

-- BOUDINOT --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Elie Boudinot and his second wife, Susanne Papin, went to Amsterdam in 1686, then to London in 1685 (?). He was grandfather of Oliver Besly II, b. about 1687 Charles Town, SC. To NYC before 1694.

In his will he wrote: Elie Boudinot. [This will is written in the French language.] "Au nom de Dieu, Amen. Je sousigne, Elie Boudinot, merchant," formerly dwelling in the government of La Rochelle in France ; being constrained to abandon my country, to escape continual persecution, which I received for the profession of the Gospel, and retire to this place with Suzanne Papin, my wife, and our children. And being by the grace of God sound in body and mind, I recommit my soul to the Holy and glorious Trinity. To the Father who created it. To the Son who has redeemed it, and to the Holy Spirit who has enlightened and sanctified it. Declaring that I wish to live and die, in the faith and profession of the Reformed Religion, in which I have been by the Grace of God brought up. And as by a contract of marriage between the said Suzanne Papin, my wife, and myself, made before Andre Mucot, Notary in London, November 11, 1686, there was apportioned to her children,

Benjamin and Suzanne D'Harriette, £168 sterling each, payable by me or my heirs when they come of age. I have satisfied them by paying to the late Pierre Bellin, husband of the said Suzanne, £168, and to Benjamin D'Harriette the same sum. And as it has pleased God to give me by my last marriage four children, Jean, Benjamin, Madeline, and Suzanne, I appoint my wife their guardian and leave her full possession of all goods, etc., and she is to give to each of them £250 in silver when they are of age or married. And as my son, Elie Boudinot, by my first marriage, has some time since been married, and in consideration of his marriage I have given him £300, as heir of the deceased Janice Berand my wife, his mother. To avoid all trouble I direct my wife to pay to him the sum of £150, in full of all claims upon my estate. And whereas I have left property in France, with all contracts, notes, and books of accounts, etc., in the hands of my late nephew, Jean Boudinot, with my general Power of Attorney, thus in case anything should be obtained, it is to be divided among my children. And if it should please God, as I pray with all my heart, that the liberty of our holy Religion should be re-established in France, and my children should return thither, then the said goods, etc., are to be divided among them. Makes his friend Paul Droillot executor. Dated November 14, 1700. Witnesses, Gabriel Broussard, Henry Pichet. Proved, October 26, 1702, by oath of Henry Pichet, chirurgien, and executor confirmed.

They lived at Elizabethtown, NJ and perhaps he was later a silversmith at Philadelphia?

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Elias Boudinot, of New York, merchant, being sick and weak. I leave one-third of all my lands and estate to my wife Mary Catharine, and all the rest of my estate to my five children, Elias, John, David, Mary and Susannah. My son Elias to have £10 more than the others. And in order that the bringing up and education of my children may not be burdensome to my wife, my executors are to set apart from the said two-thirds of my estate a sum sufficient for that purpose. I leave to Mr. John Barbarie, of New York, merchant, £10 for the Poor of the French Church. I appoint my father-in-law, Lewis Corre, Thomas Bayeux, my brother-in-law, and Peter Fawcasier, Esq., of New York, and John Everitt of Jamaica in Queens County, and my wife, executors; and they are to dispose of my share, being 2/12 of the copper mine, land and buildings in Simsbury, Connecticut, and my 1/3 of a grist mill in the same place. And they are also to "pursue in law" Jacob Brenton, of Rhode Island, for £100 obtained by me by arbitration, the bond for which is in the hands of John Austin, merchant, in Hartford. And they are also impowered to sell any of my lands in the colony of New York. I have hereto set my hand and seal in Jamaica, August 16, 1719. I leave to Louise Couche, 100 acres of the undivided lands in the Patent of Wawayanda in Orange County. Witnesses, Nehemiah Gail, James Lewis, I. Smith. Proved before Peter Schuyler, Esq., January 21, 1719/20.

In her will dated 29 Nov 1755 Elizabeth Town, NJ, Marie Catherine Boudinot mentioned Children--Mary (wife of John Emott), Elias and Susanna. Vergerau. Bequests to Jane (wife of Thomas Bradbury Chandler) and Mary, both daughters of John and Mary Emott, and to Elizabeth (wife of William Ricketts). Real and personal estate. Executors--William Ricketts, Thomas Bradbury Chandler and Susanna. Vergerau. Witnesses--Richard Jaques, Joseph Morse, Jr., George Ross (3d). Proved July 16, 1757.

Elias Boudinot, a prominent merchant at Princeton, born Aug. 3, 1706, died July 4, 1770. He married, in Antigua, Catherine Williams, daughter of a Welsh planter. The house occupied by him in 1756 was advertised at the time to be sold by the Rev. Aaron Burr. He was Postmaster at Princeton in 1757. He removed from Princeton in 1760, or later, to Elizabethtown, where he and his wife are both buried. Of his sisters, Mary Boudinot married John Chetwood, of Elizabethtown, afterwards a Justice of the Supreme Court of New Jersey; Jane Boudinot married the Rev. Thomas Bradbury Chandler; Suzanne married Pierre Vergereau, of New York, one of whose daughters, Suzanne, born Dec. 21, 1743, married the Rev. William Tennent, Jr., of Charleston, S. C. Elias Boudinot was the father of Elias, member of Congress, etc.; of Elisha, Justice of the Supreme Court of New Jersey, and of other wellknown children.
