The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

A John Cuer, possibly this one, along with William Ward and William Fowler, was witness to the will of William Kerke, yeoman, of the Manor of Pelham in Westchester County, dated 14 April 1713; probated 6 June 1719.¹

In his will he wrote, John Cure, of New York City, vintner, being sick. I leave to my son John my silver-hilted sword. To my son William, £10. To my daughter Sarah £20. To my daughter Beliche 1 shilling, in full of any claim to any part of my estate. All the rest of my estate I leave to my children Anne, John, Robert, William and Sarah. I leave to my daughter Sarah 1 feather bed, and furniture, 1 looking-glass, 1 dozen plates, etc. I make my son John and my brother-in-law, Cornelius Cousyn, executors. Dated September 6, 1735. Witnesses, Rachel Sanders, Samson Teller, H. De Myer. Proved, September 15, 1736.

Cure, William (d. 1632), statuary, was son of Cornelius Cure, a native of the parish of St. Thomas the Apostle, Southwark, who held the office of master-mason under Queen Elizabeth and James I, was employed in 1605-6 to erect monuments to Queen Elizabeth and Mary Queen of Scots in Westminster Abbey, and died in 1607. On his father's death William succeeded to his post of master-mason to James I, and completed the monument to Mary Queen of Scots. This monument, the painting of which was executed by one James Mauncy or Manuty, presents perhaps the most faithful portrait of that ill-fated queen at the time of her death; Cure received 825 l. 10s. for his share in the work.¹

Payments for the services of Cure and his father on these works occur in Sir Julius Caesar's papers (Brit. Mus. Lansd. MS. 164). In 1613 Cure signed an agreement to erect a monument in Cranford Church, Middlesex to Sir Roger Aston, master of the great wardrobe to James I, his two wives, and his children; this agreement still exists (Gent. Mag. 1800, lxx. 104). In 1618 he signed another agreement to erect a monument in the Abbey Church at Bath to James Montague, bishop of Winchester, for 200l.; this agreement also exists, and it is noteworthy that he spells his name in his signature as Cuer (Dingley, History from Marble, i. 155, Camd. Soc. Publ.) Cure worked under Inigo Jones at the Banqueting House, Whitehall, and continued to hold the office of master-mason until his death in 1632, when he was succeeded by Nicolas Stone (q.v.). On 4 Aug. 1632 he was buried in the church of St. Thomas the Apostle, Southwark. Francis Meres, in his 'Palladis Tamie' (published 1598) says: As Lysippus, Praxiteles, and Pyrgoteles were excellent engravers, so have we these engravers, Rogers, Christopher Switzer, and Cure." It is no doubt Cornelius Cure who is thus extolled. It would appear that Cure was of Dutch origin, as in 1576 there exists a payment to "W. Cure, Duchemane graver," for making a clay figure of the tartar, lately brought to England by Sir Martin Frobisher (RYE, England as seen by Foreigner, p. 205). (Redgrave's Dict. As William's son, William Curry, the Revolutionary soldier, stated that he was born in Middle Patent, Westchester Co., NY, investigation identifies that locality, so named, by a Patent dated 17 Feb 1701/2, as embracing the territory of North Castle, and was bounded on the north by the Bedford town line and on the south by the Colony line of Connecticut, and in 1708 the east portion of this patent was conveyed to others than those named in the original, and in this conveyance is stated that it was bounded on the south by the Colony line of Connecticut, which ran in the rear of the town of Greenwich and Horseneck. That William Curry Sr. lived near this line accounts for him registering his family in Greenwich. It was a sparsely settled district with no established church until 1753. The land records of Greenwich, CT, by Mead, p. 13, show his recorded family by wife Abigail. Note that William, Joseph and Benjamin are in Warwick, NY at the same period.

His Revolutionary War Claim S 49282, gives his date of birth as 13 July 1748 (Old Style), in Middle Patent, Westchester Co., NY, but does not name his parents. About 1773, he moved to Warwick, Orange Co., NY. He enlisted about May 1775 serving 3 months as a private in Capt. Henry Wisner's Co., Col. John Harthorn's NY regiment. He enlisted in 1776 and served 6-1/2 months as a private in Capt. Henry Wisner's NY Co. He rendered 5 subsequent tours of service as a private in Capt. Peter Bertholf's NY Co.; 3 months in 1778, 2 months in 1779, 2 months in 1780, 2 weeks in 1781, and 2 weeks in 1782. In 1778 he moved from Warwick, NY to Cherry Valley. One year later he moved to Tioga Co., NY and nearly 2 years later moved to Ulster, Bradford Co., PA, where he lived more than 30 years. He was allowed a pension on his application executed 4 Sep 1832, while a resident of Elmira, Tioga Co., NY. In 1832 he had children living in NY and PA.

William Curry owned property in Warwick, NY District No. 5, in 1775.
