The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He kept a country store in the vicinity of Coldenham, but before 1743 removed to Newburgh, where he engaged in more extensive mercantile pursuits, and aided by his enterprise its early commercial prosperity. In 1751 he was appointed Joint Surveyor General of the Province with his father, and succeeded him in that office in 1761-2, at which time he removed from Newburgh to New York City. He was a vestryman of Trinity Church from 1761 until his death, and Post Master of New York for some years prior to, and at the time of his decease.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Alexander Colden, of Brookland, in Kings County, Esq., being sick and weak, September 24, 1773. My body to be decently buried at discretion of executors, "The expense thereof not to exceed £50." After all debts and funeral expenses are paid, "a gold ring shall be purchased and given to my beloved wife Elizabeth, to be fashioned in such a

manner as she shall chuse, and a plain one to each of my children, viz. Richard Nicolls Colden and his wife Harriet, my son-in-law Archibald Hamilton and his wife Alice, John Antill and his wife Margaret, Anthony Farrington and his wife Elizabeth, my daughter Jane, my son John, and to my brother Cadwallader Colden and his wife Elizabeth, and my brother David Colden and his wife Ann, and my brother-in-law Dr. William Farquhar, and Rev. Samuel Auchmuty and Dr. Peter Middleton." "I leave to my wife Elizabeth £500, and all such rings, diamonds, jewels, neck laces, and whatsoever properly belongs to her in particular use and wearing"; Also my chariot and horses, and my single horse chair, with the harness and furniture, also four negro slaves and eight negro children; Also the use of all my plate, except two pieces, and all bedding and linnen and woolen, and all household goods during her life, with full power to dispose of the same to my children or their children. "To prevent any imbezzlement, an inventory is to be taken, and my wife is to enter into a covenant with my executors not to make any waste." I leave to my son John "my negro fellow Tom and a negro woman and child," and my gold watch and seal, and my fowling pieces and pistols, and my silver-hilted sword and all my library of books and cases for papers, and my bureau or desk and my iron chest, my weekly clock, reflecting telescope, and all my surveying and mathematical instruments. I leave to my son John £200, to be put at interest until he is 21; Also all the message and lots where I now reside, purchased from John Talman, in Brookland, with all the wagons and farming tools, But my wife is to have the profits till he is 21. If my son John dies without issue, my wife is to have the use for life, and then to my grandson, Alexander Colden, son of Richard Nicolls Colden, and Harriet, his wife, and to my grandson, Alexander M. Hamilton, son of Archibald Hamilton and Alice his wife, and my grandson, John Collins Antill, son of John Antill and Margaret his wife, and my grandson, Charles Farrington, son of Anthony Farrington and Elizabeth his wife. I leave to my daughter Jane £200 when of age or married, "provided she does not marry against the good liking and consent of my wife or executors." I leave to my granddaughters, Mary Elizabeth Jane Douglass Hamilton, Alice, and Margaret Campbell Hamilton, the daughters of Archibald Hamilton, and Elizabeth, daughter of Anthony Farrington, £100 each. I leave to my son, Richard Nicolls Colden, 1/2 of the Town lots and appurtenances in Newburgh, in Ulster County, which I own with Abraham Hasbrouck, and a lot I purchased from James Smith, and a lot I purchased from John Humphrey, Jr., "adjoining to the lot called Newburgh lot," "together with the ferry granted to me by Letters Patent"; Also a lot purchased from Mary Alexander, wife of the late James Alexander, Esq., and John Spratt, jointly by me and Burgher Wyndertse, situate at Newburgh; Also a lot called Beaver Dam lot, being part of a tract granted to Alexander Baird, and purchased by me from William Brown, Esq., of Salem, Massachusetts; Also 3/4 of 3 tracts in Ulster County, granted by Letters Patent to George Harrison. I leave to my grandson, Alexander M. Hamilton, 1/4 of a tract of 4,000 acres, granted to myself, William Willett, Stephen De Lancey, and Christopher Blundell, and lying on both sides of the Mohawk river, below the land called Huntersfield or the German Flats, and the land known by the name of Cosby's Manor; Also all my undivided share of a tract at Schoharie, granted to Henry Ten Eyck, John Rutse Bleecker, and others, adjoining to the Patent known as the Old Schoharie Patent. I leave to my grandson, Charles Farrington, all my part of a tract granted to Johanes Lawyer and others, in which Goldsbrow Banyer is interested; Also my part of a tract granted to Joseph Webb and others, the said Joseph Webb's now being used in trust for me. I leave to my daughter Jane all that lot or lots of land and Island within Butler's Purchase nigh to Duanesburgh. I leave to my son, Richard Nicolls Colden, all my lands in the township of Cambridge. I leave to my son John all my lands in the township of Pittstown. To my daughter, Alice Hamilton, all those lots on the north side of the Mohawk river in a tract known as Magin's Purchase. To my daughter, Margaret Antill, all my lots in a tract on the north side of the Mohawk river, lying on the north of Magin's Purchase, and between the two creeks known by the name of Canada Creeks. To my daughter, Elizabeth Farrington, all that lot on the south side of Mohawk river granted to Frederick Young, Cornelius Ten Broeck, and others; Also part of a lot on the south side of Mohawk river, in a tract known by the name of Schuyler's Purchase. I leave to each of my granddaughters £100, "to be used by my wife and executors in such a way that the fathers of the said granddaughters shall have nothing to do with it." I leave to my grandson, Alexander Colden, "my two eared silver cup, known by the name of Cawdle Cup," and my silver tobacco box "with a Coronet and letter L." All the rest of my personal estate to be sold, and the money paid to my children. I make my wife, and my son, Richard Nicolls, and my son-in-law, John Antill, executors; and my sons-in-law, Archibald Hamilton and Anthony Farrington, Trustees. "This will, on three sheets, signed on each sheet." Witnesses, Joseph Keys, of Bedford, Kings County, tailor, John McDonald, Bartholemew Besley. Proved, December 16, 1774. [NOTE.--Alexander Colden, the oldest son of Gov. Cadwallader Colden, died December 12, 1774, and was buried in Trinity Churchyard. He was Postmaster and Surveyor General.--W. S. P.]

- **Richard Nicolls Colden**, d. Aug 1777; m. **Henrietta Maria Bethune** (Harriet). He graduated at Columbia (then Kings) College, in the class of 1766, and on the 27th of August, of that year, was made Ensign in the 42d Royal Highlanders, then stationed in Pennsylvania. He left the army at the close of 1771, or early in 1772, returned to New York with his family, was appointed Surveyor and Searcher of Customs there, which office he held at the time of his death. He m. Henrietta Maria Bethune, a Scotch lady of the Isle of Man, while with his regiment in that place. His death was announced by Gov. Tryon to Lord Germain, 24th August, 1777, and probably occurred a day or two before that date.

- **John Colden**. He was an officer in the British Army, was lost at sea, without children.
- **Alice Colden**, d. during the Revolution; m. (license 16 July 1766), **Archibald Hamilton**

Cadwallader C. Colden was educated at the University of Edingburgh, studying for the ministry, but later becoming interested in the sciences and medicine. He came to Philadelphia in 1710 (returning later to London and Scotland). Upon his return to America, he settled in New York and became, about 1718 the Surveyor General for the Province of New York. Later, about 1722 he became a member of the King's Council for the Province of New York.

He owned a quantity of land on the west side of the Hudson about nine miles from Newburgh, where he encouraged the settlement of emigrants. He made his home on his property, calling his place Coldenham.

In 1760 he was President of Council, and Lieutenant-Governor in 1761, and held this position until his death.

The Colden family settled at Coldenham, in Montgomery Precinct, about 1728. Cadwallader Colden lived here until about 1760 when, on the death of Governor Delancy, he became the acting Governor of the province, and after which he lived mainly in New York City and on Long Island. His firm stand in favor of the Acts of Parliament made him obnoxious to the people at the beginning of the Revolution, and he retired to his farm, called "Spring Hill," in Flushing (purchased from the Willett family), and died there September 28, 1776. The "Spring Hill farm" was confiscated and sold after the Revolution, and was later owned by Ezekiel Robins.¹

 - **David Colden**; b. 23 Nov 1733 O.S.²; m. **Ann Willet**, dau. of John Willet, and had four daughters and a son. He lived with his father and was his private secretary until his death in 1776. After the Revolution he went to Europe.
- * Rev. Alexander Colden was minister of Dunsie in Merse, Scotland.

Poughkeepsie in 1793, and in 1796 relocated in New York City; appointed district attorney in 1798 and again in 1810; colonel of Volunteers in the War of 1812; member of the State assembly in 1818; mayor of the city of New York in 1819; as a Federalist successfully contested the election of Peter Sharpe to the Seventeenth Congress and served from December 12, 1821, to March 3, 1823; member of the State senate 1824-1827; moved to Jersey City, N.J.; devoted much time to the completion of the Morris Canal; died in Jersey City, N.J., on February 7, 1834.³
