The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

The progenitor of one of the Christie families of northern New Jersey was James Christie, who was born in Aberdeen and bp. 9 Oct 1670 at Sterlingshire, Scotland. He came to America in 1699, settled in Bergen County, and married 18 Sep 1703 Hackensack, Magdalena Demarest.

Others of the surname were in America as soon or sooner: In 1661, one James Christie, a native of Scotland, abt. 30 years of age at that time, bought a dwelling house at Newtown, Queens County, Long Island, N.Y. He was still living at Newtown in 1665, but the following year his widow Sarah married Humphrey Clay. —Riker, James, Jr., The Annals of Newtown, in Queens County, New York, 1852, p. 55 text and 59, footnote

David J. Christie was a Bergen County judge and Surrogate of Bergen County.

He and his wife bought, on 1 March 1837 a house and 97.15 acres from Benjamin Westervelt and his wife, Dianna Tallman. This was the house known today as "the Old Stone House" in what is now Ramsey, Bergen Co., NJ. David J. Christie and Maria, his wife, sold the house with 95 acres on 11 May 1852 to Abraham Van Horn.

They moved to New York City after their marriage, where he followed the trade of stone cutting. In 1835, he bought the farm of Garret Meyer at English Neighborhood, and retired from business.

In 1835 the "Homestead" lot of Garrett Myers, located northwest of the intersection of the Fort Lee and Hackensack Turnpike and English Neighborhood Road, was conveyed from Garrett Myers to David Christie. The house in which David Christie lived, however, was located on the northeast of the intersection. The building located on the southwest side of the intersection is probably the same building indicated on the 1865 Chapman map as the "D. Carlock Hotel." The parcels of land which David Christie owned were subdivided among family members when he died in 1848. The parcel located southeast of the intersection of the Fort Lee and Hackensack Turnpike and English Neighborhood Road was conveyed to Mary Christie Romaine, who built the "Romaine House" which is extant today and located at 107 Romaine Place.²

James Christie sailed from the port of Leith in the summer of 1698 on the ship "Caledonia," one of 5 ships in a fleet called the Patterson expedition, attempting to found a Scots colony in the Isthmus of Darien (Panama). This attempt failed, and in August 1699, Christie came to New York and settled at Hackensack, Bergen County, N.J. The original Christie homestead was in present-day Dumont, Bergen Co., NJ on the east side of Schraalenburgh Road.

James Christie enlisted as a Private in Capt. Jonathan Kinsay's Co., Col. Ephraim Martin's 4th Reg NJ Continental Line

July 1777 for the war. Transferred to Capt Lloyd's Co., Col. Israel Shreve's 2nd Reg NJ Continental Line 1780-81. He was a Private, Capt. Cyrus DeHart's Co., Light Infantry, Lt. Col. Francis Barberi Reg NJ Continental Line Apr 11, 1781 by detail from Capt. Lloyd's Co. He was a Corporal, Capt. Nathaniel Leonard's 8th Co. Col. Mathais Ogden's Regiment NJ Continental Line. He was on the rolls Mar 1-May 20, 1783 with remark "Present" at close of Rev. War. He was a dispatch rider for the army.¹

Elizabeth Cooper contracted small pox while nursing soldiers in the Rev. War and died at Mahwah during the Revolution.¹

James Christie became a circuit rider and schoolteacher at Mahwah, NJ.¹

This James Christie (and wife Grietje) are probably the witnesses in the following transaction: On 6 April 1796 (recorded 12 Aug 1805, Bergen Co. V:51) Jacob Van Zaan of the Township of Franklin, cordwainer, and Rachel, his wife, conveyed to Daniel Yeomans of the Town of New Hempsted, County of Orange, State of New York, cordwainer, for £340, three parcels: (1) 50 acres in the Township of Franklin, beginning near the corner of Lane or Road that leads to the ponds; mentioned old lot formerly the property of Helming Post. (2) also another lot in the Township of Franklin lying on Main Road that leads from the ponds church to Totowa Church on N side of Road, beginning on Road opposite line of John C. Banta and Jacob Van Rypen; mentioned line of Cornelius Mire. (3) 27 acres more or less lying on same side of Road between the houses of said John C. Banta and Jacob Van Derbeek, beginning opposite line of said John C. Banta and Jacob Van Rypen; mentioned land of Richard Dikeman. (4) estate right of said Jacob Van Zaan and Rachel his wife, of said three lots. Signed by Jacob Van Zaan, Rachel Van Zaan (her mark). Witnessed by James Christie, Grietje Christie (her mark).²

James Christie was a Loyalist. He disappeared from Bergen County and then reappeared after the Revolution at Boiling Springs (today's Rutherford). He was a blacksmith by trade and had property in New Brunswick and/or Nova Scotia, Canada, probably granted him by the British government.

Simon Demarest is said to have built the first of a series of inns on what is now Franklin Turnpike in Ramsey, Bergen Co., NJ on 108-1/2 acres leased from the Proprietors. At the time there was an inn in Hackensack operated by David Demarest, and it is believed that the Ramsey inn was operated under the family name and license (Demarest Inn). In colonial days the public inns were licensed by the Board of Freeholders of the county. In 1779 the property was owned by Aaron Demarest, who was a British Loyalist, so it was seized by the state and sold to John W. Christie and Wiert J. Banta, the latter being Christie's brother-in-law and the son of a woman member of the Demarest family

John W. Christie was listed as a private in 1776 in the Bergen County Militia under Col. Theunis Dey. John was taken prisoner by the British and held in the Old Sugar House for 6 weeks.

On 11 March 1795, Abraham Brower sold the premises at the southeast corner of what is now Henley Avenue and River Road in New Milford, Bergen Co., NJ to John Christie, a blacksmith. In the July 1795 tax rateables, John Christie was taxed as the owner of a house, one horse and two horned cattle. In November 1796, the surveyors of the highways mentioned "the

Tavern of John Christie." In his will, he provided his "beloved wife Lena" with "as much house room and privileges as she may want in and about my present premises where I now live and also \$150 out of my personal estate." He bequeathed "all of my lot of land together with the improvements thereon, whereon I now live, lying on the east side of the road [River Road]" to his son John J. Christie.¹

On 16 June 1806 (recorded 19 June 1806, Bergen Co.
