The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

The immigrant Coeyman's grandson, Andries, twice represented the Van Rensselaers in the Colonial Assemblies, the only non-family member to do so. -- Bob Protzmann

Andries Coeymans owned the house on the south corner of Bridge and Whitehall streets, in New York. Andreas divided his father's estate among his brothers and sisters, and came to the "Jerseys." He purchased some four hundred acres in the Raritan valley. In time he acquired four hundred acres more in what is now known as Roycefield.

He built the Coejeman manor house at Raritan in 1736. The bricks, much of the interior finishings and the furniture came from Holland. Anna S. Osbourne, writing in 1912, described the house: In the eastern corner of the house is the date still intact, and the same window sash of oak, with its tiny panes, upon which is scratched the name of many an old friend. The door-locks, with their old crests, are rather a curiosity to the casual visitor. The basement contained ten apartments. The first floor with its wide-arched hall and four large rooms shows how perfectly the house was completed. Each room has its mammoth fire-place, which was originally faced and floored with Egyptian marble, upon which were cut various Scripture texts. The firebacks are still in place with their odd little cherubs, that have not seen the light of day in half a century. The mantles were of richly-carved mahogany. While no one knows that Washington ever visited the Coejeman house, Lafayette danced in the west parlor. Undoubtedly many heroes of the Revolution have crossed its threshold.

In his will dated 1 July 1741, probated 15 Oct 1741, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. Be it known and manifest that I, Andries Coeymans, of Somerset County, New Jersey, Gent., being sick and weak. My executors have full power to sell all lands which I have in New York or New Jersey. I leave to my son, Samuel Staats Coeymans, £100 as a birth right; Also my large two eared silver cup, and my large silver tankard; Also £500 over and above what I have given to him, when he is of age, Provided he marries with the consent of his mother, Gertrude Coeymans. I leave to my daughters, Joana, Maybe, and Gertrude, each £500, on the same condition. My wife is to remain in full possession of all estate, and after her death all to go to my children. I make my wife Gertrude, and my beloved brother-in-law, Lewis Morris, Jr., and my nephew, Brandt Schuyler, executors. Dated, "July 1, in 15 year of George II." (1741). Witnesses, Nicholas Gouverneur, John Broughton, Joseph Clarke. Proved, October 15, 1741.¹

Barent Pietersz Kojjemans sailed in den *Harinck* from the Texel May 1639, arriving at New Amsterdam 7 July 1639. He was engaged for six years at Rensselaerswyck, beginning 14 Aug 1639. He worked for four years under Pieter Cornelisz, the millwright, and later worked at both saw and grist mills. After 1645 he is sometimes referred to as Barent de Molenaer (the Miller). On 19 Jan 1651 he was called swaeger (bother in law) of Andries de Vos. A brother by the name of Lucas Pieterz is mentioned in Rensselaerswyck court proceedings in 1650.

Andries de Vos, his sister Gertruydt (m. Barent Pietersz Coeymans), his wife and at least 3 children sailed on *den Eyckenboom* on 17 May 1641.²

Barent Pietersz later bought a tract of land at present Coeymans, NY where he and many of his descendants lived. This tract of about 12 miles square was granted to Barent Pietersen Coeymans in 1673. It included the north part of New Baltimore in Greene County, NY.

Robert Hunter, Captain-General and Governor. Whereas Barent Coeymans, late of the County of Albany, Gent, lately died intestate, Letters of administration are granted to the eldest son and heir Andries Coeymans, October 20, 1712. [Note.--The persons mentioned in above were the owners of the tract of land known as Coeymans Patent, embracing a tract 12 miles square, on the west side of Hudson's river, and now includes the town of New Baltimore, and lands adjacent in Greene County and Albany County. The rocky islet known as "Beeren Island," which figures so prominently in the veracious Diedrich Knickerbocker's "History of New York," is near the southeast corner of this Patent.--W. S. P.]¹

Except forty acres, which I give and bequeath to my two daughters Sarah Brown and Jemima Queman, that is to say twenty acres to my daughter Sarah Brown and twenty acres to my daughter Jemima Queman. Fifthly, my son John being a poor man and deranged in his senses must live with his mother and be under her jurisdiction during her life and if in case my wife should die before him, then my sons and daughters must keep him in a Christians like manner and share his land and estate between them all doing their part alike. And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former Testament, Wills, legacies bequest and executors. Sixthly, I constitute, make, and ordain my loving wife Executor and Elias Vreeland Executor of this my last will and testament ratifying and conforming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In his will, he wrote: I, Samuel Coeymans, of the manor of Rensselaerwyck, being advanced in years, but of sound mind. All debts and funeral expenses to be paid. I leave to my wife Catrina all personal estate, to do therewith as she shall think fit. I leave to my nephew, Andries Ten Eyck, 1/2 of all that tract or parcel of land situate near Achquetock, on the north side of the Hanacroys kill or creek, beginning at a certain cedar post marked with a cross, 25 paces from a certain small creek which is on the east side of a certain piece of land called the Popple Vlachte (Poplar Flat), and thence a thousand paces broad, and thence west till it makes a thousand paces above the Popple Vlachte, thence south to the bounds of David Ver Planck, and thence along the said bounds to the division line between Thomas Witbeck and Andries Ten Eyck, Together with the house, barns, barracks, and other improvements, and now in the possession of said Andries Ten Eyck, And he is to pay yearly to my wife 10 shillings. The other 1/2 of said tract I leave to the children and grand children of my nephew, Coenradt Ten Eyck, deceased, viz., Jacob C. Ten Eyck, Anthony Ten Eyck, Barent Ten Eyck, Tobias Ten Eyck, Margaretie Ten Eyck, Geritie, wife of Peter Gansevoort, and Elizabeth Bradt, daughter of Geritt Bradt, deceased, And they shall pay yearly to my wife 10 shillings. And it is my will that Geritie Ten Eyck, widow of Coenradt Ten Eyck, shall enjoy the rents during her life.
