The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

To John Brundige, eldest of the four sons, land in Rye where he now dwells except the house lot in town "where our mother lives" and "the lottment on which our brother lives;" two lots on Bryam Ridge and two parcels of land in Lame Wills Purchase, with half of ye piece of salt meadow/ Top Daniel Brundige the lands in White Plains, divided and undivided. To the other two brothers, viz., Joseph and Joshua Brundige, lands in the Field and where our mother now lives.... Joshua shall have the homelot where he now dwells.... Our mother to have full thirds of above, as if this writing had never been.¹

With the assistance of her youngest son, "Mary Brundige," still a resident of Newburgh, New York, applied for Solomon's Revolutionary War pension. As of March 1843, Mary began collecting an annual pension of \$56.66 (Book A; Volume I, page 259).

The following is excerpted from a 15 July 1938 letter sent to Mrs. Wilbur Brundage of Douglaston, New York by a government administrator: The record of Solomon Brundage, the only soldier of that name or similar spelling, that is found on the Revolutionary War records of this office, is furnished you herein, the data for which were obtained from the papers filed in pension claim under W.20779, based upon the military service of that soldier in the Revolutionary War... While residing in Pompton, New Jersey, Solomon Brundage enlisted in 1780 or 1781, and served nine months as a private in Captain Harker's Company, Colonel Rosenkrans' New Jersey Regiment; he enlisted in Warwick, Orange County, New York, May 1 1783, served as a private in Captain Abraham Westfall's Company, Colonel Weisenfiel's New York Regiment and was discharged

about January 1, 1793.

Following his military service, Solomon remained in Orange County. In the 1790 and 1810 Federal censuses, Solomon was residing at New Cornwall, Orange County, New York. In 1820, he was a resident of Newburgh, Orange County, New York.

In Mary's sworn testimony to secure Solomon's pension, it was recorded, "That her said husband died on the eleventh day of August in the year 1831 at said town of Newburgh." In contrast to this testimony, a copy of an old letter appears to indicate that Solomon actually died on 7 September 1831 at 11:15 pm, perhaps at Fayetteville, Onondaga County, New York. "Fayetteville, 11th Sept. 1831, Dear Brother, I am under the painful necessity of informing you that our dear Father is no more. He fell over in his chair from the table on Wednesday evening 24th August. I did not think him in danger though he did not stand on his feet. I discovered on the 7th that mortification had taken place and at 15 minutes past 11 P.M. he breathed his last without a struggle or groan, he appeared perfectly resigned. I caused his mortal remains to be taken to the meeting house and a sermon preached, Methodist of course. My loss is great for he was a great deal of company. My wife, self and Lottie "daughter" comprised the mourners. How small for the father of such a numerous offsprings. His venerable head is lain at a distance from his family and after I leave this part, which I mean shall be soon, there will be none to hunt out the spot. Shall write before this day. If the Friends will cast their mite I will get stone prepared that will show the spot should any of the family wish to visit this grave. Your affectionate brother, I. Brundage. The hand-written letter from which the above text was transcribed was not the original letter, as evidenced by a relatively modern style of handwriting and line-ruled paper. Errors in transcription or interpretation may have been introduced as the letter was copied from the original. However, the use of past tense wording, "I discovered on the 7th that mortification had taken place," supports the conclusion that Solomon actually died on 7 August 1831, rather than 11 August.

In the pension testimony, Mary stated "that from old age & infirmity she is unable to attend the sitting of the Court of Common Pleas of said county as the Court House is twenty miles from her residence." Given her advanced age and the stress of testifying in court, perhaps Mary unintentionally made some errors. Not wishing to heighten Mary's anxiety by correcting her in front of the judge or risk securing the pension, perhaps Alexander partially corroborated her statements with some hesitant wording: "...that he knows that his said father Solomon Brundage died in the year 1831 & from the best of deponents recollection on the eleventh day of August in said year" without commenting on the location of Solomon's death.
