The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Grace Bowne, of Flushing, on Nassau Island, widow, considering the uncertainty of my time here in this world." I direct all debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my sister, Rebecca Ford, £10, and to her 5 children (not named), £30 each. To my cousin, Sarah Bloodgood, £10, and to her 3 children (not named), £30 each. I do give unto 6 of the children of my cousin, William Burling, deceased, viz., Hannah, Sarah, Rebecca, George, William, and Elizabeth, each £35. I leave to 4 of the children of my cousin, Benjamin Burling, deceased, viz., Peleg, Lancaster, Seneca, and Rebecca, £35 each. To Samuel Burling, "son of my brother Burling, deceased," £30. To my cousin, Abigail Bowne, wife of Samuel Bowne, of New York, £10. To Hannah Vincent, daughter of my cousin, Ebenezer Burling, deceased, £30. "I do give to my grandchildren-in-law, to wit, Thomas, Mary, John, and Robert Bowne, £5 each. To my cousin, Phebe Pell, £20. To my brother-in-law, John Way, and to my friend, Matthew Franklin, each £5, for being my executors. All the rest of estate I leave to John and Edward, sons of my brother, Edward Burling, deceased, and to James Burling and Hannah Field, children of my brother, William Burling, deceased, and to Samuel Way, son of my sister, Sarah Way. I make my brother-in-law, John Way, and my friend, Matthew Franklin, executors. Dated the 27th of 2d month called February, 1759. Witnesses, John Hoogland, John Field, Jr., Elizabeth Stanton, Jr. Proved, March 13, 1761.

He was a shipping merchant of New York. He moved to and owned at one time the Schooley's Mountain Springs, Morris Co., NJ, a chalybeat spring of power and once a place of great social resort.

On 15 May 1806 (recorded 16 May 1806, Bergen Co. W:388) Peter Stuyvesant of Bergen, yeoman, conveyed to Conover Bowne of the City of New York, for \$10, property in the Township of Bergen, beginning at line of Jacob Newkirk; mentioned road that leads to Hoboken ferry. He owned land and Gravesend, and later (about 1665) settled at Holmdel, Monmouth Co., NJ.

On 12 March 1677, a commission was issued to "Captain John Bowne," President of the Court, to hold a Court at Middletown and Shrewsbury.

In 1677, Letters of Administration were granted to John Bowne, of Middletown, to administer on the estate of his father, William, "heretofore of Gravesend," and "late of Middleton, in New Jersey." John is spoken of as being his "eldest son," and he made application for the letters "with the consent and goof likeing of the rest of his brothers," perhaps [including] James....and Andrew, at this time o merchant in New York.

In 1679, John was called "Capt. John Bowne, Justice of the Peace."

On 27 May 1684 "articles of agreement [were] made between Lidia Bowne, widow, relict and administratrix of the goods" &c. "of Jogn Bowne, late of Middletown, in the County of Monmouth, deceased, of the one part; and John Bowne, son and heir at law of the said John Bowne, of the other part." By this agreement the estate, real and personal, was divided between the administratrix, John Bowne, Obadiah Bowne and Gersham Mott' and Deborah, Sarah and Catharine Bowne, his daughters.

He may be the John Bowne who signed the following: April 25, 1733 then received of robard sneathen [Robert Snethen/Sneden] in the sum of four pounds and six shillings for asadel [a saddle] and abridel [a bridle] and in trust for of money after it was due on the account of Joseph taylor I say received by me. John Bowne.¹

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen, October 8, 1757. I, John Bowne, of the manor of Phillipsburgh, being very sick. All debts are to be paid by my executors out of my movable estate. "I give and bequeath all my farm of land unto my well beloved wife, Elizabeth Bowne, and my well beloved son, Thomas Bowne, to be enjoyed by them equally as long as they do agree," and if they do not agree to live together on said farm, my wife is to have power to sell the farm, and to pay to my son Thomas £100. I leave to my son John £10. I leave to my daughters, Sarah Hyatt, Nancy Underhill, Abigail Dean, and Hannah Ferris, £10 each. I leave to my wife all movable estate after payment of debts. I make my wife, and Elisha Barton, and Samuel Sneden, executors. Witnesses, Jerusha Bishop, Nathaniel Underhill, Jr., Noah Bishop. Proved, November 5, 1757.
