

-- CLOPPER --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Cornelius Jansen Clopper, from Bergen op Zoom, was living in New York as early as 1652. The Smiths Valley was named from the fact that Cornelius Jansen Clopper, a blacksmith, established his shop on the corner of present Maiden Lane and Pearl Street.<sup>1</sup>

In the record of their marriage intentions at NYC Ref Ch, they were: Cornelis Janszen Clopper, Van Bergen op Zoom, en Heyltje Pieters, Van Amsterdam.

In his will, he wrote: 10th day of September, in the morning, about 8 o'clock, in the year 1669, appeared in their own persons before me, Nicholas Bayard, Secretary of the Mayor's Court of New York, with the under named witnesses, Cornelius Jansen Clopper, master Smith, and his wife Heyltie Clopper, lawfully joined in matrimony, living in this city, known to me and to the witnesses. The said Cornelius Clopper being sick, and the said Heyltie of indifferent health, being in child bed." Their will is that the survivor of the two is to have all the estate, to bring up and support the five under-aged children, Dinah, Margaretta, Johannah, Catharina and Petrenella, "and such other children as may be procreated." If the survivor should marry, the children are to have their portions. Witnesses, Jan Vinge, John Johnson, Van Brestede. Letters of administration are granted to his widow Heyltie Clopper, June 24, 1693.

In her will, she wrote: New York, October 14, 1700. Helike Clopper "late widow of Cornelius Clopper; being sicke."  
"Whereas my husband Shuart Olpherts hath with me signed certain deeds, at my instance, for the better satisfaction of purchasers and my children, my children are to give him security to be held harmless in the same." Leaves all the rest of estate to her children or their heirs, namely 1/6 to the 3 children of my eldest son Johanes Clopper, Eightie, Cornelis and Anatjie. 1/6

to my son Cornelis Clopper. 1/6 to my daughter Margaret, wife of Olphert Shuarts. 1/6 to Catalina, wife of John Stevens. 1/6 to Peterneel, wife of Albertus Van de Water. 1/6 to Dinah, wife of Wm. Cooley. My son in law Olphert Shuarts is to have the ground adjoining his lot as far as Nicholas Autom Bogart's land extendeth. Proved (???), 1700. Witnesses, Zacharias Sickles, Wm. Huddleston.

In his will, he wrote: ...February 11, 1772. I, Hendrick Klapper, of Claverack, in Albany County, blacksmith. I leave to my eldest son, William, for his birthright, £5, which shall be deducted from the debt he owes to my estate. I leave to my sons, George and Frederick, all my farm and improvements where I now dwell. And they are to maintain my wife Margaretha in such a manner as my executors may think proper. "I leave to the Reformed Protestant Congregation in Claverack known by the name of the New Church, standing near the Ministry House, 20 shillings, and the same to the Reformed Protestant Congregation in Rhinebeck." I leave to my son George my Great German Bible. I leave to my daughter Catharine my Great Copper Kettle. All the rest I leave to my four sons, Hendrick, Coert, Adam, and Peter, and to my wife, Anna Margaretha, and to my daughters, Anna, wife of Jost Kelder, Elizabeth, wife of Richard Blameless, Barbara, wife of William Snyder, Catharina, and Gertrude. I make my beloved friends, John Van Alen, Esq., and Capt. Richard Esselstyne, executors. Witnesses, Francis Hasdyck, Jr., Benedictus Valkener, Peter Weisner. Proved, January 29, 1773.

Whereas John Clopper, of New York, lately died intestate, Letters of Administration are granted to his widow Margaret Clopper, April 1, 1695. Quietus granted to Magdalena Clopper, as administrator of John Clopper. Account stating that the whole estate was £848, 12, 9. He left one child, Ilien, by a former wife, and two children, Cornelius and Anna, by his last wife, Magdalena. "The said Ilien Clopper having chosen her grand father Shuert Olpherts as her guardian, and she has been paid £130 as her portion, July 9, 1697.

Margaret Clopper died intestate, and letters of administration on her estate were granted to her son, Cornelius Clopper, on

13 Jan 1710/11.
