The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Brickhall, of Newtown, in Queens County, being in good health. I leave to my only son, Abraham, a negro boy; To my daughter Ann, wife of Theodorus Polhemus, "another negro boy, who was born in his house and now lives with him." I leave to my daughter Sarah, wife of John Brinkerhoff, a negro girl. All the rest of my personal estate I leave to my said children, and to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of John Rapalye, and to Mary, wife of William Bloodgood. I leave to my son Abraham all my messuages and tenements and lands, and he is to pay to my daughter Ann £200, and to my brother Hendrick £200, and to my son-in-law, Theodorus Polhemus, £200; To my daughter Elizabeth £200; To my daughter Sarah £200. I make my son Abraham, and my brother Hendrick, and my son-in-law, Theodorus Polhemus, executors. Dated April 19, 1763. I leave to my son Abraham my Large Dutch Bible, and my silver tankard and gun and wearing apparell. Witnesses, Benjamin Hinchman, Nehemiah Ludlam, Robert Hinchman. Proved, June 8, 1767, before Henry Dawson, Surrogate.

According to Maria Ferdon's Journals, he died when his horse took fright and he was thrown from his wagon. The notice of this train wreck at Etna appeared in the newspaper; the horse was also killed.<sup>2</sup>

David Brickell, 48, farmer, and Maria, 47, keeping house, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them were: Thomas E., 22; Mary L., 17; and John Jacob, 14. Also living with them was Albert Waldron, 65, carpenter.

George Brickell, was prob. the son of Thomas Brickell and Margaret Duncan. He served in the 6th Reg. of Dutchess Co. Militia - Col. Morris Ghraham during the Revolution. Records indicate he was paid £5.20.10 2/3 from Jul 24 to 1 Oct 1778, the day he died. (National Archives) "George Brickell - 6th Reg. of Dutchess Co. Militia - Col. Moris Graham, Capt. John Bell. (Roberts p. 145)

"The Brickell family were originally from Rockland Co., the first member of whom was probably George, who fell in the Revolutionary conflict. He had two sons, George and Thomas, the latter of whom came to the township of Washington (the Harrington) and pursued the weaver's craft. he was united in marriage to Altye, dau. of William Bogert, and had twelve children of whom seven now reside in the township. The sons were George, John and David, of whom George and David are in Washington and John in Newark. Much of the land now embraced in the village of Westwood belonged to this family." (Clayton p. ---- published in 1882)

From the bap. of his second son, born on 28 Jan 1779, nearly four months after his father's death, his wife's name was Anne Heyerd. We assume that she was also the mother of his son Thomas as his first son was name George and his second dau was named Ann.

In George Budke's Misc. Files is a letter from Malvina Badeau, of Lima OH, who related information about her grandfather George Douglas who was b. in England but came to America on a British vessel and ran away from the vessel to join the American army and fought to the end of the war. "After the war, he married a young widow by the name of Brickel with two

(?) children. It is probable then, that Anne Heyerd married second circa 1783-1790 George Douglas. No record has been found of their death or burial. Resources: NY in the Revolution as Colony and State by James A. Roberts comptroller Albany NY Press of Brandow Printing Co., 1898 p. 145)
