The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Their marriage record was recorded in Haarlem, Noord Holland as follows: Intention 24 Aug 1653: Anthonij de Mill, young man, from Haerlem, and Elisabeth van der Liphorst, young daughter, also from Haerlem, both residing in the Aenegant. Married at Haarlem 29 Sep 1653.<sup>1</sup>

Anthony De Mille and his family sailed from Amsterdam in Holland for New Amsterdam in *De Vergulde Bever* (*The Gilded Beaver*) in May 1658. The family came from Haerlem, in Holland (where they had been part of a colony of Flemish refugees), and consisted of the parents and their children Maria and Anna, one 4 yrs. old and one an infant.

Anthony de Mille was a baker and grain merchant in New York City.

In his will, he wrote: I, Anthony De Milt, living in the city of New York. "I make my sole and universal heirs my five children, Isaac, Mary, Anne, Peter and Sarah, gotten by my deceased wife Elizabeth Van der Liphorst. I leave to my eldest son Isaac De Milt, for his birthright as the eldest, 100 guilders, wampum value. I leave to Mary Winter for her special good service, 3 pieces of 8." Makes his sons Isaac and Peter, and son-in-law Isaac Kip, executors. Dated May 27, 1689. June 22, 1693. The original last will and testament of Anthony De Milt, merchant, being produced and proved, Letters of administration are granted to Isaac Kip, his son-in-law, by Governor Benjamin Fletcher.

At a Court of Record held in the City Hall in New York, December 10, 1689. Present P. De Lanoy, Mayor, Johan De

Bruyn, Cornelius Pluvier, Robert Walters, Hendrick Van Feurdon, John Shutt Aldermen. Peter De Mill appearing before the Court brought in the will of his father Anthony De Mill, proved before Mr. Francis Rumbout and John Lawrence, Justices of the Peace. Also an Inventory appraised by order of said Justices, by Mr. Peter De Lanoy and Geritt Duyckinck, amounting to œ192.7s. Letters of administration were granted to him. Abraham Gouverneur, Clerk. Page 92.--Inventory: 2 great chairs, 4s; 1 Looking Glass 5s. "A parcel of ground lying between the land of Barent Coerten and Hendrick Bosch in Beaver street, £22." Total £192. Taken by Martin Clock, Constable, Cornelius Duyckinck and Albert Clock, October 1, 1689. Recorded by me, Abraham Gouverneur, Clerk. December 12, 1689. Probated 4 Jan 1689.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Anthony De Milt, of New York, mason, being infirm in body, this 17 of July, 1749. I leave to my wife the use of my house on Golden Hill, in the Montgomery Ward, and from which I have lately moved, being rented at £15 a year. All the rest of my houses and lands and personal property are to be sold by my executors, and the proceeds are to be paid to my wife Mary, and to my children, Sarah, Benjamin, Anthony, and John, and my daughter Sarah Bulson and to Sarah, the daughter of my son Isaac, deceased. I make my trusty friends, Edward Man, cooper, and Johanes Durrie, baker, executors. Witnesses, William Dobbs, Robert Fenton, Charles Johnson. Proved, August 2, 1749.

In her will, she wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, ~~Margaret~~ [corrected to Mary] De Milt, of New York, being in perfect mind. I leave to my children, Steyntre, ~~Pictertie~~ [corrected to Pictertie], Elizabeth, wife of Isaac Jansen, and Jane, wife of

Stephen Ustick, my house and lot in Nassau street, with all furniture, also all my wearing apparell. To the children (not named) of Peter Vandervoort £15. My house to be sold at public vendue. I make my friends, Barent Kool, Isaac Jansen, Michael Vandervoort, and ~~Preteritie Roelandt~~ [corrected to Picteritie Roelandt], executors. Dated October 24, 1763. Witnesses, Jacobus Stoutenburgh, gunsmith; Robert Leacroft, Dirck Duryee, baker. "I will that the children of Joseph ~~Schayt~~ [corrected to Schamp] shall have £3. In their marriage record, they were: Petrus de Mill, j.m. Van N. Yorke, en Maria Vanderheul, j.d. als voren, beyde wonende alhier.

Peter de Mil, with his wife Maria/Mary and family, moved from New York City to Stamford, CT in 1715, having bought land there from Mary Sherwood on 30 Aug 1713. Peter de Mil died there on Sept. 10, 1722. The following year, Feb. 15, 1723, his widow, Mary, and son, Peter were appointed administrators of his estate. The will, made at New York in 1711, was not proved until June 15, 1729 at New York.<sup>2</sup>

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Peter De Mill, of New York, baker, being in perfect health. I leave to my wife, Mary Vanderheull, alias De Mill, during her widowhood, all my estate, houses, lands, and goods. And she shall bring up the children till of age or married; and she is to give each a portion, or outsetting, as she shall think fit. And she may sell, with the consent of my brothers, Isaac Kip and James Vanderheull, all my estate. After the death of my wife, all my estate is to be divided among my children. (Not named.) And my oldest son is to have 20 shillings over and above his share, in bar to all claim as heir at law. I make my brothers, Isaac Kip and Johannes Vanderheull, trustees, and my wife, executor. Dated July 27, 1711. Witnesses, Andries Marschalk, William Eyght, Jacob Bennett. Proved, June 15, 1729.<sup>3</sup>

On 6 Dec 1728, Mary, widow of Peter de Mil, is mentioned in the will of her sister Elizabeth's husband, Martin Clock, at New York City. On June 23, 1730, Mary, widow of Capt. Peter de Mil, at Stamford, Conn., as executrix of her late husband's will, conveys the property at Stamford to her two sons, Peter and Anthony. On Oct 25, 1744, Mary, widow of Peter de Mil, living at Stamford, Conn., is mentioned in the will of her sister, Elizabeth, widow of Marten Clock, living at Newtown, Long Island. On Aug. 30, 1759, the four living children of Peter de Mil and Mary, his wife, both deceased, divide remaining parental estate. Apparently Mary (Van Der Heul) de Mil died in 1759.<sup>2</sup>
