The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In their marriage record, they were: Benjamin Cornell of Hempstead and Deborah Dean of Flushing, married at Hempstead.

They settled at Success, Flushing, NY.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Benjamin Cornell, of Hempsted, in Queens County, being this April 10, 1768, weak in body." I leave to my wife Deborah my chest and feather bed and œ20 yearly, to be paid by my children. I leave to my daughter Hannah a feather bed and furniture, and all the linnen marked with the first two letters of her name. I leave to my daughter Sarah a bed and a cow. My executors are to sell all the rest of my estate and pay all debts. All the rest I leave to my children, Mary, Hannah, Samuel, George, Ann Thorn, Clemmons, Sarah, John, Joseph, and Benjamin. I make my son-in-law, Stephen Cornell, and James Cornwell, executors. Witnesses, Thomas Everitt, Charles Hicks, Henry Hicks. Proved, April 26, 1768.

In his will, dated 21 Sep 1783, probated 2 March 1784, Benjamin of Hempstead named wife Mary who is pregnant; children Mary and Sarah, both minors; executors Martin Van Nostrand, Joseph Skidmore; witnessed by John Cornell of Hempstead, Caleb Cornell [grandson of Edward]. On 14 Oct 1784 Mary Cornwell (widow of Benjamin) to Martin Van Nostrand, mortgage \$200, 50 acres on road from Rockaway to Jamaica; witness John Cornell. 1770-80, son devisee and Executor of Edward takes land on west side of the Brooklands on the Plains. He is to pay his brother John £100.

They lived at Warwick, Orange Co., NY from about 1776-1800 then emigrated to west of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada in 1800 and stayed there until his death. Family consisting of 10 sons/1 dau. NY Census: 1790 and 1800 at Warwick.

He served as a private during the American Revolution in the Shepherd Co., Hathorn Regiment of the Orange Co. Militia Gabriel "Cornwall" and his family appeared in the 1790 New York Census at Warwick with 1 male 16 and older, 4 males under 16 and 1 female. He was also in the 1800 census in the same location with 3 males under 10, 3 males 10-16, 1 male 26-45, 1 female under 10 and 1 female 26-45. The family was missing from the 1810 New York Census.

Gabriel and his family moved to Canada around 1800 where he traded a yoke of oxen (presumably used in the move to Canada) to Conrad Cope for 50 acres of land in the north end of Lot 33, 1st Concession of Beverly Twp. His new neighbors included the Copes as well as Daniel Cornell.

A Beverly Twp. history relates, "Among the early settlers of the place (Christie's Corners) was Gabriel Cornell. To the east ....., there resided a man named Gabriel Cornell, who had nine sons." He was named as present at a meeting in 1817 of inhabitants of West Flamborough and Beverly Townships, including Moses and Samuel Cornell who were likely his sons above, and also John Keagy, Junior, John Heagy (prob. John Keagy, Sr.), Barnard Emery and Henry and Conrad Cope. (Both Keagy and Emery were later to become fathers-in-law to sons of Gabriel.) The 1819 assessment roll for West Flamborough Twp. recorded "Gabriel Cornwall" with 110 cultivated and 50 uncultivated acres on which he paid a tax of 8 shillings, 1 pence. On 20 June 1827, Gabriel, sr. sold a hotel at the Upper Corners, West Flamborough on the Waterloo Road. Probably the hotel belonged to his second wife, widow Eve Knowles.

Gabriel's will, dated 14 Mar. 1845, stated that he owned 96 acres in Beverly Twp., composed of the "Southerly part of lot number Thirty four in the first concession" and which he bequeathed to "my youngest son William," the only family member mentioned in the document. Probate of the will shows he actually died in 1847 even though his gravestone in Christie's Corners Cemetery, W. Flamborough Twp. gives the year as 1848.

Family records said that Gabriel came to Canada from New York. It was interesting then to find a Gabriel Cornwall described in the genealogy of researcher Prentiss Glazier who said he lived in the Town of Warwick, Orange Co., N.Y. This Gabriel appeared in an addendum which analyzed the Cornell and related names from the 1790 U.S. Census. Glazier connected him to the Gabriel "Connel" who married Abigail Knapp at the Presbyterian Church in Goshen, N.Y. in 1780. Glazier suggested that Gabriel came from New Jersey and was related to Job and Sarah Cornell of Little Egg Harbor. Job died without a will by 1757, and the court documents were signed by David and Gabriel Woodmansee, who were logically her brothers. This would provide an explanation for Gabriel's first name. Unfortunately, Glazier concluded he was unable to trace the line of Gabriel or Job. Other than the census, Glazier provided no clues to where he found his information, and the above approximate birthdate for Gabriel would suggest he could not be the son of Job.

The remaining best clue would seem to be the small note included with other family records: The Cornells were of Welsh descent. Three brothers came to this country, their names were Sylvanus, Gabriel and Daniel. One of these men had ten sons and one daughter named Samuel, Nathaniel, John, Moses, Thomas, Jessie, Smith, Gabriel, Daniel, William and Sarah. Their Mother's maiden name was Marr. Their father's mother's maiden name was Knapp. The note claims that Gabriel was the brother of Sylvanus and Daniel and includes the only mention of the name Knapp in any Canadian source. The above is derived from the family history, "The Cornells of Ontario, Michigan & Ohio" by Thomas V. Cornell, 4th Edit., 1999, which describes eight different Cornell families who emigrated to Ontario, Canada from New York and additional unknowns.<sup>1</sup>

"On Bord of the Ship Whilby Laying Opisit Bedlows Island in the North River the 26 of Sept 1776~" "Dear Father & Mother~ Thes Lines Comes with my Kind Love to You and to Let You Know I am at Present well, and in Good health, Thanks be to God, Considering the Disagreeable Situation I am in. Being Confined, on bord this Ship amongst a Considerable number of Prisoners Amounting 250. I desire You wold Send me By Som Safe Hand, Som Money, Let it be in Silver, for I am Greatly Destressed for want of a Little Liquor to Rase my Druping Spirits, we have nothing allowed us, only Salt Pork and Biskit, and no kind Vigatebles. I desire You wold Apply to All my Friends to make all the Interest That Lays in thear Power to Get me Released from this disagreeable Plase of Confinement. I am Greatly in want of Som Cloathins and wold be Glad You wold Indeaviour to get Som Convadill to me, it is Verrey Sickley on bord this ship Remember my Love to my Father and Mother Van Der Vear and my Wife and Children, I am Sometimes So Low in Spirits, and am afraid I shall never see aney of You again I have no more to add at Present But Subscribe my Self Your Dutifull Son" The family tradition is that Guilliam never returned home from this ship, but died a prisoner of the British.<sup>1</sup>

The will of Jan Vanderveer, dated 7 October 1776, proved 8 April 1782, mentions his daughter, Femmetje, baptized 10 April 1737, Flatbush, "wife of Guilliam Cornell."

In 1693, his father's will mentions him third among his sons, gives him with John land north of Thomas, bounded north by Great River or Cove running east to three rail fence, also 2 acres bought of Smith to build on. In 1703 Jacob, of Success in Flushing, gent., conveys to John, his brother, 40 acres in Flushing, devised to him by his father Richard of Rockaway, lying north of Thomas Cornell. Deed acknowledged by witnesses who deposed that they saw him and his wife Hester sign the same. In 1741, on 1 March, Jacob Cornell of White Plains conveyed to E. Yeomans for £70, land in Harrison's Purchase at Brown's Point, on the Mill Brook joining Danmiel Cornell (deed witnessed by Daniel Cornell and Mary Cornell). On 30 March 1748, Daniel Cornell conveyed to Elisha Horton, 69 acres in the same locality for £202.0.6. In 1746, Jacob of Rye conveyed land to son Jacob of Cortland, Westchester Co., In 1756, Jacob Jr., of Goshen, Orange Co., NY, yeoman, eldest son and heir of Jacob of Westchester who is one of the younger sons of Richard, late of Rockaway, conveyed land to Henry Foster and Glorianna his wife, Elijah, eldest son of Jacob Jr., confirmed the deed. Daniel Cornwell had an earmark recorded in Rye, 25 May 1722, and had lands at Brown's Point, 1715 to 1742. In 1754 there was a Jacob Cornell, weaver, freeman of N.Y. Jacob seems to have been a wanderer. He left Long Island, went to Westchester Co. and Orange Co. Probably Jacob, Jr., Daniel, Samuel and Mary were children of Jacob and Hester, also Richard Jr., who married 20 Dec 1712 Elizabeth, dau. of Thomas Cornel.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Jacobus Cornel, of the New Lotts, in the Township of Flatbush, in King's County, yeoman. All just and lawful debts and funeral charges to be paid out of my estate. I leave to my son, Gileyam Cornel, my grey stallion, and my largest gun; to my son, John Cornel, my four years old grey mare, and my smallest gun; to my loving wife Maragrietje the use and benefits of my dwelling house, barn, orchard, meadows, etc., and real estate



whatsoever and wheresoever, with the sole use and benefit of the rest and residue of my personal estate, for her maintenance and support while my widow, and for the support of my children. At her remarriage I bequeath £20, my cupboard with the linen and woolen cloth therein, and also one of my bedsteads, she to have her choice. To my daughter Cornelia £50 at her marriage. After my wife ceases to be my widow, unto my two sons, Gileyam Cornel and John Cornel, my dwelling house, barn, etc., and all real, moveable and personal estate, equally, except I give to my son Gileyam £5 for his birthright before division is made. Sons to pay daughter Cornelia one half of £150 one year after they have full possession of the real estate, should she be of lawful age of 21 years, or otherways when she shall arrive at such age. Heirs are to pay the other legacies hereinbefore given. I make my sons, Gileyam, John, his brother, Johannes Cornel, and brother-in-law, Michael Stryker, executors. Dated September 29, 1767. Witnesses, Jacob Wyckoff, gentleman, John Wyckoff, Johannis Lott, Jr., yeoman. Proved, February 23, 1780.

And my said grandson is to pay £500 to the other nine children of his mother Aeltie Rapalie, my granddaughter Sammettie, now wife of Hendrick Brinckerhoff, being the eldest. I leave to my grandson, Johanes Rapalie, my large Dutch Bible and my gun. I leave to my grandson Joris a negro boy. All the rest of my estate I leave to all my grandchildren, children of my daughter, Aeltie Rapalie. I make my grandsons, Daniel and Johanes Rapalie, and my grandson-in-law Hendrick Brinckerhoff executors. Dated November, 1745. Witnesses, Nicholas Wycoff, Cornelius Wycoff, Nicholas Wycoff. Proved, January 10, 1748/9.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Cornell, of Huntington, in Suffolk County. I leave to my wife my horse and chair and the little wheel. After her death, I give the chair to John Oakley, and 1/2 of the linnen. I leave to my son William my silver tankard and £50. To my daughter, Elizabeth Horsfield, £200, "this money is not to come in her hands, but to grow upon use, and the interest to be paid to her, yearly, and after her death to her daughter." I leave to my son, Whitehead Cornell, £100, as soon as the land can be sold. "I leave to my son John £200 out of the money he owes me." I leave to my son Thomas £300 in three payments. "I order £50 to be put at interest at 5 per cent, and the interest to be added to the principal, to maintain Silvester, if he should live to be past labor." If my wife marries, the executors are to have the use of the estate for the same purpose, and my sons, Thomas, Richard, Ebenezer, and Haviland, are to have it when of age. I make my affectionate uncle, Benjamin Cornell, and my loving friend, James Horton, Jr., and my son Thomas, executors. My wife is to have the use of 1/5 after my youngest son comes of age. Witnesses, John Burling, Jr., John Flandreaw, Timothy Wetmore. Proved, August 22, 1767, before John Bartow, Surrogate, "upon the affirmation of John Burling, Jr., merchant, of New York, one of the People called Quakers."

Richard Cornell was settled at Flushing, L.I., probably before 1656, in which year his name appears in the account book of John Bowne now in the Library of the Long Island Historical Society.

"Court Proceedings, 4 May 1663. Hendrick Janszen (Cooper) of the ship *Purmerland Church*, now a prisoner, acknowledged that he with Jasper Abrahamzen, committed great violence at Rendel Huit's house and forced his wife to give them to eat; they proceeded to Joris Wolsey's house and demanded drink, so that Wolsey & Ely Douty & **Ritzert Cornewell** had enough to do to put them out, then they went to Carel Van Brugge's house and demanded drink, and continued their violence in a manner indecent to be mentioned, so that Carel & Douty & Ritzert Corewell had enough to do before they could get them out, not without tearing a flap or fall of his unmentionables, which they removed in the shoving out of his body. Ordered that they be scourged and banished." (Records of New Amsterdam, IV, 234)

In the same year, 1663, the Town Clerk of Flushing informed the Governor that Richard Cornhill had been sent to agree with him about tithes, He was authorized to offer "100 Schapel of grain, 1/2 of peas & 1/2 of wheat" (Waller's History of Flushing).

In 1665 he was delegate from Flushing to the Hempstead Convention that framed the "Dukes Laws," the first code made in the Colony. Members of this convention included Richard Cornell, Jacques Cortenyou, Frederick Lubbertsen (from Brooklyn), and John Stryker (from Flatbush). This convention was assembled under the rule of Governor Nicholls. Long Island, Staten Island and Westchester were united to form the District or County of Yorkshire and many of the provisions were evidently applicable to Yorkshire alone.

Richard Cornell was Justice of the Peace in 1666, and was on 16 Feb 1666 patentee of Flushing with 17 others, among whom were John Lawrence and William his brother, Charles Bridges, etc. On 20 Feb 1666 he bought from Thomas Kicks, land on Madnan's (Great) Neck, which in 1687 he conveyed to Palmer. In 1667 he was appointed by Gov. Nicholls to enroll the Militia. In 1670 he was appointed by the Gov. and Council to lay out roads in Newtown, and in the following year was appointed to adjust the boundary between Bushwick and Newtown, but did not serve.

He was permitted to sell liquors and powder to the Indians. In 1673 he was appointed by the Council to arbitrate between Richard Smith and the inhabitants of Huntington. Gen. Lovelace paid him a visit at his house just before the capture of New York from the Dutch.

His sisters Sarah and Rebecca appointed him their attorney to collect legacies under their mother's will. This power he transfers to his brother John and brother-in-law William Earle. In 1676 he had a survey of 180 acres on the south side of Fresh Kill (Staten Island). In 1684 he petitioned to be put in possession of this land. In 1679-80, William Haviland filed a petition reciting that his brother-in-law Capt. Thomas Hicks who had in 1660 obtained from Gov. Nicholls a patent for Madnan's (Great) Neck in the town of Glushing, which was divided equally between him and Richard Cornhill and Elias Doughty, that petitioner bought Doughty's interest, that Cornhill and Hicks had settled their son-in-law on one of the three lots and Mr. Cornhill is settling his other son-in-law John Lawrence on a part of said tract. Petitioner prays that they may be stopped. Commissioners were appointed to divide the tract into three parts and to lay out the 300 acres for Richard Cornhill, Thomas Hicks and William Haviland.

In 1679 Richard Cornhill bought from Abraham Smith 100 acres of woodland in Hempstead, northwest of Little Success Pond, on the road to Madnan's Neck. In 1690, he was appraiser for the estate of William Lawrence; forced to resign a patent

for land; owed the estate of Cornelius Steenwyck 247 guilders 10 stivers in wampum.

In 1684 Takapousha and other Indians sold to Richard Cornhill and others all the lands called Flushing, bounded west by Flushing Creek, south by Jamaica line, east by Hempstead, north by the Sound. Richard Cornhill, Sr. and others bought 966 acres adjoining the rear of Cow Neck, with a map "Survaid and Laid Out for Mr Richard Cornwell Sener & Company A Certain tract of land being siteuat and lyeing on the East side of Cow Neck upon Long Island Acording to An Indian purchase baring date begining at A Red & white aoke Trees one the North side a small Creek knowne by the Indian name of Snakeroe Creek one the West side of Long Neck from therre into the woods South east & by East two degrees and fifteene minits southerly nintey six chaines to the Indian Line in the Midle of the Neck then by dais Line South four degrees Easterly twenty to a White oake tree near the head of a small Swamp from therre East by North one degree and forty five Minnits, Northerly seventy six Chaines to the Bay, twelve Chaines to the south of the poynt wheare Mans sloope was Cast away and from therre by by the Sound to the first small Creek Including a small Island with Meadows Conteing in all 966 Akers performed this 25th Day of [blank] 1684. Phillip Welles Survr."

Another survey, in 1685, to Richard Cornwell Sr., of 837 acres in Hempstead and Flushing, southeast of Little Neck, at Success (part of this land was still owned by his descendants in the late 1800s). In 1686 another survey of more land at Cow Neck to him. Patt of this tract was sold 25 Dec 1691 to James Sands who married Mary Cornell, dau. of John Cornell. It includes the burial ground of the family of John Cornell, Cow Neck.

Richard Cornell and others resisted the encroachments of new patentees of Flushing. Richard Cornell of Cornbury, Flushing, conveyed to his son-in-law John Washburn land in Flushing, south of the brook that comes from Rushmore's Mill (on re-survey Cornbury was found to be in Hempstead. In 1687 he conveyed to Richard his eldest son, one-half of a piece of land at Success, also salt meadow at Cornbury, Neck. On 20 Aug 1687, Richard Cornell, of Cornbury (Bayside), bopught from John Palmer lands that had been granted to Palmer by Lt.-Gov. Dongan on 3 Nov 1685, south side of Long Island in Rockaway, bounded east by Hempstead, north by the patent line, south by the main sea or ocean, west by the gut or inlet which makes the bay or sound as it runs easterly until it comes to the Hempstead line. This tract including all of Rockaway Neck, had been purchased 9 Oct 1658 by John Palmer, a resident of New York, from Peeman, Sagamore of the Rockaway Indians for £30. Richard Cornell and Elizabeth his wife, the same day convey to Palmer one-third of a tract at Madnan's Neck, formerly granted by Governor Nicholls to Thomas Hicks and which Hicks sold in 1666 to Cornwell.

Soon after this date he transferred his residence from Flushing to the new purchase, improved the lands, erected a dwelling and other buildings and resided there until his death, being thenceforth known as Richard Cornell of Rockaway.

In 1688, Richard Cornwell of Cornwell Hall, Queens Co., conveyed to Thomas Hicks (who married Mary Washburn, granddaughter of Richard), lands in Huntington. He leased the Court House at Jamaica for 20 years, agreeing to keep it in repair and to allow courts to be held in it. The next year he owed some money and was plagued with demands of the Hempstead men. He and his wife Elizabeth sold 50 acres near Success to John Cornell "our cousin" (nephew, probably son of Thomas) living near Success; bounded south by brother Edward and west by Richard Jr. The deed was later acknowledged 27 Jan 1696, by Richard Cornwell, Jr., heir-at-law of Richard Cornwell, Sr. In 1690 Richard conveyed to "my son-in-law John Lawrence," lots 61 and 37 in the last division of lots in Flushing and in the same year bought from Little John Smith for £30, land at Rockaway, bounded west by Lattins Spring.

In his will dated 7 Nov 1693, probated 30 Oct 1694, Richard Cornell of Rockaway spoke of himself as "Sicke & weeke," He made over all his lands at Rockaway for the payment of a certain debt owing to the children of John Washburn. (He was Washburn's executor.) To son William, land at Rockaway, bounded north with the old fence on the south side of last year's wheat field, running east to Hemostead line, south by the sea, excepting that my now dwelling house with orchard and pastures, houses and tillage about it, gardens, springs, and outhouses I give to my wife Elizabeth during her widowhood, and afterwards to William forever. To son Thomas, the land I bought from Little John Smith, also a tract bounded south by William, north by the middle of the fresh cove that Robert Beadel's meadow was laid out in, running east to the three rail fence. To Jacob and John, lands north of Thomas, bounded north by the Great River or Cove, east by the rail fence, to be divided between them according to quantity and quality, except to Richard, 10 acres adjoining Wells line. To daughter Elizabeth Lawrence, 10 acres joining William. To daughter Mary, £100 when she is eighteen years old or married, also half my moveables within doors, money excepted. To wife, the use of negroes, stocks, etc., for the maintenance of the children during minority, excepting among other things 12 two-year heifers which I give to my twelve grandchildren when they are of age, that is to the children of my son Richard, son Washburn and son Lawrence. To daughter Sarah Arnold, two cows. If William, Jacob, Thomas, John or Mary should die without heirs, their shares to go to the survivors. If wife shall marry she shall have £100 and half the moveables within doors, money excepted, also negro girl Jane. Negroes James and Dinah to go to William. Lands at Cow Neck to be sold. My right to the undivided lands at Hempstead to descend to my five sons. Jacob and John to have two acres purchased of Little Smith, if they choose to build thereon. Debts due to me shall be used to pay the children of John Washburn and to Captain Charles Lodwick. Executors, my wife and sons Richard and William with Colonel Thomas Willett, Lt.-Col. Thomas Hicks and Capt. Daniel Whitehead as overseers. (Recorded New York Surrogate's Office, Liber 5 of Wills, p. 45),

He lived in Flushing, at Success, a little hamlet now called Lakeville, partly in Flushing and partly in Hempstead.

In 1687, his father conveyed to Richard, his eldest son, one-half of land at Success and Cornbury, joining Washburn. In 1694, as executor of his father's will, he received 1/5 of undivided lands in Hempstead. In 1695, deed from Southwood of land on Washburn Neck, sold to John Cornell in 1698.

His family is listed in the 1698 census of Flushing: Richard, Sarah (his wife), Richard, Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary and five negroes. 1698 deed, Richard of Success to brother John of Flushing, land in Hempstead. 1702, deed, Richard Cornwell of Flushing, and wife Sarah, to Candale, land in Huntington. 1705, deeds to Allen and Bayard. 1706, deed, Richard of Flushing, gent. and wife Sarah, to Johannes and Phebe Van Wyck, ;and in Flushing, near Little Neck, and other land. 1706, deed, Richard of Flushing, to Richard, his son, 150 acres in Hempstead, bounded south by Jacob Cornwell, east by Success Pond, with remainder, in default of issue, successively to son Richard, to second son Samuel, to daughters of son Richard, to his brother Thomas of Hempstead, gent., to brother-in-law William Creed, to Jonathan Whitehead, to S. Clowes, and finally to right heirs of Richard; deed, he and wife Sarah of Flushing, to Nicholas Stilwell (son-in-law), land in Flushing joining John Hicks, Dr. Rodman and Jacob Cornwell; deed to Thomas of Rockaway, 10 acre meadow, willed by my father, joining William and John Cornell. In 1708, deed to Beekman, 40 x 100 feet at Jamaica, £4. 1718, Richard of Flushing, gent., and wife Sarah, to Samuel Cornell of Flushing, gent., their son, deed one-half lands, houses, orchards, etc. in Flushing and Hempstead. 1720, deed from Van Cleef, land in Flushing, to Richard Cornell, Jr., £300, 70 acres with houses, orchards, etc. on road from Hempstead Plains to Washburn's Point. 1725, his son, called Richard Jr. 1733, deed, Richard Jr. of Hempstead, yeoman, from Wiltse, land in Hempstead on road from Herricks to Great Neck road, joining John Cornell, 6 acres.

In 1720, Richard Cornwell, Sr., contributed to Parish Church, Jamaica. In 1730 he owned land in Goshen [Orange Co., NY?] in partnership with James Sands.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Richard Cornell, of the Manor of Scarsdale, in Westchester County, being this 31 of October, 1756, sick. I leave to my four sons, Richard, Joseph, John, and Benjamin, all my lands in Scarsdale, New Rochelle, and Mamaroneck. If my son John dies without issue, his share shall go to the rest. I leave to my eldest son Richard my best riding horse in full bar to all claim as eldest son. I leave to my son Joseph my silver watch. To my son Benjamin my clock and my cart, "and he shall keep and maintain my old wench 'Jenny' during her life." I leave to my daughter Mary, widow of Edward Sands, one Pistole over what I have already given her. I leave to my sons my wearing apparell. I leave to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Aaron Quinby, £10. All the rest of my estate I leave to my 5 daughters, Deborah, wife of Matthew Franklin, Hannah, widow of Josiah Quinby, and to Hannah Griffin and Elizabeth Haviland, the two daughters of my daughter Phebe, late wife of John Willis, and my daughter Rebecca, wife of Edward Burling, and Elizabeth, wife of Aaron Quinby. The part of Deborah Franklin is only for her life, and then to my other daughters, and she and her husband, Matthew Franklin, are to give

security for the same. I make my eldest son Richard, my son in law, Edward Burling, and John Burling, executors. Witnesses, Peter Huggefard, doctor, Israel Ervin, mason, Magdalen Kelly, spinster. Proved, April 21, 1757.

He came to Boston about 1638 with wife Rebecca Briggs. They were Quakers. Thomas Cornell settled first in Westchester County, NY in 1642. He was driven from his land by Indians, and he then settled in Portsmouth, RI.

After the restoration of peace in New Netherland, brought about by the mediation of Roger Williams, Thomas Cornell returned to the Dutch Colony, but not, it seems, to restore and rebuild what had been destroyed of his property on Throgg's Neck. But he asked for a tract adjacent, fronting on the south and west of that of Throckmorton, from which it was separated on the shore by the mouth of Westchester Creek, and extending thence about two miles on Long Island Sound to the Bronx River and extending back two miles or more from the sound to the westerly edge of the present village of Westchester, formerly and even now known as Cornell's Neck; this estate was granted by Governor William Kieft to Thomas Cornell by patent dated 25 July 1646.<sup>1</sup>

Once again he was driven from his property by Indians and he returned to his old homestead at Portsmouth, RI. He served on a coroner's jury there in 1653.

On 8 Feb 1773, Friend's Records state "Rebecca Cornell, widow, was killed strangely at Portsmouth in her own dwelling house, was twice viewed by the Coroner's Inquest, digged up and buried again by her husband's grave in their own land." But on the strength of a vision which her brother John Briggs had, in which she appeared to him after her death and said "See how I was burned with fire," It was inferred she was set fire to, and that her son who was last with her did it, and principally on this evidence Thomas Cornell was tried, convicted, and hanged for her murder.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Thomas Cornell, of Rockaway, in the town of Oyster Bay, Queens County. I leave to my wife Sarah my negro woman "Phillis" and my riding chaise and chaise horse and £100 and a bed and furniture and the use of all plate except one silver bowl during her widowhood. Also the use of a certain tract of land at Rockaway, being part of the

Plantation whereon I now live. Beginning at a certain spring below my orchard called the Orchard Spring, and from thence to run as the fence now stands to another spring near Richard Cornell's called the Lattens (Lattings) Spring, including all the lands and meadows within said fence as far as the creek, with all appurtenances except wood and timber. Also the use of 1/2 of my dwelling house, kitchen, barn, and chaise house, and 1/2 the fruit of my orchard, and she is to have firewood and fencing on a certain part of my Plantation called Rooke's Point at Rockaway. I leave to my son, Thomas Cornell, one pair of good working oxen. I leave to my sister, Elizabeth Cornell, at the Fresh Kills, £20. To Letitia Lawrence a bed. I leave to my 3 daughters, Phebe, Martha, and Peggy, 3/4 of my personal estate, including my corn now growing, except £100 which is first to be taken out of my movable estate. The other 1/4 of personal estate and the said £100 are to be in the hands of my executors. I leave to my son Thomas all my lands and tenements lying on Rockaway Neck, on the south side of Nassau Island, except the use, which is left to my wife. And he shall pay to my wife £260 and £260 to my executors. I leave to my daughter Phebe £200, and to my daughters Martha and Peggy £200. To Letitia Lawrence £40. If he refuses to pay these, then my executors may sell lands. My executors are to take 1/4 of my movable estate and the said £100 and put them at interest and pay the interest to my daughter Sarah, and if she survives her present husband, Daniel Water, they shall pay her the whole amount. If she does not survive her husband the whole is to be paid according to such disposition as she shall make in writing. I leave to my daughters Phebe, Martha, and Peggy 3/4 of all my plate except the silver bowl. The other 1/4 my executors are to use for the benefit of my daughter Sarah. If she makes no disposition of the same in writing it is to go to her children. I make my friends, Valentine Hewlet Peters, Jacob Mott, David Jones, and William Nicoll, Esq., executors. Dated December 24, 1763. Witnesses, Benjamin Lester, Jacob Hicks, Benjamin Wright. Proved, April 9, 1764.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Sarah Cornell, of Hempsted, in Queens County, being now well in health. I leave to my son, Thomas Cornell, £5. My executors are to retain in their hands as much money as will purchase the several half dozens of silver Tablespoons which are hereafter mentioned, and give them to my granddaughters, viz., Mary Walters, Elizabeth Walters, and Hannah Walters, the children of my daughter, Sarah Walters, And to my granddaughters, Sarah and Phebe Tolman, children of my daughter, Phebe Tolman, and to my granddaughters, Sarah and Mary Thorne, the children of my daughter, Martha Thorne, and to my granddaughters, Phebe and Sarah Tredwell, children of my daughter, Peggy Tredwell, To each of these grandchildren I leave 1/2 dozen Silver Table Spoons. Guiliam's father was a successful merchant in Rotterdam, Holland. Guiliam came to this country in about 1640.<sup>1</sup> He was probably a Huguenot. He settled at Flatbush, Kings County, NY. His two sons eventually adopted the surname of 'Cornel.' By the third generation it became Cornell.<sup>1</sup>

Guiliam Cornelis was a sea captain. He immigrated in 1640.

On July 5, 1641 Guiliam Cornelis, a sea captain, hired the "Oak Tree," a cargo vessel, on which he served as charter boat skipper. An invoice of goods imported on the ship is recorded under date of August 14, 1641. (Cal.Hist.Mss,1,p.16).

The *Eyckenboom*, (captain Gelain Cornelisz., chartered by the West India Company), left Amsterdam May 17th 1641 and arrived in New-Amsterdam Aug. 20th 1641, with 20 colonists and 24 cows for Rensselaerswijck (according to Rink there were only 3 colonists).

Guiliam also was said to have been half owner of the Bontekoe in 1651 and a supercargo on the ship, Eagle, in 1663.

On 9 Aug 1658 he procured from Director Stuyvesant a patent for a plantation in Midwout (Flatbush). In 1661 he and his son Peter Geliamse, "bought of Jane Evertse Bont a wery [bowery?] in Flushing on west side of highway, 600 rods in length and 48 rods and 8 feet in width, containing 48 morgens, and 2 pieces of plain land of 5 morgens, 2 houses and building plots on the west side of the highway of 16 rods in length and 12 rods in breadth, with 2 houses and barns thereon, etc." The name of his descendants for more than a century was Cornele, but lately changed to Cornell.

In 1690, deed, William of Hempstead to Thomas Cornell, Esq., £20, 40 acres at Rockaway. In 1699, deed, William Cornell from John Spragg (the name is now Sprague in RI), formerly secretary of the Province, deed of Boscobel, house and lands, south side of the Plains in Hempstead, 280 acres, also meadow at Hungry Harbor in said township, formerly sold by John Washburn, deceased, to Richard Cornell of Cornbury, gent., deceased, to Richard Cornell of Cornbury, gent., deceased, and by him granted to Spragg. Boscobel had been granted ub 1688 to Spragg by the town of Hempstead. It was south of the Plains, and east of Seaman's Hollow, bounded by the road and commons. In 1694 William was an executor of his father's will; he took land at Rockaway, bounded north by the old fence, on southside of last year's wheat field, running east to Hempstead line, south by sea, except the dwelling, orchard, etc., also 10 acres meadow between Richard and Elizabeth, also two negroes James and Dinah. In 1698, May 13, William and Thomas establish a division line. This is recorded in the County Clerk's office, Jamaica. In 1708 he was Constable and Collector, Hempstead. In 1710 he was Vestryman of St. George's Church, Hempstead. 1 Feb 1715 William Cornell conveyed to Z. Van Horn, 700 acres at Rockaway Beach, bounded west by John and Thomas Cornell, north by the Boggs, east by the common, with houses, orchards, etc. In 1719, he and several other Justices of the Peace were complained of for illegal practices. He was charged with having taken upon himself in his petty Justices Court, to give judgment in a case of £3 expressly against the letter of the law, and had been indicted for robbing persons of fish. The charges were not sustained. 1 Sep 1720, he bought from S. Carman for £570 land at Far Rockaway on the road from Hempstead. On 17 April 1722, he conveyed to his son Richard the farm "where my father Richard lived," adjoining Thomas Cornell, also 10 acres at Rocks Point, with houses, etc. In 1724 he was executor of his son, Richard. In 1726 he was one of those appointed to command the inhabitants under the law for extinguishing fires in the grass in Hempstead Plains. In 1728 he and his daughter, Elizabeth Denton, conveyed 67 acres to R. Marvin for £260. On 1 Sep 1733, he conveyed to his son John for £510 the land which he had purchased from Carman. In 1734 on 8 March, Justice William Cornell issued a warrant for a town meeting to consider the granting liberty to William Cornell, John Cornell, and others to take land for building a

church according to the useages of the Church of England (St. George's Church, Hempstead). In 1734, on the first Sunday in April, William Cornell, gent., John Cornell, gent., and three others were authorized to take up half an acre at, or near the place where the old church now stands on which to build a church, also a burying ground; among the petitioners were William Cornell, Sr.; William Cornell, Jr.; John Cornell; John Cornell, Jr.; Richard Cornell, Jr.; and Thomas Cornell, Jr.

In 1735 William was a plaintiff in certain ejection suits in New Jersey.

In his will, he wrote: I, William Cornell, of Hempstead, in Queens County, gentleman, being well stricken in years but of sound mind. I leave to my two sons John and William, all my beach, marshes, and broken lands and others belonging to me at Rockaway beach, and they are to maintain the fence equally between them. After payment of debts, I give to my grand-children, Elizabeth, daughter of my son John, and Phebe Denton, daughter of my daughter Elizabeth, late wife of James Denton, each £5. To Susannah, daughter of my son William, £20. To Elizabeth Stringham, daughter of my daughter Mary, late wife of James Stringham, £10. To Mary Stringham, her sister, £100. To Elizabeth Hazzard, daughter of my daughter Letitia, late wife of Jonathan Hazzard, £10. All the rest of my personal estate I leave to my son William and my daughter Susannah, and to my grand-daughter Mary Stringham. I make my brother, Colonel John Cornell, and my sons William and John, executors. Dated May 4, 1742. Witnesses, S. Clowes, Joseph Sackett, Jr., Johanah Clowes. Proved, September 1, 1743.<sup>1</sup>

John Corness, an officer in the British Army, was with his regiment stationed for a time in the city of Dublin, Ireland.

While there a son, William, was born to him. When this son was two years old John Cornell came to America to take part in the war between the British and the French. He fell at the storming of Fort Ticonderoga under Abercrombie. He held a captain's commission at the time of his death. His wife and son remained in Dublin until the latter was 15 (in 1785), when they came to America and settled in New York City. They supported themselves by manufacturing and selling lace.

Soon after their marriage they settled in Delaware Co., NY. He purchased a tract of wild land eight miles from the village of Delhi, on the Delaware River, and lived on it until he was driven away by the British and Indians, during the Revolutionary War. During the Revolution, he was twice taken prisoner by the Indians, both times managing to escape.

He moved with some of his family to the Genesee country about 1816.
