The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Burger Joris sailed on the *Rensselaerswyck* from the Texel 8 Oct 1636, arriving at New Amsterdam 4 Mar 1637. He was at New Amsterdam in 1637 and was secured as smith (blacksmith) of Rensselaerswyck. On 18 Aug 1639 he turned over his tools to Reyer Stoffelsz and moved to Manhattan. "Burger Joriszen, Smidt" was one of several wit. to bp. NYCRefCh 10 Oct 1641 of Albert, son of Albert Cuynen.

In their marriage record, they were: Borger Joriszen, j.m. Van Hersberg, in Silesien [Germany], en Engeltje Mans, j.d. Van Coimxste in Sweden.

In 1641 he built one of the first dwelling houses, if not the very first, in New Amsterdam, east of the present (1916) Broad Street upon Hoogh Straet. He sold it, December 17, 1644, to Cornelis Melyn. It was situated on a plot of about 135 English

feet frontage. On April 28, 1643, he received a groundbrief for sixty acres of land on Mespath Kill. On January 20, 1644, he bought a lot in New Amsterdam, likewise in September, the same year, a "house, garden and brewery", which had been the property of Hendrick Janszen.

In 1654 Joris established a mill upon his bowery, for a long time it was called the "Burger's Mill." In the same year, when it was planned that new streets should be made in New Amsterdam, and that one street must pass through the garden of Joris, he determined to sell the house in which he had been living for fourteen years. He sold it in 1655. The street was laid out the next year and received the name Smith Street (Smee Straat) from the blacksmith (Joris), whose land it ran through. Later it was named William Street. About 1660 Joris sold off in small parcels all of his land remaining upon the west side of this street. His later house, the site of which was in 1916 covered by New Cotton Exchange was at the eastern corner of William and Stone Streets, and here he resided during the remainder of his stay in New Amsterdam. In the early part of the eighteenth century, this house became of interest as being the residence and place of business of William Bradford, the first established printer in New York; here, in 1725, is supposed to have been issued the first number of the *New York Gazette*, the pioneer newspaper of the City.

Burger Joris bought a sloop and became a trader on the Hudson, but he eventually settled on a farm at Dutch Kills (Newtown, Long Island?), where he died in 1671.

He was independent, wanted everything his own way, and thus, was frequently in court. In 1664 when the English conquered New Netherland he raised such an uproar — he was a great "swearer" — about the ears of the timid spirits, that the surrender to the English was delayed for several hours.

Burger Joris received, in 1658, a distinction that was given to very few in New Amsterdam, that of the great Burgher's right, in spite of his having violated various ordinances of the city. For instance, he had received from a Hendrick Jansen a brew-house, and began to sell beer without paying excise tax. He was prosecuted for this in 1646. He denied the general charge, but admitted that three half-barrels were drunk in his house "with some company." He was provoked at the fuss made about the matter and threatened to "cut a slice" of the fiscal. The aggrieved fiscal brought suit against him, whereupon he appeared before the Council and begged pardon of the officer. But the fiscal insisted that Joris should be fined. Arbitrators were appointed, but their work proved to be in vain. They reported to the Council that Joris "made game of them." The Council finally took the affair in hand, and fined Joris 60 guilders. Upon his addressing that body in a derogatory manner, it ordered him "to remain four and twenty hours in chains."

Joris left New Amsterdam about 1664 and took up residence on his Long Island bowery. Here, too, he proved himself a man of considerable prominence. He was one of the patentees named in the Nicol Patent of the town of Newtown, and one of the several commissioners appointed in 1670 to lay out and regulate roads.

His wife, Engeltie Mans, was from Compst, in Sweden. Their children assumed the surname "Burger." Burger Joris' farm was sold to John Parcell, the progenitor of the Parcell family.

The marriage record refers to them as Burger Jorisz from Hersberg, in Silesien (Hirschberg, in Silesia [Germany]) and Engeltje Mans is from Sweden.

His sons took the patronymic surname of Burger.
