

-- **BROWN, BRUYN** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He lived first at Fordham and later moved to Mount Pleasant, Westchester County, NY. He joined the Dutch Church at Tarrytown on 25 Sep 1760 with certificate from the Manor of Fordham, and was deacon of the church in 1767.

In his will, dated 24 Oct 1788 and probated at White Plains 4 April 1789 Abraham Brown, Senr., of Mount Pleasant, mentioned wife Hannah "and what there is left of her father's portion;" son Isaac Brown; son Abraham Brown; son Benjamin Brown; dau. Susannah Verplank, until her second husband's death in 1673 or 1674, seems to have resided in New York, and, during at least part of the time after her marriage to her third husband, she lived in Kent Co., Delaware, but said to be "in the territory of Pennsylvania," of which Delaware once formed a part; and here she was after her third husband's death as late as January 4, 1700, when we lose all trace of her. Her father had land in Delaware, and this may have been given to her.

It was her lot to administer on the estates of both her second and her third husbands, and Jan. 4, 1700, spelling her name Bruin, she gave a power of attorney to her "well-beloved son, Silvester Garland," to look after her material interests in New York, and recover any property there belonging to her. The witnesses to this last document were Abraham Verplank and Daniel T. D. B. Brown, and they appeared at New Castle, Delaware, May 6, 1701, to confirm their signatures.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage banns, they were: Francoys de Bruyn, Van Amsterdam, en Catharyn Verlet, Van Amsterdam.

This day, the 31st March 1663, the Marshal is authorized to seize by notices and to sell by execution the house, brewery and mill of Francois de Bruyn.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Jacobus Bruyn, of Bruynswyck, in Ulster County, being weak and sick. I leave to my eldest son Jacobus, my farm where I now live; situate and being at Shawangonk, that is to say all that certain tract of land, containing 410 acres, granted by Letters Patent to Thomas Lloyd, And also all that parcel of land granted by Letters Patent unto Gertie Brown, lying between the first mentioned tract and the land granted to Jan Van Kamp and Company; Also all that tract of wood land adjoining the tract granted to Thomas Lloyd, lying on the north west side of Shawangonk Kill, containing 300 acres, being a part of a tract of land granted by Letters Patent to John Rutsen and myself and was afterwards conveyed to me by said John Rutsen as by deed; Also all my part or proportion of a certain tract of land, by me purchased from the Trustees of Rochester, on the south east side of Shawangonk mountains; together with all houses and buildings and orchards. And he is to pay yearly to my wife Tryntie £25; and also allow her the use of three rooms in my house, and liberty of the cellar; And she is also to have the use of 2 horses, 4 cows and 5 sheep; and she is to have 1/2 of a scephle of flax seed yearly. And after the death of my wife, he is to pay to my 3 other sons, Cornelis, Sevyn, and Johanes, the sum of £500, between them. I leave to my son Cornelis all that certain tract of land in Ulster County, commonly called Packanasink, on the north side of Shawangonk creek or river, containing 500 acres, which was granted unto me by Letters Patent, dated November 26, 1719; Also all that certain tract of land lying on the southeast side of Shawangonk river, opposite to Pachanasink, being my 1/7 part of 2,000 acres of land, part of a tract of 2,500 acres, granted to myself and Henry Wileman by Letters Patent, dated April 20, 1720; together with all appurtenances; I also leave him £200. I leave to my son Sevyn, all my lands within a certain tract, commonly called the 5,000 acres, situate in Ulster County, on both sides of the Paltz river, which was granted by Letters Patent to Francis Harrison, Esq., and Company, July 7, 1720; with all arrearages of rent due, and all my right in said tract; I also leave

him £250. I leave to my son Johanes all my land within a certain tract of 2,000 acres, granted by Letters Patent to Peter Matthews and Company, lying on both sides of the Paltz river, containing, according to two deeds to me, 335 acres; Also 100 acres of land adjoining to the northwest side of the land granted to Peter Matthews and Company, which was sold to me by Johanes Rutsen; Also a certain marsh and woodland thereto adjoining, commonly called the Gebrande Vly, or the Burnt meadow, containing 200 acres, lying on the south east side of Shawangonk creek, as the same was granted to me by the said Letters Patent, dated November 26, 1719; with free liberty to cut and carry away all sorts of trees and timber for the use of said lands, within any part of the land by me purchased of the Trustees of Rochester, lying on the south east side of the Shawangonk mountains; I also leave him £50. I leave to my daughter Petronella, wife of Jacob Hardenbergh, all that certain lot of land situate on the south east side of the Paltz river, containing 667 acres, purchased by me from the executors of Captain Lancaster Symes, being a part of a tract of 3,500 acres granted to David Provoost, Rip Van Dam and Company. I leave to my daughter Catharine, wife of Abraham Hasbrouck, all that my undivided 1/2 of the dwelling house at Newburgh, upon Hudson river, which I own jointly with Cadwalader Colden, Esq.; Also my 1/2 of the Lots, No. 9, and No. 17, thereunto belonging; Also my right in the store house there built, and the lot of ground belonging to it; Also those Lots, No. 4, 12, 29, 32, 39, situate at Newburgh, as they were conveyed to me by the said Cadwalader Colden; Also all my certain message or tenement and lot of ground with appurtenances, as conveyed to me by two deeds, from John Harris, John Haywood, and Thomas Haywood, in the city of New York, upon the Dock near to Pearl street, with the hereditaments. I leave to my 4 daughters, Petronella, Catharine, Mary and Hannah, and to my 2 grand children, Lewis Dubois and Rachel Dubois, children of my daughter Gertruyd, deceased, late wife of Nathaniel Dubois; all that my 4/15 part of a certain tract of land commonly called the 8,000 acres, granted by Letters Patent, July 4, 1720, to Philip Schuyler and Company; Also all that certain tract of land situate in the Town of Rochester, in Ulster County, conveyed to me by Joseph Gee and Anthony Hill. Of these tracts each daughter is to have 1/5 and my two grand children, 1/5. I leave to my daughters, Mary and Hannah, each £150; and to each a feather bed and furniture; in order to make them equal with my other daughters. I leave to my daughter Petronella, £264. To my daughter Mary, £264. To my daughter, Hannah, £264; and to my 2 grand children, £264. I leave to my son Seveyn my silver tankard. To my son Johanes my beam scales and weights, which I use in my grist mill. To my sons Seveyn and Johanes, each one of my saddles, and a good horse and mare. To my 4 sons, all my Law Books and History Books. To my sons Cornelis, Seveyn, and Johanes, all my wearing apparell, and all the rest of my money. My executors are to put my son Johanes to school, "as soon as they can conveniently," and I bequeath to him, £15, towards his education, which sum is to be raised out of my crop of wheat; and to my daughter Petronella, £10, to be raised in same manner. To my 4 daughters and 2 grand children all household goods. To my 4 sons, all slaves, horses, Black Cattle, and sheep. I leave to my wife a negro man and negro wench, and all such goods, pictures, and plate as she has occasion for. I make my sons, John and Cornelis, and my son-in-law Abraham Hasbrouck, executors. All my debts are to be paid out of the money raised from my crop of wheat and from flour that I have in the house and mill, and at the Landing Place. Dated June 27, 1744. Witnesses, Jacob Hasbrouck, Zacharias Hoffman, Charles Clinton. Proved, September 12, 1745.

Jesse Brown, 33, farmer, b. NY, and Mary Jane Brown, 30, keeping house, b. NY, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ. Living with them were Eugene Best, 21, book keeper, b. NY; and John [Burn?; Brown?], 15, farm laborer, n. NY.

In November 1873 Jesse Brown was reported by the *Hackensack Republican* as moving his house to a more elevated position.

They were listed in the 1880 Federal Census for Hohokus Township (listed between J.J.Pulis and Ryerson Ackerson; so they probably lived in one of the houses near the train station on Park Avenue). He was listed as a carpenter (his occupation in 1900, as well).

He was an Allendale Borough Councilman in 1898.

Jesse Brown was listed in the 1885 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township. Living with him were Mary J. Brown and Eugenia Brown (5 or under).

To settle his estate, his house and grounds were sold at auction for \$2,900 about Oct-Nov 1903 (to J. W. Winter or William Robinson). J. W. Winter [sic — probably J. L. Winter is intended] was listed as the owner of the premises at 84 Park Avenue on the 1922 Dedication Map of Park Avenue, but William Robinson and his family lived in the house probably from about 1904 and were listed on the 1910 Federal Census as owning their home.

About July-August 1889 H. Wobse conveyed to Mary J. Brown, a lot at Allendale for \$2,500.

Huybertje Marselis, daughter of Marselis Janse Van Bommell, m. Joseph Yates of Albany. Before her marriage, she had an illegitimate child by Jan Bruyn in 1676. There are several entries in the Court Minutes of her father, Marcellis Jance Van Bommell, negotiating with Jan Bruyn to assume responsibility.¹ There has been speculation that the Gratia Anna Busch mentioned in Jan Hendrick de Bruyn's will, might be this daughter. A Geesje Anna Bruyn married Juriaen Busch of NY 16 October 1695; she named her first son Jan Hendrick Bosch.

Jan Hendricks deBruyn came to Albany about 1658 possibly /probably from Brazil. He is found, 1669, as a partner among the first purchasers of land at Kinderhook. But his acquisition of two large tracts at Kinderhook -- the DeBruyn Patent and the Pompoenick Patent -- are noteworthy, for they comprised about one third of the colonial town of Kinderhook.

He was a leader and eventually an elder in New York's Lutheran congregation. Numerous Albany associates link him to the frontier fur trade, but he also dealt in goods like prunes, raisins, currants, and syrup. Additionally he maintained a residence in Kinderhook where he owned (from 1661 through 1707) four tracts of land amounting to about 25-28,000 acres. About 1662 he travelled to the Netherlands. In 1671 his rescue of four prominent Albany women from drowning in a flooding Claverack creek was given prominent notice by Maria Van Rensselaer. In the same year, he brought Robert Sanders' slanderous statements about the Lutheran church before the Albany court. By July 1678 he had moved much of his operation to New York,

for the Albany court challenged his right to carry on trade there any longer. Although New York then became his principal residence, no record of freemanship survives; nonetheless, he took and appraised several inventories - most notably that of Jacobus deLange in 1685. He also served as alderman under Mayor Peter DeLaNoy and in 1690 was appointed militia officer by Leisler. He was a prominent activist in the so-called Leislerian Rebellion. In 1695 his New York property was assessed for the considerable sum of £370. Although he had no children, deBruyn married twice, so far as we know. In December 1670, "the wife of Jan Bruyns" was appointed with other Kinderhook women to attend the delivery of Ida Adriaents to learn the truth in a paternity suit. (I have sometimes had impression that there might have been a third wife .. but little or nothing is known about her.) In New York he lived on Pearl Street in the South Ward. His will mentioned two of his wife's grandchildren (John Hendrick Simms and Hannah TenEyck). In November 1709, Johanna, then "aged and infirm", wrote her will, and within little more than a year's time she died. She was thrice widowed - first the wife of a deWitt, then of Matthias deHart, and finally deBruyn. She was wealthy, with property in Manhattan and in Amsterdam, and her children - four daughters - had made some very interesting marriage alliances. They were: first, Petronella deWitt, wife of Hendrick TenEyck. Johanna bequeathed Petronella's children a fair share, provided their father Hendrick Teneyck has no share in it; she insisted that daughter "Petronella be not dissatisfied for my gift is made not with disrespect to her but because her husband, who deserves so little at her hands, should reap no benefit." Second was Sophia, the wife of Willem Teller, then residing in Jamaica. Next was Johanna, wife of David Jamieson (in her marriage record of 16 January 1703, she was called "Johanna Meech;," Jamieson was executor for mother Johana's will. Last was Catharine who married first in 1691 James Larkins; and secondly, Lancaster Symes in 1694.²

On 24 Oct 1678 John Hendrick Browne was sworn, a a meeting of the Common Council, a Constable for the City [of New York].³

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen, I John Hendrick De Bruyn, of New York, merchant, this October 11, 1702. I leave to the children of my sister Catharine Margaretta, late wife of Albertus Browsers, of Amsterdam, deceased, namely John Hendrick, Dorothea and Maria, 900 guilders of Holland. I leave to the two children of Maria Elizabeth, daughter of my sister Catharine Margaretta Browsers, deceased, 300 guilders, of Holland. I leave to John Hendrick Symes, son of Lancaster Symes, £50 when of age. I leave to the Lutheran church of New York, £25. To Gratia Anna Busch the interest of £100 for life. After her death £50, to go to her son John Hendricks. To Hannah, daughter of Hendrick Ten Eyck, by Petronella De Witt, £20, to Abraham Staats of Albany, £20. I leave all the rest of my estate to my dear and loved wife Johana De Bruyn, and make her sole executor. Witness Guysbert Vanderburgh, Benjamin Wynkoop, James Vanderlide. Proved before Richard Ingoldsby, Lieutenant-Governor, June 20, 1709.

In her will, she wrote: I, Johana De Bruyn, widow and sole executrix of John Hendrick De Bruyn, being aged and infirm. My executors are to pay the legacies left by my husband which are not yet paid. I leave to my loving neighbor, Cornelia Low, the gold ring I have used to wear upon my first finger. I leave to the children of my eldest daughter Petronella, that is to say, Johannes Ten Eyck, Maria Ten Eyck, Hendrick and Eva Ten Eyck, all that tenement and house where I now live fronting to both streets, between the tenement of Allard Anthony on the west and Benjamin Blagge on the east. But Hendrick Ten Eyck, her husband, is to have no share thereof. I leave to Johana and Elizabeth, the two children of my second daughter Sophia [Teller] all the dwelling house and tenement in New York, wherein Richard Stillwell now lives between the tenement and house wherein the widow Van Horn lives on the west and Paul Droillet lives in on the east, reserving to my daughter Sophia if she comes back from Jamaica the rents of the same during her life; Also the interest of £50 if she takes upon herself the charge and nurture of the said two children. I leave to my third daughter, Johana Jamieson, all that tenement and dwelling house situate and lying over against the house in New York, where I now live, whereof Christopher Denne is the present tenant, and lying between the tenement of Thomas Roberts on the west and Benjamin Blagge on the east, and from the street to the water side or Dock. I also give her £100. I leave to my son in law, David Jamieson, £20, and make him executor. I release to my children all they are indebted to me, except the bond of my son in law, Lancaster Symes, the present husband of my daughter, Catharine Symes, and Thomas Speed, to my late husband John Hendrick De Bruyn, for £50, which Lancaster Symes did own that he received from Thomas Speed, but now detains in his hands. And also excepting the £30 which my daughter Catharine has craftily obtained from me since my husband's death. I leave to my daughter Catharine all that piece or parcel of ground which is near and adjoining unto the land of the Dutch Church. I also leave her £400. All the rest of my estate is to be divided into three parts: One part to the four children of my daughter Petronella, one to my daughter Johana Jamieson, and one to my daughter Catharine. My executor has power to sell houses in Amsterdam in Holland. I desire that my daughter Petronella be not dissatisfied, for my gift is not made through any disrespect to her but because her husband, who deserves so little at her hands, should reap no benefit. Before my daughter Catharine, or her husband, Lancaster Symes, receives any benefit from this my will, they shall convey to all my other children all claim to the estate of her uncle, Balthazar De Hart, or her father, Matthias De Hart, or anything due to her first husband, James Larkins. Dated November 30, 1709. Witnesses, Robert Livingston, Oliver Teller, Elias Boudinot, Thomas Bayeux. Codicil. August 30, 1710. Confirms the above, and gives to the two children of her daughter Sophia £200. She also states that her daughter Catharine has paid £15 of the £30 owing to her. Proved before Henry Wileman, Esq., being authorised and confirmed by Governor Hunter, January 20, 1710/11. Robert is to be brought up by Charles Warner, and Mary by Abigail Emmons. Leaves legacy to Sarah Rier's son Gilbert. Makes wife Catharine and Wm. Stevenson executors. They are to sell all estate except what my wife brought to me. Rest of estate to wife and daughter Elizabeth. Witnesses: Edward Meeker, Richard Crab, Peter Yates.¹

He wrote (in another version of the will abstract): I, Leonard Brown, of the Yonkers, in the County of Westchester, farmer, being very sick. "I desire my body to be buried in a decent and Christian manner at the discretion of my executors and good neighbors." My two Mulatto children, Robert and Mary, are to be free, and my son Robert I leave in care of Charles Warner to be brought up till he is 15 years of age, and then put to any trade he likes best, and I leave him £20. I leave to my daughter Mary, £20, "and if Abigail Emmons dies before my daughter Mary is of age, then Charles Warner shall have the care of her till she is 15, "and they are both to have their freedom forever." I give £10 to Sarah Piero's son Gilbert. I make William Stephens, Sr., and my wife (not named), executors, and they are to sell all lands, and meadows, and movables, except what my wife brought with her. I give 1/3 of the proceeds to my wife, and the rest to my daughter, Elizabeth Brown. Dated October 6, 1752. Witnesses, Edmond Meeks, Richard Crab, Peter Yates. Proved, November 16, 1752, and widow Catharine Brown confirmed as executor.²

Of the proceeds, one third is to be given to my son Caleb when he is twenty-one, and the rest to my four daughters, Elizabeth, Sarah, Rebecca, and Hannah, "and the child that my wife goes with now." I leave to my wife Martha, all movable estate, and the use of the money arising from the sale of lands, until my children are of age. I make my wife Martha, and Jonathan Brown, and Hachaliah Brown, executors. Witnesses, William Purdy, Joseph Kniffin, Benjamin Brown. Proved, November 28, 1733.

In his will, he wrote: I, Wouter Brown, of the Township of Hempstead, in Queens County, being very sick and weak." I leave to my wife, Neltie Brown, all movable estate except as herein reserved, during her life, and then to my daughter Martha. I leave to my daughters, Charity, wife of Daniel Mattock, Katharine, wife of James Ablit (?), each 5 shillings. I leave to my wife the use of my dwelling-house and barn, and all my land and farm, during her life, and after her decease to my daughter

Martha. I make my wife Neltie and my daughter Martha executors. Dated January 20, 1724. Witnesses, John Dusingberrie, Benjamin Seaman, Jr., Henry Berrien. Proved, June 28, 1732.
