The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Cregier, Martyn (Capt.; Martinus)

He was the first burgomaster of New Amsterdam and was a merchant at New Castle on the Delaware River.¹

Martin Cregier was at first a trader in America. On September 2, 1643, there is a record of him discussing the price of beaver. On July 15, 1644, he sent 50 beavers to Holland for sale. On December 4, 1646, he signed partnership papers with Kieft, acting for the West India Company, and 9 others which indicate he owned 1/16th of the small French-built frigate, "La Garce," which sailed as a privateer under the control of the Dutch government, preying upon Spanish barks and returning to New Amsterdam with copper, Negroes, coral, wine, tobacco, ebony, sugar and the spoils of war. Cregier was captain of a sloop which sailed between Albany and New Amsterdam, called the "Bedfort" with which in later years he traded along the Delaware.⁵

Jan Janszen alias Jan Wanshaer (and other names) became a part owner in *LaGarce*. But he sold his share in 1646. On (prob) Sept 15, 1646: "Bill of sale. William Albertus Blauwfelt and others, owners of the frigate *La Garce*, to Christiaan Petersen & Co." 1644 Nov 26, Contract: "Anthony Crol, Christiaan Pietersen, Abraham, Philip and Jan Jansen, part owners of the frigate *La Garce*, to provide for Cornelis Deelee, afflicted with a cancer, and to pay his surgeon's bill." 26 Nov 1644: "Joint will of Abraham Jansen and Simon Joosten, part owners of the frigate *La Garce*." On 4 Dec 1646, the following signed articles of copartnership in the privateer frigate *La Garce*: Augustyn Herrman, Capt. [William Albertus] Blauvelt, Director Kieft, Jan Damen, Jacob Wolphertsen, Martin Cregier, Jacob Stoffelsen, Hendrick Jacobsen, Pater Vaer, Hendrick Arentsen, Christian Petersen Rams, William de Key.⁶

Capt. Martyn Cregier/Kregier was the first burgomaster of New Amsterdam; a fearless and skillful military leader and an exemplary magistrate. Retiring from the city he settled on a plantation in Niskayuna, a portion of which is still held by his descendants, and there ended his days in the early part of 1713 (?) (O'Callaghan's Hist. N. Netherland, II, 554).³

About the official response to the Esopus massacre of 1663, Henri and Barbara van der Zee wrote, in *A Sweet and Alien Land: the Story of Dutch New York*, Viking Press, 1978p. 407: "Enthusiasm was as usual almost nil. The general himself visited several places, but could not inspire the colonists to enlist. The army that arrived at Wiltwyck [Kingston] was composed mainly of eighty company mercenaries and thirty English soldiers under Sergeant Nicholas Stilwell, accompanied by forty Long Island Indians. It was not a very impressive force, but the troops were under the command of New Netherland's best warrior -- Martin Cregier -- the experienced commander of the burgher militia in New Amsterdam. He was assisted by Pieter van Couwenhoven, another Captain of the burgher guard, now in charge of the Indians. Captain Lieutenant Cregier, at that time about forty-five years old, had, like so many excellent soldiers, served his military apprenticeship in the Dutch armies of Stadtholder Frederick Hendrick, Prince of Orange. He was a pleasant, intelligent, and able personality, a born leader. Apart from his tavern, he ran a prosperous shipping business. Official appointments had been heaped on him since his arrival around 1643 -- firewarden, orphanmaster, militia commander -- and ten years later he became the first burgomaster of New Amsterdam, a function he would frequently fulfill and which he had relinquished upon taking command of the vital campaign at Esopus. It was to become the crown of his career..."

It is known that Martin had a tavern on 23 Jul 1647 when Fiscal Van Dyck's conduct was questioned (See Calendar of NY Man. v I:39).

Marten Cregier was listed in the 1686 Dominie Selyns list of members of the NYC Ref Ch. He was living on Paerl Straet, (Pearl Street) (Between State and Whitehall Sts.). Listed before him were: Jan Willemszen, en syn huysv. Lysbeth Fredricx. Listed after him were: Tryntie Cregier, wed. van Stoffel Hooglant; Margareta Blanck, h. v. Philip Smit; Gerrit Hardenberg, en syn huysv. Jaepje Schepmoes; Sara Hardenberg; etc.⁴

At the time of their marriage, they were from New Albany.

He was public clerk in New Amsterdam, from 1646 to 1661: probably removed to Albany about 1685; owned a lot inherited from his mother-in-law on the east side of North Pearl a little south of Steuben street.³

1681 Agreement of Gerrit Banker, husband of Elisabeth van Eps, Marte Cregier husband of Jannetie Hendriks, both sons-in-law of Maria Dame deceased, and also for Jan van Eps her son at Schenectady, with Hendrick and Gerrit van Ness, attorneys for their father Cornelis van Nes, releasing for 5700 guilders the interest of the surviving husband in his wife's estate, partly annulling the joint 1677 will of Corn: van Ness and Maria Daeme.²

In his will, written in Dutch and dated 12 Jan 1702, probated 3 March 1711 at Albany, Martin Cregier "living at Castagoa in the jurisdiction of New Albany" left property to wife Janettie, eldest son Martyn, and other children. The children named were: Martyn, Elizabeth, Margaritse, Catrina, Johana, Samuel, and Gertruy. Witnesses were Matys Rossie and Johannes Quackenbos.¹

His wife made her will Aug. 22, 1734, proved June 10, 1741, and mentions all the children except Johanna; was buried in Niskayuna, Aug 28, 1734.³

In his will, he wrote: Nicholas Cruger, New York, Merchant, after my just debts and funeral charges are paid I will my executors, to make a full and perfect inventory of my estate--I bequeath to my aged Uncle John Cruger, Esq--the annual sum of £150, during his natural life, the first payment to be made to him in one year after my death and on that day yearly during his said life; the residue of my estate both real and personal I devise as follows; one third part thereof to my wife Ann, her heirs forever; and it is my will that my wife, may if agreeable to her take the said one third part thereof out of such part or parts of my estates as she may choose so that on a fair and equitable valuation of the said part or parts she shall so choose shall not together exceed the value of one third of my real and personal estate as first above devised to her; also to my wife, all her wearing apparel, rings, jewels, and other personal ornaments; the remaining two thirds of my estate to my children, sons and daughters as well as those of my first marriage, to be divided among them share and share alike; my executors to pay to each of them their separate shares on their arriving to the age of twenty-one years; should any of my children die before arriving at lawful age and without issue the share of the one so dying shall be equally divided among the survivors; whereas by the death of my first wife in the Island of St. Croix, the laws of Denmark and that Island entitled my children by my first wife to a certain part of my estate in the said Island of St. Croix and elsewhere; to the intent therefore that my children by my present wife receive an equal share with the children of my first wife, it is my will that that part of my estate shall be considered as part of the two thirds of my estate as above given to all my children; but if either of my children by my first wife shall take and receive to his separate use the aforesaid part of my estate in the Island of St. Croix or elsewhere which by the said laws thereof and those of Denmark they are entitled to then it is my will that it be considered as taken and received in part of his legacy herein devised to him; but if it should amount to as much as the whole of his legacy so as aforesaid devised to him then it be considered as taken in full satisfaction thereof--I appoint my wife Ann, executrix, Robert Watts, John Watts, Esq Cornelius Stevenson, Esq--all of New York, executors, my executors to repair and improve all my estate to the best advantage for my several devisees and at their discretion to sell both real and personal estates or lease or rent the same, and the monies arising therefrom to be put out at Interest upon good security and that so much of the Income or Interest thereof on the separate shares of my children as will be necessary and sufficient for their and each of their support and education, during their minority; my executors to pay the same to them for their use either annually or otherwise as occasion may so require; if the interest or income of their share be more than sufficient then it is my will that the over plus be also placed out at interest (as it shall arise) for each of their separate use; I give my executors full power to sell or dispose of and convey all or any part of my real estate and to settle all differences or disputes that may arise in and about the execution of this Will. Dated February 22, 1791. Witnesses Charles Haight, James Codwise, Michael D. Henry. CODICIL.--I have found it necessary to return to this Island where part of my property lies arising from inheritance in right of my first wife Ann Cruger, born De Nully and my present wife Ann Cruger, born Markoe, both or neither of which are mentioned or included in my preceding Will, have thought it necessary to make the following arrangement in this Codicil with respect to said property intending the same to be as binding as my preceding Will dated February 22, 1791; the children of my first wife shall inherit and receive to themselves only all that part or share of the property coming to me from the joint estates of Major and Madame De Nully in right of my marriage with their daughter, leaving to my sons and daughters by said marriage the whole thereof to be equally divided between them; the whole of the property coming to me from the estate of Isaac and Elizabeth Markoe shall be and remain the whole and sole property of my wife Ann Cruger during her natural life, and to be at her entire disposal after the same so that she shall not be accountable to any person whatever for any disposition she may think proper to make of the same--I have thought it necessary that some person in this Island should be named with my executors in my said Will above mentioned--I nominate William H.
