The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...November 26, 1747. I, Abraham Cannon, of Staten Island, yeoman, being in good health. I leave to my dearly beloved wife Janake my bed which I lie on and the furniture thereto belonging, and a horse and saddle, and all the pewter that she hath bought since she hath been my wife. I leave to my son Isaac my sword, as being my eldest son. I leave to my son David all my lands and meadows and buildings on Staten Island, and 4 horses, a plow, and my gun and cane, and œ40. I leave to the children of my son Abraham £40, "but £25 of the said £40 is to be paid to Anthony Doshen, son of Isrene Doshen, deceased." I leave to my son Andrew £40. To my son John £40 and two horses. These legacies are to be paid by my son David. I leave to my wife £6 yearly. I make my son David and Henry Corsen executors. Witnesses, Alse Merrell, John Merrell, Richard Merrell. Proved, June 9, 1755. David Cannon was then the surviving executor.

In his will, he wrote: 12 day of March, 1710. I, Andrew Cannon, of Richmond County, being sick and weak, but praised be God of perfect remembrance. I leave to my eldest son, Abraham Cannon, one cow, in full of his pretence as heir at law. I leave to my son Andrew all that my Plantation on Staten Island at a place called the Long Neck adjoining to Phillip Chashee, with all the improvements. When he is of age the Plantation is to be appraised, and he shall pay to his sister Anna one-third of its value. If he die under age then the Plantation is to go to my four children, Abraham, John, Catalina and the heirs of my daughter Hester, and they are to pay to my daughter Anna one-third. All the rest of my estate I leave to my wife Anna, the better to enable her to pay my debts and for her comfortable living, and I make her executor. Witnesses, Augustus Grasset, Elias Neau, William Huddleston. "The above is in the handwriting of Andrew Cannon." Proved, March 27, 1711.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Cannon, of New York, boatman, being sick, this 17 of October, 1746. I leave to my son John, £10, in lieu of all his claim as heir at law. I leave to my wife Mary so much of my household furniture and kitchen stuff as she thinks proper or convenient to take; Also all the rents and profits of my real and personal estate, and the sum of £40 yearly. My executors are to sell all my real estate, and if any of my children desire to have the same and will give as much as a stranger, they may have it. My executors may sell, with consent of my wife, all my personal estate and the proceeds to be divided among my children, Janette, wife of John Goelet, John, Hester Kortright, Mary, wife of Evert Byvanck, Peter, Catharine, wife of Cornelius Van Ranst, Andrew, and Abraham, and Sarah, wife of John Schermerhorn. I make Raphael Goelet and Abel Hardenbrook, executors. Witnesses, Lewis Kierstead, Peter Martyne, Simon Johnson. Proved, October 5, 1748.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Mary Cannon, of New York, widow. I leave to my son, John Cannon, 10 shillings, in bar of any claim as eldest son and heir at law. I leave all the rest of my estate, real and personal, to my children and grandchildren, viz., To my son John, and my daughter Jannettie, wife of John Goelet, Hester, widow of Cornelius Kortright, and Mary, wife of Evert Byvanck, each 1/8, And 1/8 to Aernout, John, Mary, and Catharine, the children of my son Peter Cannon, deceased, And 1/8 to my son Andrew and to my daughter Sarah, wife of John Schermerhorn, To receive their respective shares when of age. My executors are to sell the estate. I make my friends, Francis Marschalk and Joris Brinkerhoff, executors. Dated April 16, 1751. Elizabeth Compton, in her will, dated 3 April 1744, proved 12 Oct 1745, wrote: ...I, Elizabeth Compton, of New York, widow of David Compton, Sr., after the payment of all debts, I give all the remainder of my estate "for reasons best known to me" to Sarah and Mary Cannon, daughters of my affectionate friends and benefactors, Mr. John Cannon, Jr., and Jerusha, his wife, viz., all my land, tenements, and goods and all estate, and I make John Cannon, Jr., and his wife Jerusha executors.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Cannon, of New York, merchant, being in good health. I leave to my son John £5, and my large silver bowl, in bar to all claims as heir at law. Of all the rest of my estate, real and personal, I leave 1/4 to my son John, 1/4 to my son Le Grand, 1/4 to my grandson, John Samuel Cannon, son of my son Andrew, deceased, and 1/4 to my grand-

son, John Pintard, son of my daughter Mary, deceased. I also leave him a negro girl. I leave to my wife Hemica, daughter of Thomas Sickles, and widow of Nicholas Swan, £25 yearly, as by a marriage contract made December 18, 1759. I make my sons John and Le Grand executors. Dated May 9, 1761. Witnesses, Benjamin Payne, Evert Byvanck, Peter Van Ranst. Proved, October 19, 1762. [NOTE.--John Cannon owned several lots on the north side of Water street, east of Beekmans Slip (now Fulton street), and they were called Cannon's wharf.--W. S. P.]
