The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. The 30 day of December, 1782, I, Balm Johnson Cozine, of the Out Ward of the City of New York, farmer, being weak in body. All my just debts and funeral charges to be paid within some convenient time after my decease by my executors. I leave to my loving wife, Cornelia, the profits of my estate, real and personal, during her widowhood. After the intermarriage or decease of my wife, unto my loving son John, all my right and title of that certain tract of land whereon my barn stands on the opposite side of my dwelling house and land lying in the Out Ward of the City of New York, Bloomingdale Road; the land fronting said road; and the rear, the North River. Unto my loving son, Cornelius, all my right and title in that tract of land whereon my dwelling house now stands; the land fronting the Road; the rear, the Commons. Unto my eight loving children, namely: John, Cornelius, Sarah, Hannah, Deborah, Catharine, Rachel and Jane, the remainder of my estate, real and personal, in equal shares. My children to be supported out of the profits of my estate until my youngest child shall come of age. My sons, John and Cornelius, each must pay £300 for the land above given to them; which money shall be divided amongst my six other children. The £300 apiece, which my sons are to pay, to be paid in twelve months' time if they choose to hold the lands; the division of said money to be made at the age of the youngest child. I make my beloved wife and my loving sons, John and Cornelius, and likewise my friend, John Hopper, of Bloomingdale, executors. Witnesses, Louis Andrew Gauteer, inn-holder; William How, yeoman; both of the City of New York; Mathewis Van Orden. Proved, January 20, 1783.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Barne Cosens, of New York, Gentleman, considering the dangers to which I am exposed during a voyage intended shortly (by God's Grace) to be made to England, I do make this my last will and testament. I direct that all debts due to me shall be collected, and the proceeds applied for the education of my two children, John and Mary. I leave to my son John all my 1/5 of a tract of land in Duches County; which I own in company with Jacob Regnier, Peter Fauconier, Benjamin Ashe, and John Parsons. I leave to my daughter Mary the £100 left to me in England by my grandmother Ursula Barne. All the rest to my two children. I make Hon. Robert Millwood executor. My wife Grace shall not have any administration of my estate, nor have anything to do with the education of my children. Dated December 5, 1706. Witnesses, Roger Brett, Thomas Gage, Richard Harris.

Cornelius Cosyns and Debora his wife wit bp. 15 June 1735 Tappan of William, son of Jan Cure & Lena Van Scheyven.

They lived at Tappan until the birth of their second child, where Cornelius had connections through his aunt Grietie, wife of Jan Pieterse Haring and Daniel DeClark; and his cousin Catalyntie, wife of Claes Peterson. They thereafter moved to the Bloomingdale area of New York, where he had a farm between present Central Park and the Hudson River, crossed by Broadway, then called the Bloomingdale Road. He was given the freedom of the city on 6 June 1721 and was registered as a cordwainer on 1 March 1726, in which trade he continued until his death. The Cosine farm was lot 2, of the ten lots. No deed from Van Cortlandt or into Cosine has been found. It is believed that the original Cosine farm house was the house shown on the Randel Map, in the bed of 54th St on the west side of the Bloomingdale Road.

Cornelis Cosine was elected constable of the West Ward in 1725. He had moved to Bloomingdale by Sept 1741, when he was elected collector for the Bowery Division of the Out Ward.

When John Balme, of New Jersey, died intestate, Letters of Administration are granted to Cornelius Cosine, of New York, Gentleman, June 5, 1740.

His will was dated 14 Dec 1764, probated 8 April 1765 (filed NY). In his will, he wrote: ...I, Cornelius Cosine, of New York, cordwainer, being in good health. "I leave to my eldest son Garrett £25 in bar to all claim as heir at law. Also the negro 'Jack,' he having paid me £55 for him, together with the £25 above mentioned, making the sum of £80, being the full value of said negro Jack." "I leave to my said son Garrett one pair of hand irons and one Beaver Hatt, which said Hatt he has already received." I also leave to my son Garrett 1/5 of my farm at Bloomingdale, which said 1/5 joins on Hans Hopper, and thence running down to the North River. I leave to my son Cornelius £100, "on his Misfortune of having a Sore Legg." Also all my wearing apparell and my movables at Bloomingdale, except one cow for my son Garrett's daughter Hannah. I also leave to my son Cornelius 1/5 of my farm at Bloomingdale, which said 1/5 joins on De Lancey's land, and thence down to the North River. I leave to my son, Balm Johnson Cosine, 1/5 of my farm, which part on the southwest joins on his brother Garrett, and runs down to the North River. I leave to my daughter Margaret, wife of Nicholas Fletcher, 1/5 of my farm joining the main road, and running thence down to the North River, which said 1/5 joins her brother, Balm Johnson Cosine. That part of the farm over the road, which joins the Commons, is excepted. I leave to my daughter Sarah, wife of William Swanser, 1/5 of my said farm, which joins the main road and runs down to the North River, and joins the land of her sister Margaret. The part over the road is excepted. I leave to my three sons, Garrett, Cornelius, and Balm Johnson all that part of my farm which joins on the road and Commons. All the rest of my estate in New York I leave to my 5 children. "At my decease I will and desire that my wife and children have each of them £10 for mourning." Provided that my wife assigns her right of dower to the land I sold to Jonas Wright, I leave her the use of 1/3 of my farm and the use of the back room she lives in and the little room behind it, and half of the cellar under the shop, and all my household furniture, and a negro wench to wait on her. "After the death of my wife the negro wench to be sold to the highest bidder." "I also leave to my wife Deborah £40 per annum, and she is to have a Decent Burial at the discretion of my executors." All the rest of my lands I leave to my 5 children. If any minerals and ore be found on my lands the charges of mining to be among my children, also the profits. My children that have my farm at Bloomingdale shall pay me £25 per annum during my life. I make my son Garrett and my friend Abraham Lott, of New York, baker, and my son Cornelius and my wife Deborah, executors. December 14, 1764. If any of my children think that their part of the farm is too small for farm, they may convey their parts to each other. Witnesses, Thomas Clement, Gent., Morris Earle, Joost Evert. Proved, April 8, 1765.

In her will, she wrote: In the name of God, Amen, November 25, 1774. I, Deborah Cozine, relict of Cornelius Cozine, late of Bloomingdale, New York. My executors are to pay all debts. I leave to my daughter Sarah a bed "as it now stands in the back room with blue curtains." I leave to my granddaughter, Deborah Cozine, one large silver tablespoon and a gold ring. I leave to my grandson Cornelius, son of Balm Johnson Cozine, a silver tablespoon. To my granddaughter, Lettie Fletcher, two of my gowns. All the rest to be sold in three months, and all debts paid, and the remainder to be paid to the children of my son, Balm Johnson Cozine, viz., Sarah, John, Deborah, Nicholas, Cornelius, and Catharine. I make John Hopper, Jr., and Wessell Hopper, executors. Witnesses, Henry Gulick, Phebe Gulick, George Furman. Proved, April 4, 1775. The executors resigned, and Letters of Administration were granted to Balm Johnson Cozine.

He went to NJ in 1751 and became the Reformed Dutch pastor at Conewago [York County], PA, where he served from the fall of 1772 to 1786.

In 1761, Cornelius Cozine contributed £2.0.0 to Neshanic Church building fund. He was living in Somerset Co., NJ in 1762⁶.

It is not known where Rev. Cosine took his training or was ordained. Until the fall of 1772 the Conewago congregation was attended to by various ministers sent from the Classis of New Brunswick (NJ). At that time the colony secured a pastor of their own, Rev. Cornelius Cosine. Dr. E. T. Corwin, in his *Manual of the Reformed Church in America*, says of him only that he was pastor of the Conewago Church from 1784 to 1788 (note: he died in 1786). But, in the baptismal record the sacrament was administered by him at stated times beginning 11 Oct 1772.⁶

The earliest settlers in the colony came in 1765, with the main migration taking place in 1771. The Conewago colonists cleared farms and built homes along a road still known as the Low Dutch Road which extended in a S.W. direction from the junction of Little Conewago with Big Conewago Creek about 2 miles E. of Hunterstown to the Baltimore Pike and down the pike to Two Taverns. The colony was shaped somewhat like a half moon, and at either end was a cemetery. Both cemeteries are maintained today by donations from descendants of the colonists. The Reformed Dutch Church was built at the north end of the colony. The preserved baptism records indicate that the church was organized at least as early as 1769.⁶

Rev. Cornelius Cosine (Cozine) owned two separate tracts of land under application No. 5203 dated 3 Oct 1768. One was located at "F" containing 280 acres 157 perches, the other located at "G" containing 254.25 acres. (Pa. Land Office Survey Docket C-23-257 and C-42-205. Warrant dates of 3 Oct 1767 and 30 Jun 1773 respectively.) The Application No. and date are from a copy of the original survey signed by Deputy Surveyor Archibald McClean in possession of Arthur Weaner. This survey draft lists a tract of land between the two containing 73.25 acres, with the notation "This there is as yet no Right for but is recorded in my books. Archd. McClean" Both tracts were called "Pleasant Plain."

Unrecorded Deeds, Vol. 3, Brooklyn, Kings Co. Courthouse, NY. Abstract of "Indenture made April 13, 1754 etc ... between Cornelius Cozine and Antie, his wife, of Bushwick ... Abraham Bogart of Brucklands ... a certain farm and tract of land lying in Bushwick ... Gerrit Couwenhoven to whom this tract or place did formerly belong ... that said Cornelius Cozine and Antie his wife, now possess in their own right ... in perfect absolute and Indefeaible Estate of Inheritance ... the said tract or parcell of land" Signed: Cornelius Cozine, Antie Cozine {her mark} This record is a valuable piece of information in accurately identifying Rev. Cosine's mother. Gerrit Van Couwenhoven was the first husband of Aeltje Van Wyck. This piece of land was probably the 1/3 dower of Aeltje Van Couwenhoven, widow, and Cornelius would inherit from her. His half brother, Gerrit Van Couwenhoven, would have inherited the other 2/3 of his father's estate.⁶

In the Orphans Court Dockets F, 214, 31 Jul 1789, upon the petition of the executors of Rev. Cosine's estate, the court appointed John Cozine (his son) and James Brinkerhoff to be guardians of Anne and David, two of the minor orphan children of Cornelius Cozine "the younger," and grandchildren of the said Cornelius Cozine, "the Elder." There must have been disagreement over the children since Cornelius Jr. appointed his father-in-law as guardian of his orphan children, and when he died, his brother-in-law, Samuel Demaree, took over those responsibilities.⁶

Jacobus Vanarden of Haverstraw, Orange Co, NY, yeoman, Attorney for Mary Cozine, widow, of York Co, appointed Jacobus Brinkerhoff of York, her attorney and for the widow to recover and receive from David Beaty for the estate of Rev. Cornelius Cozine dec'd of York Co, PA money that is due Oct 1790, Jacobus Vanorden, Orange Co NY.³

In his will, he wrote: I Cornelius Cosine of Strabann Township in the County of York and State of Pennsylvania being weak of body but of sound mind and Memory and caling to mind the Mortalety of Body and knowing that it is appointed for

all men to die; Do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in Mannar and form following that is to Say Principaly and first of all, I recommend my Soul to the hand of God and my Body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner, at the Discreation of my Executors and so touching such Estate as it hath Please God to blif me with in this Life. I give Bequeath and dispose of in Manner and form following, Viz. First of all, I order and allow all Just Debts and fumeral expences to be paid out of my Estate, Imprimis I have and Bequith to my loving wife Mary hir Choice of all my Beds with its furniture, and One hundred Pounds Lawful money of the State affor said to be paid to hir as soon as it can be raised, out of my Estate; which is to be Considered as hir full Dower of my Estate Rail and Personal. Also I lave and bequith unto my sons John and Garard each of them one Wagon and two Horses such as my Executors shall think Proper. Also I lave and Bequith to my Daughter Aunty intermarried with Simon Vonasdal, the sum of eighty Pounds Lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I lave and Bequith unto my daughter Lume intermarried with John Bodine the Sum of eighty Pounds Lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I lave and bequith unto my daughter Anne intermarried with Barnet Smock the Sum of eighty Pounds lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I lave and Bequith to my Daughter Jane intermarried with Luke Vanasdal the Sum of eighty Pounds Lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I lave and Bequith to my Daughter Ufemy intermarried with James Westbelt the Sum of eighty Pounds Lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I lave and Bequith to me Daughter Mary Intermarried with Abram Broca the Sum of eighty Pounds Lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I lave and Bequith to me Daughter Elizabeth intermarried with Peter Banta the Sum of eighty Pounds Lawful money to hir and hir Heirs. Also I order and allow that each and every of the above Sums to be paid to my Daughters above named out of my Estate Real and Personal at the Discretion of my Executors, so as not to exceed six year untill the hole is paid. Also I lave and bequith to the four childring of my Son Petter Consine deceased the one fourth of the remainder of my Estate Rail and Personal and Forty six Pounds thirteen shilling and sic pence over and above the afforsaid one fourth to then and their Heirs to be divided as Nearly equal as Passable between Mail and Fenal as I have divided among my Sons and daughters. Also I lave and Bequith to my son Cornelius the one fourth of the remainder of my Estate Real and Personal (except one Hundred forty Pounds) to be take from his one forth and added to the children of Peter Coninie deceased as afford saide John Conime and Garard to him and his Heirs. Also I do order and Allow that Elizabeth Venordir shall have an Out Let as my Executors shall think she hath earend Also I do order and allow that my Executors hereafter named do make, Seal and Deliver a good and sufficient Deed of Conveyance of that part of my Real Estate where my son Cornelius formerly lived Containing one hundred and eighty one acer and one half to Dennis Buys his Heirs and Asseigns, Agreeable to the artiele of Agreement Between the said Dennis Buys and Myself and the paid conveyance to be as sufficient as if I myself had mad it. Also I do order and allow that the hole of my Estate Both Real and Personal be put to Seal at the discreation of my Executors, And Lastly I do order Constitute and appoint Francis Casart, George Williamson and David Beaty Esq. to be my hole and Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Revoaking and Disannuling all other Wils and Instruments of Writing, Ratifying and Confirming this my Last Will and Testement In Witness wherof I put my hand and Seal the fifth Day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-six. Sugned Sealed and Published Peter Cannine Roelof Brinkerhof Jacob Brinlerhoh. Before me Jacob Barnitz Esquire Register of Probate of Wills and granting of Letter of Administration in and for the county of York in the State of Pennsylvania. Personally came Roelef Brinkerhof and Jacob Brinkerhof two of the subscribing witnesses to the foregoing Instrument of writing and on their Solemn Oath do severally say, that they were personally present and Saw and Heard the foregoing named Cornelius Cosine mark unto and Seal and publish the foregoing instrument of writing as and for his last Will and Testament, and that at the time of doing therof he said Cornelius Cosine was sound disposing Mind, Memory and unerstanding to the best of their knowledge, and belief and that they subscribed their names thereto as Witnesses in the presence of the said testator and at his request and also in the presence of each other, and farther that they also saw Peter Cannine the other witness subscribe his name thereto as a Witness at the same time. Jacob Brinkerhof Roelef Brinkerhof. Sworn and subscribed before me at York the 30th day of August 1786 Jacob Barnitz Register. Memorandum that letters testamentary in Common form were granted unto Francis Casart, George Williamson, and David Beaty Esq. of the Estate of the Rev. Cornelius Cosine deceased. Inventory to be exhibited into the Register's office on the thirtieth day of September next and as account or reckoning on the thirtieth day August 1787 or when legally required. Given uner my hand and seal of office, the 30th day of August 1786.⁴ (York Co., PA, Will Book G, p. 122)

Jacobus Vanarden of Haverstraw, Orange Co, NY, yeoman, Attorney for Mary Cozine, widow, of York Co, appointed Jacobus Brinkerhoff of York, her attorney and for the widow to recover and receive from David Beaty for the estate of Rev. Cornelius Cozine dec'd of York Co, PA money that is due Oct 1790, Jacobus Vanorden, Orange Co NY. (Dauphin Co., PA Deed Book H, Vol. 2, p. 430).⁷

John Yurry and Elizabeth, wife, daughter of Mary, wife of Rev. C. Cozine, dec'd of the town of Haverstraw, in the County of Orange NY in the town of Haverstraw appoints Joseph Brinkerhoff of York Co, PA their attorney to receive what ever due them from Jacob's estate. (Dauphin Co., PA Deed Book H, Vol. 2, p. 430).⁷

State of Kentucky, Mercer Co, to wit: To all whom these press----, I Samuel Demaree of Kentucky and the County of Mercer the only surviving Executor of Cornelious Cozine dec'd for the diverse good causes and considerations appoint Luke Vanardel (Vanarsdal) of this State etc. and Jacob Cofsort and David Cofsort Jr. or York and PA my attorney's and in my name to transact all business for me in PA. Maria Brouwer/Brewer m. (2) 10 Jan 1788 Mercer Co., KY, **Samuel Demaree, Jr.**, son of Samuel Demaree & Leah Demarest. They relocated to Shelby Co., KY before 1790 when tragedy struck. Young Daniel was killed and his sister, Sarah, was kidnapped by Indians.³

Researched by Mrs. Trynke Hoekstra, of Ermelo, Netherlands for Jim Cozine in Oct 2000 -- Putten, married 2 January 1631: Cosijn Gerrits, son of the late Gerrit Jans, to Maeijken Everts, daughter of the late Evert Reijers. both of Putten.⁵

Gerrit Jans (the father) was also named from Oldenbaneveld or Barneveld.⁵

Cosyn Gerritsen was a prominent farmer and wheelwright from Putten, Netherlands, who came to New Amsterdam in 1633⁴; he lived in the settlement called the Bouwery in New Amsterdam.

In the manuscript by mr j D Robinson done in 1982 he says that Cosyn signed on to come to New Amsterdam April 9, 1633 at Utrecht.

Vouwtie was a passenger on the *De Trouw* (the *Faith*) in Feb 1659 listed as "Vrouwtje Gerrits, wife of Cosyn Gerritsen; Wheelwright." (no children are listed with her).^{3,7}

In a 1643 indenture he is named as "Cosyn Gerritsen wheelwright." A power of attorney was granted by Cosyn Gerritsen to Sybolt Claessen, to receive a legacy left him by Susanna Ellfertsen in Hoorn, in 1649.¹

In two declarations in NYHM: Dutch vol II Cosyn states he is aged 36 years in Nov 1643 [orig. page 90] and about 36 years of age on 13 May 1644 [orig. page 109].¹⁰

41: Bou van Cosyn -- The bouwery of Cosyn Gerritsen van Putten. The ground-brief was made to him March 13, 1647 (Liber GG:185, Albany), and included 34 morgen. This plantation was bounded east by the wagon-road from Sapokanikan

(the Bowery Lane as far as the point where the road over the Sand Hills met it, was often so called). Cal.Hist.MSS, Dutch, 373. It covered land lying south of the road over the Sand Hills, corresponding with the present Astor Place, and is correctly placed on the Manatua Maps. See DePeyster Papers, in NY Hist. Soc.⁹

Parcel C -- Parcel C of this farm embraces the land granted to Cosyn Gerritsen east of the Greenwich Road; the Old Van Twiller homestead plot; and a tract of 20 acres opposite the homestead, originally part of the lands of Van Twiller. Cosyn Gerritsen's Bouwery. The Manatus Maps list, No. 41: Bou van Cosyn. In Vol. III, 203 (photocopy not clear, has a smudge there) that number is attributed to this bouwery, 34 morgens in extent. Further research has proved that Cosyn Gerritsen's homestead farm and house lot, in 1639, was the five acre tract north of his old wagon way, which finally became a part of the land of 'Sailors Snug Harbor'. Cosyn Gerritsen van Putten was an early settler, but very little has been found about him in the records. March 2, 1640 he gave power of attorney to Aert Gerritsen to collect money due him in Hoorn. In 1643 he is mentioned as a wheelwright, a trade he followed for many years. In 1649 he employed a friend to receive a legacy due from relatives at Hoorn. Cal Hist. MSS, Dutch 13, 23, 48.⁹

(The ground-brief which follows did not cover any land that had belonged to Van Twiller.) Willem Kieft, Director, etc. to Cosyn Gerritsen. Ground-brief dated March 13, 1647, Liber GG:185(Albany). Original in DeLancey Papers, 1647-1804 in NY Hist Soc. Conveys "A certain piece of land bounded on the North West by Twillers Plantation (original reads:lying North West of van Twiller's Plantation) and extends along by his said improvements (dwelling house) till to the Cripplebush, East one half point Southerly 40 rods: along the Cripplebush, South by West, one half point Westerly, 208 rods: its breadth in the Woods, North one half point Westerly, 128 rods; then back to the place of beginning, along the Wagon road from Sapocanikan, South South East one half point Easterly, 200 rods; amounting in all to about 34 morgens." (The original contains the reservation concerning Van Twiller's plantation found in the confirmation.)⁹

Richard Nicolls to Cosyn Gerritsen. Confirmation dated May 26, 1668. Not found of record; original in DeLancey Papers, 1647-1804, in NY Hist. Soc. Richard Nicolls, Esq., Governor General, under his Royall Highnesse James, Duke of Yorke and Albany, etc., of all his Territoryes in America; To all to whom these presents shall come, sendeth Greeting. Whereas there was a Patent or Ground briefe, heretofore graunted by the Dutch Governor William Kieft, unto Cosyn Gerrits, for a certaine piece of Land, upon this Island Manhatans, lying & being to the North west of Twiller's plantation, Striking by his Land, to the swampe East, and a little Southerly it contains forty Rod; In length along by the said Swampe, South and by west, half a Stroke more westerly, it makes two hundred and Eight Rod. In breadth into the woods, Northerly, half a Stroke to the West, it is one hundred twenty Eight Rod; Again by the first descent, alongst the Waggon Path, South South East, halfe a Stroke more Easterly, it contenes two hundred and twenty Rod, and amounts in all to about Sixty Eight Acres, or thirty-four Margen; Which said Patent or Ground briefe so graunted as aforesaid, bears date the 13th day of March 1647, having this Proviso or condition therein, That the said Ground briefe should bee no prejudice to the Govenor van Twiller's Plantation; Now for a Confirmation unto him the said Cosyn Gerrits, in his Possession and Enjoyment of the premises (with the proviso and Condition aofresaid) Know Yee, &c. 'Given under my hand and Seale at ffort James in New York, the 26th day of May in the twentieth yeare of his Ma'ties Regne, Annoq Domini, 1668. Richard Nicolls. Recorded by Order of the Governor the day and yeare above written. Matthias Nicolls, Sec.⁹

On the tax list for 15 July 1699 there is an item in the west ward "Cosyn Gerretse Estate". This is just above Gerrett Cosine 3 houses &c. [Collections of The New-York Historical Society, 1911, vol. II, p. 289].¹⁰

Garrett Cosyn, of the City of new York, Carman and Beiltie, his wife, to Adrian van Schaick, of the Bouwery, Gentleman. Deed dated Dec. 15 1698.* (*This must have been the date of the delivery of the deed. Van Schaick was in possession in 1690.) Not found of record; original in Warren Deeds, 1691-1784, in NYHist Soc Consid., L265 10s. Recites ground-brief March 13, 1647, confirmation May 26, 1698 (1668) That Garrett Cosyn inherited as eldest son and heir of Cosyn Gerritsen. Conveys land described in the ground-brief, with the same proviso or condition about Van Twiller's plantation. "The devolution of title from Adriaen Cornelissen van Schaick to Cornelius Webber is the same for thuis parcel as for parcel B."⁹

25 April 1665 -- Cousyn Gerritzen, pltf. v/s Eghbert Woutersen, deft. Pltf. demands possession of a farm of Wolter van Twiller's according to acte executed to him by Gerrit Rees. Deft says, he has incurred expence on the farm, for which he agreed with Rensselaar, that he should have the use of it for four or five years, and that Rensselaar has let him know, that no one else but he has authority over it and shall send him down the conditions. Burgomasters and Schepens decree, as no power of attorney is exhibited, that the case shall be postponed, until Rensselaar writes down or until procuracion be exhibited' and deft. shall meanwhile have the use of the land as long, as his lease runs.⁸

Pltf. says, that deft. meeting him yesterday on the Bouwery Road, drew a knife and said - Draw, van Leer, or I shall stab and cut you, etc. Proceeding against pltf. with very threatening and abusive words, so that the pltf. was obliged to save his life in the house of Cosyn Gerretsen as the deft. pressed hard upon him. Deft. says, that pltf. challenged him yesterday morning in the house of Lucas Dircks, the tapster, to fight in the neighborhood of the Fresh Water, and as he did not find the pltf. there at the appointed time he went further towards the bouwery, where he found him on the road and asked him, Is this the appointed place etc ? Admits further having drawn a knife and to have said - Draw also van Leer. Pltf. denies having challenged the deft. and demands, that he shall prove it, as there were many people at Luycas Dircks at the time, who without doubt have heard him. Deft. answering says, that the pltf. whispered it to him, so that none of the bystanders could hear him. Tomas Lodowyck entering declares, that as he was proceeding with Abel Hardenbroeck and some women folk towards the Bouwery, he saw the deft. Denys Isaackzen draw the knife on pltf., whom he pursued with many abusive and threatening words. The Mayor and Aldermen having heard parties, refer the decision to the Court of Assizes and order deft. meanwhile to enter sufficient bail in the sum of fl. 500 Hollands, that he shall comport himself towards the pltf. in such wise as an honest and decent man ought to do. Ady as above.²

Gerrit Cosyn and his wife, Vrouwtje Gerrits are both shown on Selyn's list of members of the NYC Ref Ch in 1686 as liv-

ing beyond the Fresh Water. [HSYB for 1916]

[Note:] Cosyn Gerritsen's farm was near the present Astor Place, having a frontage of 16 rods on the Bowery and running thence West 100 rods "to a way that is by a certain swamp" (Hoffman, E. S. 2, 193), that is the old Greenwich Lane, thus crossing Broadway to Waverley Place betw. 5th and 6th Avenues. The scene of the above told encounter therefore was on 4th Ave. and Astor Place. - O.C. Cosyn Gerretszen owned the land on which now stands N.Y.U. and Washington Sq. Park.²

"Garrit Cosine" is listed in 1738 on "A List of all the Inhabitants of the Township off Flattbush both of Whites and Blacks, Males and Females." He and his wife were living with a black female under age 10. Also in 1738 "Gerret Cozyn" is listed on the "muster roul" of Capt. Boelen's Company of the NY Militia. In Flatbush on 15 Apr 1755 a list of all slaves in the area was made. "Gerret Cozyn" was listed as having one male slave named Henry.¹

He signed a Will on 24 Apr 1781 in Staten Island, Richmond Co., NY. Abstracts of Wills, New York (Lib. 34, p.436) -- "I, Garret Cosine, of the County of Richmond (Staten Island), Yeoman ... I leave to my two sons Jacob and Cornelius Cosine, a certain piece of land lying or being on Long Island at New Lots in Kings County, now in possession of Cornelius Cosine to be equally divided between them; also to Jacob Cosine 3 pounds, he being my eldest son. To son James Cosine 90 pounds; to son Wilhelmes 100 pounds; to my daughter Altie Dougan 40 shillings, ... to all my children-vis-Javob, Cornelius, James, Wilhelmes, Affe, wife of John Blauw, Altie, wife of Cornelius Dougan." Witnesses: Peter Housman, William Kingston, John Houseman. Proved: 20 Feb 1782.¹

In his will, he wrote: I, Garret Cozine, of the Province of New York, now bound to Albany in the King's Service. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my wife Jane all my estate, real and personal, while she remains my widow, but if she marries, she shall have only one-third. I leave to my son Cornelius all my apparell, and £5 more than one-third of my estate. I leave to my daughter Catrina 1/3 of my estate. To my daughter Hannah £100 more than 1/3 of my estate. I make my wife Jane, executor." Dated February 16, 1759. Witnesses, Morris Earle, Crossfield Thurston, Nicholas Fletcher. Proved, October 22, 1773, before Moses Grumley, Esq. Confirmed by Governor Tryon, November 9, 1779, and Jane Cozine being dead, Letters of Administration are granted to Catharine, wife of Jacob Harsen, late Catharine Cozine. Administration granted on the estate of Garrit Cosine to Jacob Harsen in the outward of New York City, yeoman, and Catharine his wife, a daughter and residuary Legatee of Garrit Cosine, late of the said City, deceased. Whereas said Garrit Cosine made his will February 16, 1759, and appointed his wife Jane sole Executrix and soon after died, and whereas the will was proved at New York, October 22, 1773, and administration granted to said Jane, who has since died also, the estate not being settled, administration is hereby granted to the above. August 5, 1785.

Jacobus Cosine is on "A True List of the Respective Officers and Souldiers Belonging to the Regiment of Militia in Kings County; 1715," in Capt. Frances Titus' company.²

"Jacobus Cosyn" is listed in 1738 on "A List of all the Inhabitants of the Township off Flatbush both of Whites and Blacks, Males and Females." He and another white male above 10 years were living with 2 white females above 10 years, 2 black males above 10 years, a black female above age 10.²

In his will, he wrote: ...April 1, 1734. I, Jacobus Cousine, of Bushwick, in Kings County, yeoman, being in good health. I leave to my son Gerritt, all the farm where he now dwelleth, lying at a place called Flatlands, in said county, with all the stock of cattle and 3 negroes. I leave to my wife Altie the use of all the rest of my estate during her life, and after that "my son now called Cornelius" is to have the house and farm, and all things thereunto belonging; Also a negro man, 6 horses and 6 cows. I leave to my daughter, Affey Cousine, my two houses and lots in New York. I make my wife Allie, Cornelius Cousine, Abraham Van Wyck, and Gerritt Cousine, executors. Witnesses, Elbert Lieverse, Elbert Haring, Edward Penant. Proved, November 30, 1739.

An unrecorded deed shows Cornelius & Antie (Staats) Cozine selling land that formerly belonged to Gerrit Van Cowenhoven, probably Aeltje's one-third share of her first husband's estate. It is likely that she died before then and they were disposing of her estate.²
