The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He emigrated about 1660 from the Province of Guelderland, in which there is a village of Hart; he or his ancestors were probably French and his will was partly written in that language. He settled in New York City where he became a merchant and shipper. He had two sons, Matthias the ancestor of the Elizabeth, NJ branch; and Daniel, the ancestor of the Staten Island branch, by Margaret Stuyvesant (Margrietje), the widow Backer.¹

In his will, he wrote: 1672, the 4th day of January on Thursday, in the afternoon, about 3 of the clock, I Wm. Bogardus, notarie Publick in New York, admitted by the Hon. Col. Francis Lovelace. . . . Comes as witnesses those that have these underwritten, unto Balthazar DeHart, merchant and Inhabitant of this city, a man well known to the witnesses and mee. Being sickly of body nevertheless having his memory and speech as well as formerly. Soe as outwardly did appear." He doth bequeath unto his natural son Matthias DeHart, 2,000 guilders Holland money, which shall remain put and secured upon the house and lot of said DeHart where hee for the present dwelleth, lying within this city between the house of Mr. John Lawrence and the widow of Daniel Litsche, until he comes of age. And he is to have maintainance with reasonable vittles, and clothes, and likewise to be taught to read and write, and in a trade also that thereby he may help himself. He leaves to his natural son Daniel DeHart, . . a certain house and lot, as likewise the lot that came of Robert Baulands, belonging thereto, lying within the city upon the Heere Gracht, where . . . Elias Provoost, smith, for the present doe dwell. Likewise 2 great stilling kettles, and 60 guilders wampum yearly until he is of age. Also leaves . . . a certain cedar chest with all that may be found therein, and a negro woman named Sarah with her 3 children. He doth make as a gift to his brother Jacobus DeHart all the land in Haverstroo, purchased by the testator of the Indyans, and a Patent granted by the Governor, Philip Carterett. He leaves the remainder of his estate to his true brothers Daniel, Matthias, and Jacobus DeHart, and to the children of his sister Willemyntje. And that this may be done in the uprighteousest and truest manner, he appoints Hendrick Van Bomell, Jacob Teunison Kay, his good and acquainted friends, to administer this will and estate, and Jacques Cousseau is to take an exact invoice of goods. Dated and past in the house of the testator, being present Mr. Hans Kierdstede, Chirurgion, and Timon Van Borsum as desired witnesses, which with the said DeHart and mee Notary being subscribed the original hereof the day and year above written. Translated out of Dutch into English by me, Thomas Lovell.² Whereas Mr. Balthazar De Hart, of this city, merchant, did in his will appoint Jan Hendricks Van Bommell, Jacob Teunison Kay, and Mons. Jacques Cousseau his executors, they are confirmed. July 24, 1671.

The Deposition of Hartman Wessels, aged 54, or thereabouts, and John Cavalier, aged 45, deponents being sworn upon the Holy Evangelists, that on or about the 9th day of July, 1689, these deponents were then at the house of Daniel De Hart, late of New York, deceased, and that they heard the said Daniel DeHart declare that he left all his estate to his then wife, Martha DeHart. And both further declare that the said Daniel DeHart was then at that time of perfect sense and memory to the best of their knowledge, and further sayeth not. Hartman Wessells, John Cavalier, Gertrude Jans Van Tuyl. New York, May, 1690. Jurat Coram, me, S. Van Cortlandt. Gertryd Jans Van Tuyl, also being sworn, says that she heard Daniel DeHart declare the words in the above deposition expressed, and that she was requested to be a witness. Recorded by John Marsh.¹

In his will he wrote: "In the name of God, Amen. July the 9, 1689. I, Daniel De Hart, of New York, Doctor, being sick, do make this, my last will. "I leave all my estate to my wife, Martha De Hart, and make her my sole executrix, and do make and declare this to be my last will and Testament. The above will, to the certain knowledge of us, the subscribers, being all present, ear and eye witnesses to the same, was absolutely the last will and testament of the above said Doctor Daniel De Hart. And to the end that right might take place, as also being the especial request of our deceased friend, have hereby and with clear consciences to this, our certificate, subscribed, and not only soe, but are also ready when occasion shall us thereto require, to depose the same upon our respective oaths, as witness our hands. Hartman Wessels, John Cavalier, Jan Otto Van Tuyl, Cornelius Jan Van Tuyl. This 10th of April, 1690, appeared before us, Hartman Wessels and gave his oath on the Bible that the above written instrument is the real will and Testament of Daniel De Hart. Samuel Edsall, Content Titus, Justices. Also sworn to by Geritt Janse Van Tuyl and Gertruyd Janse Van Tuyl, alias van Pelt, before Barent Janse, Justice.¹

Her name is given as "Cattelyntie Larue, wife of Elias De Hart" in a list of early members of the Ref Ch at Six-Mile Run, NJ, made by Rev. Paulus Van Vlecq, who organized the church in 1710. This list prob. dated from about 1711.

In the will of Gisbert Lane of Middletown, Monmouth County, NJ, dated Nov. 7, 1720, proved May 17, 1727, she is called Catherine DeHart.

Elias built a home on his father's land on Gowanus Bay in Brooklyn, NY, and stayed there 10 years. Elias was one of the earliest pioneers in Monmouth County, NJ and is mentioned in describing the boundary in a deed of Peter Cortelyou dated June 1, 1703, said land being in Middlesex County (C. C. Gamer's notebooks, Rutgers Univ. Library).

In her 1709 will Johanna (Gerrits) De Wit De Hart De Bruyn mentions all of her daughters and their present husbands. She mentions by name her daughter Sophia's two children -- Johanna and Elizabeth -- and Sophia is to receive 50 pounds if she returns from Jamaica and starts caring for her children. The children were those of "Edmond Thomas" and "Maria Sefia de Witt", "Sofia de Witt". Johanna was baptized on 22 October 1704 and Elizabeth on 19 March 1707. In 1709 they would have been 5 and 2 years old.

"There is a legacy given to me in the will of my grandfather, Roelof Schenck, some of which I have received and some is due. I leave the same to Jacob, John, and Roelof Cowenhoven, my half-brother, and to Mary Cowenhoven, my half-sister." I also leave to them all my wearing apparel. The

rest of my personal estate I leave to my sister, Geeshe Bergen. I make Simon Boerum and John Rapalye, executors. Witnesses, Wilhelmus Bennet, Tunis Bergen, Simon Lott. Proved, October 10, 1769.

William De Hart was a lawyer residing in Morristown, and one of its streets was afterward named after him. He was a son of Dr. Matthias De Hart, and had two brothers killed in the Revolutionary War. His name occurs frequently in the records of the court. He was licensed as attorney November 1st 1767, and as counselor May 30th 1771. During the Revolution, he was a major in the first battalion, first and second establishments; afterward lieutenant-colonel of the second regiment continental army.
