

-- COLLARD. COLLERD --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

The name Collard is probably Flemish in origin. It may have started as Caillard. It has been found spelled Cauillard, Callerd, Collord, and Callard, etc. Isaac from Antilles was the first in America. They settled in Westchester Co. NY around New Rochelle and Pelham Manor. They moved to Bergen, NJ (now Jersey City) and were among the earliest settlers of Morris Co., NJ. They were Huguenots, French Protestants.

Henry first shows up in Pequannock Township on the 1830 census. Pequannock at this time was Boonton, Montville, and then some. Parsippany was part of Hanover Twp. Persepeny is now Parsippany and at one time straddled the borders of Peq. and Hanover. The Peq. part became Montville. Boonton was originally known as 'the Falls', or Pequannock Falls. It was named for Gov. Boone (1760-1762). It was settled by 'Low Dutch' (History of Willis Family). While the town of Boonton was incorporated in 1867, old Boonton now lies under the reservoir.

In 1860, Henry lived in dwelling 299, family 311 in the census. He is 69; Sally is 61. He is born in Bergen; she in Morris. Real estate valued at \$2000. Pers. Prop. is \$2500. The house, which may still be standing, was purchased by Henry in 1857.

Doug Graham of the Reformed Church in Montville provided Henry's date of death. He also told me the name was spelled Collerd on the tombstone in the Church cemetery (it is also spelled that way in Church recs.) On Dec. 8, 1818, the Church was incorporated as The First Reformed Dutch Church of Montville (its title to this day), with John Collerd among the Elders signing. Henry was also active in the Church Consistory; he was a Deacon in the 1840's, elected treasurer 2 March 1844, and an Elder Sept. 18, 1847-Sept. 1, 1849 (RDC of Montville recs.film #0888747)

Henry's Will left all to Sarah, then to daughter Susan Jacobus except 2 acres to John plus \$200 after Sarah's death. James received \$700 under the same terms. Mariah (Zabriskie) received \$800. John and James were executors.

Among the items in Henry's inventory were: several mortgages held on others; \$242 in the Newark Saving Institution; a hive and bees (\$3); 20 fowls (\$5); 1 cow (\$40); 3 beds & 'bedding' (\$50); 1 'beaurow' (\$3); and 1 'guilt looking glass' (\$2). His personal property was valued at \$2762.50; household at \$103.50

In their marriage record, they were: James Caller, j.m. V. Westchester, met Marytje De Gree, j.d. V. Boswyk op L. Eilt., beide op de Mannor V. Fordham. Her probable sister, Jannetje De Gree, married the same day, at the same place, Sacharia Sikkels, Junior (Zachariah).

In his will, dated 19 Aug 1763, probated 29 April 1765, he left to his wife the use of the estate. Left to son Jacob "my silver hilted sword and Pistols. Rest to his 12 children, Wm., Michael, James, Isaac, John, Jacob, Mary, Jane, Keturah, Susannah, Rebecca, and Margaret. Witnesses John Lading, Yorst de be Vois, James De Graw.

Another abstract of his will: August 19, 1763. I, James Caller, of the Manor of Morrisania, in the County of Westchester, "knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die." "It is my will that my dearly beloved wife Mary shall have a full and quiet possession of all my estate during her widowhood, and when altering her condition it is my will that everything be disposed of by way of Vendue, and she have an equal share with my children." I leave to my eldest son William all my wearing apparell. To my youngest son Jacob my silver-hilted sword and one pistol. To my eldest daughter Mary one cow, "and she is to have her choice to take the second best." After the death or marriage of my wife, the remaining part of all my estate is to be divided among my 12 children, William, Michael, James, Isaac, John, Jacob, Mary, Jane, Katharine, Susanah, Rebecca, and Margaret, "share and share alike." I make my wife and son James, and Robert Gilmar, of Brookland, in Kings County, executors. Witnesses, John Godwing, Dunkel Yorst Debevois, James Degraw. Proved, April 29, 1765, before John Bartow, Surrogate.¹

They were married on the same day, and at the same church, as Johannis Van Houte, y.m., and Annatje Callerd, y.d.

In his will, dated 14 Jan 1823, probated 5 Jan 1830, he left to his wife Charity, he left 1 feather bed bedstead and furniture, 1 cow, and "all the property by heirship of her mother." James and Henry were to give her "a good and decent maintenance during her widowship". James recieved 1/3 of John's Pequannock property. This ran "along the north side of the farm, that is to say on the east side of the road to the brook through the woodlands to the mountain. 1/3 on the north side including I purchased from the (?). Also 1/3 of the lot on the west side of the road being on the north side of the lot to the meadow then 1/3 of the meadow on the Rockaway River." Henry recieved the other 2/3, a horse and waggon, farming utensils and 1/2 the sheep and cattle. They divided 32 acres at Stony Brook. Charity received \$300. Among John's possessions were: 3 featherbeds & furniture (\$90.00); 4 head horned cattle (\$100); 2 horses (\$100); 2 'waggons' with harness (\$48); 8 sheep (\$20). Other items included 5 cider barrels and 5 cedar casks (\$1.121/2); books (\$4); 7 silver teaspoons and 2 looking glasses(\$5); a brass pistol (\$1.50) and a pigeon net (\$2). Total inventory : \$443.25.

John's Will was proved at New Barbadoes in Bergen Co. This was on the east side of the Passaic river above where Belleville is now located in Passaic Co. He stated he was a resident of Bergen Twp. in Bergen Co.

John was a church official in the RDC of Montville. He also appears to have been a clerk in the Bergen RDC. This was the 1st established RDC in NJ, chartered by Gov. William Franklin Dec. 20, 1771 and reincorporated in 1779. Before regular Ministers (or Dominie), the churches had 'Voorleezers', who kept records, taught school, etc. After the Bergen Church recieved a full time Minister, John became a clerk from 1789-1809 (Documents Relating to the Colonial History of the State of New Jersey Vol. 22 p394) He was an Elder of the Persepeny/Montville Church.
