

-- CROUTER --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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**Crouter**

The Crouter family may have had its origins in or around Picardy, France, where about 1406 Harmen and Julian Croutere were awarded grants for life for safe-keeping the castle of Guynes in Picardy.

David Crouter was one of ten soldiers left at Quabaug (Brookfield) March 4, 1675. They were left there by Col. Will Turner when taking soldiers out of Boston for the relief of the settlements in MA and CT in King Phillips War.

Anthony Crowder is listed in Capt. John Peter Smith's (Orange Co.) company in the NY troops under the command of Col. (James) DeLancey, esq., 1758, as 26 yrs. old; trade, Taylor; stature 5-10-1/2; voluntier, officer who enlisted-Peter Smith; hair, short brown; time of enlistment April 23, 1758.

On Feb 28, 1774 Anthony Krauter was elected Warden of the Ramapo Church.

In the Revolution, Anthony Crouter served in his second war. He enlisted April 22, 1776 in Capt. David Van Ness' company, Col. Goose Van Schaick's battalion of NY State troops, also known as 1st NY Regiment, Continentals, being the first regiment raised in NY state, and the first regiment to take the field against King George, but its principal fighting was in north New York State. The muster rolls show him present at every call. On Dec. 15, 1776 he re-enlisted for the war in Capt. Andrew Fink Jr.'s company, same regiment as previously stated, and was transferred Nov. 24, 1777 to Capt. John H. Wendell's company, same regiment, a picket company of men trained as scouts and in Indian fighting. This regiment took part in the bloody battle of Oriskany Aug. 6, 1777 which caused the surrender of Burgoyne and in the battles of Saratoga Sept. 19 and Oct. 7, 1777 which preceded the surrender. By the end of 1778 they had made the northern frontiers of New York State quite secure. In 1779 his regiment and one other regiment, that of Col. Marinus Willette was sent against the Onandaga Indians and in many bloody encounters destroyed all their villages. In one of these encounters Anthony Crouter was taken prisoner probably wounded, for his record states "Taken prisoner at Fort Stanwix June 4, 1779." Fort Stanwix was situated on the present site of the city of Rome, NY.<sup>1</sup>

A Mary Crouter was listed as head of the household in the 1790 Federal Census, living in New York State, Orange County, Haverstraw Town, with three males under 16, and two females (one being herself). A John Crouter was listed immediately after her; his family consisted of two males 16 and over; 2 males under 16; and 2 females.

On 19 February 1805 (recorded 13 May 1806, Bergen Co. Y:9) Peter Stultz of the Township of Franklin, and Jemiah, his wife, conveyed to Anthony Crouter of the same place, for \$550, 20 acres strict measure being part of a tract in the Ramapock tract in the Township of Franklin (lot no. 24). Signed by Peter Stults, Jemimah Stults (her mark). Witnessed by Abrm. Westervelt, Anne Westervelt.<sup>1</sup>

He was living in Allendale by 1811, possibly in a house at what is now the southeastern corner of the intersection of East Allendale Avenue and Franklin Turnpike.

C. P. Crouter, 26, carpenter, and Sarah Crouter, 22, were listed, with Augustus Crouter, 3, in the 1870 Federal Census, liv-

ing in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ (in or near what became Ridgewood).

He was a carpenter. In 1874 he bought the Ridgewood butcher business of John J. Bogert and conducted the Crouter Market for 39 years, until 1913.
