The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the Kingston Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Charles Brodhead, j.m. and Marretjen Herdenberg, j.d., both resid. in Kingstown.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Charles Brodhed, of the Green Kill, in Ulster County, being weak in body. I leave to my wife Maritie the use of all estate during her widowhood. After her death I leave to my nephew, Charles De Witt, all my lands in Hurley and Kingston, and at the Green Kill, with all houses, barns, mills and barracks; Also 4 negroes, the remainder of my negroes to be at my wife's disposal. I leave to my wife £500 and all household goods, "and she may devise her wearing apparel as she sees fit." All the rest of personal estate, after her death, to my nephew, Charles De Witt. I give to my nephew, Charles De Witt, 10,000 acres of land in the Great Patent, being part of a Lot of 27,000 acres sold to me by Col. Johannes Hardenbergh, out of Lot No. 3, which said 10,000 acres is to be laid out and located at the west end of said Lot. For which, the said Charles De Witt shall pay to David Provoost, of New York 1/2 of a bond of £326, 18s. 11d., being due him from Col. Hardenbergh; Also 1/2 of the amount due to Dr. Johannes Elmendorf, and Dr. Conrad Elmendorf, for services as Doctors to my mother-in-law, Catrina Hardenbergh, deceased. All the rest of my lands in said Patent I leave to my brother, Wessel Brodhed, and to the two sons of my brother, Daniel Brodhed, deceased, Daniel and Samuel, and to the two children of my sister, Mary De Witt, deceased, viz., Andries De Witt, and Anne Newkirk, wife of Cornelius Newkirk. My brother, Wessel Brodhed, to have 1/3, and the land is to be divided immediately. I make Charles De Witt, sole executor. Dated April 17, 1774. Witnesses, Hendricus Van Steenbergh, Gerritt Freer, John Freer. Proved, August 25, 1774.

In his will, he wrote: ...July 30, 1774. I, Wessel Brodhead, of Marbletown, Ulster County. I leave to my wife Catharine my whole estate, real and personal, while she remains my widow. After her death, I leave all my lands to my two sons, Charles and Lewis, as by virtue of sundry deeds and lying in Marbletown and Rochester, with all houses and mills. To be divided as follows: "The house lots of my two sons, shall be divided by a line beginning at a stone set up, on a Rocky Ridge, where the bush fence now is, on the northwest side of the wagon Path, which leads from my house to the Kings Highways, and to run from thence to a mulberry tree, and the same course to an Elm tree, standing on the southeast branch of the Rust Plaas Kill, from thence to a stone on the low land, thence to a chestnut tree near the Rondout Kill." All the lands north of said line are for my son Charles for a house lot, with the buildings. And all the lands south are for my son Lewis, with all the buildings, except the Grist mill, which I leave to both. I leave to my 5 daughters, Rachel, wife of Jacobus Van Wagenen, Mary, wife of John Cantine, Catharine, wife of Louis Du Bois, Elizabeth, wife of Dirck Romeyn, and Gertruy, wife of Johan Schoon-maker, £200 each. All the rest of my lands I leave to my 2 sons. The sums advanced by me to my daughters are to be deducted. I leave to my two sons my saw mill and blacksmith's shop. I leave to all my children my lands in the Great Patent, as left to me by the will of my brother, Charles Brodhead. I leave to each of my sons a gun and a sword, and a negro man. I leave to my sons two seats in the Church at Marbletown. I make my wife and my sons-in-law, Jacobus Van Wagenen, and Johan Cantine, executors. Witnesses, Benjamin Alliger, Frederick Rosakrans, Charles De Witt. Proved, September 29, 1774.
