of Jan Boeckholt de Nosper on the above charge. He prayed forgiveness for having violated the Sabbath for shooting pigeons on that day pleading ignorance of the law. He was sentenced to pay a fine of 12 guilders and costs.<sup>3</sup>

In his will, dated 23 Aug 1692, probated 23 May 1695 (Queens County Wills, Liber A, of Deeds, Jamaica, L.I., N.Y.), John Bockhout, of Mespat Kille, weaver, mentioned son Matties, son Peter, daus. Trincke, Alkie, Mary; wife Hannah. Wife executrix. Wits: William Hallett, Andrew Bird, & Robert Blackwell.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Johanes Bockhout, of Rombouts Precinct, in Duchess County, being weak in body, August 20, 1770. "All my onnest debts are to be paid." All the rest of my estate I leave to my four sons and four daughters in manner following: I leave to my oldest son Peter for his Birth right £5, "and then to divide equally with his three Broderon, that is to say, my three sons, John, Jacobus, and Abraham." But out of this is to be paid to my four daughters as followeth: "To my daughter Hester with the outset I gin her when she was maryed with the vally to be made up to £50." "And also to Mary with what I gin her when she was maryed to be made up to £50." And to my two daughters, Margaret and Nancy, each £50. I make my friends, John Cook, merchant in Rumbout Precinct, and Joseph Thurston, of the same place, executors, "and for their Pains to be Reasonable Rewarded." Witnesses, Thomas Johnson, Samuel Barker. Proved, February 11, 1771. The executors resigned, and Administration granted to Isaac Vail, Jr., principal creditor.

In his will dated 20 Jan 1774, probated 28 April 1785, confirmed 14 May 1785, he wrote: ...I, John Bockhout, of the Manor of Philipsburgh, Westchester County, in perfect health. I leave to my well-beloved wife, Debura Bockhout, all she brought at marriage and also one horse, two cows and five sheep "during my widow" and the third part of "all my hous to be divided between my weddow and my granson, John Jewel." To both the above "my fishing net to there one use and benifeet of the famely." To wife £40, and my "negro winch Hanna to whyt on her." And after her death or remarriage to go to one of my children "which she lieks beest." To grandson, John Jewel, two "horssees or mairs, feet to worck, and gears and plow, tackelen to work and one cow forever." Remainder of moveable estate to be divided into three parts, one third part to my children and grandchildren, viz.: Matice Bockhout, Jacob Bockhout, Mary, wife of Jacob Van Wert; Anna, wife of Conrat Sedore; Elizabeth, wife of William Jewel; one and all my grandchildren (not named) to draw equal share of their father or mother. Remaining two thirds of estate to be again divided in three parts, one third to go to wife Deborah, and two thirds to be divided between children and grandchildren. To grandson, John Jewel, "my Improvements with the consent of Col. Fredrick now Lord of said Mannor," said John Jewel to give my widow a maintenance and after her death or marriage to give and divide £100 between my children and grandchildren. Executors, sons, Matice and Jacob, friend, William Davids, Witnesses, Edward Couenhoven, James Hamman, John Van Tessel. Proved, Westchester County, April 28, 1785. Confirmed, New York, May 14, 1785.<sup>1</sup>
