The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Corssen, Corsa, deCoursey, etc.

Some of the early DeCoursey and Corson progenitors used the Dutch version of the French name "COURSIER" (pronounced "Coursay") which translates into the Dutch as "STAM", into Italian as "CORSO", and into English as "RACE" or "RACER". It is a fact that one whole branch of descendants of Jan CORSZEN and Metje CRAY took the surname "RACER" about the time of the American Revolution, while others, about the same time took the surname "DECOURSEY". In my informed opinion, the original French Walloon "COURCY" surname was Dutchified due to the Dutch influence in Holland before coming to America by the addition of the "n" sound as in COURSEN in keeping with the traditional Dutch Patronymic naming system then in vogue. Later generations recognized their French heritage by reverting to versions of the original. — Information online 5 July 1998 from BILL DECOURSEY <bill@lifeweb.lifetouch.com>

As to a possible answer to the question of how and why the Staten Island Corsons and their relatives the Kroesens, VanSants, VanderGrifts, etc. migrated about 1724 from Staten Island to Bucks County, PA near the Swedish Settlement that had been earlier established there, it turns out that Arendt Corssen Stam (a very probable son of Pieter Course, the Huguenot, and a probable brother to Kors Pieterszen progenitor of the Staten Island Corson family) purchased this land from the Indians in 1633 for the Dutch West India Company and was granted a portion of it as a reward.

Arent Corssen (Stam) was commissary at Fort Nassua (now Gloucester, NJ). In the employ of the Dutch West India Co., in 1633, he purchased "from the right owners and Indian chiefs" land on the east bank of the Schuylkill River, in the old Indian district of Passvunk, and within the present First Ward of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Here a trading post was established to "restrain the encroachments of the Swedes who were boldly pushing their boundaries northward on both sides of the South (now Delaware) River and seeking to monopolize the trade with the Indians." Fort Beversrede was subsequently erected on this site in 1646. Arent Corssen Stam was a brother of Dirck Corssen (and very likely a brother to Kors Pieterszen Corssen, progenitor of the Staten Island Corsons).¹

Benjamin and his family lived on Staten Island until 1726, where he was a farmer. His mark for cattle was recorded in Richmond County on Staten Island, Dec. 10, 1722 and can be found in Stillwell's "Historical Miscellany," Vol. 1, p. 32: Benjamin Corsen, his Mark for his cattle and sheep and horses (horses crossed out). A half penny in the under side of the left

ear and for his horses branded with letters B.K. upon left Buttick.

Benjamin and his family came to Bucks County in 1726, purchasing a farm in Northampton Township of Jeremiah Dungan, a tract of 250 acres for the consideration of 350 pounds. Among his neighbors were many of the Dutch families who had previously migrated from Staten Island. See: "The Pennsylvania Traveler", Vol. 5, May 1969, pp. 10-12.

They removed about 1726 to Northampton Twp., Bucks Co., PA, where they attended the North and Southampton Dutch Ref Ch in Churchville.

Benjamin Corssen died intestate, and letters of administration on his estate were granted to his eldest son, Cornelis, after his widow Blandina renounced her right of administration on 10 Nov 1740

Christian Corsen was a Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Richmond Co., N. Y., and was a prominent figure in the Dutch Church in Staten Island.

In his will dated 5 Feb 1762, probated 7 Jan 1766, Christian Corsen, Esq., of Richmond County, mentioned dau Neetiea, wife of Frances Gerbrantz, and her two sons, Christian and Daniel Gerbrantz, also her two daus; grandsons Cornelius and Daniel, sons of my son Cornelius, deceased; grandson Daniel (when of age), son of my son Daniel Corsen, Esq., deceased, and Mary Corsen his widow, and the three children of son Daniel; grandsons Peter, Christian, Cornelius, and Daniel, sons of my son Cornelius Corsen, deceased; grandchildren Richard, Daniel and Ann, children of son Daniel, deceased; grandchildren Peter, Christian, Cornelius, Daniel, Mary, Jane, Katherine, and Ann, children of son Cornelius, deceased. Made dau-in-law Mary Corsen, widow, and grandson Cornelius Corsen, and Abraham Speer and Daniel Lake, executors. Wit: Henry Wildman, Walter Clenre, John Hillyer. Codicil dated 9 July 1763 mentioned four granddaughters Mary, Jane, Katharine and Ann; grandchildren Sarah, Catharine and Peter Corsen, and Mary McLean. Wit: John Hillyer, Pierre De Grout, Thomas Lisk. Codicil dated Dec 1764 mentioned dau. in law Mary Corsen having died and her eldest son Richard her heir at law and provided for, revokes legacy to him and leaves instead to granddaughter Antee, dau. of son Daniel. On 30 Dec 1680, two patents for land on the north side of Staten Island were issued to "Capn. Cornelis Coursen & Company," the company consisting of Andries Jurianson, Derrick Cornelison [Hooglandt] and John Peterson. This Peterson seems to have been Jan Pieterszen Van Woggelum.

In his will, he wrote: ...February 2, 1755. I, Cornelius Corsen, of Staten Island, Esq., being very sick. "I will and particularly order all just debts and funeral charges to be paid." All my negroes, lands, and tenements, in the North Precinct of the County of Richmond, whereon I now dwell, are to be sold by my executors. I leave to my two sons, Cornelius and Daniel, all my lands and tenements in the Manor of Castleton, in Richmond County, purchased by me from Thomas Dongan. I leave to my sons Peter and Jacobus £640. To my daughter Mary, wife of Charles McLean, £120. To my daughters Catharine, Ann and Jannettie, £465. To my son Daniel my negro boy. To my daughter Mary a negro girl. To my sons, Peter, Cornelius, Jacobus, and Daniel, 4 cows and all my horses. To each of my daughters 2 cows. To my son Jacobus £15. To my son Christian's child, named Cornelius, £30 when of age. All the rest of my goods and chattels to my children, viz., Peter, Cornelius, Daniel, Jacobus, Mary, Catharine, Ann, and Jannettie. I make my son in law, Charles McLean, and my brother, Daniel Corsen, executors. Witnesses, John Jenner, Gerardus Beekman, merchant, John Jenner, Jr. Proved, May 1, 1755.

Cors. Corzen Vroom and Maritie Jacobs V. der Griest, w., wit. bp. 17 Oct 1680 at Flatbush of Daniel, son of Daniel Stillwell and Maria, of Staten Island.

Capt. Cornelius (1645-1698) was married to Marritje Jacobs VanderGrift (1649-1698) -- his cousin, sort of. Frederick Lubbertse was Marritje's grandfather and Cornelius' step-father. He purchased extensive lands on both sides of the Raritan which he shared with brother Hendrick. He never moved there, living instead on Staten Island where he was Justice of the Peace and Capt. of the Militia.¹

Cornelis Corsen was He was a Captain in Colonial Wars and also a constable of Long Island.

In his will, he wrote: Cornelius Corsoen, Staten Island. "In the name of God, Amen. I, Cornelius Corsoen, of Staten Island, in the County of Richmond, yeoman." Leaves all estate, real and personal, to his wife Mattie Corsoen, for life, and then to their children equally. If she remarry then the children are to take one half, each to have their share when of age (names not given). Makes his wife sole executrix. Dated December 9, 1692. Witnesses, Cornelis Nephews', Peter Staers (Staats?), Thomas Carhart. --Benjamin Fletcher, Governor, etc. To all, etc. Know ye that at the city of New York, on the 7th of December, 1692, before me, the last will of Cornelius Corsoen, of Staten Island, was proved, and the widow, Mattie Corsoen, is confirmed as executrix.¹

Jacob became a supervisor for Richmond County in 1709 and was a colonel in the militia in 1730. After the death of his father in 1693 and his mother about 1698. He bought the interest in his father's estate from his brothers and sisters. In 1712, he

seemed to have inherited the share of his younger brother Daniel, who had died intestate. Thus he gained controlling interest of all the vast holdings of his father.

Jacob and his wife had seven children, some were baptized in the Dutch Reformed Church of Staten Island and others were named in his will.

An abstract of his will is given, naming only the surviving children - a codicil the children of his son Benjamin: The will can be found in the Surrogate Office, New York, Liber 20, pg. 51. Codicil, Dated February 3, 1742/43: Whereas I have given to my son Benjamin, one half of all my lands in Hunterdon County, West New Jersey, which I purchased of John Budd, my executors are to pay to Jacob, son of my son Benjamin, 30 pounds out of said lands and the rest of said lands to be divided among Jacob, Sarah and Elizabeth, the children of my son Benjamin Corsen. But if my grandson Jacob wished to keep all said lands he shall pay his sisters 2/3 value. Witnessed by: Christian Corsen, Antje Corsen, Daniel Corsen. Proved Aug. 2, 1756.
