The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

According to the Van Rensselaer Bowier Manuscripts, Albert Andriesz sailed on the *Rensselaerswyck* from the Texel 8 Oct 1636, arriving at New Amsterdam 4 Mar 1637. He was from Frederikstad, in the southeast of Norway, and is designated in early records as *Noorman*. After 1670, he became known as Albert Andriesz Bradt. His brother was said to be Arent Andriese Bradt who was among the early Dutch settlers at Schenectady, NY.

Albert Andriessen Bradt, the tobacco planter and sawmill operator, was one of Albany's first settlers. He was known to be cruel to his wife and children. The Bradt family is descended from him. He was known as Albert The Norman, and the Normanskill in Albany was named after him.<sup>1</sup>

[Albert Andriese] an industrious but volatile man...admonished by the patroon for abusing his family and for not keeping good accounts...never afraid to act independently...a leader of the underground Lutheran congregation which was not allowed to worship openly in Albany until the English takeover of the village...when separating from his third wife, Geertruy Pieterse Vosburgh in his old age, he was supposed to pay a share of her support payments with summer and winter apples from his orchard. He leased this orchard to his son-in-law, Teunis Cornelis Slingerland. Teunis arranged to pay him rent in apples which Albert refused to accept. He demanded money instead because he was supposed to pay support to Geertruy with the apples. It was clear he didn't wish to help her in any way. Albert Andriessen's wife, Annetje Barents was a vital part of [her husband's tobacco farming]; she was allowed wages for her work, and, as with any farm help, one half of her wages were to be charged to the patroon [Kiliaen Van Rensselaer]. It appears her duties were to do the cooking, washing, and cleaning for the farm helpers; in addition, she tended a garden and domestic animals. Time spent on her own household and children was separate."<sup>6</sup>

An agreement between Albert Andriessen (Bradt), and Kiliaen VanRensselaer was signed in Amsterdam, Holland on 26 August 1636. It states that Albert Andriessen was a tobacco planter. He sailed from Texel, 8 October 1636, accompanied by his wife, Annetje Barents of "Rolmers", two children and his brother, Arent Andriessen on the ship "Rensselaerswyck," which arrived at New Amsterdam, 4 March 1637. The voyage was through rough seas, and a son born to his wife during the voyage was named "Storm." The log of the ship contains under the date of Sunday, 2 November 1636, the following entry: "Drifted 16 leagues N.E. by E.; the wind about west, the latitude by dead reckoning 41 degrees, 50 min. with very high seas. That day the overhang above our rudder was knocked in by severe storm. This day a child was born on the ship, and named and baptized in England stoerm; the mother is annetie barents. This day gone."<sup>2</sup>

Albert Andriessen quickly separated from the others and built his own house, for which he requested payment from the patroon. The patroon protested this independence but chalked it up to the personality of Albert Andriessen. Van Rensselaer wrote to Peter Cornelisz, the millwright who had been one of the trio, 'albart andries separated from you; I hear he is a strange character and it is therefore no wonder he could not get along with you.' (A.J.F. van Laer, trans. and ed., van Rensselaer Bowier Manuscripts (Albany, NY, 1908), 406) An industrious but volatile man, Albert Andriessen was admonished by the patroon for abusing his family and for not keeping good accounts. Never afraid to act independently, Andriessen was a leader of the underground Lutheran congregation which was not allowed to worship openly in Albany until after the English takeover of the village. He also ran sawmills for many years, acquired property in Manhattan as well as in Albany, and cooperated with his sons and sons-in-law in several business ventures. His 1637 tobacco plot near the Normanskill was near his house and included one or more barns. Although Albert Andriessen sent back word in 1638 that the tobacco looked fine, samples of the tobacco he was raising proved poor and thin. . . . Albert's brother, Arent, aided in the tobacco project. . . .<sup>4</sup>

Kiliaen van Rensselaer was not satisfied with the tobacco accounts; he instructed Albert Andriessen in July 1640: "first you must calculate what your dwelling house costs you, which concerns you alone; then what the drying houses or the tobacco, costs you, half of which is to be charged to you and half to me; further, as to my half of your board and that of the men whom you have employed, this must not be mixed and entered with the expenses for board, clothes and household articles of the whole household." (VRBM, 448) Albert Andriessen's wife, Annetje Barents, was a vital part of the operation; she was allowed wages for her work, and, as with any farm help, one half of her wages were to be charged to the patroon. It appears her duties were to do the cooking, washing, and cleaning for the farm helpers; in addition, she tended a garden and domestic animals. Time spent on her own household and children was separate.<sup>4</sup>

Albert Andriessen's contract ran out; the patroon grudgingly permitted him to continue in the colony with the understanding that if he obtained any livestock, one-half of the issue was to be reserved for the patroon as usual. Within a few years, Albert Andriessen took charge of sawmills on the mill creek near his house. For this he had no authorization until 1652. He also became a fur trader, in violation of his original contract. This violation caused further disagreements with the patroon, even after 1639 when the trade was opened to all, as Van Rensselaer expected one-half of their profits from all his employees.<sup>4</sup>

A few years after Kiliaen van Rensselaer's 1643 death, a new planter, Jacob Havick, undertook to raise tobacco south of the fort, beside the Normanskill. . . . In time, there were a few other residents in the area. Albert Andriessen's son-in-law, Teunis Cornelis Slingerland and his wife, Engeltje Albertsen Bradt, lived in a house on the plain (pastures) south of

Fort Orange and had other sites in Albany. They obtained farm land on both sides of the Normanskill near Albert Andriessen at least by 1670. That year, Slingerland had a dispute with a neighbor, Peter Winne, who then lived south of the Normanskill, over fencing Slingerland's corn on the land. The couple had a house on the property within a decade. In 1677 complaints were made to the court that Teunis Slingerland intended 'to cut off the path below his house, across his land lying on the Normanskill.' This was the well-traveled path to Bethlehem which ran across the property; he was forbidden to do this by the court. There were rare disputes; Teunis and Engeltie, who still held property in Albany, had become successful Albany traders.<sup>4</sup>

In July of 1663 Barent Bradt, Jan van Eeckelen, and Theunis Slingerland, on behalf of themselves and the other Bradt brothers and sisters, appointed Storm [Bradt, who took the name Storm van der Zee] as their attorney to collect their inheritance from the estate of Pieter Jacobsz van Rynsburch, last husband of their grandmother Geesie Barents, based on a settlement of November 26, 1660, whereby they were to receive f200, and their cousins, Geesie and Raechel Barents, an equal sum. Storm was to collect f200 directly from the Rynsburch estate. The other f200 for his cousins he was to collect from Rynsburch's former employers, the director-general of New Netherland and his council. The settlement of the estate of Annatie's mother shows that only two of Barent's children, Geesie and Rachel, were then still alive, Barent himself, his son Jan, and whatever other children there might have been, not being mentioned in the settlement. Rachel Barents remained in the Netherlands, where she married, and died. [there is an American line of descent from Rachel, even though she never immigrated.]<sup>8</sup>

Wife no. 2, Pieltje Jans, had a son-in-law named Egbert Benning/Buyningh.<sup>7</sup>

In Jan. 1670 Geertruy applied for her antenuptial contract with Albert to be enforced so that he would have to assist her. In March of that year Albert applied for an annulment of the marriage contract, which the court denied. A legal separation was allowed instead. Geertruy was awarded "alimony" by the court (80 schepels of apples yearly) but Albert did everything he could to see that she did not receive them - even to leaving them to rot. In 1676 she left for Kinderhook to live with a son (not named in the source) and was still there in 1682. In 1695 she died.<sup>5</sup>

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Johannes Arentse Brat, of Schenectady, being weak in body, do this 16th day of February, 1760, make this my last will. I leave to my wife Maria £1,000. Also all that certain house and lot of ground in the town of Schenectady, in the street called the South street, as the same was conveyed to me by Andres Mack, deceased. Also a negro man, bought of Alida Vacks; also a negro wench and two best horses and four cows, and a wagon and sled and all household goods, except my house clock and book of accounts, and she is to pay all debts. I leave to my three sisters, Marytie Van Dyk, Catrina Wypmell, and Harjaentie Van Petten, and to my sister's daughter, Janettie Schermerhorn, each £80. "In case the said Janettie Schermerhorn shall not get any children," then her share to go to the children of my sisters. I leave to my cousin, Janettie Truax, daughter of my brother-in-law, John Truax, deceased, £50. I leave to my servant-maid Carel £50 and a cow, and if she shall come to be married, my wife shall give her sufficient household stuff. I leave to the four daughters of my brother, Andres Brat, deceased, viz., Cathalinta, wife of John Butler; Janatte Brat, Helena Brat, and Harjaentie Brat, £20 each. I leave to my sisters, Marytie Van Dyk, Catrina Wypmell, Harjaentie Van Petters, and to Janettie Schermerhorn, daughter of my sister, Helena Brat, deceased, £200. I leave to my father, Arent Brat, £100. These are to be paid out of the money I leave in the custody of my wife, six weeks after my decease. The parts of Janettie Schermerhorn and Margaret Carel and the daughters of my brother, Andres Brat, who are not married, are to be paid to them when they are married. I leave to my brother, Hermanus Brat, my part of the negro man named "Sopus," and 1/2 my linnen and woolen wearing apparel. I leave to my brother's two sons, Arent Andrese Brat and John Andrese Brat, the other half. All the rest of my lands and estate I leave to my wife Maria during her life or widowhood, and then I leave to my brother Hermanus 2/3 of my arable land, or 8 2/3 morgen, adjacent to his own land, situate about 3/4 of a mile west of the town of Schenectady, and was conveyed to me by my father, Arent Brat, bounded north by the highway or small river, south by Ryer Schermerhorn, and west by said Hermanus Brat. Also 1/2 of a certain piece of woodland, or pasture, except one and a half morgen of hay land, at a place called the Sloat, about 2 miles east of our town, near the road that leads to Nistagoene, and which was conveyed to me by my father. Also a negro man and a

house clock and 1/2 of my tools, and free liberty in my brew house to brew beer for his own use. Also one part of the parts I have in two saw mills, of 150 logs in each mill. He is to have his choice of my part of the saw mill at Norman's Kill, or in the first mill at the Eel Place Kill. I leave to my cousin, John Andrese Brat, my dwelling-house and lot, where I now live in Schenectady, opposite the house and lot of Elias Grost. Bounded south by the street, west by the lot of Arent Samuel Brat, north by the lot of Harmanus Van Antwerp, and east by the lot of ground conveyed to me by my father, being 50 feet wide. Also 1 1/2 morgen of hay land about 1 1/2 miles east of Schenectady, at a place called the Sloat (Drain ditch). I leave to my cousin, Arent Andrese Brat, 1/3 of my arable land, or 4 1/3 morgen, which is about 3/4 of a mile west of our town, between the land of my brother Hermanus and the land of Abraham Wypel, north by the highway and south by Ryer Schermerhorn, for a pasture. I leave to my said two cousins all my woodland not disposed of, about 2 miles east of Schenectady, near the Nistagyoene road, and my brew house and 1/2 my utensils. I leave to my brother Hermanus and my cousin John Anderse Brat, my lot and barn next to my dwelling-house, and west of the house lot of my brother Hermanus and north by the lot of Isaac Switz. My brother Hermanus is to pay 1/2 of my father's just debts and his funeral charges, and my brothers Arent and John shall pay the other half. I make my friends, Simon Johnse Veeder, Isaac Vrooman, and my brother Hermanus, executors. Witnesses, John Vedder, Henry Roseboom, Johanes Vanderheyden, Jr., Dirck Van Ingen. Proved in Albany before John DePeyster, Surrogate, September 8, 1760.
