The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Jacques Cossart was listed on the 8 Sep 1683 Rate List of Bushwyck, NY, with 1 poll, 2 horses, 1 of 2 yrs., 5 cows, a of 2 yrs., 2 of 1 yr., 1 hog, 18 morgens of land; animals valued at £78; land valued at £36, for a total of £114.²

In the Brooklyn Ref Ch record of their banns, they were: "Jakop Cassou, young man born in New York, and Anna Marij Johannes, young woman, born in "Creupelbos" [Cripplebush]."

The census of Kings County taken about 1698 shows in Brooklyn a Jacob Cousseau with 1 man, 1 woman, and 1 child. (O'Callaghan, Doc. Hist. of the State of NY, vol III, p. 134).¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Jacob Cassow (corrected to "Cassou" in Vol. I of Corrections), of Brookland, in Kings County, yeoman, being sick. I leave to my son Johanes £1 8s. for his birth right. I leave to my son Jacob all the farm on which I now live, with all utensils for husbandry and weaving, Also a bond due me from Johanes Culver, and he shall pay £300 to my executors; I also leave him all my land and meadows in the town of Bushwyck, and he shall pay £250. The money that he pays I leave to my children, Abraham, Johanes, Janettie, Jost, and Angentie (per Corrections, Vol. I, p. 259: will of Jacob Cassow also mentions daughters "Catharine and Annatie"), and to the children of my son Jeronimus. I leave to my grand son Thomas (corrected to "Theunis Cassou" in Vol. I of Corrections), son of my son, Jacob Cassow, my gun for a remembrance of me. I leave to my son Abraham all my meadows at Celler's Neck in Jamaica. To my daughter Angentie a bed that stands in the leanto of my house. To my grand daughter Maria, daughter of my son Jacob, my best oval table and looking glass. To my grand daughter Maria, daughter of my son Abraham, I leave a heifer. I leave to my grand son Jacob, son of my son Jacob, a sword. I make my sons Jacob and Abraham, and my kinsman, Johanes Culver, executors. Dated May 31, 1754. Witnesses, Rem Remsen, Jacob Remsen, Albert Schenck. Proved, October 2, 1758.

Jacques Cousseau and his first wife Magdaleen de Tuljerar were members of the New Amsterdam Ref Dutch Ch before 1660.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their (2) marriage and banns, they were: Johannes Casjou, Wedr. Van Magdaleen de Tuljerar, Annetje Vincent, Wede. Van Simon Tel, beyde woonende tot N. Yorke.

3 Oct 1662 -- Fiscal Nicasius de Sille appears in Court with Jan van Cleef and Titus Cyre stating, that they bought Jacob van Couwenhoven's horse mill and that Titus Cyre sold his share to Jan van Cleef, who sold it to Albert Albertsen Lintwever [Terhune]; on which aforesaid horsemill he paid and disbursed above his just third part the sum of two hundred and ten guilders, and that he and Albert Albersen again sold the mill, as they bought it, according to agreement therefor, to Jacobus Backer, Govert Loockermans, Jacques Cosseau, and Hendrick van de Water, and that the aforesaid Albert Albertzen has given an assignment of four hundred guilders on the abovenamed van de Water, which remarking a fearing, that he should not get his own, he directed the Court Messenger to attach the money, which being done requests the attachment to be declared valid, until it shall be found to whom the most is belonging. The Worsh. Court declares the attachment valid.¹

Jacques and Simon Fell were friends and business partners prior to Simon's death.

Annetje Vincent's brother Jan Vincent, carpenter, was granted letters of administration for the estate of Jacques Cousseau on 13 Nov 1682 [WNYHS:1-2:121 (p 447)] and Quietus on 23 Mar 1683/4 [WNYHS:1-2:273 (p 67)]. Letters of administration of estate of Jacques Cousseau of New York, merchant, granted to John Vincent, carpenter, November 13, 1682. Inventory of estate of Jacques Cousseau, January 31, 1682/3, by order of Mayor's Court. "House and lot sold at vendue to Cornelis Van Bursum, lying in the Pearle street," 5850 guilders; 1 House and lot upon the Lords Gracht (Broad street), 8,000 guilders. "Some writing books, accounts and papers, which we leave to the creditors, and we have valued at 000." Total 14,026 guilders. B. Bayard, Adolph Peters, Abraham Jansen, Paul Richards. Whereas John Vincent, did administer upon the estate of Jacques Cousseau, and being informed that the said John Vincent hath well and truly administered according to law, a Quietus is granted, March 23, 1683/4.

De Purmerlander Kerck sailed from Amsterdam on 12 October 1662 under the command of Captain Benjamin Barentsz. Among the passengers were "Jacques Cossaris, wife and two children, 5 and 1-1/2 years old."¹

Jacques Cousseau bought, about 25 March 1662 at public auction, the house at New Haerlem formerly of Jan Sneden and his wife, Grietje Jans, who both died early in 1662. When granted to Sneden, the lot was described as Lot 18 (a strip of land a few rods wide running from about the foot of present East 109th Street northwesterly at about the southwest corner of Jefferson Park and across First, Second and Third Avenues to a place between Third and Lexington Avenues with an end facing northwest. The northern corner was probably at 117th Street, about a third of the block east of Lexington Avenue. The house probably stood at 115th or 116th Street.) The house, land and growing grain were bought by Jacques Cossean (Jacques Cousseau) for 135 guilders.

Jacques Cousseau, with Belina, witnessed the baptism 19 Aug 1671 NYC Ref Ch, of Henrica, dau. of Michiel --- & Henrica.

Dirck Jansen De Groat, plaintiff, against Jacques Cousseau, states that on April 3, 1669, the defendant sold to Carster Jansen Eggert, a certain lot of ground and a mill house free of all incumbrances. And that before that time the said lot was mortgaged by said Cousseau to Frederick Phillipse, but left unsealed. And since that time the said lot and mill house is transported by Dirck Jansen De Groat as executor, and heir of said Carster Jansen Eggerts, unto Clement Sibrach to him and his heirs and assigns forever, as by deed, March 31, 1679. And that on account of said mortgage the said Clement Sibrach keeps back the purchase money. He prays that the defendant be ordered to pay the mortgage. [NOTE.--The "mill house and lot" was on the north side of South William street, New York, about 150 feet east of Broad street. The original name of the street was "Syck Steege," or Dirty Lane. After the above named Jacques Cousseau built his horse mill, the name was changed to "Mill street," and remained so till 1836.--W. S. P.]
