

-- CADMUS --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

"Abraham Codmus, of Second River, Essex Co., merchant," left a will dated 27 Oct 1759, proved 20 Feb 1760. In it he mentioned wife, Chertey and children Thomas, Peter, John Speere, Abraham Speere and Mary King. Homestead of 14 acres bought of Simeon Vrelandt and wife, Marretye; small lot adjoining, bought of Franscoys Wouterse; lot of 25 a., 49 rods on the Third River, Newark, bout of Malicut Codmus, and wife, Elizabeth; also personal property. Executors named wre sons John Speere and Thomas Codmus. Witnesses were Thomas Codmus, Corneleya Caddemus, William Hawhey.

An inventory of the estate, valued at £139.6.0 was made 11 Mar 1760 by Samuel Whittimore and William Dow.

Dirck Frederickszen was one of [if not] the first to adopt the "Cadmus" surname.

Jannetje's father gave her land in Bayonne which remained in the Cadmus family for generations.

In 1735, Dirck Cadmus of Bergen and his brother-in-law Adrian Vermeule, purchased a large tract of land (660 acres) in the Blue Hills area of what would become Plainfield, Union, NJ. Adrian Vermeule died at Bergen shortly after the purchase, but his widow and 2 sons, Frederick who never married and Cornelius, occupied two-thirds of the purchase at once. Dirck Cadmus never came, but his son Andries occupied his third about 1765.²

Many of their children probably took the patronymic surname "Frederickson."

In 1692, Frederick Thomasen [Cadmus] owned property at Slotterdam on the east side of the Passaic River, across from Acquackanonk [Passaic, NJ], but continued to live in Bergen (per Cadmus Family). The last time he and Geertje appeared together was on 3 Apr 1712, when they wit. a bap. of a gr.child at Bergen Ref Ch (bap.#453). The Bergen Ref Ch.(bur.#302) record states "Fredrik Cadmus" d. 8 Nov 1745, and was bur. 10 Nov 1745. In all other RDCh. records his surname was given as the patronymic Thomase or Thomasen, not Cadmus which many of his descendents later used. Nevertheless, this death notice may refer to him though he would have been 98 at death!

Col. Peter Cadmus served in the American Revolution; was a "Minute Man" and also in the Essex Co. Militia.³

During a scuffle with the British in 1780 Blandina Kipp Cadmus hid her children from the British in a large oven and suffered serious injuries from bayonet wounds from her refusal to tell the British where the local men could be found. Blandina survived her wounds and the children emerged from the oven when Peter Cadmus and his brother heard the disturbance at the house and came running.¹

In their marriage intentions, filed 26 May 1646 Amsterdam, they are (translated from the Dutch): Appeared as before Thomas Frericx from Amsterdam 34 years old, seaman, [living] in the Halve Maen steech, having no parents, and Maritie Ariaens from Amsterdam, 18 years old, assisted by Ariaen Ariaens, [living] in the Blindeman steech.¹

His parents filed intentions to marry 16 Sep 1606 Amsterdam: [Translation] Appeared as before Freric Thomasz from Groeningen, dyer, 30 years old, living on the Lijnbaen Dwarsgracht, declaring to have no parents, on the one side, and Fransje Cornelis[dr], 24 years old, living at the same place [] mother [] [] on the other side [both signed with a mark]. Frederick Thomasz and Fransje Cornelis subsequently married on 3 October 1606 in Amsterdam.¹

Her father, Adriaen Adriaens was of Delft, Holland; her mother, Tryntje Stevens, was of Munster, Westphalia, Germany. They were married 25 Nov 1618 Amsterdam.¹

He had several siblings, among them two sisters who emigrated to the new world, Celitje Frederickdr, bp. as Selijtje 10 May 1608 Amsterdam Nieuw Kerk, m. 11 Jan 1632 Amsterdam Nieuw Kerk, Andries Jochemszen; and Neeltje Fredericksdr, bp. (as Cornelia) 21 Feb 1621 Amsterdam Oude Kerk, m. Claes Hendrickszen (Van Schoonhoven).¹

They probably immigrated smetime between May and Sep 1650. They lived at New Amsterdam, Fort Orange, Communi-paw, and Bergen.

Thomas is found as "Thomas Cuyper" ca 1649, listed as a Member of the DRC in NY). However in all other records from 1650 on he is listed as Thomas Fredericks (and variations in spelling). The "Cadmus" surname did not come into use until the early 1700s, and the origin of the name remains elusive.
