The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

From Zenger's New York Weekly Journal, 28 June 1742: Byvanck, Anthony, late of NYC, dec's -- houses and lots for sale.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Anthony Byvanck, of New York, shop keeper, being in good health. I leave to my son John, £5 in bar to his pretence as heir at law. I leave to my wife Teuntie all the rest of my estate during her life, on condition that she remains my widow; and then to my children, John, Henricus, Anthony, Evert, Anake, wife of Francis Costagen, Esq., and Belitie. And whereas I am bound for my son John for several sums, if he does not pay the same, they are to be deducted from his share. I make my wife and my respected friends, Bernardus Smith and Abraham Lefferts, executors. Dated December 21, 1733. Witnesses, John Spratt, Charles Le Roux, John Goelet. Proved, May 22, 1741.

In her will, she wrote: I, Tuentie Byvanck, of New York, widow, being not well, "considering the uncertain continuation of my life, and the many Hazzards and Dangers it is obnoxious to." I leave to my grand daughter Hannah, the daughter of my son, John Byvanck, deceased, all my apparell, to wit, "all my gown or Rappers, both of silk, woollen and linnen, and shoes and stockings, and the bed on which I now lie, with the curtains, and 1/2 dozen best sheets and my best looking glass." And 3 of the best large gilt framed pictures, and the Mahogany tea table. All debts due to me are to be collected and all the rest of my estate to be sold by my executors, and the proceeds to be divided among Annaca, wife of Francis Costigan, attorney-at-

Law, my sons Henry and Anthony and Evert, and Sarah, widow of my son John, deceased, and her six children, Anthony, Sarah, John, Hannah, William, and Evert. I make my grand son, Anthony Byvanck, son of my son John, deceased, and my good friend, Abraham Van Wyck, merchant, executors. Dated December 21, 1749. Witnesses, Duncan Brown, Elizabeth Miller, Denis Bryan. Proved, January 3, 1749/50.

Wyntie's daughter by her first husband was Aegie/Aefje, who married Wm. Provoost.

In his will, Evert Byvanck of Westchester, left to father Jan Byvanck the house he lives in, on or near my plantation in the Borough Town of Westchester, for life. Mentions nephew Evert, son of brother Johannes Byvanck; wife Wyntie with full power over estate. After her death, portions to brother Johannes; brother Garritt; children of sister Helena, wife of David Provost, viz. David, Beeltie, Catharine and Helena; sister Maria Byvanck; son and dau. in law Wm. Provoost and Aegie, his wife; and said Wm. Provost and wife during minority of my wife's grandson, Cornelis Van Exveen, son of Cornelis Van Exveen late of Ulster Co. Makes wife executor. Witnesses: Cornelis Van de Water, Heny. Vanderspiegel, Abm. Gouverneur. Dated 24 Dec 1709, probated 19 Oct 1710 (Westchester Co., Liber 7, p. 591)

2 April 1711 (Westchester Town Records, Old Libers 7 & 8, bound up with Book 4, p. 2) -- Wintie Byvanck, widow of Evert Byvanck, sells to William Provoost of NYC, lands, grist and saw mills; land formerly granted to William Richardson.¹

Teuntje Byvanck, widow of Anthony Byvanck, in her will, dated 21 Dec 1749, mentioned "Sarah, widow of my son John, deceased, and her six children, Anthony, Sarah, John, Hannah, William, and Evert."

Sarah Byvanck, in her will, wrote: ...I, Sarah Byvanck, of New York, widow, "although sick and infirm in body, but of good, perfect and sound mind." All such debts as I may happen toowe, are to be paid. "My funeral to be decent, after the discretion of my children, and the charges thereof to be paid out of the sum of £80 due to me from my son, Anthony Byvanck." I leave to my eldest son Anthony a Silver Tea Pot. I leave all the rest of my silver plate to all my children, viz., Sarah Pell, John, Hannah Byvanck, alias Hannah Harrison, William, and Evert. All my shop goods are to be left for my daughter Hannah and my son Evert, for the space of four years, and what then remains unsold to be divided among my six children. "What remains of the £80 after paying funeral expenses is to be lent to my daughter Hannah and my son Evert, with all money due to me, to trade withal, and they are to pay 1/6 to the other children." All my household and kitchen furniture is left to my daughter Hannah or son Evert, for four years, and then to all the children. I make my daughter, Sarah Pell, and my daughter Hannah Byvanck, alias Harrison, and my son Evert, executors. Dated April 29, 1768. Witnesses, Sarah Borom, wife of George Borom, William Haviland, Robert Leycroft. Proved, August 16, 1773.
