

-- CORNELISON --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

[This Claes Cornelissen Meutelaer/Van Schouw has been erroneously confused with the Claes Corneliszen who was the progenitor of the Wyckoff family \(and of Claes Cornelison Swits. Beware of confusion!](#)

Metje Harperts’s parents were married on the 1st November 1609 in the Oude Kerk (Old Church) in Amsterdam.¹

Claes appears to have hailed from Brouwershaven, a city on an island called Schouw or Schouwen, in the estuary of the Ooster-Schelde River, off the west coast of the Netherlands (Hoppin, vol. 3, p.173). Claes was born about 1605, judging from a deposition he gave on May 5, 1640 (HSNY, New York Historical Manuscripts: Dutch, vol. I, record 200): “This, date under-written, before me, Cornelis van Tienhoven, secretary in New Netherland, at the request of Hendrick Pietersen, mason, personally appeared Claes Cornelissen van Schouw, aged about 35 years ...” There has been some dispute as to the validity of this age estimate, as on February 19, 1664 Claes gives his age as 67, consequently having been born in 1597 (Hoppin, p. 181). It was the consensus of researchers Hoppin, Hoffman, and Peterson that Claes, memory was better in 1640 and, so, he was better able to reckon his age.

The Sloterdijck church record of their banns has been translated: “Appeared before me as before Claas Corneliss of Brouwershaven age 25 and Metgie Harpers from Amsterdam 20 years old assisted by Pietertje Jacobs and living as before in the Haerlemmerstraat. .” In the margin there is also writing which translates to “The banns have been read in Brouwershaven without hindrance. This persons have been married on the 21st of March 1632 in Sloterdijk by Mathijas Mursius, vicar.”³

He and his family had lived on the Island of Schouwen, and then went to Amsterdam, from whence he embarked for New Netherland. By about 1638, he had built a small house at Turtle Bay, NY, and set himself up in the trade of wheelwright. He was killed by an Indian; strangely enough, his son Cornelis was also later killed by an Indian.

On 19 February 1664, as Claes Cornelissen of Amersfoort (Claes Cornelisz "Meutelaer" Van Schouw) along with his son-in-law Sijmon Jansen van Arsdalen, he signs a deposition with the identical mark (according to Hoppin, "The Washington Ancestry ..." p. 177)

Land patent to Claes Cornelisz van Schouw "We, Willem Kieft, etc. ...have granted to Claes Cornelisz van Schouw a certain piece of land lying upon Long Island opposite Manhattan Island between the ferry and Andries Hudden Done 14 November 1642 at Fort Amsterdam in New Netherland." This land is now part of Brooklyn Heights. Goodwin states "Southward from the Ferry and along the present Heights and East River shore extended the farms of Claes Cornelissen Van Schouw, Jan Manje, Andries Hudde, Jacob Wolphertsen, Frederic Lubbertsen; and ex-Governor van Twiller had himself taken a grant. The ferry would become a landmark of sorts toward identifying Claes, family, as when daughter Geertje Claes "from the ferry" and her husband Hendrick Volckerssen baptised Jeuriaen on November 6, 1661 (HSNY, Brooklyn Church Records, p. 110), witnessed by Sijmen Janssen, Hermanus van Bossum, and Trijntje Claes.

Claes apparently [owned?] an island which bore his nickname, "Mutelaer" (or "grumbler"). It was recorded as such on several occasions, including on May 8, 1697 on p. 134 of Book 2 Conveyances (NYGBR, Vol. LIV, p. 250): "Coert Stevense, Lucas Stevense, John Stevense, Albert Stevense, John Kierstead, Barne Vriane, Alexander Sympon, and Albert Terhuynen deed Garrett Courte land in Flatlands bounded by that of Simon Janse and Hendrick Peterse also another lot bounded by property of Lucas Stevense, formerly in possession of Stephen Coerte and others and another lot bounded by lands of Lucas Stevense and Helena Aertsen and Claes Peterse also a lot on Mutelaer's Island (This is now Bergen Island) and also another lot in Flatlands bounded by lands of Tunis Janse, Hendrick Peterse and Cloisse Wyckoff. All sign but Alexander Sympon signs by mark. Wit. by John Terhuynen and John Hansen. Acknowledged May 8 and Recorded. May 12, 1697 by Henry ffilkin, Reg.

Tryntje Pieters decd., daughter of said Pieter Cornelissen, or Tielman van Vleeck's substitute, pltf., against Sybout Clazen, deft., for and on a/c of four hundred and forty guilders in question for four hundred boards at twenty two stivers each, which the pltf Simon Claazen Turc claims, in the quality, in which he acts, from Sybout Clasen; in opposition to which the deft.

Sybout Clasen concludes not to be indebted, inasmuch as he has satisfied and paid the same, producing certain proofs to this effect: All which vouchers, documents and papers and whatever is material produced by parties on each side being examined and weighed by Burgomasters and Schepens, they find by copy of a certain letter dated 19 May 1649 from Pieter Cornelissen and copied by D: v. Hamel, Secretary of the Colony of Reinselaerswyck, that Pieter Cornelissen agreeably to the demand of Symon Clazen Turck sold to Sybout Clasen four hundred boards @ 22 stiv: each amounting to four hundred and forty guilders abovementioned, of which fl. 440. he, Pieter Cornelissen, writes to Albert Andriessen [Bradt], that he had received from Sybout Clasen one hundred and sixty two guilders, and further sevety eight guilders, so that, he writes, there remain from Sybout Clase two hundred guilders, and that Catalyn and Joresy have promised him the balance and if he had it here to

send it up; and as it appears from Catalyn and Joresy's letter, that the fl. 200, which Sybout Clazen owned to Pieter Cornelissen, red'd by them, was sent up by them on 3d September 1649 to Albert Andriesen Noorman, whilst Pieter Cornelisn aforesaid was in the Virginias and the aforesaid sum of fl. 440. by the abovementioned Sybout Claen is satisfied and paid therefore the pltf's. suit instituted herein is dismissed and he is condemned to all the costs incurred in and relative to this suit. Thus etc. Marten Kregier.¹

28 Jan 1660 -- Burgomaster and Schepens of the City of Amsterdam in N: Netherland having considered, read and re-read the vouchers, documents and papers used on both sides in the suit between Tielman van Vleecck attorney of Symon Clasen Turck, (as husband and guardian of Merritje Pieters, daughter of decd. Pieter Cornelissen, millwright, and his lawful heir, as well as for himself as representing herein the orphan child of Tryntje Pieters, deceased daughter of said Pieter Cornelissen) pltf. against Dirck van Schelluyne, attorney of Albert Andriesen Noorman [Bradt], residing at Fort Orange, deft. relative to and concerning two hundred guilders, which Symon Clasen Turck is demanding from Albert Andriesen for so much, that Albert Andriesen has received from Joresy in the absence of Pieter Cornelissen, millwright, dated 3rd September 1649, done to the Virginias, and not computed by him nor made good as appears by contract mase between Albert Andriessen and Symon Clasen Turck by the intermediation of--Corlear and Dirck van Schelluyne according to acte thereof executed before D: V. Hamel, Secretary of the Colony of Reinselaars Wyck, dated 27th September 1658; and whereas the words of the contract read as follows--"Firstly, Symon Turck shall collect, receive, retain and dispose of as his own according to his pleasure, all outstanding debts receivable, wherever they may be, all effects and goods found in the house of the decd Pieter Cornelissen, whether belonging to him individually or to this Company or Association; On the other hand, Albert Andriesen assumes to himself all the debts payable where and to whomsoever they may be, relating to their partnership, whether these stand in the name of Pieter Cornelissen or his own name, promising to release Symon Clasen Turck from all claims relating hereunto." -- Having looked into, examined and wighed every thing material, Burgomaster and Schepens find it right, that the pltf's demand be dismissed, inasmuch as they find, that the two hundred guilders were not to be received, but were paid several years since to Joris Rapalje, who sent the same to Albert Andriessen Noorman and are accordingly not payable to the estate of Pieter Cornelissen, but whenever Symon Turck or his attorney can prove that, at the time of the settlement of a/cs and writing of the contract, Albert Andriesen Noorman [Bradt] notified Symon Turck, that he should receive the fl. 200., hereinbefore in question, from Sybout Clasen, then Albert Andriesen shall give and pay the abovementioned fl. 200 with costs and in default of proof the pltf. is condemned in the costs of suit. Regarding the demand in reconvention about certain planks, no disposition can be made therein as the same is moved according to the *Lites Contestatio*. Thus done and adjudged by the Burgomasters and Schepens of the City of Amsterdam in New Netherland as above. Adj. as above. Martin Kregier.¹
