The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

About 1770 he moved to the Bartram farm, in Bergen County on the east side of the Ramapo River. He moved to Hackensack a few years before the Revolution. He was sheriff of Bergen County, elected in 1778. He was later judge of the Court of Common Pleas in Bergen County, later a member of the Legislature (1795) and was elected to the eighth Congress of the United States beginning 4 March 1803.

On 3 January 1793 (recorded 17 April 1806, Bergen Co. X:316) Hendrick V. D. Varbryck and Antia, his wife, of New Barbadoes precinct, conveyed to Adam Boyd of the same place, for £84, 4 shillings, 21 acres English Measure of maple swamp on the SW corner of the lot where the parties of the first part now dwell, at neck of land called Kalkoenneck, on line of John Varick. Signed by Hendrick V.D. Varbryck, Antje Varbryck. Witnessed by Jacobus Brinkerhof, Roelof Verbryck.¹

On 8 March 1806 (recorded 8 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:198) Adam Boyd, Esquire of the Township of New Barbadoes, conveyed to John A. Boyd of the same place, for \$326, 21 acres English measure in the Township of New Barbadoes, maple swamp; which Hendrick V. D. Verbryck, deceased, conveyed to said Adam Boyd 3 January 1793; mentioned Kalkaneck; beginning line of John Varick. Bounded SE by Kalkaneck; E by maple swamp of Jacobus Brinkerhooft; NW by maple swamp now or late of said Hendrick V. D. Verbryck; SW by maple swamp of heirs of Benjamin Vanderlinda, deceased. Signed by Adam Boyd. Witnessed by Alexander James, Tully Robinson.¹

On 8 March 1806 (recorded 8 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:201) Adam Boyd conveyed to daughter Catherine, for natural love and affection and 5 shillings, a "Negro boy, a slave names Abraham." Signed Adam Boyd. Witnessed by Alexander James, Tully Robinson.¹

In the Charity Ackerman record of their marriage, Adam Boyd was of Hackensack and Maria Jane Post was of Acquackanonk [this might refer to their church affiliations].

They lived in Franklin Lakes (then Ponds Neighborhood; Oakland) at 1095 Franklin Lake Road near Hoppers Crooked Pond, which they bought in 1841

Adam Boyd, 20-30, was listed in the 1840 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with him was one male under 5, another male 20-30, one female 15-20, one female 20-30, and one female 60-70.

I leave to my brother, Nathaniel Boyd, a lot of land in Orange County, being 56 acres, commonly called by the name of Boyd's Grove, And my sister, Margaret Boyd, is to have a living on it during her widowhood, or till the youngest child is of age, I also leave him £85. I leave to my brother, James Boyd, a lot of land, 100 acres, in Ulster County, commonly called Boyd's Folly, and my sister, Mary Boyd, is to have a living on it during her widowhood, or till the youngest child is of age. I leave to my sister, Mary Waugh, 100 acres of land in Ulster County, called by the name of Boyd's Promise, and I also further order that if her male heirs should wear out, then that 100 acres shall return to my brother, Nathaniel Boyd. I leave to my brother David and his children in Ireland £100, and £20 now in the hands of Mr. Jesse Craig. I leave to my honored father [not named] £3 Stirling yearly during his life. I leave to my cousin, Robert Boyd, blacksmith, £5, and to every brother's son that is named after me £10. "All the rest to my brothers and sisters and their children." I make Abraham Van Gelder, cordwainer, Robert Boyd, blacksmith, James Boyd, farmer, and Nathaniel Boyd, farmer, executors. Dated February 7, 1757. Witnesses, Abraham Van Gelder, Edward Snape, Andrew Sloane. Proved, April 7, 1757.
