The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Cock, of New York, cooper, being sick and weak, May 29, 1773. My executors are to pay all debts. I leave to my son William 25, two gold rings, "and a silver table spoon, marked A. C. H., and all my wearing apparell; Also my silver watch." I leave to my daughter Hannah "one gold mourning ring of my former wife Hilah"; Also another gold ring and a silver milk pot, "and table spoon marked A. C. H., and six tea spoons," and all the wearing apparell of my former wife. I leave to my wife Anne, three silver table spoons marked A. C. H., and £5 for mourning. My executors are to hire out or sell my negro man, "Joseph," and pay the money to my wife and my children, William, Hannah, and Hilah. I leave to my three children "all those three certain lots in the Bowery in the Out Ward, now in occupation of George Birke, butcher, subject to a mortgage to Robert Leake, Esq." I leave all the rest to my wife and children, and my executors are to sell the house where I now live. I make Joseph Jadwin and Mangle Minthorne, cooper, executors. Witnesses, Jasper Drake, Tavern keeper, Foster Lewis, Charles Morse. Codicil, July 26, 1773. My executors are to sell all my 3 lots in the Bowery in the Out Ward, and my dwelling house, to pay debts. Proved, November 8, 1773.

In his will, he wrote: ...This 7 day of March, 1771. I, Daniel Cock, Sr., of Oyster Bay, in Queens County, being in good health. "I leave to my wife Susanah all the goods and money that was hers before I married her, and all the goods that she had when her mother died." And if I should live longer than she, then to go as she wills it; Also the use of my oldest house, which is the east house "where she and I now live, and the room belonging to it, and part of the chamber, and a privilege in the kitchen with my daughter and her husband, Jacob Coles; Also the use of the barn and crib and the new shop, and my riding chair, and garden and new Hen House," And a house I bought of Henry Colwell; Also 2 cows, 6 sheep, "and some other certain things that she has got for herself by my consent," And £120, and the use of 1/4 of land and meadow, so long as she remains my widow, and no longer, "except the 3 acres in the Town Spot of Oyster bay. She is to have no right in that." "And I think that the agreement that I made before we were married, dated October 16, 1765, is fulfilled in this will. I leave to my granddaughters, Sarah Coles and Anne Coles, £100 each, when of age. After all debts are paid I leave 1/2 to my daughter, Sarah Coles, and 1/2 to her children. I leave to my daughter Sarah, wife of Jacob Coles, all my land and meadow, but not to be sold by her, except she has three living children. But the 3 acres in the Town Spot of Oyster Bay that I bought of Silas Weeks is to be hers in fee simple. After her death the other lands and to her children. "Each child to be brought up and have a reasonable good School Learning." Mentions "the sons of my brother Hendrick," "The children of my brother James," and "my other brother's and sister's children." I make my wife and my son-in-law, Jacob Coles, and my nephew, John Cock, son of my brother, Hendrick Cock, and my kinsman, James Townsend, son of William, executors. "I think there is no more that it is needful to mention here." Witnesses, Coles Carpenter, John Jackson, Sarah Carpenter, widow. Proved, May 1, 1771.

[Note.--The house and lot of Gallas Kock, is now Nos. 1-3 Broadway, the site being covered by the Washington building, which also covers the site of the house and lot of Captain Martin Cregier, who was a very prominent citizen in early days. His widow, Anna Kock (or Cox), married Lodowyck Post.--W. S. P.]¹

In his will, he wrote: ...24 day of February, 1732/3. I, Henry Cock, of Matinecock, in the Town of Oyster Bay, in Queens County, being very sick. I leave to my son Joseph, £20. To my son Benjamin, £5. I leave to my son John, a certain piece of meadow and creek thatch lying near the Fresh Pond, in Oak Neck, and all my right of land and swamp lying on the southeast part of my plantation, betwixt this plantation and Daniel Underhill's land, as the bounds now stand, and bounded southeast by the meadows. I leave to my son Samuel, 2 beds with furniture, and 1 great Cupboard and Looking Glass, and a warming pan, and 2 chests and all there is in them. It is my will that all my estate of land and meadow, lying in the town of Oyster Bay, shall be sold by my executors. I leave to my son John, £100, out of the proceeds of the sale, and £15 are to be taken to pay debts, the remainder to my sons Henry and Samuel. I leave to my 3 daughters, Mary, Sarah, and Elizabeth, £15 each. I leave to my 4 daughters, Amy, Mary, Sarah, and Elizabeth, all the rest of my movable estate. All my right of land upon the main, in Ridgabotts Point, in Mamaroneck, shall be sold, and the money to be paid to my 3 sons, John, Henry, and Samuel. I appoint my son John, and my cousins Joshua Cock and James Cock, executors. Witnesses, William Carpenter, William Hall, John Matchett. Proved in Hempstead, before George Clarke, Esq., May 18, 1733.

The tax list of 1665 (Records of New Amsterdam vol 5 p.223) shows "Wil Koeck" living on Pearl Street.

A 1674 list of owners in the 1896 Holland Society Yearbook shows a William Cook living on Pearl Street and shows him to be of English descent.

In his will dated 17 June 1688, he wrote: I William Cooke (or Kooke) of New York. I appoint for my sole and universall heir, my son Thomas Kook, procreated by my wife Sara Kook, deceased. 'Signed and sealed at the house of Dirck Janse Woertman within the jurisdiction of Brookland, in Kings County.'" Witnesses, Dirck Janse Woertman, Jan Vandewater. At a Court of Record held in New York, December 24, last, the will of Wm. Kooke was produced, and Harmsie Kooke, widow of Thomas Kooke, son of said Wm. Kooke having requested Letters of administration they are granted, (???) , 1690." Proved at Court of Records in New York, December 24, 1689. Inventory of the estate of William Kooke. Taken December 30, 1689. Houses in Pearl street, according to the Grond Brief. (List small, no value given.) [Note. -- The house of William Kooke was on the south side of Pearl street, west of Whitehall.]¹
