The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Abraham de Lanoy, the first to appear in New Amsterdam (New York), was a grandson of Jean de Lannoy who was born 1570 at Tourcoing and died in Leiden 1604. Jean, married in the Walloon Church, Tournai, Jan. 13, 1596, the Protestant Heiress Maria'le Nahier (b. 1578, d. 1650) of a distinguished Brabant family. In 1609 Marie established a hospice (a convent for the entertainment of travellers), composed of twelve Houses for the persecuted Huguenots. John Robinson the famous pastor took refuge there with his flock in 1611, remaining until his death in 1625. The will of Marie de Lannoy concerning this foundation is now preserved in the public archives of Leiden, Holland. Jean was the son of Gysbert The Huguenot, b. 1533, at Tourcoing in Flanders. Gysbert was baptised in the Roman Catholic Church, but became a Protestant after the Seige of Tourcoing by the Huguenots, commonly so-called in derision after 1560, the word Huguenot signifying Confederate. Gysbert married in 1558 the Protestant heiress, Lady Marguerite de Ligne, but removed to Tournai in Hainault. Gysbert's marriage with the Protestant heiress and the subsequent complete alliance with the Huguenots caused a serious family feud, he being the first Protestant in any branch of the family and he was disinherited by his father. Gysbert, used the Coat Armor of Barbancon, inherited by his mother and the Lannoy Arms of his paternal ancestors.

Abraham De Lanoy was of Haarlem, No Holland, Netherlands and arrived in New Amsterdam ca 1651. Abraham de Lanoy was granted a small Burgher Right in Apr. 1657, at New Amsterdam.

From Dutch Document labelled, "Original Record of Burgomasters and Orphan Masters" "Surrogates". Wednesday Feb. 12, 1659, "Immetje wid. of Frans Clasz, requests Jacob Jansen Moesman and Abraham de la Noy to act as guardians for her four children".

From the Register of Solomon LaChair, Notary Public. Under date of Sept. 1, 1659, "Abraham De la Noye Burgher and inhabitant of New Amsterdam, acknowledged to owe Pieter Hertyens about to depart for Holland, 330 whole beavers, purchase money for house and lot north of the Beaver Street, to the west house and lot of Oloff Stevens van Cortlandt, to the

north of said Cortlandt, to the east of the house and lot of Frerick Lubbersz, to the south the said street."

On May 9, 1662, "Machdelena Hansen, wife of Rendrick Jansen Spier of Gemoenepa, sells to the name of her husband to Cristoffel Van Laer, shoemaker, at New Amsterdam, house and lot on the Heere graft at New Amsterdam, next to the house of Oloff Stevens Van Cortlandt and Gerrit Janse Roos, extending in front eartward to the burghwall (city wall) and in the rear to the lot of Abraham De la Noye."

"Abraham De Lancy [De Lanoy] and Maria Lubberts, made joint will on April 26, 1654, before Notary Schelluynne at New Amsterdam", at which time they had three children, Abraham Peter and Maryken. Under date of Dec. 15, 1661, "Elsie Ty-mens, wid. of Pieter Cornelis Van de Veen, Marycken (Maria) Lubbers, wid. of Abraham De la Noy, and Cornelis Pluyvier wid. of Geertruyt Andries Van Rosevelt, are notified to send in on Dec. 15, 1661 an inventory of their estate."

He was a Corporal of the Burger Corps of New Amsterdam in 1653. He was the Proprietor of the City Tavern in 1662. The City Tavern became historic almost from the day it was opened to the public and its pages are written full of many events which took place in its short life as in 1654 it became the Town Hall. Abraham de Lanoy appears often in the Court Records of Nieuw Amsterdam.¹

"Abram d'LaNoy" was made schoolmaster in New Amsterdam 1667-8.¹

The sister of Maria/Marritje Lubberts was Cornelis Lubberts of Haarlem, Holland, who married 17 Dec 1651 Johannes de Peyster, Deputy Mayor of New York in 1677.¹

In their marriage record, they were: Abraham de Lanoy, j.m. Van Haerlem, en Cornelia Toll, Wede. Van Evert Duycking, beyde woonende tot N. Yorke.

In his will, he wrote: "...I, Abraham De Lanoy, of the city of New York, Schoolmaster, do make this my last will and testament." I leave one half of all my estate to my wife Cornelia, and the other half to my children. Maria, wife of Evert Duyckinck, Jacobus, Abraham, Johanes, and Catharine. My wife is to bring up the children till they are of age, and to act in all things as a pious mother, for God's sake, is bound to do ; they are to be instructed in reading and writing, and an art or trade, each according to their capacity. I appoint Colonel Gerard Beekman, and Mr. Evert Duyckinck, tutor of my children, and make my wife executor. Dated August 3, 1702. Witnesses, William Waldron, Leendert Huygens de Klein, Aert Ellettse. Proved, October 6, 1702. Whereas, the said Cornelia De Lanoy hath died since the death of her husband, Abraham De Lanoy, intestate, and without having proved the above will. And whereas, on the day of the date hereof, Evert Duyckinck, son-in-law of said Abraham De Lanoy, and the said Cornelia, aged 25, and Mary De Lanoy, daughter of said Abraham, aged 20, did renounce their right to the administration, Gerard Beekman and Geritt Duyckinck are appointed administrators for said Mary and the rest of the children till they be of age. The children, Jacobus being 18, Abraham 15, Johanes 12, Katharine 10, all choose these as guardians, October 6, 1702.

Recorded at the request of Evert Duyckinck, October, 1702. 6 Books of Evangelists, £2, 3s; 9 Historical School Books, £3, 4s; 10 Books of Cortimus, £3, 9s; 14 Catechism Books, £3, 6s; 32 Song Books, £4, 6s; 13 Books of Golden Trumpets, £2, 6s; 1 Great Looking Glass, £5; 12 bags with money, £1,151; 10 bags with money to buy wampum, £25; 9 silver spoons, £5, 6s. Peter was appointed, by Leisler, the first Mayor of New York City on 14 Oct 1689. On Dec. 14, 1689 "Ordered that Pieter de Lannoy be Commissioned for receiving their Magesties Revenues in the Province of N. Y. He was Judge of the Court of Admiralty, Sept. 17, 1690. Committee of Safety and held other important offices.¹

Benjamin Fletcher, Governor, etc. Know ye, that on the 20th of November, 1696, before Colonel Stephen Van Cortlandt, my delegate, the will of Peter De LaNoy was proved, and Letters of Administration were granted to Mary De Lanoy, the widow. In his will, he wrote: "In the name of God, Amen. I, Peter De Lanoy, considering the mortality of man, have with good knowledge made my last will and testament as followeth." I leave to my brother, Abraham De Lanoy, my clothes and my School books, and my Dutch books of Divinity, Provided I have no child by my present wife, Mary. I leave to my beloved wife, Mary, the parcel of ground given to her by her father, Samuel Edsall, by deed of gift. Leaves all the rest to his wife. If he leaves a child, the estate is to be appraised, and the child to have one half. Makes his wife executor, and his brother, Abraham De Lanoy, and his brother in law, Engelbert Lott, overseers. Dated September 2, 1696. Witnesses, Johanes Kirbyll, Johanes Kip, Johanes De Peyster, G. Van Imbrugh, C. De Peyster. Proved before Colonel Stephanus Van Cortlandt, November 20, 1696.

Philip Delanoy came to New England in America on the *Speedwell* in 1620 (or on *The Fortune* in 1621^{1,2}).

"One year later [1621], a nineteen-year-old French youth of noble birth arrived at Plymouth. Born in Holland, where his parents had fled because of their faith, he had sailed with the Pilgrims from Delfthaven to Southampton, but when the Speedwell--intended to accompany the Mayflower--proved unseaworthy, he had to wait in England for another ship to be fitted out. His family's name was de Lannoy; among the Forticue's passengers he was listed as Philip De-La-Noy, and his descendants shortened the name to Delano."

Others of this name remained in Leyden. Jaques de la Noy, perhaps a brother of the emigrant to New England, presented his son Philippe for baptism in Leyden, June 1, 1625. Guillaume de Lannoy and Geertje Barthelemi were married September 19, 1633. A daughter was baptized July 23, 1634: Marie de Lannoy and Jeanne de Lannoy, witnesses.
