The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

[Bogert] Van Der Bogaert, Harman Meyndersen

Harmen Myndertszen Van der Bogaert came to New Amsterdam in the ship *Endraght* 24 May 1630 as a surgeon of the ship, having sailed from Texel on the 21st of March previous.

Before Harman Van Der Bogaert married Jellisje (in 1639), he wrote an early will "wishing to anticipate the uncertainty of death . . . inasmuch as he is at present about to go on a West India voyage, declared it to be his will and deliberate intention that Jelisje, daughter of Clases JANSEN of Ziericksee [a city on the island of Schouwen, Zeeland]. his, the testator's future wife, shall after his death. . . have power to dispose of all their goods . . .¹

In late 1647 [Adriaen] van der Donck may have assisted Stuyvesant. Harmen van den Bogaert, the one time barber-surgeon who thirteen years earlier had made the first daring journey westward deep into Iroquois country, had been an active member of the colony ever since. He had married, and fathered four children, had purchased an interest in a privateer called *La Garce*, which he then accompanied on a raiding voyage to the Caribbean, then served as supply master to the company, first in New Amsterdam and then at Ft. Orange. He had also been involved in the affairs of the murdered wheelwright Claes Swits, to whom he had apparently been related.²

In addition to all of this, van den Bogaert had a secret, which he kept as quiet as possible since its discovery would almost certainly lead to a sentence of death. He had a fondness for men.²

In the Calvinist Dutch colony, as in the Puritan English colonies, homosexuality was a crime on a par with murder.

Van den Bogaert thought he had found a discreet outlet in the person of his young black servant Tobias; we have no idea how Tobias felt about the relationship, but somehow the two were caught in flagrante. Van den Bogaert fled. In 1647 New Netherland, however, there were few places to hide. You couldn't exactly lose yourself in a crowd, everyone knew everyone else. He might have tried to stow himself on a ship, if one were departing, but upon discovery, he would have been shipped back for punishment. Instead, he went back to the one place he knew of where few Europeans had been- into Mohawk country, retracing his journey of years earlier. It was autumn now, not winter, so the going would have been less difficult, but he was alone this time, traveling across dozens of miles of virgin woodland without a guide.²

He made it to one of the villages that had befriended him years before, and presumably was welcomed by the inhabitants. Meanwhile Nicholas Coorn, who had taken over from Adriaen van der Donck as the law man of the independent fiefdom of Rensselaerswyck, did a bit of Sherlock Holmes-style reasoning, and sent a woodsman named Hans Vos off westward through the same forests on what may have been America's first bounty hunting expedition. In a sequence foreshadowing the Wild West of two hundred years later, Vos cornered van den Bogaert in an Iroquois longhouse used to store grain and a shoot-out commenced. Van den Bogaert, once the hero of the colony, but now laid low by his sexual proclivities, attempted a distraction by setting fire to the place. Vos caught his man anyway, and brought him back to Fort Orange. Coorn then wrote Stuyvesant, informing him of the event, and asking what should be done with the man.²

Stuyvesant wrote back that he himself would stand in judgment at van den Bogaert's trial, but not until spring, when the ice on the northern stretches of the river had broken and ships could get through. Before that, however, van den Bogaert, certain of Stuyvesant's judgment, and desperate beyond reckoning, escaped from the prison in the fort. As he ran across the frozen expanse of the river, he fell through the ice and was drowned. So ended the life of the barber-surgeon turned explorer.² The Indians petitioned Stuyvesant for reparations for the loss of their longhouse and their stores which it contained, and van den Bogaert's property was sold to pay for what Stuyvesant decided was a just debt of the company to the Indians. Adriaen van der Donck ended up with van den Bogaert's interest in the privateer *La Garce*.²

In a notarial document Jellisje was identified as "being full aunt of the late Claes Cornelissz Swits and Isaack Cornelisz Swits, young men aged 20. . ." grandsons of Claes Corneliszen Swits, immigrant. The grandson, Claes Cornelissz, was also killed in a dispute in 1664 that occurred in Schenectady.¹

Bogart was Assistant Deputy Quartermaster-General under Colonel Morgan Lewis, and a member of the Committee of Safety, was appointed by Congress Commissioner of Stores and Provisions in 1775, and by General Washington Inspector of Revenues of the Port of Albany in 1791. He was an alderman in 1767 and city surveyor.

But if I have a child, then these legacies to be void. All the rest I leave to my father, Cornelius Bogart, and my brother, Cornelius Bogart, and my brother, Nicholas C. Bogart. I make my father, Cornelius Bogart, and my brother, Nicholas C. Bogart, executors. Dated February 1, 1774. Witnesses, Robert Ray, Ralph Thurman, Benjamin Curtis. Proved, June 3, 1774.

Jacobus Laroe sold his Ramapo land on 25 March 1765 to Isaac Bogert. Bogert bought it for his son, Jacobus Isaac Bogert. On 11 May 1784, Jacobus Isaac Bogert sold the land to Cornelius Haring, who had apparently rented the home before his purchase.

On 25 March 1765, Mary Laroe (widow of Hendrick Laroe, deceased) of Ramapo, Saddle River Precinct, conveyed to Isaac Bogart, yeoman, of Campeau [Gampgaw] of Saddle River Precinct...bounded by Jacobus C. Bertholf and John Laroe...one fourth of land in will of Hendrick Laroe (16 June 1753), surveyed by George Ryerson. Witnessed by Johannes Laroe, Henry Van Gelder.¹

On 2 August 1740, Garret Van Ale, of Saddle River, conveyed to Roelif Cor Van Houten, miller, of the same place, for £65, land purchased by Gisbert Van Blerkum, John Bogart and John Bardan, all of Bergen County, from Andrew Johnston and William Skinner, both of Perth Amboy...said John Bogart being introduced by his two brothers Steven and Isaac Bogart...said Isaac Bogart exchanged with Peter Van Ale who sold to Henry Van Ale and the said Garret Van Ale. Signed Garret Van Ale (his mark). Witnessed by Isaac Vander Beck, Paulus Vander Beck, William Provoost.³

An Isaac Boogaert was mentioned in a Bergen County Road Return dated 23 Sep 1743, which was recorded at his request. Landmarks mentioned in the Return were the mill of Roelof Van Houten, land of Coenraad Stor, land of Johannes Pillesfelt, land of Barent Van Horne, land of Abraham Volck, meeting with Ramapogh Road.²

On 12 December 1769, Isaac Bogert, of Campgaw, conveyed to John Van Allen, for £350, 139 acres minus 19 acres...in Saddle River Precinct, bounded by William Hopper and Hendrick Laroe, deceased...purchased from William Kingsland, sheriff of Bergen County, who sold the lands of Johannes Laroe to satisfy a judgement of Abraham Gouverneur. Signed by Isaac Bogert. Witnessed by Hessel Doremus, Guilliam Bertholf.³

On 13 September 1779 (recorded 16 May 1805, Bergen Co. U:180) John Van Alen of Ramapough, yeoman, conveyed to Andrew W. Hopper of the same place, for £3800, 139 acres excepting 18 acres formerly sold by Johannes Laroe to Isaac Bogert 12 Dec 1769, being a house and tract at Ramapough in the Township of Franklin, the same being 1/4 part of land lately belonging to Hendrick Laroe, deceased. Bounded N by Jacobus G. Bogert; S by said Andrew Hopper; E & W by land belonging to the Proprietors of New Jersey. Signed by John Van Allen (his mark). Witnessed by Jacobus Bogert, Crynes Bartolf.

An Isaac Bogert built, before 1767, the house located at what is today the corner of Campgaw Rd. and Pulis Avenue in the Fardale section of Mahwah, Bergen Co., NJ.

Bergen County Roads, Book A, p. 10, June 29, 1737:

The surveyors do alter a two rod road which was laid in the year 1733, Nov. 22nd, as follows: Beginning from the house of Johann Pillesfelt as the road now goes to the house of Isaac Boogaert; from thence as the road now goes to the line of Peter Fauconnier and Johannes Tysse's land; thence along said line till it comes to a small meadow; thence north with a small turn as the trees are mark till it comes to the said line again and so along the line to the end of the lott of Johannes Tysse; thence as the road now goes to the line of Gerrit van Blerkum to a black oak tree to the corner of his fence; thence from said tree to a black oak stump standing in his clear land; thence on a straight to where he has planted apple trees; thence south-westerly along his apple trees by the east side of his house as the Road now goes to the north side of Jhn Van Blerkum's house along the two rocks; thence on a west line to the Old Road; thence as the Road now goes to the south side of the house of Peter Tibow's; from thence as the road now goes till it comes to the King's Road from Ramapog.

"On 29 March 1753 Magdalene Valleau was induced to execute a release to the East Jersey Proprietors of her interest in the Ramapo Tract upon receipt of a deed from the Proprietors to her 900 acres at Campgaw. These 900 acres Mrs. Valleau afterwards sold in parcels to Dirch and John Tiebout, John Pulisvelt, John Billfield, Isaac Bogert, William Winter, Barent Van Horn, and Harmoan Nax, all of whom settled on it." — Braun, Maria S., *Franklin Lakes: Its History and Heritage*, Cedar Grove: Phillips-Campbell, 1965, p. 10, citing Harvey, *Gen. Hist. Hudson & Bergen Counties*.

Isaac Bogert operated a tidal grist mill on the east bank of the Hackensack River in what is now Ridgefield Park from 1751 until 1762.

Isaac Bogert came to the area of what is now First Avenue & Mill Street in Westwood, Bergen Co., NJ about 1765, and purchased (on 26 Mar 1765 from John Merselis) an established grist mill, homestead farm, and other lands, which were inherited by his son Albert. Albert was operating the mill by 1779, when he was taxed for the mill and 75 acres of improved land and six horned cattle. During the Revolution, Gen. George Washington and his troops stopped at the mill for refreshment on the way from Tappan to Paramus 7 Oct 1780, after the execution of Major Andre.

On 1 May 1762, Isaac & Leya Bogart, miller, of Bergen County, conveyed to Simon Simson, of Staten Island, NY, for £580, grist mill and 4 acres...line of Hendrick Brinkerhof, deceased, and Benjamin Westervelt. Signed Isaac Bogart, Leya Bogart (her mark). Witnessed by Gyllejaem Bogart and Guilliam Bertholf.¹

In their marriage record they were a y.m. and y.d., both of Schraalenburgh.

Isaac's grandfather, Isaac Bogert came to the area of what is now First Avenue & Mill Street in Westwood, Bergen Co., NJ about 1765, and purchased an established grist mill, homestead farm, and other lands, which were inherited by his son Albert. During the Revolution, Gen. George Washington and his troops stopped at the mill for refreshment on the way from Tappan to Paramus 7 Oct 1780, after the execution of Major Andre.

Isaac A. Bogert inherited the family land and business of his father in 1833.

The mill business was continued by descendants and the last building was destroyed by fire in 1910. It stood across the road from the homestead by the Musquapsink Brook, a site long known as Bogert's Pond. The homestead was replaced about 1852 by the house now at #2 First Avenue.

Isaac D. Bogert inherited the Westwood, Bergen Co., NJ grist mill property and homestead of his father. During his ownership, the mill was on occasion rented and operated by others. At one time Joseph C. Hasbrouck rented the building for making barrels. Sometime during 1910 the mill burned.

He served in the Civil War and then formed, with his brother-in-law, Benjamin Z. Van Emburgh, the firm of Van Emburgh & Bogert, dealing in groceries, dry goods, lumber and coal in a building erected at the southeast corner of present-day Broadway and Westwood Avenue in Westwood, the first store in town.

Isaac D. Bogert held many local positions, including that of Postmaster of Westwood (for 22 years) and was the first Mayor of the Borough of Westwood in 1894.

He had no children.

I leave to my two daughters, Catharine and Helena, each £40, to be paid 12 months after the decease of me and my wife, And I leave to each 1/4 of all the bog or unimproved land which shall be found to be my property, and they are to pay their share of the cost of recovering said lands. My wife may sell any part of the orchard joining to my house, except what is given to my eldest son Myndert, if it is necessary to pay debts, and she is to live in my house while she is my widow. I make my two sons, Myndert and Jacobus, executors. Witnesses, William Welling, Elizabeth Noxon, Bartholemew Noxon. On 2 August 1740, Garret Van Ale, of Saddle River, conveyed to Roelif Cor Van Houten, miller, of the same place, for £65, land purchased by Gisbert Van Blerkum, John Bogart and John Bardan, all of Bergen County, from Andrew Johnston and William Skinner, both of Perth Amboy...said John Bogart being introduced by his two brothers Steven and Isaac Bogart...said Isaac Bogart exchanged with Peter Van Ale who sold to Henry Van Ale and the said Garret Van Ale. Signed Garret Van Ale (his mark). Witnessed by Isaac Vander Beck, Paulus Vander Beck, William Provoost.¹

In his will (abstracted in NJA), dated 4 Aug 1760, probated 25 Nov 1760, "John Bougaert, of Pearemis," Bergen Co., mentions wife Antie; oldest son Jacobus; children Abram, Cobes, Steven, Willimptie, Angenietie, Nitie; daughter's child, Cornelia Hoppe. Executors named were Roelof Westervelt and Luykes Bougaert. Real and personal estate was mentioned. Witnesses were Allebartis Terhujin, William S. Van Emburgh, Abraham Terhujin.

Maria Pratt Hopper discovered that the original will of John Bongaert at Trenton is similar though it would seem Cobus and Nitie were nicknames for Jacobus and Angenietie. Zabriskie, she said, undoubtedly used the abstracted version of David Hopper's will, wherein it states, "Daughter, Cornelia (wife of Jacobus A. Bogert), the debt I owe her." This may have been interpreted by Zabriskie as referring to her illegitimacy. However, upon examination of a copy of the original will at the Bergen County Court House, (and later the original at Trenton) the will stated: "First, the sum of thirteen pounds, ten shillings and three, which I owe my daughter Cornelia, the wife of Jacobus A. Bogert, and all my other debts ... be paid." Clearly then the debt he owed his daughter was actually money he had borrowed from her, (or part of a legacy due to her), and not in payment for her condition of birth.

Peter W. Bogert is listed as a "spring maker" in the 1850 census. Living in 1850 in Hohokus Township with Peter W. and Phebe Jane Bogert and Catharine Bogert, 1/12 were Theodore Baily, 18, spring maker; James Anderson, 14; and Elsey Van Winkle, 86.

Living with them at the time of the 1860 census is Abraham Holdrum, 46, laborer.

He was named as deceased in January 27, 1868 school meeting minutes. Motion was to build a school house on the lands

of Peter Bogert, deceased, where his blacksmith shop formerly stood.¹

In his will, probated Bergen Co., dated 10 March 1863, proved 27 July 1863, names wife, Phebe Jane, refers to children as "the boys" and "the girls" and provides for "the girl, Elizabeth, that lives with us now" to have the same share "as my own daughters do." He also wrote: I, Peter W. Bogart of Township of Hohokus, County of Bergen...authorized executors to pay just debts, sell real estate including a lot of 14 acres more or less, bounded E by John Blauvelt, S by Henry Pulis, W & N by James N. Bogert); also woodlot in Campgaw Mountains bounded N by lands of Sally Ann Ward, W by lands of Abraham Hammond, S by lands of Peter Ward. He appointed wife Phebe Jane executrix and Levi Hopper executor. Dated 10 March 1863. Witnessed by Marten T.? Myers, Thomas Myers Jr. An inventory of his estate was made 10 July 1863 by Phebe Jane Bogert, Executrix, Martin J. Myers and William Ward, two disinterested freeholders. The estate (household goods & furnishings) was valued at \$282.50.²

Phoebe Jane and her children were living with her parents, William and Sarah Ann Ward, in Hohokus Township (Fardale/Campgaw section of Mahwah, near Wyckoff) at the time of the 1865 New Jersey State Census: William Ward, Sarah Ann Ward, Catherine Ward, Rachel Ward, Peter Ward, Mary Ward, Emma Ward, Jemima Ward, Phebe Jane Ward, Kate Ward, Emma Bogert, Ida Bogert, Ward Bogert, and Eliot Bogert.

Phebe Bogart, 50, widow, Farmer, was listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in [the Campgaw section of] Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Living with her were her unmarried children: Emma M., 25, teaching school; Ward Bogart, 23; and Eleyot Bogert, 21.

Anna Hopper Bogert was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, with \$75,000 worth of real es-

tate.

States Bogert was a witness to the following deed: on 2 July 1803 (recorded 12 March 1804, Bergen Co. R:394) Richard Morris of the County of West Chester, State of New York, Esquire, conveyed to Andrew Hopper of the Township of Franklin, for \$211.33, a tract of 126-80/100 acres strict measure, being one equal undivided sixth part of a tract in the Ramapock Track designated on a map by Lot No. 123, beginning on the line of John Barbarie's six hundred acre tract, being corner Lot 122. Signed by Ri^d Morris. Witnessed by States Bogert.³

His will was dated 23 June 1845, probated 13 June 1850 (5105b, Bergen County NJ). In it, he wrote: I, States Bogert of the township of Franklin in the county of Bergen in the State of New Jersey...I do give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anne ...real and personal (estate)...unto my grandson Andrew H Hagerman, the farm I bought of Gilleam Hopper...180 acres, also the house and lot at the forks of Campgaw road..2 acres; unto my granddaughter Maria Louisa Hagerman, daughter of my daughter Anna, the wife of Henry B Hagerman, 22 acres which I bought of Peter Lozier, 18 acres which I bought of William J Hopper, appoint beloved wife, Anne, and grandson Andrew H Hagerman and friend David J Christie executors. Signed by States Bogert, 23 June 1845.²

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen, June 22, 1767. I, Teunis Bogert, of Brookland, in Kings County. "Desiring that every person herein concerned may be fully contented and satisfied, and raise no Contention." My executors are to pay all debts and funeral expenses. I leave to my eldest son, Guisbert Bogert, £5, before any division, and my silver hilted sword and cane, for his birth right. I leave to my daughter Antie £200 and a bed, and furniture thereto belonging, also her mother's cupboard, and a Looking Glass which hangs in my large room, also my new Tea kettle, and a cow. I leave to my daughter Maria, wife of Evert Sudam [Suydam], £200. I leave to my grandchildren, the children of my daughter Janattie, deceased, £200, when of age. I leave to my grandchildren, the children of my son Townsend, £200. I leave to my sons, Guisbert, Adrian, Abraham, and Cornelius, each a feather bed. To my sons, Adrian and Cornelius, all my utensils of husbandry. I leave all my household furniture to all my children. I leave to my sons, Adrian and Cornelius, all my farm and real estate, and they

are to pay 1,200. The farm to be divided as follows: Beginning by the river and running in a straight line to a mulberry tree in my orchard, then running east to a fence standing on the east side of my orchard, then southeast along the same, to the corner of my orchard, and then east, so as to divide the whole equally. And my son Cornelius is to have the south part, and he is also to have 1/2 of all my meadow ground in Boswick, and he shall pay £540. My son Adrian shall have the north part, and 1/2 of my meadow ground in Boswick, and he shall pay £660. All the rest of my estate to my 5 sons. I make my sons, Isaac and Adrian, and my friends, Jeremiah Remsen and Volkert Rapalye, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Remsen, Michael Vandervoort, Simon Boerum. Proved, April 27, 1768.

I leave to my wife all household goods, and my silver Chocolate ladle, marked H. V. H., And 2 silver Chocolate spoons, one marked H. B. and the other W. B. H. I leave to my son William all my wearing apparell, and my large English Bible, and a bed, gold ring, gun, Cartouch box, and 3 silver Chocolate spoons marked W. B. H. I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Bogert, my best bed, Looking Glass, and the wearing apparell that belonged to her mother, And 2 pair of gold sleeve buttons, 2 gold rings, and 3 silver Chocolate spoons, marked W. B. A. The things that belonged to my [present] wife when I married her I leave to her sisters (not named). I make my wife and Andrew Gautier executors. Mentions my brother and sister (not named). In the NYC Ref Ch record of the (2) marriage, they were: William Bogert, Wedr. & Christiana Thomson, Wed.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, William Bogert, of New York, carpenter. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my wife Christian the use of all my estate until my youngest child is of age, to enable her to bring up my children and maintain the family. And when my youngest child is of age it is my will that all my real estate shall be sold, That is, my dwelling house where I now live in Broad street and my house in Montgomerie Ward, "on the east side of the highway that leads from Smiths Vly to Freshwater," And to be sold at publick vendue, And the money to be paid to my wife and children after giving £10 to my son William "in full for his Birth right as eldest son," Also my lot known as Lot 15 in Cherry street. I leave to my wife all household goods, and my silver Chocolate ladle, marked H. V. H., And 2 silver Chocolate spoons, one marked H. B. and the other W. B. H. I leave to my son William all my wearing apparell, and my large English Bible, and a bed, gold ring, gun, Cartouch box, and 3 silver Chocolate spoons marked W. B. H. I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Bogert, my best bed, Looking Glass, and the wearing apparell that belonged to her mother, And 2 pair of gold sleeve buttons, 2 gold rings, and 3 silver Chocolate spoons, marked W. B. A. The things that belonged to my [present] wife when I married her I leave to her sisters (not named). I make my wife and Andrew Gautier executors. Mentions my brother and sister (not named). Dated November 8, 1755. Witnesses, Jacobus Quick, Andrew Marschalk, Richard Snedeker. Proved, October 20, 1762.

[NOTE.--The house and lot where William Bogert lived is now No. 45 Broad street. Christian Bogert, the widow, married Andrew Gautier. The daughter, Elizabeth Bogert, married James Van Varck. These and the son William sold to Ann Smith, "widow," November 3, 1762, the house and lot bounded west by Broad street, east by land of Andrew Gautier, north by lot of Nicholas Anthony, south by lot of Jacobus Quick. The heirs of Ann Smith sold to Elizabeth Carmer, who sold to John S. Brown, in 1816, for \$3,500. His heirs sold it to Joseph Meeks for \$3,937, April 7, 1825. The lot next north, now No. 43, was sold by Nicholas N. Anthony to Robert Dunn, "mariner," in 1799. He sold it to Joseph Meeks, "cabinet maker," for \$4,250, March 4, 1806. It was 19 feet 10 inches front, and bounded north by "the lot formerly of William Rooseboom." The house and lot of Jacobus Quick (No. 47) was sold by his heirs to Joseph Meeks, May 1, 1834, "with a 3 story brick house," for \$20,000. It was 21 feet 7 inches wide. All of these three lots were owned by Joseph Meeks at the time of the great fire of 1835. The house and lot "on the east side of the highway that leads from Smiths Vly to Freshwater" is now No. 362 Pearl street. The heirs of William Bogert sold it to Adam Todd, November 3, 1762. It was "Lot No. 18 on a certain map." It was 31 feet front and was next south of the lots on which the Quaker meeting-house on Pearl street afterward stood. The lot on

Cherry street is probably now No. 18 on that street.--W. S. P.]
