The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Anthony Dey went to Jersey City at the age of 16 and studied law in the office of his cousin, Col. Richard Varick. He became a very successful and wealthy lawyer.

On 18 April 1804 (recorded 22 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:200) Anthony Dey of the City of New York, Attorney and Counsellor at Law, and Catharine, his wife, conveyed to Abraham Varick of the same place, for \$1, land and meadow in the Township of Bergen at Powles' Hook, bounded E by Hudson River; N by said River or the Bay called Horsimus; S by Communipaw Bay; W in line of flagg staffe on Ellis Island. Mentioned were: chimney of house of Stephen Vreeland; Right of Ferry. As conveyed by Cornelius Van Voorst to said Anthony Dey 26 March 1803. Signed by Anth<sup>y</sup> Dey, Catharine Dey. Witnessed by James Kent, Robert Benson.<sup>2</sup>

On 19 April 1804 (recorded 22 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:204) Abraham Varick of the City of New York, Merchant, conveyed to Richard Varick, Jacob Radcliff and Anthony Dey of the City of New York, for \$1, parcels at Powles Hook, blocks or squares No. V and No. VI, each of which contains 32 lots. Signed Abraham Varick. Witnessed by James Kent, Robt. Benson.<sup>2</sup>

On 20 April 1804 (recorded 22 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:208) Abraham Varick of the City of New York, Merchant, conveyed to Richard Varick, Jacob Radcliff and Anthony Dey of the City of New York, for \$1, land in the Township of Bergen at Powles Hook [excepting tract in previously cited deed, S:204]. Signed by Abraham Varick. Witnessed by James Kent, Robt. Benson.<sup>2</sup>

Derrick Dey came to New York City from Holland abt 1640 as a soldier in the employ of the West India Company and established a mill and ferry at the foot of Dey Street in New York City. He lived on Broadway, at the head of Dey Street.

Jannetje Theunis sailed on *Den Conninck David* in 1642.

In the *Alexander Papers* in the N.Y. Hist. Soc. there is a copy of the grant of Oct. 18, 1667, which recites the grant of Dec. 15, 1644. It is endorsed as follows: "Minutes of patent to Congo, a free negro, bought by Derick Siecken of him but cannot find the Deed or said Dutch Patent. Geertje Cole [who was a grand daughter of Geertje Johnson, widow of Derick Jansen Dey, otherwise called Derick Siecken] has Original patents both Dutch & English this is supposed to be the Land belonging named in Tunis Dey's agreement." There is a further statement that Derick Jansen Dey died shortly after making his will, Sept. 5, 1683.<sup>9</sup>

As Dirck Janse Croon, he was in the Albany area as early as 1655 when he was appointed magistrate of Beverwyck. He may have returned to Netherlands in 1664. Burgher, New Amsterdam. To NY, 1650, from Amsterdam. Signed oath to the Patroon, Rensselaerswyck, Nov 28, 1651. Carpenter, Beverwyck. Built a house with Harmen Bastiaensz, in 1650, later transferred to his name in 1652. Magistrate, 1655. To New Amsterdam, 1664. In 1654, Willem Jansz from Amsterdam, was apprenticed to him as a gunsmith.

Dirck Jansen Siecken Dey, with Claes Carstens, was among the earliest settlers of Greenville, NJ. As shown by an entry in the "Minutes of the Orphanmasters of New Amsterdam," 1655-1663, p. 70, he also owned 100 acres of land at Pemmerpooch,

before February 19, 1659. Owing to this he or his son Jan Dey, was among the earliest settlers in Bayonne, NJ. Winfield, History of the County of Hudson, p. 85 note. NY Genealogical and Biographical Record, Vol. 7, p. 57. Winfield calls him Seicken or Sycan, and Sycan's Creek was named for him. Winfield, History of the Land Titles of Hudson County, NJ, p. 59.<sup>6</sup>

He was sued for half his property by Maria Wessels, of New Amsterdam, in 1663, for breach of promise. He was a carpenter (timmerman) in Beverwyck. Magistrate, 1655, 1658, Beverwyck. 1663, Superintendent of wells.

24 Feb 1660 -- Gabriel Carpesy [Carbosie?], pltf. v.s Jan Jansen, deft. Pltf demands from deft. fl. 6: 15 and one pound of butter for taking care of his cow. Defts. son appears in Court and says, that pltf let his cow stray in the bush and he and his brother in law Dirck Siecken were two days in search of her. Pltf says, that deft. did not deliver his cow like others, on the blowing of the horn, to be led to pasture. The Court orders deft. to pay the pltf the six guilders and 15 stivers and a pound of butter for the pasturing of his cow.<sup>5</sup>

On 3 Oct 1665, the Court in New Amsterdam decided "Whereas complaint has been made to us on the part of Wolphert Webber that he has suffered much damage in his garden through the cattle of Severyn Laurenszen, with requests that some persons may be appointed to inspect the same and estimate the damage, therefore the Major and Alderman of the City of New York this day appoint and authorize Mr. Thomas Hal, Dirck Siecken and Arien Cornelissen to inspect the aforesaid garden, to estimate the pretended damage and to determine how the same occurred, whether by imperfect fencing or otherwise, and if possible to reconcile parties; if not, to report their find to the W. Court."

Geertje Jans, h.v. Dirck Siecken, joined the NYC Ref Ch 3 Jan 1667.

Dirck Siecken, with Claertie Ebels, witnessed the baptism 23 Nov 1659 NYC Ref Ch of Geertie, dau. of Jan Adams (Metselaer) & Geertruyd Dircks.

On 25 Feb 1672/3, Jan Vingie of NYC conveyed to Dirck Siecken of NYC, husbandman, a parcel of land on Manhattan Island, lying without this city land gate, on west side of highway; bounds - N, his Royal Highnesses farme; S, Olof Stevensz; from highway to waterside.<sup>2</sup>

The house of dirck Siecken was mentioned in a deed 30 April 1673 from Jan Smedes to Coenraet Ten Eyck, Jacob Abramse, Carsten Leursen, and Jan herberding.<sup>3</sup>

Dirck Siecken, with Rebecca Idens, witnessed the bp. 4 Feb 1674 NYC Ref Ch, of Cornelis, son of Hendrick Hendricksen & Gosewyntie.

1678-9 Feb. 13. Recorded Dec. 3, 1695. Deed. Derrick Sicken of New York and wife Gerty Johnson to Enoch Machilson of Bergen Co., for 50 Dutch morgen in said Co. at Neycusick, also 15 morgen of meadow adjoining, as per patent.

Dirck Sicken, with Jannetje Dye, witnessed the baptism 15 Oct 1679 NYC Ref Ch of Marritie, dau. of Jan Janszen Langestraten & Marritje Arents.

Geertie Siecken, with Willem Wessels, witnessed the baptism 30 Oct 1680 NYC Ref Ch, of Hans Claeszen Ditlo, son of Claes Diedelofs & Aeltje Samsons/Rutgers.

Dirck Sicken, with Geertie Langendyck, witnessed the baptism 3 Dec 1681 NYC Ref Ch, of Dieuwertie, dau. of Jan Maston & Geertie Frans.

Derrick's will, dated 5 Dec 1683, was proved 11 Nov 1687. In it, he wrote: "In the name of God, Amen, know all men by these presents, that on the 5 of December, 1683, before me, Wm. Bogardus, Public Notary, in the presence of the under written witnesses. Dirck Jansen Dey, living just without this city, known to me, being sick a bed." Leaves to his wife Geetie Jansen, "all that land which at present lyeth to the south side of the house where the testator is dwelling, stretching to the land of Mr. Olof Stevens Van Cortlandt, and from the highway to the strand, or water side as far as his right is, reserving only an alley of four feet to the south side of the house." The rest of the premises are left one half to his wife, the other half to his children, Teunis and Jannettie. The testator further declares that he has fully satisfied his son Teunis for his mother's share. Witnesses, Evert Peters, Albert Leenderts Grovas. Proved by the oaths of the witnesses, and Letters of administration granted to the widow Geetie Jansen Dey, July 11, 1693.

On 1 June 1687, in a deed from the Corporation of the City of New York to White Timmer, of NYC, gunsmith, the description included "...that certaine peece of Ground Scituate Lyeing and being in the Smiths Street within the sd. Citty next to ye houses and Grounds of Lowrence Hendrix & the Houses & Grounds Gertie Dye..."<sup>4</sup>

On 11 Nov 1687 NYC Ref Ch, Dirck's widow, Geertje Jans Langendyck married (2) **Theunis Gysbertse Bogaert** (widower of Sara Rapalje) who lived in the Wallabocho on Long Island.

Dirck's second wife, in her will, wrote: I, Geertie Jans Van Langendyck, of New York, being sick and weak of body. I leave to my cousins, Jan Cornelis and Tryntie Van Langedyck, children of my brother, Peter Jans Van Langedyck, deceased, £50, when they are of age. I leave to my grandson, Cornelis Cornelisen, son of Franz Cornelisen, and my daughter Janake, both deceased, £10. I leave to my grand daughter, Geertie Cornelisen, daughter of Franz Cornelisen and my daughter Janake, all my wearing apparell, and two Dutch Church books, with silver clasps. And I leave all the rest of my estate to my said grand children. Dated September 5, 1702. Francis Wessells and Johanen Hardenbrook, executors. Proved, March 7, 1731/2. And Letters of Administration are granted to "Geertie Cole, widow of Henry Cole, and Hannah Brown, widow of Cornelis Cornelisen, in behalf of herself, and Frans Cornelisen, an infant of the age of 15, which Cornelis Cornelisen and Geertie Cole are the only children of Frans Cornelisen and Janake Frans, who was the only child of Geertie Jans Van Langedyck, Johanen Hardenbrook, one of the executors, being dead."

The following refers to a namesake and grandson of this Dirk Dey: On the 25th March, 1758, Dirck Dey, of the city of New York, Gentleman, conveyed to Trinity Church a lot of land lying west of Broadway near the present Canal Street. In the deed he is styled the grandson and heir at law of Dirck Seicken, alias Dey. Dirck Janszen, alias Siecken (Sichem, Sicken, Sycan, Zieken), alias Dirck Janse Dey, came from Amsterdam at an early date, and settled in New Amsterdam.<sup>1</sup>

Dirck was reared in the home of his step-father, Joris Ryerson, a young man from Wallabout, Brooklyn, whom his mother married 11 Aug 1691. The family lived on the Dey farm in NYC until 1708 when they moved to Preakness, near Paterson, NJ.

They lived at Lower Preakness, near Paterson. Dirck Dey may have settled in Preakness as early as 1707. On 9 Oct 2727 he bought 600 acres on Singac (now Preakness) Brook in Lower Preakness from the heirs of Thomas Hart of London, who had been one of the original 12 proprietors of East Jersey.

A carpenter, he built about 1740 a Georgian mansion (Dey Mansion/ Washington's Headquarters on Totowa Rd., Wayne, Passaic Co.). He was a freeholder of Bergen County for many years (this section was then in Bergen Co.), and a member of the New Jersey Assembly 1748-1752.. In 1752 he moved to New York City, where he lived the balance of his life.

In his will dated 4 Aug 1761, probated 29 May 1764, "Dirck Dey, of New York" mentioned son Theunis Dey; daughter Jane, wife of John Varck; daughter Ann; daughter Mary. Made his four children (Theunis, Jane, Ann and Mary) executors. When will was probated, Mary Dey was the wife of David Shaw. In the will, he wrote: I, Dirck Dey, of New York, being in perfect health. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my son, Theunis Dey, all my real and personal estate in East and West New Jersey, both divided and undivided, with all rights. I leave to my daughter Jane, wife of John Varck, 2 lots No. 33-37, on a certain draft or chart, and £1,000. I leave to my daughter, Ann Dey, 2 lots, No. 34-38 and £1,000, and an outset as her sister had when married. To my daughter, Mary Dey, 2 lots No. 35-36 and £1,000 and an outset when married. Their son Theunis was baptized September 24, 1656. He married Anneke Schouten in 1685. He was the owner of the Dey farm in New York, on both sides of Dey street. His son, Dirck Dey, is the testator of the above will. In 1717 he purchased a tract of 600 acres at Singack Brook, near Preakness, N. J. His son, Theunis Dey, was a Colonel in the Revolution. He had a son Richard, whose son Anthony was one of the founders of Jersey City. Colonel Theunis Dey married Hester, daughter of Philip Schuyler, who was eldest son of Arent Schuyler. His house is yet standing at Preakness, N. J., and was Washington's Headquarters in 1780. Lot 33 is the north corner of Broadway and Dey street. Lots 34-35 are next north. Lot 37 is west of

Isaac Day was a blacksmith at Hackensack. He later went to Harlem, NY, where he kept the Day Tavern, which stood on the Kingsbridge Road about where 126th St. would have crossed it. In Nov 1783 Washington moved down from the Van Cortlandt House in Yonkers where he had remained until the British had left the City, to Day's Tavern, where he met Governor Clinton; together on 25 Nov 1783 the two men entered the City side by side.

In his will, he wrote: Isaac Day, of New York City, to my wife Susannah, all my estate, real and personal, lands and tenements, goods and chattels, to sell, rent, dispose of as she should think fit during her widowhood; if my wife dies or marries, then what remains of my estate, I order my executors to sell, and the money so arising to be divided as follows: To my daughter Ann, wife of Pexcel Fowler, and her children, namely, Isaac Day Fowler, Ann Fowler, Pexcel Fowler, and John Fowler, each an equal part, to them, their heirs forever. I appoint my wife Susannah, John Day, son of John Day; William Day, son of Abraham Day, executors. Dated January 24, 1777. Witnesses, John Fowler, Robert Finley, David Oakley, of Yonkers, Esq. Proved, January 13, 1787.

Susannah Day was listed in the 1790 census as the head of a family living at Harlem; with her were 3 males over 16 (Pexell Fowler and his sons Isaac Day Fowler and Pexall Fowler, Jr.), 2 males under 16 (John Fowler and George Fowler) and 3 females (Susannah Day, her dau. In his will, dated 4 Sep 1784, proved 3 Feb 1785, he wrote: In the name of God Amen I William Dey of South Amboy in the County of Middlesex and State of New Jersey being of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to the almighty God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body doe (sic) make and ordain this to be my last will and testament and as tuching such worldly estate whearewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life - I give and bequeath and dispose of the same in manner and form following. It is my will and I do order that in the first place all my just debts be paid. I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Margret Dey the sum of one hundred pounds in gold and silver, my best bed and bedding, my best horst and riding chair with harnesses compleat, my best cow - all to be her own forever. And it is my will that my executors hereafter named are to pay yearly to my wife Margret, the sum of fifteen pounds in gold or silver, the first payment to be paid in six months after my disceas (sic) to be paid to her every year as long as she remains my widdow (sic) - and it is my will that my wife Margret shall have my yong (sic) negro wench Kate, to wait upon her as long as she lives or remains a widow, After her discease it is my will that what is left her should be devided (sic) equally among the legatees hereafter named or their survivors. I have given already to my children as followeth - to my son William the sum of thirty pounds, my son Joseph thiry poounds, my son John thirty pounds, Kenneth one hundred and fifty pounds, Peter one hundred fifty pounds, my daughter Rebecca thrity-five pounds, Abba forty pounds, Lydia thirty-five pounds, Jane sixty pounds, my grandson Nehemiah MOUNT thirty-five pounds, my daughter Eupphame forty pounds. All these sums is to be deducted out of each ones share, then to be divided equally amongst my children by my executors after that part that each one hase (sic) had allready (sic) is taken out of their shares - and it is my desire (sic) that my executors should discharge a certain boun that my son John is bound for my son Joseph to Gorge (sic) Weatheril before they pay any part of his share to him of any estate. And it is my wish that my grandson Nehemiah Mount shall draw his mother's share equally with the rest of my children. And it is my will that all my estate of land and moveable shall be sold at publick sale by my executors \_\_\_ (?) private sale as soon as they and my legatees think proper after my deceas. And the money arising (sic) for the sle to be devided amongst all my legatees as is herebefore mentioned by my executors. An lastly I doe nominate, constitute and appoint my son William Dey and my trusty freinds (sic) Mathew Rue and W. Perrine, son of Peter my executors to execute this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four 1784. In the presasents (sic) of use witnesses Roeloff Cortleyou, John Smock, Robert Barclay. Proved at Princeton, February 3, 1785
