The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Christoffel/Kit Davids first appeared in the colony of Rensselaerswyck in 1638.

Kit Davids applied for a patent of land at the Esopus in September 1656, and Kit sold part of the land to Jacob Jansen Stol. Jacob and Geertruy, his wife, must have moved to Esopus about this time, and then Jacob died in 1659. Kit Davids sold 6 morgans of his Esopus land to Evert Pels on 27 March 1667.

In 1650 he lived on a farm at Dominie's hoeck now called Van Wie's point, Albany. 1656 received a patent for 36 morgens of land at Esopus about a (Dutch) mile inland from the North river; 1663 asks permission to reenter on land from which he had been driven by Indians at Esopus. His wife was Cornelia, dau. of Andries De Vos of Beverwyck. She died in 1657, leaving at least two children: Joris Christoffelse, and David Christoffelse. The latter with wife and four children were massacred by the French and Indians at Schenectady, Feb. 9, 1690.¹

In the published Van Rensselaer Bowier Manuscripts at the end of the book the editor, A.J.F. van Laer, included biographical sketches of some of the people mentioned in the Colony of Rensselaerswyck. On page 819 he says that Christoffel/Kit Davids was born in England, and on 3 Sep 1658 Kit deposed that he was then 42 years old.

Guillaume David was said to be of unknown origin; confirmed 10-08-1659 Quebec, 23 years; Sorel inhabitant in 1674,

passed to New-Holland (New York) 1677, La Rochelle inhabitant in 1711 (ct 26-10-1711 LePailleur) m about 1656, Three-Rivers, Marie Armand "Confirmé le 10/08/1659 à Québec"¹

In 1657 they were living at Three Rivers, a place midway between Montreal and Quebec, on the north shore of the St. Lawrence River. This was one of the first settlements in Canada and was the wintering place of the fur-traders.²

Marie Armand was confirmed RC 10/8/1659 at Quebec, she went to New England with her husband in 1677, at the time their young infants were baptized at the Reformed Church of New York. In the PRDH records (PRDH: "programme de recherches en demographie historique) at Universite de Montreal" Repertoires des actes de baptemes, mariages, sepultures du Quebec ancien) Marie's name is listed as Harman, Harmans and Harment on three children's baptisms, so HERMAN as a last name could be more correct than Armand.¹

Guillaume David, brother to Claude, married Marie Armand at an unknown location. Marie Armand, in Trois-Rivières 8 May 1658, "asked to be excused from giving verbal testimony 'in as much as she has difficulty speaking French'."... Guillaume David and his family were in "Nouvelle-Hollande" or modern day New York by about 1678, apparently because Marie had relatives there. The family of their daughter Madeleine David and her husband Jacques Lepage, returned to New France by 1699 with their children, some of whom were baptized on their return. Their daughter Marie Lepage went to Fort Pontchartrain. Her cousin, Thérèse David, daughter of Claude David and Suzanne Denoyon, served as godmother at the Fort for Marie's first child in 1709.¹

Guillaume David is said to be "of" La Rochelle, France, on the marriage contract for Madeleine David (widow Lepage)'s secondmarriage in 1711 to Jean Poussard in Montréal.¹

This couple is seen baptizing children in Sorel and Trois Rivieres, Quebec, and in 1677 went to, or possibly returned to, New York.¹

A footnote says: This land was at Pamrapo, below Jersey City on the line of the NJ. Central R.R. De Forest had bought it from Jan Cornelissen Crynen and sold it to James Davison or Davits April 15, 1655. Davison was an Englishman, who kept a tavern in New Amsterdam and Albany, and ran a sloop between New Amsterdam and Albany. He sold the land in 1670, obtained some on Staten Island in 1676 and died 1688.¹

Thomas Davids Kikebell was a riverboat captain on the Hudson River. He and Anneke Schaets met when she had been banished from Albany to New Amsterdam. He had a stormy relationship with the beautiful and fiery Anneke Schaets. They were separated on a couple of occasions and in some court records she said she'd rather be dead than be forced to live with him, but she finally went back and agreed to "fulfil her Christian obligations" as his wife.¹

Anneken had an illicit relationship with **Arendt Van Curlaer**¹, by whom she had a son, Benoni. Anneken was banished from her father's church after this incident, but her father sued members of the congregation for slander and won the suit. Still, the magistrates banned her from Albany. In 1670, Anneken's father sent her to New Amsterdam, with her son, to start a new life. There she met and married Thomas David Kikebell. The marriage was a stormy one. In 1681, Anneken left Thomas and returned to Albany with her children, Benoni and the 2 girls she had with Thomas. She was again forbidden to accept communion and the court sent her back to NYC, to her husband. He owned Lot No. 2, Block M, Castello Plan.²

Albany, Rennselaerswyck and Schnectady Court Minutes 1680-1685 page 149 (153) -- Thomas Davidtse, plaintiff, aganist Domine Gideon Schaets, defendant. (Thomas was the spouse of the Domine's daughter, Anneken). The plaintiff presents his declaration in writing, setting forth that by means of various friendly appeals, he has repeatedly requested the defendant to let him have his wife and children and the effects belonging to him, which he has not been allowed to have, they having been expressly detained by the defendant, contrary to the law established in such matters...etc. Thomas Davidtse, plaintiff against Anneke Schaets his wedded wife, defendant.....The defendant says she is not obstinate, but that he is not a man with whom she can live, and that she would prefer to be dead or imprisoned for life rather than live with him...The 12 jurors who, being sworn, are to give their verdict in the aforesaid matter are as follows: Capt. Phillip Schuyler, foreman, Adriaen Gerritse, Davidt Schuyler, Wouter Albertsen, Johannes Wendel, Lawrens van Ale, Jan Vinnagen, Aernout Cornelise, Gerrit Banker, Luycas Gerritse, Jan Lansingh, Myndert Frederickse. PS..Anneke promised to conduct herself quietly and properly and go to New York with her husband, with her children and effects and there "to share the sweets and sorrows with him as a Christian wife"²

In his will, Thomas Davids, New York wrote: "To all Christian People: to whom this Present shall concern. I, Thomas Davids, of ye city of New York, widower of Anna Scheats, deceased, send Greeting." He makes his sole heirs, his two daughters, "gotten by my said wife," Aeletie and Angeineltie. "And whereas Benony Van Curlaer, the son of my said wife Anna, hath been adopted by me as a child, but whereas he hath been to me very disobedient and stubborn, committing acts and words against me, I have thought best that he shall have no more than 3 shillings in silver money." He makes "my very good friends Peter Jansen Messier and Peter Simkam," executors and tutors of his children. Witnesses, Joost Paldinck, P. DeLanoy. Proved at Court of Record held in New York in the City Hall on Tuesday, August 21, 1688. J. Nicolls.

On 11 April 1670, "Willem Davids" and Dirck Storm served as witnesses to the prenuptial agreement of "Sr. Jan Strycker of fflackbush" and "Mrs. Swaentie Jans widdr off Cornelis De Potter at the Ferry" (A. Van Doren Honeyman, James Nevius and His Descendants [hereinafter Nevius], [1900]).

Willem eventually settled at Flatlands, where he was taxed on 25 morgens of land in 1683 (DHNY, II:497). When William Davies took the Oath of Allegiance in September 1687, he stated he had been in this country for 34 years. He died before 20 May 1695, when Thomas Willett, Sr. and wife Helena of Flushing; Garrett Stoothoff and wife Johanna; and John Vandyck-huys and wife Aecheye of Flatlands, deeded Helena Davies of Flatlands, widow of William Davies, land in that place (Long Island Source Records).

William and Penelope (Storm) Davids, of Phillipsburgh, sold the tract of land owned successively by David Horton in 1726, and David Horton and his wife Bellica in 1752, to Daniel Horton of Harrison, in 1784 (Westchester Co. Land Records,

Liber K, p. 450).¹

In his will, he wrote: 28 Aug 1787, William Davids, of Philipsburgh, farmer, mentioned wife (name not given) to have household furniture, and use of house during widowhood; mentioned grand-daughter Sarah Davids; grandson John Davids; granddaughter Mary Davids; grandson William Davids; grandson John Davids; dau/ Hester Miller; son Charles; grandsons Abraham Davids and David Davids, to have lands in North Castle on the east side of "the "Broncks" river, provided they give good support and care for "my son Charles Davids so long as he shall live;" lands in White Plains to be sold to pay debts, and remainder to daughter Hester Miller and her children, Administrators: friends James Hammond and George Comb. Wit: Isaac Conklin, Isaac Mead, Jacobus Davids. Probated 19 Oct 1787.
